Thirty-one, or 37% per cent., of the total deaths were of children not exceeding the age of three years, twenty being under the age of one year. Scarlatina and scarlet fever are reported as being prevalent at Brunswick. The other districts are healthy. There was one death from typhoid fever at Frabran. At South Melbourne ten of the deaths occurred in charitable institutions, and in Prahran two occurred in the hospital.
