PREPARATION OF GENERAL ELECTORAL LISTS DURING THE WEEK ENDING THE FIRST DAY OF SEPTEMBER 1875.

SPECIAL NOTICE TO HOLDERS OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

IT is hereby notified that holders of electors' rights issued on or before the 1st September 1874 must obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the General Lists to be made up from and after the 1st September next.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new lists to be made up as aforesaid.

Scarlatina is reported as prevalent at Brunswick. The other districts are healthy. One death from typhoid fever occurred at North Fitzroy. Of the total deaths recorded, 24 or 24½ per cent. were children not exceeding three years of age, seventeen of them being under the age of one year. The three deaths at Kew occurred at the Lunatic Asylum, and thirteen at South Melbourne and two at Prahran occurred in the hospitals.

QUARANTINE DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Governor in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Quarantine Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter described shall be Quarantine Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

Pursuant to Order of 12 April 1875.

MANSFIELD QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the source of the Howqua River in Mount Howitt; thence down that river to Tarika run; thence by the eastern boundary of that run to Jamieson River; thence down that river to Goulburn River; thence down that river to Wappan run; thence by the southern boundary of that run north-westerly to the eastern boundary of Mount Pleasant B run; thence by that boundary south-easterly to the Maitongoon West B run; thence by that run easterly to the Delatite River; thence down that river and the Goulburn River to Balham Hill run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that run, Killingworth, Murrindindi East, Island, and Muddy Creek A runs to the Main Dividing Range; and thence by that range easterly and northerly to the point of commencement: Provided always that the Upper Thornton run shall form no part of said quarantine district.

CLEAN DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 66th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Governor in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Clean Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter defined shall be Clean Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

Pursuant to Orders of 23 December 1874.

GEE LONG CLEAN DISTRICT.—Commencing at Cape Otway; thence by a line bearing northerly to the south-east angle of the Forrest run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that and Pirron Yallock runs to the shore of Lake Corangamite; thence by the eastern boundary of that lake to the Junction Creek which forms the southern boundary of the Poliah run; thence by the said southern boundary and the north-eastern boundary of said run to the Frenchman's station; thence by the eastern boundaries of that and Glenfine runs, and by the northern boundary of the last-named run to the Nairngal run; thence by a portion of the eastern boundary of Nairngal run and the eastern boundary of Mount Bute run to the south-east corner of allotment 80 parish of Mannibadar; thence by a straight line easterly to the junction of a small creek with the River Leigh about twenty-six chains north of the Mount Mercer Cattle Station pre-emptive right; thence down the said River Leigh to the boundary of Golf Hill property easterly and southerly to the boundary of Native Creek property; thence southerly by the boundary of said property to the Burnsides property; thence southerly and westerly by the boundaries of Barwon Park, Murdiduke, Ingelby, and Yan-yan Gurt properties to the west corner of allotment 20 A, parish of Bamba; thence southerly by the surveyed road to Loutitt Bay, and thence south-westerly by the sea shore to the point of commencement.

CASTLEMAINE PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

In pursuance of the powers vested in them, the Trustees of the Castlemaine General Cemetery rescind the Rules and Regulations published in the *Government Gazette* of the 1st day of November 1859, and make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

