WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to alter the boundaries of or abolish the subdivisions existing in any municipal district; and it was further enacted that every Order under the provisions of Part I. of the said Act should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication; and it was also enacted that the road district of Coburg should on the commencement of the said Act be constituted a shire under the name of the Shire of Coburg: And whereas a petition signed by not less than one-fourth of the persons whose names are inscribed on the municipal roll of the Shire of Coburg has been presented to the Governor in Council, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, praying that the said Shire may be proclaimed a single and undivided Shire: And whereas such petition has been published in the manner directed by the said Act and no counter petition in opposition thereto has been presented: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order abolish the subdivisions existing in the Shire of Coburg.

## THE SHIRE OF FLINDERS AND KANGERONG RE-SUBDIVIDED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-fifth day of May 1875.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might from time to time make Orders, amongst other things, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication; and it was also enacted that the road districts of Flinders and Kangerong should be united and constituted a shire under the name of the shire of Flinders and Kangerong: And whereas a petition signed by one-fourth of the persons whose names are for the time being inscribed on the municipal roll of the said shire has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order abolish all previous subdivisions of the said shire of Flinders and Kangerong, and doth re-subdivide such shire into three several subdivisions, the boundaries whereof shall be as follow, that is to say:—

**THE WEST RIDING.**—Bounded by a line starting on the shore of Port Phillip Bay, north-west corner of the parish of Wannaeuc; thence eastward and southward by the north boundary of the parish of Wannaeuc, and the east boundaries of the same and of Fingal, to the south boundary of the shire; and around the shire boundary westerly to the starting point.

**THE CENTRE RIDING.**—Bounded by a line starting at the north-west corner of the parish of Kangerong; thence eastward and southward by the boundaries of same parish, and the road from its south-east corner, to and by the east side of allotment 66, parish of Balnarring, to Stony Creek; down Stony Creek to and southward and westward by the shore of Western Port and the ocean to the south-west corner of the parish of Flinders; and northward by the east boundaries of the parishes of Fingal and Wannaeuc, and the north boundary of the latter, and the shore of the Port Phillip Bay to the starting point.

**THE EAST RIDING.**—Bounded by a line starting on the shire boundary at the north-west corner of the parish of Balnarring; thence eastward by the shire boundary to Western Port Bay; southward and westward by the same to the south end of the parish of Balnarring; up Stony Creek to and by the east side of allotment 66 of same parish to a road; and northward by this road to and by the west boundary of said parish to the starting point.

And the Honorable Duncan Gillies, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted, that, subject to the provisions of the said Act the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things altering, for the purpose of adjusting the boundaries of contiguous municipal districts, being shires, without any petition; and it was further enacted that every Order under the provisions of Part I. of the said Act should be published in the *Government Gazette* and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas it has been mutually agreed between the Councils of the Shires of Mount Alexander and Metcalfe, that a portion of the boundary line between the said shires shall be altered; and it is expedient to give effect to such resolution: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby alter and adjust the boundaries of the said Shires of Mount Alexander and Metcalfe, and doth re-define the boundaries thereof respectively in manner following, that is to say:—

**THE SHIRE OF MOUNT ALEXANDER.**—Commencing at the north-east angle of the parish of Yandoit; thence by the north boundary of that parish bearing westerly to the south-west angle of allotment 24, section 14, in the parish of Guildford; thence by the west boundary of section 14 bearing north to the south-west angle of the township reserve of Guildford; thence by the west boundary bearing north to a point thereon bearing east from the south-east angle of allotment 1 of section 9, parish of Guildford; thence by a line bearing west fifty links; thence by a line following the centre of the road forming the east boundary of the last-named allotment bearing north twenty chains (more or less) to the River Loddon; thence crossing that river by a line bearing south-westerly to the southern angle of allotment 38 of section 6; thence by the west boundary of that allotment bearing north forty chains fifty-three links to the north-west angle thereof; thence by a line bearing east fifty links; thence by a line following the centre of the road forming the west boundary of allotment 37 of section 6, and the prolongation of that line bearing north eighteen chains fifty-eight links to a point on the centre of the road forming the south boundary of the Strathloddon pre-emptive section, the said point bearing east fifty links and north fifty links from the north-east angle of allotment 11 of section 9 in the parish of Guildford; thence by a line following the centre of the said road bearing easterly to the west boundary of the parish of Fryers; thence northerly by the said boundary to the south boundary of the parish of Castlemaine; thence westerly by the said south boundary to the south-west angle of the parish of Castlemaine; thence north by the west boundary of the said parish, for a distance of one mile and sixty-six chains, more or less, to a point due west of the south boundary of the Castlemaine municipality; thence due east by the said south boundary to a point in the west boundary of the Chewton municipality being the south-east angle of the Castlemaine municipality; thence south by the west boundary of the Chewton municipality to its south-west angle; thence east and north by the south and east boundary of the Chewton municipality to the intersection of the Green Gully Creek; thence easterly by that creek to its intersection with the west boundary of the parish of Elphinstone; thence south to the south-west angle of the parish of Elphinstone; thence south and west by the east and south boundaries of the parish of Fryers to its south-west angle; thence northerly by the east boundary of the parish of Yandoit to the commencing point.

