CASTLEMAINE PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

In pursuance of the powers vested in them, the Trustees of the Castlemaine General Cemetery rescind the Rules and Regulations published in the Government Gazette of the 1st day of November 1859, and make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say :-

- 1. That all fees and charges shall be paid when applications
- 2. That any person desiring ground for a private grave or a vault, tomb, monument, cenotaph, tombstone, or for any other purpose in the cemetery under the above Act, shall apply to the secretary, and if approved, the trustees, on the payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying a certificate of right of burial in the form specified in schedule A.
- 3. That any person desiring to construct a brick grave, vault, or tomb, or to erect a monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection in any part of the cemetery, shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a plan, design, or drawing of such, with full particulars, for approval.
- 4. That any order for interment shall be given at the cemetery eight working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made if required. No free interment shall be allowed without said notice.
- 5. That the name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death of the deceased, and other particulars mentioned in schedule C, shall be furnished at the time of giving the order.
- 6. That the trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same, under directions of the secretary, on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate or iron

therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a stap of stone, slate or iron.

7. That every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than three feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the ground, after such interment.

8. That no interment shall be permitted in any private grave or vault, without the production of the certificate of right of burial, or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except as provided for in the next rule.

9. That in the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault, to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given in with the order.

10. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in said cemetery without a certificate from a deputy-registrar of deaths, or a coroner. Such certificate shall be delivered to the secretary before the funeral enters the cemetery.

11. That the hours fixed for burials shall be as follows:—
On week days—September to April inclusive, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; May to August inclusive, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. On Sundays—throughout the year from 2 to 5 p.m.

12. That no burial shall be allowed to take place between the hours of 7 p.m. and 7 a.m. except by special permission of the trustees.

13. That the time fixed for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.

14. No bath, each, or other soft stone shall be allowed to be used in any work. All stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be removed at once. Copper cramps only shall be allowed in the erection of tablets or other exposed stone work.

 19. That all materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery, and shall be admitted only at the principal entrance.

20. That catacombs shall be allowed.

21. That no wooden crection shall be allowed.

22. That the trustees shall not (unless in very exceptional cases) permit the removal of any corps from any grave for reinterment either in said or any other cemetery.

- 23. That before any such exceptional case shall be dealt with by the trustees a written application setting forth the reasons for the proposed removal and verified by statutory declaration shall be produced by the nearest available representatative of the deceased, and in the event of such application being granted, the permission of the Minister administering the Coroners' Statute 1865, and the Act numbered 338, in addition to that of the trustees, shall be obtained. If found necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a secend and airtight coffin, prior to removal.

 24. That any workman not employed by the trustees shall
- 24. That any workman not employed by the trustees shall be under the supervision and control of the secretary, who shall have power to regulate his hours of labour, to see that his work is completed satisfactorily and with despatch, and to remove him summarily from the cemetery upon any cause of
- 25. That, unless otherwise ordered, the principal entrance shall be open daily from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. during the other months of the year.
- 26. That no child under 10 years shall be admitted into the cemetery, except in charge of a responsible person.

 27. That no smoking shall be allowed within the cemetery, nor any fireworks discharged therein.
- 28. That no dogs shall be admitted into the cemetery.
- 29. That no ogs suan oe admitted into the cemetery.

 29. That any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any crection, or otherwise infringing the above Act, or any rule, regulation, or bye-law made for protecting the cemetery, shall be prosecuted as the law directs.

30. That no person shall be allowed to take any flower or plant out of the cemetery.

31. That the secretary shall exercise a general supervision and control, under the trustees, over all matters pertaining to the converter.

32. That the gates of the cemetery will be closed when a crowd of the general public is expected to be present at the burial, at least one hour before the time fixed for such burial, and no persons without permission of the sexton or other person in charge of the gates, excepting those attending the funeral, will be then permitted to enter.

33. That no children, except those in charge of parents or responsible guardians, will be permitted to enter the cemetery at any time.
