Of the total deaths, 19 or 26 per cent. were children not exceeding the age of 3 years, 12 being under the age of one year. Two cases of scarlet fever are reported from Collingwood, and bronchitis as being prevalent at Prahran. In other respects the districts are healthy. The death at Kew occurred in the Lunatic Asylum, and 15 of the south Melbourne deaths in public institutions. Three of the deaths at North Melbourne were of persons, aged 72, 58, and 101, who died in the Benevolent Asylum.

The births of 718 children, viz., 362 boys and 356 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of July. In the month of June 739 births were registered, or 21 more than in the month under review.

The deaths in July numbered 373, viz., 205 of males and 168 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 345. The deaths exceeded those in June by 16, and were also in excess of the average of June during the previous ten years by 69. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, the mortality will be found to have been about equal to the average of those ten years.

The highest temperature in the shade, recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 66.1° on the 14th and the lowest was 31.1° on the 8th. The mean temperature of the month (46.3°) was fully a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (25.1°) took place on the 12th, viz., from a maximum of 60.2° to a minimum of 35.1°. The least range (9.0°) was on the 29th, viz., from a maximum of 54.2° to a minimum of 45.2°. The mean daily range was 16.4°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.128 inches) was about a tenth of an inch above the average.

Males and females died during the month in the proportion of 55 and 45 per cent. respectively. Children under the age of 5 years contributed 29 per cent. to the mortality, as against 38 per cent. in July 1874; 36 per cent. in July 1873 and July 1872; 34 per cent. in July 1871; 39 per cent. in July 1870; 37 per cent. July 1869; 44 per cent. in July 1868 and July 1867; 40 per cent. in July 1866; and 44 per cent. in July 1865.

The deaths of persons of the age of 75 years or upwards, which occurred during the month, numbered 19, viz.:—Those of a female aged 75, who was accidentally burnt to death in bed; a female inmate of the Kew Lunatic Asylum aged 79, who died of brain disease; a grocer aged 80, who was accidentally drowned whilst taking a warm bath; a female inmate of the Benevolent Asylum aged 80, who died of valvular disease of the heart; a farmer aged 81, who died of pleurisy; a baker aged 81, who died of paralysis; a female storekeeper aged 81, who died of apoplexy; a draper aged 84, who died of bronchitis; a female aged 94, who died of strangulated hernia; a laborer, a mariner, and a female all aged 75, a female aged 76, a gardener aged 79, two females aged 80 and 89 respectively, two farmers aged 83 and 85, and a carpenter aged 89, who died of old age.

Twenty-one deaths resulted during the month from external causes, of which twenty were set down as accidental and the remaining one as suicidal. The particulars are as follow:—A newly-born female infant died of extravasation of blood on the brain, caused by external violence; a boy, aged 7, died of injury to the spine, caused by a boat falling on him; a boy, aged 10, died of fracture of the skull, caused by a load of wood—the supports of which had been removed in play by another boy—falling on him; a coachbuilder, aged 43, died of compression of the brain, caused by a fall from a cart; a boy, aged 6, received fatal injuries by being passed over by a waggon; a gasfitter, aged 42, was killed by an explosion of gas at the Theatre Royal; a glue-manufacturer, aged 47, died of the effects of being knocked down by an engine, whilst trespassing on the railway line; a female child, aged 18 months, and a male child, aged 15 months, died of scalds; a woman, aged 75, was burnt to death in bed; a female, aged 58, died of suffocation, her bed having accidentally caught fire; five persons were accidentally drowned, viz., three male children, aged respectively 1½, 6, and 9, a quarryman, aged 47, and a grocer, aged 80—the last whilst taking a warm bath; three infants, aged 17 days, 1 month, and 3 months respectively, were suffocated in bed; a boy, aged 5, was choked by a fish-bone; and a laborer, aged 26, was found drowned—the opinion of the jury being that he committed suicide whilst of unsound mind.