Wherever the line described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether specifically described or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary line.

**THE SHIRE OF METCALFE.**—Commencing at a point in the centre of Piper's Creek bearing east from the south-east angle of the parish of Metcalfe; thence west to the said south-east angle; thence west by the south boundary of the parish of Metcalfe to the south-west angle of section 1; thence by a direct line south through portions 46, 45, 44 and 43 to the centre of the Coliban River, opposite the centre line of a road forming the south boundary of portion 50 in the parish of Edgecombe; thence to and by the centre line of said road west to a point bearing south of a point on the west side of the main line of road from Taradale to Elphinstone, the last-named point bearing S. 52° 37' W. from the north-west angle of allotment 1, section 12 of Taradale suburban allotments; thence north to the north boundary of the parish of Drummond; thence west to the south-west angle of the parish of Elphinstone, in the county of Talbot; thence north by the west boundary of the parish of Elphinstone to its intersection with Green Gully Creek; thence westerly by said creek to its intersection with the eastern boundary of the borough of Chewton; thence north to the north-east angle of the borough of Chewton; thence west by the north boundary of said borough to the east boundary of the borough of Castlemaine; thence north and west by the east and north boundaries of the borough of Castlemaine to the boundary of the electoral district of Castlemaine; thence northerly by the said electoral boundary to the north

boundary of the parish of Harcourt; thence east by the said north boundary to the north-west angle of portion 1, section 8, parish of Harcourt; thence northerly, easterly, and southerly by the western, northern, and eastern boundaries of the parish of Sutton Grange to the centre of Myrtle Creek; thence by the Myrtle Creek to the Coliban River; thence by the centre of Coliban River north-easterly to the Campaspe River; thence southerly by the centre of Campaspe River and Piper's Creek to the commencing point.

Wherever the line described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether specifically described or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary line.

And the Honorable Duncan Gillies, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might from time to time make Orders, amongst other things, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication; and it was also enacted that the road district of Whittlesea and the Morang riding of the shire of Darebin should be united and constituted a shire under the name of the shire of Whittlesea: And whereas a petition signed by one-fourth of the persons whose names are for the time being inscribed on the municipal roll of the Shire of Whittlesea has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order abolish all previous subdivisions of the said Shire of Whittlesea and doth hereby re-subdivide the said shire into three several subdivisions, the boundaries whereof shall be as follows, that is to say:—

**THE WHITTLESEA RIDING.**—Bounded by a line starting on the Great Dividing Range at the north-west angle of the shire; thence south by the west boundary of the shire to the south boundary of the parish of Toorourong; east by this boundary and on to Arthur's Creek; and up this creek and by the north-eastward boundary of the shire to the starting point.

**THE YAN YEAN RIDING.**—Bounded by a line starting at the intersection of the north boundary of the parish of Yan Yean with the west boundary of the shire; thence south by the latter boundary to the south boundary of the parish aforesaid; east by the parish boundary and Doctor's Gully road to Arthur's Creek; up Arthur's Creek to and along the south boundary of Whittlesea riding to the starting point.

**THE MORANG RIDING.**—Bounded by a line starting at the intersection of the north boundary of the parish of Morang with the west boundary of the shire; thence southward, east, and northward by the shire boundary to the south boundary of Yan Yean riding, and by this boundary to the starting point.

