The correct position of Masthead Island and the detached Reef has been ascertained by Staff Commander Bedwell, R.N., the Admiralty Surveyor, to be three miles west by south from that assigned to it upon the present charts; thus narrowing the channel between Cape Capricorn and the detached Reef by that distance.

#### NOTICE TO MARINERS.—RECHERCHE ARCHIPELAGO.

THE accompanying extract from a letter received from Captain A. E. B. Brown, of the barque Albyn's Isle, is published for general information.

PETER LALOR, Commissioner of Trade and Customs.

Department of Trade and Customs, Melbourne, 11th August 1875.

"On my last voyage to Western Australia, whilst passing north of Termination Island (Recherche Archipelago) I found a reef about fitty (50) yards east and west, about four (4) feet above water, and bearing about N.E. by E. from the island three (8) miles, with (apparently) a good clear passage between. This reef is not laid down on the Admiralty charts in my possession. I may also mention that several reefs seen breaking to the northward while passing Termination Island, although laid down on Flinders' chart, are very much out of position.

"I had a current of from 1½ to 2½ knots to the northward and eastward from the time of leaving the island till abreast of King George's Sound, in the latter part of the month of April."

#### HORSES FOR THE BENGAL ARMY.

THE subjoined notice, regarding the purchase of re-mounts required for the Bengal army, is published at the instance of the Government of India.

Ir is hereby notified with reference to the advertisement of the 8th June 1874,\* that the Government of India are prepared to purchase 1000 horses, suitable for army purposes, during the year 1875-76.

The purchases will bemade by re-mount agents or com-dee. mittees as in previous years at the stations named in the

Agra. | Junualis. | Peshawur. at the stations named in the margin.

The purchases will, except under any special circumstances, be made only between the 1st October and 1st April.

The requirements of 1876-77 will be 600 horses, more or less. Horses and mares of all breeds will be received, and they must be within the prescribed age—four to seven years.

The average price for a remount has been fixed at Rs. 550. Every horse presented for purchase will be valued separately, and higher or lower prices may be given, provided that the average of the purchases does not exceed that limit.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1874, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Hawthorn order as follows:—

If any cattle shall be found upon any land not being a common, and such that there is no fence, whether upon the same land or any other dividing such first-mentioned land from any street or road, whether public or private, without any person having charge of such cattle, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit a sum not exceeding twenty shillings for every head of such cattle, and the proper officer of the council may seize such cattle and place the same at some neighboring place of safe custody; and any justice, if such owner be not known, upon proof of the issue of a summons in the usual form addressed to such owner as "owner" only, without otherwise naming or describing him, such cattle and place of seizure being duly described therein, and of the publication of such summons in some newspaper commonly circulating in the neighborhood, may, after the expiration of twenty-four hours from such publication, proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons stating his name had been effected, or if such owner appear then as in other cases; and the justice may order the cattle to be sold, and the moncy arising from the sale, after deducting the said penalty and the costs awarded and the reasonable expenses, to be estimated and assessed by the justice, of seizing, keeping, and selling the said cattle, shall be paid if demanded within one month to the owner of the cattle, and if

not so demanded then to the municipal fund; and if the said money shall not be sufficient for all the purposes aforesaid the amount whereby the same falls short, or, if no such sale be ordered, the whole of the said amount may be recovered from the said owner if and when known in like manner as other penalties and sums adjudged or ordered to be paid by justices was to be recovered. are to be recovered.

If any cattle be at any time found in any street without any person having the charge thereof, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit for every head of such cattle a sum not exceeding twenty shillings, and if such shall, by reason of having been so found at large, have been impounded by the council, the amount of such penalty and costs, if adjudged respectively before the release or sale of such cattle, shall be added to the pound fees and charges payable in respect of such cattle, the amount thereof, or such lesser amount (if any) as after the sale of the cattle may remain in the hands of the poundkeeper, shall be paid over by him accordingly; and if the proceeds of any sale of such cattle shall not be sufficient, after paying the lawful fees and charges aforesaid, to satisfy such penalty and costs, or if such penalty and costs shall have been adjudged after the release or sale of the cattle, the same or so much thereof as remains unpaid shall and may be recovered from the owner of the cattle in like manner as other penalties and costs adjudged by justices are by law to be recovered; and if in the case of any information under this section the owner be not known, then the provisions of the last preceding section, so far as necessary to give the adjudicating justice jurisdiction, shall apply.

If any cost shall have been impounded under the provisions

It shall be lawful for the council to make regulations from time to time for appointing the hours during which it shall not be lawful to drive into or through the municipal district, or such parts thereof as shall by boundaries be set forth in such regulation, any cattle intended for sale, slaughter, or shipment, or travelling from one part of Victoria, or of any other colony to any other part, and to provide, if they shall see fit, in such regulations separately with respect to Sundays and week days; and if any person shall drive any such cattle contarry to such regulation he shall forfeit for every head of cattle so driven a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings: Provided that nothing herein contained shall apply to horses driven in harness or to oxen in the yoke.
