MANAGER OF A COMMON-TOLL ROAD.

THE Administrator of the Government in Council, on the 25th of May 1875, made the following appointment and arrangement with reference to the Common-toll Road herein-after mentioned, under the provisions of the Act 38 Victoria No. 506, § 435, viz.:-

W. H. WASTELL

to be Manager (*vice* J. F. DISTRICT WHERE CERTIFICATES MAY BE GRANTED FOR PUBLICANS' LICENSES CHARGEABLE WITH FEE OF £10.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir WILLIAM FORSTER STAWELL, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Colony of Victoria, and the Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute* 1864 amendment Act it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon the application in writing of the council of any shire or road district, to proclaim any part of such shire or road district, to be defined by such council, and not being in or within one mile of any city or town, a part within which the licensing magistrates for such district might grant certificates for publicans' licenses as aforesaid, for which should be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds, and on the like application of the council of any borough not being within fifty miles of the city of Melbourne, the Governor in Council might, if he should think fit, proclaim any portion of such borough as a part within which the licensing magistrates for the district might grant certificates for such publicans' licenses, and for which license should be charged a like fee of Ten pounds, and the said Governor in Council might from time to time revoke any such proclamation, such revocation to take effect from the time of the expiration of the last issued license under such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the district hereinafter mentioned as a district within which Licensing Magistrates may grant Certificates for Publicans' Licenses for which shall be charged the annual License Fee of Ten pounds, that is to say:—

The whole of the parish of Bil Bil Wyt in the Shire of Wannon.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this seventh day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, and in the thirty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

QUARANTINE DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Governor in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Quarantine Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter described shall be Quarantine Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

Pursuant to Orders of 23 December 1874.

POSTLETHWAITE OR BAILESTON QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the point where the southern boundary of the Protectorate run abuts on the Goulburn River; thence by the southern boundaries of that run and the Waranga run, the south-eastern boundary of Colbinabbin South run, and by the northern and eastern boundaries of Cherrington run to Compton's Creek run; thence by the northern boundary of that run to the Goulburn River; and thence down that river to the commencing point.

PROTECTORATE QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Protectorate run).—Commencing at the north-east angle of Waranga run; on the west by that run; on the south by Postlethwaite run on the east by the Goulburn River for about seven miles; thence by a line running north-west to the commencing point.

WARANGA QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the south-east corner of Toolamba run, on the Goulburn River; thence by the southern boundaries of that run and Wanalta East run to Gobareep run; thence by the eastern boundary of that run to Colbinabbin South run; thence by a portion of the northern and eastern boundaries of that run to Postlethwaite run; thence by the northern boundary of that run to the Goulburn River; and thence by that river to the point of commencement: Provided that the road from Corop to Rushworth and Whroo shall form no part of the said quarantine district.

Pursuant to Order of 12 April 1875.

MANSFIELD QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the source of the Howqua River in Mount Howitt; thence down that river to Jamieson River; thence down that river to Goulburn River; thence down that river to its junction with the Delatite River; thence up that river to Wappan run; thence by the southern boundary of that run north-westerly to the eastern boundary of Mount Pleasant B run; thence by that boundary south-easterly to the Maitongoon West Run; thence by that run easterly to the Delatite River; thence down that river and the Goulburn River to Balham Hill run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that run, Killingworth, Murrindindi East, Island, and Muddy Creek A runs to the Main Dividing Range; and thence by that range easterly and northerly to the point of commencement: Provided always that the Upper Thornton run shall form no part of said quarantine district.

CLEAN DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 66th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Governor in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Clean Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter defined shall be Clean Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

Pursuant to Orders of 23 December 1874.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir WILLIAM FOSTER STAWELL, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Colony of Victoria, and the Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that the Governor might from time to time increase, and after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette* diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and might from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Act; and it was also directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to and increase the Commons hereinafter respectively mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

NAVAL CADETS.

HIS Excellency the Administrator of the Government has directed the subjoined Despatch and accompanying documents to be published for general information.