No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might from time to time make Orders, amongst other things, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication; and it was also enacted that the Road District of Templestowe and the Shire of Nunawading should be united and constituted a shire under the name of the Shire of Nunawading: And whereas a petition signed by one-fourth of the persons whose names are for the time being inscribed on the municipal roll of the said shire has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the

Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order abolish all previous subdivisions of the said Shire of Nunawading and doth re-subdivide such shire into three several subdivisions, the boundaries whereof shall be as follow, that is to say:—

**THE NORTH RIDING.**—Commencing at the north-east angle of portion 131 parish of Nunawading; thence westerly by the north boundaries of portions 131, 124, 121, and 116, to the north-west angle of the last-named portion; thence south by the west boundary of said portion 116 to a point opposite the north boundary of portion 93; thence west to and by the north boundary of portion 93; and the north boundaries of portions 92, 91, 90, 89, 88, 87, 86, and a direct line to the western boundary of the road district; thence northerly, easterly, and southerly by the western, northern, and eastern boundaries of the Shire of Nunawading to the commencing point.

**THE CENTRE RIDING.**—Commencing at the north-east angle of portion 131, parish of Nunawading; thence westerly by the north boundaries of portions 131, 124, 121, 116, to the north-west angle of the last-named portion; thence south by the west boundary of said portion 116 to a point opposite the north boundary of portion 93; thence west to and by the north boundary of portion 93 and the north boundaries of portions 92, 91, 90, 89, 88, 87, 86, and a direct line to the western boundary of the Shire of Nunawading; thence south to the centre of Moloney's road; thence east by the centre of that road to the centre of a road forming the west boundary of portions 97 and 98; thence north by the centre of the last-named road to a point due west of the north boundaries of portions 98, 99, 100, 101, 113, 112, 111; thence east to and by the said north boundaries to the east boundary of the Shire of Nunawading; thence northerly by the said east boundary to the commencing point.

**THE SOUTH RIDING.**—Commencing at the south-east angle of portion 110, parish of Nunawading; thence west and north by the south and west boundaries of the Shire of Nunawading to the intersection of the centre line of Moloney's road; thence east by the said centre line to the intersection of the centre line of road forming the west boundary of portions 97 and 98; thence north by the centre of the last-named road to a point due west of the north boundaries of portions 98, 99, 100, 101, 113, 112, and 111; thence east to and by the said north boundaries to the Dandenong Creek; thence southerly by that creek to the commencing point.

And the Honorable Duncan Gillies, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by The Local Government Act 1874 (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted, that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might from time to time make Orders, amongst other things, altering for the purpose of adjusting the boundaries of contiguous municipal districts, being shires, without any petition; and it was also enacted that, every Order under the provisions of Part I. of the said Act should be published in the *Government Gazette* and should take effect as from the day of such publication; and it was further enacted that any error in any Order under Part I. of the said Act, or under any of the analogous provisions of the Acts thereby repealed, might be rectified by the Governor in Council by any subsequent Order: And whereas errors have occurred in the descriptions of the boundaries of the Shires of Seymour, Pyalong, and Romsey in the Second Schedule to the above recited Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order alter, adjust, and rectify the boundaries of the said several Shires of Seymour, Pyalong, and Romsey, and doth re-define the boundaries thereof in manner following, that is to say:—

**SHIRE OF SEYMOUR.**—Commencing at the junction of Hughes's Creek with the Goulburn River; thence easterly by Hughes's Creek to the western boundary of section A, in the parish of Avenel; thence north by the western boundary of section A, and east by the northern boundary of sections A and B, and south by part of the eastern boundary of section B, so far as the township reserve of Avenel; thence by the northern, eastern, and part of the southern boundary of the township reserve to Hughes's Creek; thence up that creek to its junction with a tributary north of the northern boundary of Abdallah pre-emptive section; thence southerly by that tributary to its intersection with the said northern boundary; thence westerly by the northern boundary, southerly by the western boundary, and easterly by the southern boundary to the intersection of the said southern boundary by the aforesaid tributary of Hughes's Creek; thence by that tributary southerly to the northern boundary of Kobobyn pre-emptive section; thence easterly by the northern boundary, southerly by the eastern boundary, and westerly by the southern boundary of Kobobyn pre-emptive section to the intersection of its southern boundary by the aforesaid tributary

