WHEREAS by The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute 1864 amendment Actif was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon the application in writing of the council of any shire or road district, to broclaim any part of such shire or road district, to be defined by such council, and not being in or within one mile of any city or town, a part within which the licensing magistrates for such district might grant certificates for publicans' licenses as aforesaid, for which should be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds, and on the like application of the council of any borough not being within fifty miles of the city of Melbourne, the Governor in Council might, if he should think fit, proclaim any portion of such borough as a part within which the licensing magistrates for the district might grant certificates for such publicans' licenses, and for which license should be charged a like fee of Ten pounds, and the said Governor in Council might from time to time revoke any such proclamation, such revocation to take effect from the time of the expiration of the last issued license under such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the district hereinafter mentioned as a district within which Licensing Magistrates may grant Certificates for Publicans' Licenses for which shall be charged the annual License Fee of Ten pounds, that is to say:

#### QUARANTINE DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 64th section of The Scab Act 1870, the Governor in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Qarantine Districts hereinalter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter described shall be Quarantine Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

#### Pursuant to Orders of 28 December 1874

POSTLETHWAITE OF BAILESTON QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—
Commencing at the point where the southern boundary of the
Protectorate run abuts on the Goulburn River; thence by the
southern boundaries of that run and the Waranga run, the
south-eastern boundary of Colbinabbin South run, and by the
northern and eastern boundaries of Cherrington run to Compton's Creek run; thence by the northern boundary of that run
to the Goulburn River: and thence down that river to the to the Goulburn River; and thence down that river to the commencing point.

PROTECTORATE QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Protectorate run).—Commencing at the north-east angle of Waranga run; on the west by that run; on the south by Postlethwaite run on the east by the Goulburn River for about seven miles; thence by a line running north-west to the commencing point.

WARANGA QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the south-east corner of Toolamba run, on the Goulburn River; thence by the southern boundaries of that run and Wanalta East run to Gobareep run; thence by the eastern boundary of that run to Colbinabbin South run; thence by a portion of the northern and eastern boundaries of that run to Postlethwaite run; thence by the northern boundary of that run to the Goulburn River; and thence by that river to the point of commencement: Provided that the road from Corop to Rushworth and Whroe shall form no part of the said quarantine district.

Nominations for naval cadetships will take place half-yearly, immediately after the report of the last examination has been received.

An examination of the young gentlemen who have obtained nominations will be held at the Royal Naval College, Greenwich, under the direction of the Admiralty Examiners, on the third Wednesday in June and the last Wednesday in November in each year, but the appointments will date from the 15th July and January following respectively.

3. No candidate will be eligible for examination in June whose age will not be within the following limits on the 15th July following, viz., not less than twelve nor more than thirteen and a half years of age, nor in November whose age will not be within those limits on the 15th January following.

4. Every candidate will be required to pass the medical examination according to the prescribed regulations, and must have been found physically fit for the Royal Navy.

He must be in good health and free from any physical defect of body, impediment of speech, defect of sight or hearing, and also from any predisposition to constitutional or hereditary disease or weakness of any kind, and in all respects well developed and active in proportion to his age.

Any candidate rejected at the medical examination will, subject to the approval of the board, be finally excluded from the Royal Navy.

5. The candidate will be required to produce (1) a certificate of birth, or declaration thereof made before a magistrate, (2) a

Candidates whose age exceeds thirteen on the 15th July or 15th January following the examination, will not be allowed a second trial.

8. Any candidate who fails to appear at the examination after he has obtained a nomination will not be allowed to present himself at any future examination without a fresh nomination, except in the case of illness, certified by a physician or surgeon, and approved by their Lordships, in which case the candidate will be allowed to present himself at the following examination, provided he is still within the limits of age; but under no circumstances will such a candidate be allowed to appear at more than one examination.

9. For all cadets entered under these regulations, the annual rate of payment will be at the rate of £70 per annum for the period in the "Britannia" to be paid half-yearly in advance to the Accountant-feneral of the Navy. 1. The naval cadets who join the "Britannia" are allowed our terms—two in each year—to complete their course of ady; at the expiration of which they go up for final examination.

8. The cadets have a weekly, allowance, and all expenses attending their amusements are paid for by the ship. It is therefore requested that their friends do not give them any money except on joining, or on their return from the vacations, and then the amount must not exceed Ten shillings. It is particularly requested that this regulation be adhered to. Such money as may be required by a cadet for any special circumstances will be advanced by the paymaster under the authority of the captain of the "Britannia."

9. It is particularly requested that the cadets bring their linen clean, and clothes and boots in good order, when they join the ship, and also when they return from leave; and that the outfit, as required, be complete.

10. Cadets are not permitted to open an account with tradesmen. Parents and guardians are therefore requested to pay no bills that may be sent them.

11. Should there have been any infectious disease in the house where cadets have been staying during their holidays, notice of the circumstance is to be given to the commanding officer of H.M.S. "Britannia;" and they are not to join until they have received a communication from him to that effect.

12. All letters relative to the cadets should be addressed as follows:—"The Commanding Officer, 11.M.S. 'Britannia,' Dartmouth."

13. Should cadets bring valuable gold watches or chains with them to the training ship, they will be taken from them and placed in security, until they return to their homes. Silver watches will be allowed to be used.

14. Parents or guardians of cadets must, in all cases of permanent change of residence, communicate the same to the captain of the training ship, without delay.

