I, WILLIAM McCREA, being the medical officer in attendance on the execution of Henry Howard at the Gaol of Melbourne, do hereby certify and declare that I have this day witnessed the execution of the said Henry Howard at the said gaol; and I further certify and declare that the said Henry Howard was, in pursuance of the sentence of the Central Criminal Court at Melbourne, hanged by the neck until his body was dead.

Given under my hand this fourth day of October in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, at the Gaol of Melbourne.

REPORTED SUNKEN ROCKS.

The evidence taken before the official court, held at Melbourne this day, into the cause of the wreck of the barque *Flying Squirrel*, near Sea Elephant Island, on the east coast of King Island, tends to show that a patch of rocks, extending about 300 feet north and south and 100 feet wide, with only 8 feet water over it, not shown in the Admiralty chart, exists. Purposes to which Proceeds of Disposition are to be applied.—Rents obtained from leases to be applied to payment of costs and expenses connected with execution of trusts, of all charges on the property and of costs of keeping premises insured and in substantial and ornamental repair, so far as such charges and costs shall not have been otherwise provided for. Balance of rents to be paid from time to time to the person holding for the time being the office of Dean of Melbourne, for his own use, or, if there be no such person, to the Bishop, or, during the vacancy of the see, to the person for the time being administering the affairs of the diocese. To be invested or applied in such manner as the Bishop, or such person administering the affairs of the diocese, shall think best for the benefit of the person holding for the time being the office of Dean of Melbourne. Premiums on leases or proceeds of sales to be invested, with approval as aforesaid, in Government debentures, or in mortgage of real estate in Victoria, or in the purchase of land with buildings thereon, or in the purchase of land and in the erection of buildings thereon. The income derivable from such investment to be applied in the same manner as rents derived from leases; the trustees having power to alter or vary investments with approval as aforesaid; all substituted investments being subject to same trusts as those herein set forth. BALLAN NEW CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

In pursuance of the 8th section of *The Cemeteries Statute 1864*, whereby it is enacted that the trustees of any such cemetery shall have power and authority to make such rules and regulations, and to do and perform and cause to be done and performed all such acts, matters, and things as may be necessary and proper for any of the purposes aforesaid, and for directing the positions of all graves and vaults to be made in the said cemetery, the depths of the graves and construction of coffins to be admitted into vaults, and the covering of vaults so as to prevent the escape of any noxious exhalation or evaporation in the said cemetery, and for protecting the buildings, monuments, shrubberies, plantations, and enclosures therein and thereof from destruction or damage. The trustees of the above-named cemetery make and promulgate the following Rules and Regulations:—

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given or before the ground or vault is opened.
2. By the 19th section of the Statute, any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees, under these rules, and upon payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons and his or their representatives for ever.
3. Application for such permission to be made at the office of the secretary, a certificate of permission, in the form set out in the schedule, will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the proper charges.
4. Orders for interment to be given to the secretary of the cemetery, only such order to be given between the hours of Nine a.m. and Three p.m. the previous day.
5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug; parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the surveyor, and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent, in writing, of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.
6. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.
7. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.
8. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive; and Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the usual and only hours for funerals will be from Two to Five o'clock throughout the year.
9. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
10. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

11. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are required by the 7th section of the Act to determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument according to description, size, character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper clamps must be used.

12. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

13. The ground will be open daily from sunrise to sunset.

14. A plan of the cemetery showing the situation of the purchased and other graves is kept at the office, and may be inspected, and registers of all parties are kept by the secretary.

15. The secretary or keeper has orders to turn out or take into custody, as the case may require, any person who shall behave indecorously, or commit any trespass, injury to trees, flowers, or erections, or otherwise infringe the said statute or the regulations for protection of the cemetery, and such person will be proceeded against according to the provisions of the said statute.

16. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.

And it is hereby declared that the said _____ shall be entitled to have, maintain, and keep up such vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the terms of this permission, to and for the sole and separate use of the said _____ and his (or their) representatives for ever: provided always, and it is hereby declared that this grant is made subject to the terms and conditions following, viz. —

1. That the said piece of ground shall be kept and used by the said _____, his heirs and near relations, solely as a burying place, and that no other use shall be made thereof.
 2. That no enclosing wall or fence, building, monument or tombstone, shall be erected or placed on the said piece of ground until a plan thereof shall have been exhibited to the said trustees, and their authority given for the erection thereof.
 3. That the said grave or vault, and the said wall, fence, building, monument, or tombstone shall be maintained and kept up by the said _____ and his representatives, in proper repair to the satisfaction of the said trustees.
 4. That the said _____ and his heirs and near relations shall, in the use of the said piece of ground and access thereto, be subject in every respect to such rules and regulations as the trustees of the said cemetery may from time to time make, and shall not be entitled to exercise the right to bury or inter therein except on payment of such charges as shall from time to time be established by the said trustees.

STREET IN THE TOWN OF FITZROY.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir WILLIAM FOSTER STAWELL, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Colony of Victoria, and the Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette* to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and such land should thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Town of Fitzroy has requested that a certain street within the said town be so declared a public highway: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the land in the town of Fitzroy reserved or used for the street hereinafter named and described to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

A street known as "Kneen street," extending from Falconer street northwards to a street at present unnamed.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eighteenth day of October in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, and in the thirty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign.