Ninety-one deaths, or 24 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—35 in the Melbourne Hospital; 5 in the Immigrants' Home; 9 in the Alfred Hospital; 1 in the Lying-in-Hospital; 19 in the Benevolent Asylum; 9 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum; 12 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum; and 1 in the Pentridge Stockade.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 109, of which 57, or 52 per cent., were of males; and 52, or 48 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 69 were under one year of age, 20 were between one and two, 12 were between two and three, 4 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 264. Of these, 148, or 56 per cent., were males, and 116, or 44 per cent., were females; 19 were between five and ten, 14 were between ten and fifteen, 10 were between fifteen and twenty, 13 were between twenty and twenty-five, 11 were between twenty-five and thirty, 21 were between thirty and thirty-five, 14 were between thirty-five and forty, 30 were between forty and forty-five, 26 were between forty-five and fifty, 21 were between fifty and fifty-five, 22 were between fifty-five and sixty, 10 were between sixty and sixty-five, 24 were between sixty-five and seventy, 10 were between seventy and seventy-five, 7 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 12 were upwards of eighty.

By far the largest number of deaths were caused by local diseases, especially those of the nervous and respiratory systems. Deaths from zymotic diseases were fewer than they have been for many months past. Measles caused 6 deaths, making in all 725 in Melbourne and suburbs since the first outbreak of the epidemic. Childbirth and metria caused 7 deaths, making 49 since the commencement of the year, as against 4,925 births registered, or about one death of a mother to every 100 births. Phthisis caused 50 deaths in July, as against 52 in June, and 48 in May.

Wool will not be received at Country Stations for shipment at Williams-town, unless the name of the vessel it is intended for be given on the Consignment Note.

WILLIAMSTOWN LINE.

2. Wharfage rate on wool for shipment arriving by lighters or other craft from any place on the shores of the bay or Yarra 6d. per bale.
3. For the carriage of wool from the pier to the dumping sheds and back to the ship, if the wool is subject to wharfage as above 2d. per bale.
4. For the carriage of wool from the pier to the dumping sheds and back to the ship, if free of wharfage 4d. per bale.
5. For the carriage of dumped wool from the dumping sheds to the ship 1d. per bale.

* NOTE.—This rate is net cash without discount. Vessels loading will be required to take wool or other cargo from trucks in preference to lighters or other craft. If from delay in this respect, or from any cause not due to the department, the vessel is not ready to receive wool or general cargo within twenty-four hours after the arrival of the trucks, demurrage will be strictly enforced at the rate of 10s. per truck per diem until the trucks are unloaded by the consignee, or until the department, at the cost and risk of the consignee, unloads the trucks and sends the goods to store. Wool consigned for shipment, and requiring to be dumped, will be deliverable at the dumping sheds, where a receipt must be given on behalf of the ship.

All bales of wool carried on the above lines weighing over 4 cwt. each will be charged at rate and a half.

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

Twenty-four hours will be allowed for the removal of wool after arrival of the trucks. From that time storage will be charged, and strictly enforced, at the rate of One penny per bale per diem until the wool is removed by the consignee, or sent to store by the department at the consignee's cost and risk. All wool is carried at owner's risk as to condition, and will be signed for accordingly. If detailed weight lists are furnished by the department for the use of the consignees, the charge for weighing will be Fourpence per bale; if weighed by the owners, One penny per bale will be charged for the use of the scales. Consignors requiring weight lists must pay for same at sending station.

All previous wool rates are now cancelled.

MANSFIELD QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the source of the Howqua River in Mount Howitt; thence down that river to Tarika run; thence by the eastern boundary of that run to Jamieson River; thence down that river to Goulburn River; thence down that river to its junction with the Delatite River; thence up that river to Wapian run; thence by the southern boundary of that run north-westerly to the eastern boundary of Mount Pleasant B run; thence by that boundary south-easterly to the Maitongoon West B run; thence by that run easterly to the Delatite River; thence down that river and the Goulburn River to Balham Hill run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that run, Killingworth, Murrindindi East, Island, and Muddy Creek A runs to the Main Dividing Range; and thence by that range easterly and northerly to the point of commencement: Provided always that the Upper Thornton run shall form no part of said quarantine district.

In pursuance of the 66th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Governor in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Clean Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter defined shall be Clean Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

Pursuant to Orders of 23 December 1874.

