I, WILLIAM McCrea, being the medical officer in attendance on the execution of Henry Howard at the Gaol of Melbourne, do hereby certify and declare that I have this day witnessed the execution of the said Henry Howard at the said gaol; and I further certify and declare that the said Henry Howard was, in pursuance of the sentence of the Central Criminal Court at Melbourne, hanged by the neck until his body was dead.

Given under my hand this fourth day of October in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, at the Gaol of Melbourne.

REPORTED SUNKEN ROCKS.

The evidence taken before the official court, held at Mcl-bourne this day, into the cause of the wreck of the barque Flying Squirrel, near Sea Elephant Island, on the cast coast of King Island, tends to show that a patch of rocks, extending about 300 feet north and south and 100 feet wide, with only 8 feet water over it, not shown in the Admiralty chart, exists. This patch bears from Sea Elephant Rock N.E. by N., distance about four miles.

In pursuance of the 8th section of The Cemeteries Statute 1864, whereby it is enacted that the trustees of any such cemetery shall have power and authority to make such rules and regulations, and to do and perform and cause to be done and performed all such acts, matters, and things as may be necessary and proper for any of the purposes aforesaid, and for directing the positions of all graves and vaults to be made in the said cemetery, the depths of the graves and construction of coffins to be admitted into vaults, and the covering of vaults so as to prevent the escape of any noxious exhalation or evaporation in the said cemetery, and for protecting the buildings, monuments, shrubberies, plantations, and enclosures therein and thereof, from destruction or damage. The trustees of the above-named cemetery make and promulgate the following Rules and Regulations:—

above-named cemetery make and promulgate the following Rules and Regulations:—

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given or before the ground or vault is opened.

2. By the 19th section of the Statute, any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees, under these rules, and upon payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons and his or their representatives for ever.

3. Application for such permission to be made at the office of the secretary, a certificate of permission, in the form set out in the schedule, will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the proper charges.

4. Orders for interment to be given to the secretary of the cemetery, only such order to be given between the hours of Nine a.m. and Three p.m. the previous day.

5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug; parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the surveyor, and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent, in writing, of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

6. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.

7. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the

of death of the deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.

7. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

8. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive; and Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the usual and only hours for funerals will be from Two to Five o'clock throughout the year.

9. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

10. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

11. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be crected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are required by the 7th section of the Act to determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument according to description, size, character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper clamps must be used.

12. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

13. The ground will be open daily from sunrise to sunset.

14. A plan of the cemetery showing the situation of the purchased and other graves is kept at the office, and may be inspected, and registers of all parties are kept by the sccretary.

15. The secretary or keeper has orders to turn out or take into custody, as the case may require, any person who shall behave indecorously, or commit any trespass, injury to trees, flowers, or erections, or otherwise infringe the said statute or the regulations for protection of the cemetery, and such person will be proceeded against according to the provisions of the said statute.

16. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.