SIR,—The Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty have again placed at the disposal of the Secretary of State for the Colonies the seven nominations to Naval Cadetships, which previously to 1872, when they were suspended by their Lordships, had formerly been assigned to him for distribution in certain colonies.

9. These nominations, which are available only for colonists in the strict sense of the term, were originally assigned to the North American and Australian colonies, but as all were not invariably claimed by those colonies, and the nominations lapsed if not claimed within the year, it often happened that several were annually lost to the colonial service, whilst the privilege of nominating would have been much prized in some of the un-nominating colonies.

3. In these circumstances it has been decided to increase the number of colonies to which these nominations will in the first instance be assigned, and should all of them not have been applied for by those colonies by the end of the first quarter in each year, the nominations then at my disposal will be made available to meet any applications which may have been received from other colonies.

4. Should you have occasion to submit an application in favor of a candidate, you will take care that he is within the limits of age prescribed by the enclosed regulations, that he is free from any physical defect, and that he is likely as far as can be ascertained to be able to pass the necessary examination, as the nominations in all cases of rejected candidates, from whatever cause, are considered by the Admiralty to be forfeited.

5. I enclose a copy of a form which is required by the Admiralty to be filled up by the parent or guardian of the candidate, and which must be transmitted with any recommendation in favor of a nomination which you may make. I also enclose copies of regulations for candidates, regulations while under training, and a memorandum as to physical disqualifications for the service.

6. As the number of nominations at my disposal is very limited, you will point out to the friends of any candidate whose name you may submit, in order that there may be no misapprehension and consequent disappointment, that the recommendation is made by you without any assurance of my having a vacant nomination at my disposal.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING NAVAL CADETS.

(For the information of candidates.)

1. Nominations for naval cadetships will take place half-yearly, immediately after the report of the last examination has been received.

2. An examination of the young gentlemen who have obtained nominations will be held at the Royal Naval College, Greenwich, under the direction of the Admiralty Examiners, on the third Wednesday in June and the last Wednesday in November in each year, but the appointments will date from the 15th July and January following respectively.

3. No candidate will be eligible for examination in June whose age will not be within the following limits on the 15th July following, viz., not less than twelve nor more than thirteen and a half years of age, nor in November whose age will not be within those limits on the 15th January following.

4. Every candidate will be required to pass the medical examination according to the prescribed regulations, and must have been found physically fit for the Royal Navy.

He must be in good health and free from any physical defect of body, impediment of speech, defect of sight or hearing, and also from any predisposition to constitutional or hereditary disease or weakness of any kind, and in all respects well developed and active in proportion to his age.

Any candidate rejected at the medical examination will, subject to the approval of the board, be finally excluded from the Royal Navy.

5. The candidate will be required to produce (1) a certificate of birth,* or declaration thereof made before a magistrate, (2) a

certificate of good conduct from the masters of the school or schools at which he may have been educated during the two previous years, or, if educated at home, from his tutors or the clergyman of the parish in which he resides; and (3) a certificate of good health.

6. The candidates will be required:—

Four-fourths of the marks assigned must be obtained in each subject—320 marks in the aggregate.

7. A candidate whose age does not exceed thirteen on the 15th July or 15th January (as the case may be), who may not be successful, will be allowed to present himself again at the next examination without undergoing a fresh medical examination, but no candidate will be allowed more than two trials. Candidates whose age exceeds thirteen on the 15th July or 15th January following the examination, will not be allowed a second trial.

8. Any candidate who fails to appear at the examination after he has obtained a nomination will not be allowed to present himself at any future examination without a fresh nomination, except in the case of illness, certified by a physician or surgeon, and approved by their Lordships, in which case the candidate will be allowed to present himself at the following examination, provided he is still within the limits of age; but under no circumstances will such a candidate be allowed to appear at more than one examination.