1. That all fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.
2. That any person desiring ground for a private grave or a vault, tomb, monument, cenotaph, tombstone, or for any other purpose in the cemetery under the above Act, shall apply to the secretary, and if approved, the trustees, on the payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying a certificate of right of burial in the form specified in schedule A.
3. That any person desiring to construct a brick grave, vault, or tomb, or to erect a monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection in any part of the cemetery, shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a plan, design, or drawing of such, with full particulars, for approval.
4. That any order for interment shall be given at the cemetery eight working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made if required. No free interment shall be allowed without said notice.
5. That the name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death of the deceased, and other particulars mentioned in schedule C, shall be furnished at the time of giving the order.
6. That the trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same, under directions of the secretary, on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate or iron.
7. That every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than three feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the ground, after such interment.
8. That no interment shall be permitted in any private grave or vault, without the production of the certificate of right of burial, or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except as provided for in the next rule.
9. That in the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault, to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given in with the order.
10. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in said cemetery without a certificate from a deputy-registrar of deaths, or a coroner. Such certificate shall be delivered to the secretary before the funeral enters the cemetery.
11. That the hours fixed for burials shall be as follows:— On week days—September to April inclusive, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; May to August inclusive, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. On Sundays—throughout the year from 2 to 5 p.m.
12. That no burial shall be allowed to take place between the hours of 7 p.m. and 7 a.m. except by special permission of the trustees.
13. That the time fixed for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.
14. That the trustees may permit any poor person to be buried in the cemetery without fee or charge, on the certificate of a minister of religion, or a statutory declaration proving to the satisfaction of the trustees, that such person was a pauper, and that the relatives and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the usual fee or charge; any such person will not be allowed to select ground, but will have to bury in ground set apart by the trustees; also, any such person bringing a "mounted" or otherwise ornamented coffin, hearse, or mourning coach will not be allowed the above privilege, but will have to pay the usual fees, such person not being deemed a pauper, according to the terms of the 4th regulation.
15. That every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner.
16. That any person desiring to place any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a copy thereof.
17. That any person putting up any erection, or placing any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery without the permission of the trustees shall be liable to the penalties imposed by the above Act for so doing, and to be further dealt with as a trespasser.
18. That every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations (extending to the bottom of the grave when ordered). No bath, caen, or other soft stone shall be allowed to be used in any work. All stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be removed at once. Copper cramps only shall be allowed in the erection of tablets or other exposed stone work.
19. That all materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery, and shall be admitted only at the principal entrance.
20. That catacombs shall be allowed.
21. That no wooden erection shall be allowed.
22. That the trustees shall not (unless in very exceptional cases) permit the removal of any corps from any grave for reinterment either in said or any other cemetery.

23. That before any such exceptional case shall be dealt with by the trustees a written application setting forth the reasons for the proposed removal and verified by statutory declaration shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased, and in the event of such application being granted, the permission of the Minister administering the *Coroners' Statute* 1865, and the Act numbered 338, in addition to that of the trustees, shall be obtained. If found necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second and airtight coffin, prior to removal.

24. That any workman not employed by the trustees shall be under the supervision and control of the secretary, who shall have power to regulate his hours of labour, to see that his work is completed satisfactorily and with despatch, and to remove him summarily from the cemetery upon any cause of offence.

25. That, unless otherwise ordered, the principal entrance shall be open daily from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. during the other months of the year.

26. That no child under 10 years shall be admitted into the cemetery, except in charge of a responsible person.

27. That no smoking shall be allowed within the cemetery, nor any fireworks discharged therein.

28. That no dogs shall be admitted into the cemetery.

29. That any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, or otherwise infringing the above Act, or any rule, regulation, or bye-law made for protecting the cemetery, shall be prosecuted as the law direct.

30. That no person shall be allowed to take any flower or plant out of the cemetery.

31. That the secretary shall exercise a general supervision and control, under the trustees, over all matters pertaining to the cemetery.

32. That the gates of the cemetery will be closed when a crowd of the general public is expected to be present at the burial, at least one hour before the time fixed for such burial, and no persons without permission of the sexton or other person in charge of the gates, excepting those attending the funeral, will be then permitted to enter.

33. That no children, except those in charge of parents or responsible guardians, will be permitted to enter the cemetery at any time.

34. That a book for recording complaints and suggestions from the public is kept by the resident clerk at the cemetery.

35. That a plan of the cemetery showing the distribution of the land, compartments, situations and numbers of the graves, and a registry of all certificates of right of burial shall be kept at the office.

Fourth, that the said _____ and his representatives shall in the use of the said piece of ground, and access thereto, be subject in every respect to such rules, regulations, and bye-laws as the trustees of the said cemetery may from time to time make; and shall not be entitled to exercise the right to bury or inter therein, except on payment of such charges as shall from time to time be established by the said trustees.
