PREPARATION OF GENERAL ELECTORAL LISTS DURING THE WEEK ENDING THE FIRST DAY OF SEPTEMBER 1875.

SPECIAL NOTICE TO HOLDERS OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

IT is hereby notified that holders of electors' rights issued on or before the 1st September 1874 must obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the General Lists to be made up from and after the 1st September next.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new lists to be made up as aforesaid.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the registrar, but the renewed right will bear the same number, and be in the same form and tenor as that in lieu of which it is issued. It will be equally available for any election that may take place before the compilation of the new roll in October next.

No elector whose name is on a roll of ratepaying electors for any province or district is entitled to a renewed elector's right for such province or district (*vide* sects 61 and 62 of *The Electoral Act 1865*, and sec. 21 of Act No. 334).

QUARANTINE DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Governor in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Quarantine Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter described shall be Quarantine Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

Pursuant to Orders of 23 December 1874.

POSTLETHWAITE OR BAILLESTON QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the point where the southern boundary of the Protectorate run abuts on the Goulburn River; thence by the southern boundaries of that run and the Waranga run, the south-eastern boundary of Colbinabbin South run, and by the northern and eastern boundaries of Cherrington run to Compton's Creek run; thence by the northern boundary of that run to the Goulburn River; and thence down that river to the commencing point.

PROTECTORATE QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Protectorate run).—Commencing at the north-east angle of Waranga run; on the west by that run; on the south by Postlethwaite run on the east by the Goulburn River for about seven miles; thence by a line running north-west to the commencing point.

WARANGA QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the south-east corner of Toolamba run, on the Goulburn River; thence by the southern boundaries of that run and Wanaita East run to Gobareep run; thence by the eastern boundary of that run to Colbinabbin South run; thence by a portion of the northern and eastern boundaries of that run to Postlethwaite run; thence by the northern boundary of that run to the Goulburn River; and thence by that river to the point of commencement: Provided that the road from Corop to Rushworth and Whroo shall form no part of the said quarantine district.

Pursuant to Order of 12 April 1875.

MANSFIELD QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the source of the Howqua River in Mount Howitt; thence down that river to Tarika run; thence by the eastern boundary of that run to Jamieson River; thence down that river to Goulburn River; thence down that river to its junction with the Delatite River; thence up that river to Wappan run; thence by the southern boundary of that run north-westerly to the eastern boundary of Mount Pleasant B run; thence by that boundary south-easterly to the Maitongoon West B run; thence by that run easterly to the Delatite River; thence down that river and the Goulburn River to Balham Hill run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that run, Killingsworth, Murrindindi East, Island, and Muddy Creek A runs to the Main Dividing Range; and thence by that range easterly and northerly to the point of commencement: Provided always that the Upper Thornton run shall form no part of said quarantine district.

CLEAN DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 66th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Governor in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Clean Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter defined shall be Clean Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

Pursuant to Orders of 23 December 1874.

GEELONG CLEAN DISTRICT.—Commencing at Cape Otway; thence by a line bearing northerly to the south-east angle of the Forrest run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that and Pirron Yallock runs to the shore of Lake Corangamite; thence by the eastern boundary of that lake to the Junction Creek which forms the southern boundary of the Poliah run; thence by the said southern boundary and the north-eastern boundary of said run to the Frenchman's station; thence by the eastern boundaries of that and Glenfine runs, and by the northern boundary of the last-named run to the Nairnall run; thence by a portion of the eastern boundary of Nairnall run and the eastern boundary of Mount Bute run to the south-east corner of allotment 80 parish of Mannibadar; thence by a straight line easterly to the junction of a small creek with the River Leigh about twenty-six chains north of the Mount Mercer Cattle Station pre-emptive right; thence down the said River Leigh to the boundary of Golf Hill property easterly and southerly to the boundary of Native Creek property; thence southerly by the boundary of said property to the Burnside property; thence southerly and westerly by the boundaries of Barwon Park, Murdiduke, Ingelby, and Yan-yan Gurt properties to the west corner of allotment 20 A, parish of Bamba; thence southerly by the surveyed road to Loutitt Bay, and thence south-westerly by the sea shore to the point of commencement.