9. For all cadets entered under these regulations, the annual rate of payment will be at the rate of £70 per annum for the period in the "Britannia," to be paid half-yearly in advance to the Accountant-General of the Navy. But the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty reserve the power of selecting, from among the candidates nominated at each half-yearly examination, a number, not to exceed 10, being sons of officers of the Royal Navy, Army, or Marines, or of civil officers under the Board of Admiralty, with respect to whom the annual payment for the two years in the "Britannia" will be £40 only. In selecting these their Lordships will have regard solely to the pecuniary circumstances of the parents or guardians of the cadets.

No application for admission on such reduced scale will be entertained unless made before the candidate is nominated.

10. The period of training on board the "Britannia" will be, as now, four terms; there will be two terms in each year. The first term of each year will be from February to July, the second from August to December.

The vacations will be six weeks at Christmas, a week at Easter, and six weeks at midsummer.

11. There will be an examination at the end of each term.

12. Cadets who pass unsatisfactory examinations at the end of any term will be warned that they will be discharged at the end of the following term if they do not show sufficient improvement.

13. Any cadet who shall have been specially reported to their Lordships as for any reason unfit for the service will be removed from the Navy.

14. The parent or guardian of every cadet will be required to provide outfit as under the regulations in force hitherto, and to sign a declaration (on the admission of the cadet to the "Britannia") to the effect that he shall be immediately withdrawn on the receipt of an official intimation of his being considered unfit for the Royal Navy.

With a view to prevent parents and guardians from incurring the inconvenience and expense of preparing candidates for naval cadetships who may be physically unfit for Her Majesty's service, it is suggested that they submit the young gentlemen to examination by the medical adviser of the family, or any other qualified medical practitioner, to whom the following points may be submitted as those upon which they will, previous to their educational examination, be physically examined at the Admiralty.

It is to be understood that this private examination is merely suggested as a guide to parents and guardians, and to lessen the chances of disappointment, and that it is by no means intended to take the place of, or to influence in any way, the regular official physical examination.

1. A weak constitution arising from imperfect development, or weakness of the physical powers of the body, either hereditary or from chronic disease, wounds, or injuries.

2. Chronic eruptions on the skin or scalp.

3. Malformation of the head, with a dry, harsh, divergent state of the hair of the scalp, fracture or depression of the bones of the skull, disordered intellect, imbecility, epilepsy, paralysis, or impediment of speech.

4. Blindness or defective vision, as tested by Snellen's test types, in one or both eyes, fistula lachrymalis, and ptosis.

BYE-LAW No. XIII. OF THE MINING BOARD OF THE MINING DISTRICT OF BALLARAT.

AT a meeting of the Mining Board of the Mining District of Ballarat, begun and holden at Ballarat, in the said district, on the 9th day of March One thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, it is ordained as follows (that is to say):—

1. Whenever any water shall by means of any appliances for raising or lifting water erected on any land held under the provisions of the Mining Statute 1865 for the purpose of mining for gold, or any metal or mineral other than gold, be drawn not only from the land on which such appliances are erected as aforesaid but also from any other such land, the owners for the time being of such other land held as aforesaid (including in that term a mortgagee in possession) shall contribute towards the expense of such appliances and the working thereof, in proportion to the number of acres so held by them respectively, and such contribution shall be payable weekly to the proprietor or proprietors of such appliances so long as water continues to be so drawn from such other land; and the expense of such appliances shall be deemed to be Ten pounds per centum per annum upon the original cost thereof; and the said per centage, calculated per week, and the actual

weekly expense of working such appliances shall together constitute the total expense of such appliances and the working thereof within the meaning of sub-section XV. of section 71 of the said Statute. Provided always that the land held by the owners on which such appliances are erected shall also contribute to the expense of such appliances and the working thereof in like proportion as other owners of any such land as aforesaid are hereby required to do.