GERLONG CLEAN DISTRICT.—Commencing at Cape Otway; thence by a line bearing northerly to the south-east angle of the Forrest run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that and Pirron Yallock runs to the shore of Lake Corangamite; thence by the eastern boundary of that lake to the Junction Creek which forms the southern boundary of the said run; thence by the said southern boundary and the north-eastern boundary of said run to the Frenchman's station; thence by the eastern boundaries of that and Glenfane runs, and by the northern boundary of the last-named run to the Nairngal run; thence by a portion of the eastern boundary of Nairngal run and the eastern boundary of Mount Bute run to the south-east corner of allotment 80 parish of Mannibadar; thence by a straight line easterly to the junction of a small creek with the River Leigh about twenty-six chains north of the Mount Mercer Cattle Station pre-emptive right; thence down the said River Leigh to the boundary of Golf Hill property easterly and southerly to the boundary of Native Creek property; thence southerly by the boundary of said property to the Burnside property; thence southerly and westerly by the boundaries of Barwon Park, Murdiduke, Ingelby, and Yan-yan Gurt properties to the west corner of allotment 20 A, parish of Bamra; thence southerly by the surveyed road to Loutitt Bay, and thence south-westerly by the sea shore to the point of commencement.

GIPPSLAND CLEAN DISTRICT.—Commencing at the point on the sea-coast where the eastern boundary of the county of Mornington abuts thereon; thence northerly by the said boundary to the Forest West A run; thence by that run to Mountain Glen run; thence northerly, easterly and northerly by that run to the Moe; thence across the Moe to the eastern boundary of Tanjil Hills run; thence by that boundary to the north-eastern corner thereof; thence by a straight line to Mount Baw-baw; thence by the south-eastern and eastern boundaries of Mount Useful run to the Main Dividing Range; thence by that range to Mount Hotham; thence north-easterly by the watershed between the head waters of the Little River and the head waters of the Cobungra and Bundarah creeks to Mount Cope; thence northerly by the watershed between the head waters of the Little River and the head waters of the Big River to Mount Nelson, Bogong; thence south-easterly by a range dividing between the waters of the Big River and the heads of Snowy Creek to Mount Wills; thence easterly by Wombat Creek, being the south boundary of Mount Martin run, to its junction with the Mitta-mitta River; thence north-easterly by the south-east boundary of the Gibbo run to the south-east corner of said run; thence by the north-east boundary of said run to the north-west corner of Buemba run; thence easterly by the northern boundary of Buemba run to the trigonometrical station on Mount Gibbo; thence by a straight line to the north-west corner of the Tom Groggin run, as gazetted in *Government Gazette* of 16th February 1872; thence by the north boundary of said run to the Indi River; thence up the Indi and Upper Indi River, being the boundary between the colonies of Victoria and New South Wales, to Forest Hill; thence south-easterly by the boundary-line between said colonies to Cape Howe; and thence south-westerly by the sea-coast to the point of commencement.

SANDHURST CLEAN DISTRICT.—Commencing at the point on the Murray River where the eastern boundary of the Murrabit run abuts thereon; thence by the said boundary of that run and the eastern and southern boundaries of the Reedy Lake run to Quambatook East run; thence by the northern boundary of that run and by the northern, western, and southern boundaries of the Quambatook West run to the Avoca River;

thence up that river to the Spring Bank West run; thence by the northern boundary of that run and the western boundaries of that run and of the Coobover A and Yawong Springs runs; also by the southern boundary of the last-named run to the Spring Hill run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to the Brenanah run; thence by the western and north-western boundaries of that run to Powlett Plains run; thence by the southern boundaries of that and Salisbury Plains runs to the Bullock Creek Plains run; thence by the western southern, and portion of the eastern boundaries of that run to the south-west corner of Yarraberb run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to Campaspe River run; thence by the western and portion of the northern boundaries of that run to the Campaspe River; thence down that river to its junction with the Murray River; and thence down that river to the point of commencement: Provided that the following Quarantine Districts, viz.: the Brenanah Quarantine District, the Powlett's Plains Quarantine District, the farms of Clancy and Mackin now in quarantine, shall form no part of this Clean District: Provided further that the whole of the Warparilla run shall belong to this Clean District.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE GREENSBOROUGH FARMERS' COMMON.

The Council of the Shire of Heidelberg, by virtue of the power vested in it by the regulations prescribed under *The Land Act 1869* in that behalf, has drafted the following Regulations:—

1st. The fees for depasturing to be as follows:—
For every horse, 8s. per annum.
For every head of neat cattle, 4s. per annum.
For every sheep or goat, 2s. per annum.

2nd. The fees shall be paid half-yearly in advance, the half-years to terminate on the 31st January and 31st July.

3rd. All unregistered cattle found upon the common will be treated as trespassers.

4th. Before any cattle are turned out upon the common they shall be duly registered and given into the hands of the herdsman, who will be in attendance at the mustering yards every alternate Monday; and no cattle will be allowed to be turned out unless the same are marked with the proper brands of the person registering and with the common brand.