A T a meeting of the Mining Board of the Mining District of Ballarat, begun and holden at Ballarat, in the said district, on the 9th day of March One thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, it is ordained as follows (that is to

nundred and seventy-five, it is organized as follows (that is to say):—

1. Whenever any water shall by means of any appliances for raising or lifting water erected on any land held under the provisions of the Mining Statute 1865 for the purpose of mining for gold, or any metal or mineral other than gold, be drawn not only from the land on which such appliances are erected as aforesaid but also from any other such land, the owners for the time being of such other land held as aforesaid (including in that term a mortgagee in possession) shall contribute towards the expense of such appliances and the working thereof, in proportion to the number of acres so held by them respectively, and such contribution shall be payable weekly to the proprietor or proprietors of such appliances so long as water continues to be so drawn from such other land; and the expense of such appliances shall be deemed to be Tenpounds per centum per annum upon the original cost thereof; and the said per centage, calculated per week, and the actual

weekly expense of, working such appliances; shall together constitute the total expense of such appliances and the working thereof within the meaning of sub-section XV. of section 71 of the said Statute. Provided always that the land held by the owners on which such appliances are erected shall also contribute to the expense of such appliances and the working thereof in like proportion as other owners of any such laud as aforesaid are hereby required to do.

2. From and after the date on which this bye-law shall have the force of law throughout the Mining. District of Ballarat, as provided in the Mining Statute 1865, section 72, the following bye-law, that is to say, the bye-law of the Mining Beard of the Mining District of Ballarat numbered XII, published in the Government Gazette on the 10th day of July 1874, shall be and the same is hereby repealed, saving and excepting the rights of all persons thereunder existing and prior to and at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied, otherwise than by measure, for domestic purposes.

On every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds (£10) and under, Ten shillings per annum.

On every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds (£10), a rate of Five pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.

Water troughs will be charged for at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum cach.

Water for steam-boilers will be charged for at the rate of Fifteen shillings per horse-power per annum each.

For water supply by measure—except in cases of agreement with the council—at the rate of Two shillings per thousand gallons.

The rates shall be paid in advance, by equal payments on the first day of January and the first day of July in each year. And for water supplied by measure, payments shall be made quarterly on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October in each year.

A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply for water-closets and baths exceeding one water-closet and one bath to cach tenement or premises separately rated; or for any cattle, or for horses, or for any steam-engine, or for washing carriages, when such horses or carriages are kept for hire; or for the purpose of any trade, manufacture, or for washing carriages, when such horses or carriages are kept for hire; or for the purpose of any trade, manufacture, or for any ornamental purpose.

No. 2 Bye-law.—For Regulating the Supply and Distribution of Water.

THE Council of the United Shire of Beechworth doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Local Governing Bodies Loan Act 1872, make the following bye-law for regulating the supply and distribution of water within the Water Supply District of Beechworth, that is to say—

1st. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be the quantity of which the charge at Two shillings per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate if supplied otherwise than by measure. Syphon-pumps will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure.

be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure.

2nd. Every person who shall have agreed with the council for a supply of water by measure shall, at his own expense, provide a meter and keep and maintain the same in good working condition, to the satisfaction of the council or such officer or servant as the council may appoint; and in the event of any repairs being required, notice in writing shall be immediately given by such person to such officer or servant, and a registration of the quantity of water used shall be taken before such repairs are effected. The key of all meters to be in the custody of the council, or any officer or servant whom they may appoint.

3rd. All service-pipes, with the necessary stop and bib cocks, must be supplied and fixed at the cost of the person or persons requiring the same, under the direction and supervision of such officer or servant as the council may appoint.

4th. Any person desiring to affix any service-pipes to the main-pipe shall make application to the council, or to its officer or servant, by giving notice in writing three clear days before tapping the main-pipe.

sth. All pipes, bibs, and cocks, and attachments, must be first approved of by the shire engineer, or other officer or servant duly authorized in that behalf, before such pipes, bibs, or cocks are affixed to the main-pipe or service-pipe.

6th. The drawing bib, stop, and ball cocks must be of strong hard brass, sanctioned and approved from time to time by the shire engineer (and unless and until due notification to the contrary), the drawing-cocks must be of the best and most

approved kinds of those called screw-down cocks, high-pressure, and all exposed places to be opened and shut by a novable key or handle, protected by wooden or iron casing, at the discretion of the shire engineer. No other description of cocks shall be used without the written permission of the shire engineer first had and obtained.

7th. No pipes shall be affixed to the main-pipe or to any service-pipe or apparatus connected therewith, nor shall any alteration be made in any existing pipes or apparatus without notice in writing of such alteration being given to the council, and the consent of the council or duly authorized officer thereto first had and obtained.

8th. No person but the officer or servant of the council duly authorized in that behalf shall be allowed to shut off and turn on water in the main-pipes of the council when required for the purpose of affixing service-pipes thereto.

the purpose of affixing service-pipes thereto.

9th. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the council into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer or servant of the council that such service-pipe requires repairing, the council may stop the water from flowing into such premises, and if after the expiration of twelve hours from the time of receiving such notice such person has not repaired such service-pipe, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Hive pounds; and in the event of his continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the council or its officer or servant.

10th. Any person supplied with water who shall wilfully and negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the council or its officer or servant.

11th. Any person damaging any stand-pipe or other portions of the water works of the council shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, without prejudice to the right of the council to recover damages from him in respect of any injury done to the property of the council.

12th. The water supplied in the above district shall be re-ceived and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the same regu-lations, and not otherwise.