of Hughes's Creek; thence up that tributary southerly to a point due north of the north-west angle of Grant's pre-emptive section; thence by a direct line south to the said north-west angle, and further south by the western boundary of Grant's pre-emptive section to the Goulburn River; thence north-westerly by the Goulburn River to a point about one and a half miles below the junction of the Narrangearnong Creek, and north of a point in the road from Yea to Dabyminga one mile twenty-eight chains west of its intersection with the Narrangearnong Creek; thence due south to that road and by that road westerly to a point due south of the south-east angle of Worrough pre-emptive section; thence due south to a point due east of the northern boundary of the parish of Broadford; thence by a straight line west to the centre of the road north of Broadford parish, and by that road further west to the Sunday Creek, and by the Sunday Creek northerly to its intersection with a road north of allotments 104, 106, and 107, in the parish of Lowry; thence by that road north-westerly to the Sugarloaf Creek and further west about thirty-nine chains by the road between Ryan's selections and south-westerly about nine chains, and north-westerly about one and a half miles, being a continuation of the road between Ryan's selections to a point due south of the junction of the Glenaroua and Sunday Creek runs about seven and a half miles south-west of the junction of Hughes's Creek with the Goulburn River on the electoral boundary of Dalhousie and Rodney; thence due north about eight and a half miles; thence north-easterly about seven and a half miles to the commencing point.

**SHIRE OF PYALONG.**—Commencing in the centre of a road north of the north-east angle of allotment 19A, in the parish of Goldie; thence by a line easterly in the same direction to the summit of the Tantarabon Range, and by that range and the summit of Mollison's Black Range and a direct line easterly to the northern boundary of John Shubert's selected land; thence by the northern boundary of the said land and a straight line to the centre of the road from Kilmore to Heathcote, and by the centre of the road south-easterly so far as the north-west corner of allotment 49, parish of Moranding; thence easterly by the northern boundaries of allotments 49 and 117 and the centre of a road forming the northern boundary of allotments 112 and 111 to the centre of a road leading to Mount Piper reserve; thence northward by the centre of that road to the north-west angle of the said reserve, and further by the western boundary of Broadford parish to the north-west angle of allotment 121, parish of Broadford; thence easterly by the centre of a road between Broadford and Lowry parishes to the Sunday Creek; thence by the Sunday Creek northerly to the centre of a road between allotments 104, 106, and 107 on the south, and allotments 1 and 2 on the north to the Sugarloaf Creek; thence by a road westerly about thirty-nine chains, between Ryan's selections and south-westerly about nine chains, and north-westerly about one hundred and twenty chains, being a continuation of the road between Ryan's selections to a point due south of the junction of the Glenaroua and Sunday Creek runs, and about seven miles and a half south-west of the junction of Hughes's Creek with the Goulburn River, on the electoral boundary of Dalhousie and Rodney; thence due north about eight miles and a half to the said point; thence south-westerly by the said electoral boundary to Mount Koala; thence by the dividing range forming the boundary between the Broadford and Campaspe electoral divisions to meet a direct line from the south-east angle of allotment 2, in the parish of Baynton, to the source of Mollison's Creek, and by Mollison's Creek to its junction with Spring Gully (shown on the county map of Dalhousie as having its source at Permanent Springs); thence due south to the Dividing Range and by the Dividing Range easterly to the centre of the road from Lancefield to Pyalong; thence by that road north-easterly to and by the northern boundary of allotments 12A and 13A, in the parish of Goldie, to the centre of a road between allotments 13A and 24; thence by that road northerly to its intersection with a road north of allotments 16A, 17A, 18A, and 19A, and by that road to the point of commencement.

**SHIRE OF ROMSEY.**—Commencing at a point in the north boundary of the county of Bourke north of the north-east angle of suburban allotment 18, in the parish of Lancefield; thence south to the north-east angle of the said parish; thence southerly by the eastern boundaries of the parishes of Lancefield and Monegeeta to the south-east angle of the parish of Monegeeta; thence west by the south boundary of the said parish to a point in the centre of the Lancefield road west of the north-west angle of the parish of Havelock; thence southerly by the centre of the said road to the northern boundary of the parish of Bolinda; thence west to the north-east boundary of the Mount Alexander railway; thence north-westerly by the north-eastern boundary of the said railway to a point in the said boundary due south of a point in the centre of Bolindo Creek which is due west of the southern boundary of section A, in the parish of Havelock; thence by a direct line northerly to the south-west angle of Brock's pre-emptive right; thence north to the south-west boundary of the parish of Monegeeta; thence by the south-west, west, and part of the northern boundaries of the said parish to the south-west angle of the parish of Lancefield; thence north by the western boundary of the said parish and a direct line to the northern boundary of the county of Bourke; thence easterly by the said county boundary to the commencing point.