GIPPSLAND CLEAN DISTRICT.—Commencing at the point on the sea-coast where the eastern boundary of the county of Mornington abuts thereon; thence northerly by the said boundary to the Powlett West A run; thence by that run to Mountain Glen run; thence northerly, easterly and northerly by that run to the Moe; thence across the Moe to the eastern boundary of Tanjil Hills run; thence by that boundary to the north-eastern corner thereof; thence by a straight line to Mount Haw-baw; thence by the south-eastern and eastern boundaries of Mount Useful run to the Main Dividing Range; thence by that range to Mount Hotham; thence north-easterly by the watershed between the head waters of the Little River and the head waters of the

Cobungra and Bundarah creeks to Mount Cope; thence northerly by the watershed between the head waters of the Little River and the head waters of the Big River to Mount Nelson, Bogong; thence south-easterly by a range dividing between the waters of the Big River and the heads of Snowy Creek to Mount Wills; thence easterly by Wombat Creek, being the south boundary of Mount Martin run, to its junction with the Mitta-mitta River; thence north-easterly by the south-east boundary of the Gibbo run to the south-east corner of said run; thence by the north-east boundary of said run to the north-west corner of Buemba run; thence easterly by the northern boundary of Buemba run to the trigonometrical station on Mount Gibbo; thence by a straight line to the north-west corner of the Tom Groggin run, as gazetted in *Government Gazette* of 16th February 1872; thence by the north boundary of said run to the Indi River; thence up the Indi and Upper Indi River, being the boundary between the colonies of Victoria and New South Wales, to Forest Hill; thence south-easterly by the boundary-line between said colonies to Cape Howe; and thence south-westerly by the sea-coast to the point of commencement.

KILMORCLEAN DISTRICT.—Commencing at the north-east angle of the Wharparilla run, being a point on the Murray River; thence by the eastern and southern boundaries of the said run to the Campaspe River; thence up that river to the Campaspe River run; thence by the northern, western, and a portion of the southern boundaries of that run to the Muskerry run; thence by the northern boundaries of Muskerry and Mount Pleasant runs to Colbinabbin run; thence by the western and northern boundaries of that run to Gobareep run; thence by the northern boundary of that run to Waranga run; thence by the northern boundaries of that run and Protectorate Station to the Goulburn River; thence down that river to the Murray River aforesaid; and thence down that river to the commencing point.

SANDHURST CLEAN DISTRICT.—Commencing at the point on the Murray River where the eastern boundary of the Murrabit run abuts thereon; thence by the said boundary of that run and the eastern and southern boundaries of the Reedy Lake run to Quambatook East run; thence by the northern boundary of that run and by the northern, western, and southern boundaries of the Quambatook West run to the Avoca River; thence up that river to the Spring Bank West run; thence by the northern boundary of that run and the western boundaries of that run and of the Coonover A and Yawong Springs runs; also by the southern boundary of the last-named run to the Spring Hill run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to the Brenanah run; thence by the western and north-western boundaries of that run to Powlett Plains run; thence by the southern boundaries of that and Salisbury Plains runs to the Bullock Creek Plains run; thence by the western southern, and portion of the eastern boundaries of that run to the south-west corner of Yarraberb run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to Campaspe River run; thence by the western and portion of the northern boundaries of that run to the Campaspe River; thence down that river to its junction with the Murray River; and thence down that river to the point of commencement: Provided that the following Quarantine Districts, viz.: the Brenanah Quarantine District, and Powlett's Plains Quarantine District, the farms of Clance, and Mackin now in quarantine, shall form no part of this Clean District: Provided further that the whole of the Warparilla run shall belong to this Clean District.

Pursuant to Order of 18 January 1875.

BALLARAT CLEAN DISTRICT.—(being the late Ballarat Clean Districts No. 1 and 2 amalgamated).—Commencing on the Werribee River where it is intersected by the eastern boundary of the town of Ballan; thence by the east, west, and north boundaries of that town bearing respectively north, west, and south to the before-mentioned river; thence up that river to its source in the Main Dividing Range; thence by that range bearing south-westerly to the Peerwerri run; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of that run to the Warren-heip run; thence by the north-eastern boundaries of that and Wyndham runs to the Dowling Forest run; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of that run to Burrumbeet run; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries thereof to Langi Kalkal run; thence by the northern boundaries of that and Euranbeem runs to the above-mentioned dividing range; thence by that range to the northern boundary of the United Ararat and Burrumbeep Goldfields and Farmers' Common; thence westerly by that common to the Armstrong Common; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of that common to the Black range; thence southerly by that range to the Ararat Common; thence by the west boundary of the Ararat Common to the boundary of the Lexington run; thence by the eastern and southern boundaries of that run to Barton run; thence by the eastern, southern, and portion of western boundaries thereof to Mount Birchett run; thence by the eastern, southern, and western boundaries thereof to La Rose, Mokepile, and Lexington run; thence by the western boundary of that run to Woorook run thence by the southern boundaries of that run, Rosebrook, and Brim Spring runs to Glenisla run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that run and Markanger run to the Plains run; thence by the north-eastern boundaries of that run, Mount Sturgeon Plains North, and Mount Sturgeon Plains run to Linlithgow Plains run; thence by the northern boundaries of that run, Burrit-burrit, and Glenronald runs to Greenvale run; thence by the southern and eastern boundaries of that run to the Lake Manonia run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to View Lake run; thence by the western and southern boundaries of that run and the southern boundaries of Fiery Creek and St. Enoch's runs to