No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted, that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might from time to time make Orders, amongst other things, altering for the purpose of adjusting the boundaries of conterminous municipal districts, being shires, without any petition; and it was further enacted that every Order under the provisions of Part I. of the said Act should be published in the *Government Gazette* and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas it has been arranged that a portion of the boundary line of the Shire of Minhamite shall be altered: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter and adjust the boundaries of the said Shire of Minhamite and doth re-define the boundaries thereof in manner following, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF MINHAMITE.—Commencing at the north-west angle of the parish of South Caramut; thence south by a road

the western side of which coincides with the western boundaries of the parishes of South Caramut, Minjah North, Minjah, and Woolsthorpe, to the intersection of the road from Woolsthorpe to Green Hills at the south-west angle of allotment 1 of section 20 in the parish of Woolsthorpe; thence south-easterly by the said road intersecting sections 20, 19, 22, and 23, in the said parish, to its junction with the road bounding the township of Woolsthorpe on the west; thence southerly by the last-named road to the south-west angle of the township of Woolsthorpe; thence south-westerly by the north-western boundary of sections 26 and 29 in the parish of Woolsthorpe, and allotment 3 of section E in the parish of Warrong; thence southerly by the western boundary of said allotment and of allotments 2 and 3 of section F in said parish to the south-west angle of allotment 3 of section F; thence westerly by the road on the north of sections Q, P, O, N, M, and the northern boundary of allotments 2 and 3 of section K in said parish of Warrong, to the north-west angle of allotment 3 of said section K; thence southerly to the south-east angle of section 24, in the parish of Kapong; thence westerly by the road on the south of said section and of sections 25, 26, 27, and 28 in said parish, and of the township of Orford, to its intersection with the River Shaw; thence southerly by the course of that river to a point opposite the north-west angle of allotment 18 in the parish of Yambuk; thence by a line bearing west eighty chains; thence northerly to the south-west angle of allotment 160 in the parish of St. Helens; thence north by the western boundary of said allotment and allotment 153, and further north crossing a road, and by the western boundaries of allotments 144 and 137 in said parish to the centre of the road on the northern boundary of said allotment 137; thence west by that road to the Kumeralla River; thence crossing the river, and further west by the road bounding on the north allotments 58, 57, 54, 55, and 50 of the parish of Tyrendarra to the intersection of the road bounding said allotment 50 on the west; thence north by that road to the intersection of the road on the north margin of said parish; thence west by that road to the intersection of the road bounding allotment 80 of the parish of Bessiebell on the east; thence north by that road to the intersection of the road on the south of allotments 22 and 23 of the parish of Dunmore; thence east by that road to the intersection of the road on the east of the last said allotment; thence north by that road to the north-east angle of said allotment 23; thence by a direct line to the south-east angle of Lake Condah; thence northerly by the centre of that lake and the Lake Condah Swamp to the centre line produced of the South Swamp; thence by the centre of the latter swamp and the Weerangourt Creek to the intersection of a right line joining the south-west angle of the Lyne pre-emptive section and the north-west angle of the Weerangourt pre-emptive section; thence south-easterly by that line to the north-west angle of the Weerangourt pre-emptive section; thence by the western boundary of said section to the south-west angle thereof; thence by a right line south-easterly to the north-west angle of section 4 of the parish of Macarthur; thence southerly by the western boundary of section 4 and the south-western boundary of section 2 of the said parish to the north-west angle of the township reserve of Macarthur; thence by the northern and eastern boundaries of the said township reserve to the western boundary of the county of Villiers; thence northerly by the western boundary of the said county to the road on the south of section 1, parish of Tallangook; eastward along this road to the south boundary of the parish of Yalmerone; thence east by the south boundary of that parish and the parish of Purdeet to the commencing point.

No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might from time to time make Orders, amongst other things, to constitute any part of Victoria containing rateable property capable of yielding, upon a rate not exceeding one shilling in the pound on the annual value thereof, estimated under the provisions of the said Act, the sum of five hundred pounds, a shire; and it was also enacted that the Governor in Council might make Orders altering for the purpose of adjusting the boundaries of conterminous municipal districts, being shires, without any notice; and it was further enacted that every Order under the provisions of Part I. of the said Act should be published in the *Government Gazette* and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor in Council, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, signed by not less than fifty inhabitants of the part of Victoria described in such petition (being a portion of the Shire of Avon) each of whom possesses rateable property therein, praying that such part should be constituted a municipality by the name of the Shire of Maffra; And whereas such petition has been published in

Wherever the line so described as aforesaid runs along a river, creek, or road, whether such is specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken as the boundary line.

SHIRE OF AVON.—Beginning in Flooding Creek, at the west boundary of the parish of Sale; thence north to its north-west corner; east to the south-east corner of allotment 26A, parish of Bundalagwah; north to the north-east corner of allotment 13^b, same parish; west to the south-east corner of the parish of Wa-de-lock; north and east along said parish boundary to the River Avon; east to the south-east corner of Raymond's pre-emptive section; northward by the two-chain road passing along the east boundary of the parish of Briagolong and a line in continuation of the centre of said road to the boundary of the county of Tanjil; eastward along said boundary to the road from Grant to Stratford by Anderson's track; southward along said road to the northward boundary of the parish of Stratford; eastward and southward along the boundaries of the parishes of Stratford, Yeerung, Meerlieu, and Bengworden south to MacLennan's Straits; through said straits and along the north shore of Lake Wellington to and up the River Latrobe and Flooding Creek to a point south of the south-east corner of allotment 44, parish of Sale; north to the north-east corner of allotment 86; west to the north-west angle of allotment 74 and in continuation to Flooding Creek; up this creek to opposite the south-west corner of allotment 199; north to and around the cemetery to its south-west angle to the south-east angle of allotment 100; and thence up Flooding Creek to the starting point.

BOND SHEDS.—ECHUCA.