2. From and after the date on which this bye-law shall have the force of law throughout the Mining District of Ballarat, as provided in the Mining Statute 1865, section 72, the following bye-law, that is to say, the bye-law of the Mining Board of the Mining District of Ballarat numbered XII., published in the *Government Gazette* on the 10th day of July 1874, shall be and the same is hereby repealed, saving and excepting the rights of all persons thereunder existing and prior to and at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

No. 1 BYE-LAW.—MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

THE Council of the United Shire of Beechworth doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Local Governing Bodies Loan Act 1872, make the following Rate, from the date hereof, upon all lands and tenements within the Water Supply District of Beechworth, that is to say—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied, otherwise than by measure, for domestic purposes.

On every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds (£10) and under, Ten shillings per annum.

On every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds (£10), a rate of Five pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.

Water troughs will be charged for at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each.

Water for steam-boilers will be charged for at the rate of Fifteen shillings per horse-power per annum each.

For water supply by measure—except in cases of special agreement with the council—at the rate of Two shillings per thousand gallons.

The rates shall be paid in advance, by equal payments on the first day of January and the first day of July in each year. And for water supplied by measure, payments shall be made quarterly on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October in each year.

A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply for water-closets and baths exceeding one water-closet and one bath to each tenement or premises separately rated; or for any cattle, or for horses, or for any steam-engine, or for washing carriages, when such horses or carriages are kept for hire; or for the purpose of any trade, manufacture, or business whatever; or for watering gardens, or for fountains, or for any ornamental purpose.

The foregoing bye-law was agreed to by the Council of the United Shire of Beechworth at a special meeting held on Friday the seventh day of May A.D. 1875, and finally passed by the said Council at a special meeting held on Friday, fourth day of June A.D. 1875, and the common seal of the said Council hereunto affixed in the presence of

No. 2 BYE-LAW.—FOR REGULATING THE SUPPLY AND DISTRIBUTION OF WATER.

1st. Syphon-pumps will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure.

2nd. 3rd. All service-pipes, with the necessary stop and bib cocks, must be supplied and fixed at the cost of the person or persons requiring the same, under the direction and supervision of such officer or servant as the council may appoint.

4th. Any person desiring to affix any service-pipes to the main-pipe shall make application to the council, or to its officer or servant, by giving notice in writing three clear days before tapping the main-pipe.

5th. All pipes, bibs, and cocks, and attachments, must be first approved of by the shire engineer, or other officer or servant duly authorized in that behalf, before such pipes, bibs, or cocks are affixed to the main-pipe or service-pipe.

6th. The drawing bib, stop, and ball cocks must be of strong hard brass, sanctioned and approved from time to time by the shire engineer (and unless and until due notification to the contrary), the drawing-cocks must be of the best and most

approved kinds of those called screw-down cocks, high-pressure, and all exposed places to be opened and shut by a movable key or handle, protected by wooden or iron casing, at the discretion of the shire engineer. No other description of cocks shall be used without the written permission of the shire engineer first had and obtained.

7th. No pipes shall be affixed to the main-pipe or to any service-pipe or apparatus connected therewith, nor shall any alteration be made in any existing pipes or apparatus without notice in writing of such alteration being given to the council, and the consent of the council or duly authorized officer thereto first had and obtained.

8th. No person but the officer or servant of the council duly authorized in that behalf shall be allowed to shut off and turn on water in the main-pipes of the council when required for the purpose of affixing service-pipes thereto.

9th. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the council into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer or servant of the council that such service-pipe requires repairing, the council may stop the water from flowing into such premises, and if after the expiration of twelve hours from the time of receiving such notice such person has not repaired such service-pipe, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of his continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the council or its officer or servant.

10th. Any person supplied with water who shall wilfully and negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the council or its officer or servant.

11th. Any person damaging any stand-pipe or other portions of the water works of the council shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, without prejudice to the right of the council to recover damages from him in respect of any injury done to the property of the council.

12th. The water supplied in the above district shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the same regulations, and not otherwise.

13th. In the foregoing bye-law whenever the words "officer" or "servant" shall occur the same shall be deemed and taken to be any officer or servant of the council duly authorized in that behalf.