the Benjamie run; thence by the south-western and south-eastern boundaries thereof to the Mount Emu run; thence by the southern boundaries of that and Carnham, Nuntingbool, Bantshaw, Warrenheip, Peerwerth, Borambeeta, Hunterston, and Ballan runs to the southern boundary of the before-named town of Ballan; and thence by the southern and eastern boundaries thereof to the commencing point.

Pursuant to Order of 15 March 1875.

CASTLEMAINE CLEAN DISTRICT No. 2.—Commencing at the north-western corner of Avoca Forest run; thence by the western and southern boundaries of that run to the Avoca River aforesaid; thence again up the Avoca River to the Amphitheatre run; thence by the north-western and western boundaries of that run to the Langi-Kalkal run; thence by the northern boundary of that run to the Burrumbet run; thence by the northern and eastern boundaries of that run to the Dowling Forest run; thence by the northern and eastern boundaries of that run to Wyndham run; thence by the north-eastern boundaries of that and Warrenheip runs and the north-western and eastern boundaries of the Peerwerth run to the Main Dividing Range; thence by that range to the western boundary of the Pannu-Banwar run; thence by the said boundary and the northern boundary of that run to the before-mentioned range; thence again by that range to the source of the Campaspe River; thence down the river to the Langworn run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to the Coliban River; thence down that river to the Campaspe River aforesaid; thence again by that river to the south-east angle of the Axedale township reserve; thence westerly and northerly to the south-west and north-west angles respectively of the said township; thence by the Axedale and Sandhurst road to its intersection with the eastern boundary of the borough of Sandhurst; thence southerly, south-westerly, and westerly to the south-west angle of said boundary; thence by a line westerly sixty chains to the west boundary of the parish of Sandhurst; thence northerly three miles to the south-east corner of the parish of Nerring; thence westerly by the south boundary of that parish and a line to the north-west angle of the township of Marong; thence by the Inglewood and Weidern road westerly and north-westerly to the River Loddon at the township of Bridge-water; thence by that road to the western boundary of Catto's run; thence by the western boundary of that run to the south-west corner of the Powlett's Plains run; thence by the southern boundaries of that and the Brennah runs to Coyurn Springs run; thence by the southern and western boundaries of that run to Spring Hill run; thence by a portion of the western boundary of that run to Yawong Springs run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to the Strathfillan run, being the point of commencement.

Pursuant to Order of 12 April 1875.

Four deaths from typhoid fever are reported, viz.:—1 from Collingwood, 2 from the Melbourne Hospital, and 1 from Richmond. WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to and increase the respective Commons herein-mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

BRANXHOLME TOWN COMMON.—The Branxholme Town Common proclaimed by Order of the 15th October 1866 is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands comprised within the boundaries of the Town of Branxholme, as shown upon the plans deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(74N.2783.)

TOWNS OF PELLUEBLA.—County of Moira, parish of Pelluebla: Commencing at a point bearing north one chain from the north-west angle of James Goudie's 10th section block No. 704, bounded thence by a road bearing north twenty chains; thence by lines bearing respectively east fifty chains, north twenty chains, and west fifty chains; thence by a road bearing north twenty chains; thence by a line bearing east one hundred and two chains; thence by the parish boundary bearing south sixty chains; and thence by a road bearing west one hundred and two chains to the point of commencement. The bearings are from the true meridian.—(L.P.591.) (75.U.2159.)

PART II. OF "THE PUBLIC HEALTH AMENDING STATUTE 1867" EXTENDED TO GEELONG WEST.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir WILLIAM FOSTER STAWELL, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Colony of Victoria, and the Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-first year of Her present Majesty's reign, intitled *An Act to amend the Laws relating to or affecting Public Health* (31 Vict. No. 310), it was amongst other things enacted, that Part II. of the said Act should apply to all places where the Part of the Act thereby repealed, or any portion thereof had been in force, and all or some of the provisions of Part II. aforesaid should also apply to every such city, town, borough, shire, district, or place in Victoria as the Governor in Council should by Proclamation direct; and the Governor in Council might at any time, and from time to time, alter, repeal, or revoke any such Proclamation theretofore or thereafter made: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation, direct that all the provisions of Part II. of the above recited Act, 31 Vict. No. 310, shall apply to the borough hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—