And the Honorable Duncan Gillies, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might from time to time make order to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication; and it was also enacted that the Road District of Connemare and the Borough of South Barwon should be united and constituted a shire under the name of the Shire of South Barwon: And whereas a petition signed by one-fourth of the persons whose names are for the time being inscribed on the municipal roll of the Shire of South Barwon has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order abolish all previous subdivisions of the Shire of South Barwon and doth subdivide the said shire into three several subdivisions, the boundaries whereof shall be as follow, that is to say:—

**THE KARDINIA RIDING.**—Commencing at the River Barwon opposite the north boundary of section 25, parish of Barrabool, county of Grant; thence down said river to the centre of the Barwon Bridge; thence by a line along the centre of the said bridge and the southern embankment and continued along the centre of the Colac road to the boundary of Shire; thence north to and by the north boundary of section 25 Barrabool, to the starting point.

**THE BARWON RIDING.**—Commencing at the centre of the Barwon Bridge, thence down the centre of the Barwon River to a point due north of the east boundary of the Racecourse; thence by a line south and the eastern and southern boundaries of the Racecourse to a point one chain due north of the north-east angle of allotment J, section 4, parish of Connemare; thence by a line bearing south to the south-east angle of allotment K, section 4, in the same parish; thence by a line bearing west to the south-west angle of portion 16, parish of Duneed; thence by a line bearing north to the centre of the Colac road; thence by a line along the centre of the Colac road to the starting point on the Barwon Bridge.

**THE CONNEMARE RIDING.**—Commencing at a point in the centre of the River Barwon due north of the east boundary of the Racecourse; thence down said river and the westward shore of Lake Connemare to the sea-shore; by the sea-shore to the mouth of Spring Creek north, in continuation of, and along the east boundary of allotment 39, parish of Puebla, and to the north-east angle of allotment A, section 5, parish of Connemare; thence east to the south-east angle of allotment K in the same parish; thence north to the south boundary of the Racecourse; thence by the south and east boundary of the Racecourse to the starting point.

And the Honorable Duncan Gillies, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Of the 93 deaths 30 or 32.2 per cent. were of children not exceeding 3 years of age, 25 being under the age of one year. Typhoid fever and scarlatina are reported at Kew, one death being the result in each case. Bronchitis still prevails at Brunswick and Prahran, and chest affections at Sandridge. With the above exceptions the districts are reported on favorably as regard sickness and mortality. Twelve of the deaths in South Melbourne occurred in public institutions. Three cases of typhoid fever are reported from the hospital. Six deaths in Prahran took place in public institutions also.

The coal is to be of the very best quality for smithy purposes, and must be screened before delivery over a screen with bars half an inch apart, and afterwards through a screen with bars an inch apart, and that which has passed through the bars one inch apart is to be delivered, and is to be what is termed nutty smith's coal, free from lumps, dust, shale, sulphur, and other impurities.

2. The contractor is to deliver the coal screened ready for use, into the waggons on the railway or breakwater pier at Williamstown, at the option of the Government, or may deliver into the railway waggons at any station on the Victorian Railways. The coal will be weighed by the Government, and such weight and returns shall form the basis upon which the contractor's account will be made out.

3. The contractor will be required to produce the invoice and a letter from either company to prove the genuineness of the coal before it will be received. The coal will be afterwards subjected to such test as the Engineer-in-Chief or General Overseer of Locomotives may decide before acceptance.

4. The contract entered into under this notice is not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by the importation of smiths' coal by the Government for the service of the Victorian Railways, or the purchase of slack or small coal.

6. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supply as to the quality of the coal, the same is to be decided by a board of survey composed of persons named by the Commissioner of Railways, and the decision of the board is to be final.

If the delay necessary for obtaining the decision of a board of survey should be detrimental to the public service, the Engineer-in-Chief or General Overseer of Locomotives will have the power to reject coal which is of inferior quality, it being understood that either of these officers will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected coal and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense charged to him.

8. Irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractors to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds for each case, as the Government may direct; and it will also be in the power of the Government to terminate the contract forthwith.