5th. Persons depasturing cattle on this common shall be privileged to remove any number of such cattle, and replace them with others of a like kind, provided that notice in writing of their intention be given to the herdsman.

6th. It shall be the duty of all persons using the common to assist at the bi-annual mustering, or, in default, pay 6d. for every head they may turn out.

7th. No person shall depasture more cattle than he has registered, and such number shall not exceed the number prescribed by the Land Regulations relating to commons of the 26th May 1873.

8th. No entire horses or bulls over six months of age will be allowed on the common without the consent in writing of the managers.

9th. Cattle legally depasturing on the common—cows in milk and working horses and bullocks excepted—are not to be disturbed without due notice being given to the herdsman.

10th. All cattle suspected of being diseased shall be removed by the owners within twenty-four hours after notice to do so has been served upon them, and in default of compliance with such order, the managers shall have power to destroy such cattle at the cost of the owners thereof.

11th. The term cattle shall include horses and other animals.

12th. The managers will not be responsible for any neglect or irregularity of the herdsman.

13th. Every person offending against any of the preceding regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £20 for each offence.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE PORTLAND BOROUGH COMMONS.

1. Ratepayers in the borough, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers, may respectively depasture on the said common, within a distance of five miles from their places of residence, four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle.

2. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him, may depasture on the said common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

3. Bulls or entire horses will not be allowed on the commons without the consent of the managers.

4. The fees shall be—for every head of cattle, two shillings per quarter; for every horse, two shillings and sixpence; and for every goat, one shilling; calves and foals, six months old, half fees; twelve months old, full fees; payable in each case in advance on or before the 31st December, 31st March, 30th June, and 30th September in each year.

5. Sheep will be charged at the rate of thirty-four shillings per hundred per quarter, the same to be depastured within the boundaries of Fern street south and north, and west by Learmonth street, and to be shepherded by the owner.

6. Carriers and other travellers will be allowed to depasture teams twenty-four hours on the common free of charge. After that time a fee of one shilling and sixpence per head per week or part of a week will be charged.

7. Previous to running stock on the common, the owners shall register the same with the secretary, together with the number, description, and brands, &c.; and all stock not registered within the time fixed by Rule 4 will be impounded by the herdsman.

8. The managers will not be responsible for the safety or production of any stock committed to their care, but every precaution will be taken to secure their safety.

9. No stock shall be removed from the common without the knowledge of the herdsman.

10. The herdsman shall report immediately to the managers any disease in the stock on the common. He shall also take charge of all milking cattle at eight a.m., and return the same at six p.m. each day during the six months between 1st October and 31st March; and from 1st April to 30th September the hours for receiving and delivery shall be from nine a.m. to five p.m. And any impounding fees resulting from the proved neglect of the herdsman shall be paid by him, or the amount may be deducted from his salary. He will also be required to keep all stock off the streets during the day time, between the hours of six a.m. and sundown, and to place all registered stock, not otherwise secured, in the yard or reserve appointed for that purpose during the night. It will be his duty, as far as practicable, to see daily all the stock placed under his charge, and should any be missing to inform the owners. The managers will also require returns of unregistered stock from time to time; and the herdsman must serve any notices or summonses when required.

11. The managers reserve power at any time to dispense with the services of the herdsman after fourteen days' notice to that effect.

The foregoing regulations were adopted by the Council of the Borough of Portland on the 12th day of July 1875.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

2. By *The Cemeteries Statute 1864* it is provided that "Any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees, and upon payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons and his or their representatives for ever."

3. Applications for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the party applying on payment of the charges in the schedule.

4. Orders for interment will be given to the secretary on the previous day between the hours of Eight o'clock a.m. and Five o'clock p.m.

5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the surveyor; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

6. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

7. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hour fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten o'clock a.m. to Six o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten o'clock a.m. to Four o'clock p.m. throughout the rest of the year.

8. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

9. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

10. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are required by the

same Statute to determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument, according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.

11. No catacomb or any wooden fencing allowed without first submitting a plan for the approval of the trustees.

12. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

13. The ground will be open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.

14. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office and may be inspected; and registers of all grants are kept by the secretary.

15. Any person who shall wantonly or wilfully destroy or do or cause to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, will be proceeded against as directed by the said Statute.

16. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these Rules and Regulations.
