STREET IN THE BOROUGH OF STAWELL.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR WILLIAM FOSTER STAWELL, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Colony, of Victoria, and the Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette* to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and such land should thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or hereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Borough of Stawell has requested that a certain street within the said borough be so declared a public highway: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the land in the borough of Stawell reserved or used for the street hereinafter named and described to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

A street known as "Brandon street," running from Napier street in a north-easterly direction to Maud street.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-seventh day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, and in the thirty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign.

QUARANTINE DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Governor in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to Quarantine Districts, and has ordered that the portion of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter described shall be a Quarantine District within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

Pursuant to Order of 12 April 1875.

MANSFIELD QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the source of the Howqua River in Mount Howitt; thence down that river to Parika run; thence by the eastern boundary of that run to Jamieson River; thence down that river to Goulburn River; thence down that river to its junction with the Delatite River; thence up that river to Wappan run; thence by the southern boundary of that run north-westerly to the eastern boundary of Mount Pleasant B run; thence by that boundary south-easterly to the Maitongoon West B run; thence by that run easterly to the Delatite River; thence down that river and the Goulburn River to Balham Hill run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that run, Killingworth, Murrindindi East, Island, and Muddy Creek A runs to the Main Dividing Range; and thence by that range easterly and northerly to the point of commencement: Provided always that the Upper Thornton run shall form no part of said quarantine district.

CLEAN DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 66th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Governor in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Clean Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter defined shall be Clean Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

Pursuant to Orders of 23 December 1874.

GREYLONG CLEAN DISTRICT.—Commencing at Cape Otway; thence by a line bearing northerly to the south-east angle of the Forrest run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that and Pirron Yallock runs to the shore of Lake Corangamite; thence by the eastern boundary of that lake to the Junction Creek which forms the southern boundary of the Polish run; thence by the said southern boundary and the north-eastern boundary of said run to the Frenchman's station; thence by the eastern boundaries of that and Glenfine runs, and by the northern boundary of the last-named run to the Nairngal run; thence by a portion of the eastern boundary of Nairngal run and the eastern boundary of Mount Bute run to the south-east corner of allotment 80 parish of Mannibadar; thence by a straight line easterly to the junction of a small creek with the River Leigh about twenty-six chains north of the Mount Mercer Cattle Station pre-emptive right; thence down the said River Leigh to the boundary of Golf Hill property easterly and southerly to the boundary of Native Creek property; thence southerly by the boundary of said property to the Burnside property; thence southerly and westerly by the boundaries of Barwon Park, Murrindindi, Ingelby, and Yan-yan Gurt properties to the west corner of allotment 20 A, parish of Bamba; thence southerly by the surveyed road to Loutitt Bay, and thence south-westerly by the sea shore to the point of commencement.

GIPPSLAND CLEAN DISTRICT.—Commencing at the point on the sea-coast where the eastern boundary of the county of Mornington abuts thereon; thence northerly by the said boundary to the Powlett West A run; thence by that run to Mountain Glen run; thence northerly, easterly and northerly by that run to the Moe; thence across the Moe to the eastern boundary of Tanjil Hills run; thence by that boundary to the north-eastern corner thereof; thence by a straight line to Mount Baw-baw; thence by the south-eastern and eastern boundaries of Mount Useful run to the Main Dividing Range; thence by that range to Mount Hotham; thence north-easterly by the watershed between the head waters of the Little River and the head waters of the Coburg and Bundarah creeks to Mount Cope; thence northerly by the watershed between the head waters of the Little River and the head waters of the Big River to Mount Nelson, Bogong; thence south-easterly by a range dividing between the waters of the Big River and the heads of Snowy Creek to Mount Wills; thence easterly by Wombat Creek, being the south boundary of Mount Martin run, to its junction with the Mitta-mitta River; thence north-easterly by the south-east boundary of the Gibbo run to the south-east corner of said run; thence by the north-east boundary of said run to the north-west corner of Buemba run; thence easterly by the northern boundary of Buemba run to the trigonometrical station on Mount Gibbo; thence by a straight line to the north-west corner of the Tom Groggin run, as gazetted in *Government Gazette* of 16th February 1872; thence by the north boundary of said run to the Indi River; thence up the Indi and Upper Indi River, being the boundary between the colonies of Victoria and New South Wales, to Forest Hill; thence south-easterly by the boundary-line between said colonies to Cape Howe; and thence south-westerly by the sea-coast to the point of commencement.

SANDHURST CLEAN DISTRICT.—Commencing at the point on the Murray River where the eastern boundary of the Murrabit run abuts thereon; thence by the said boundary of that run and the eastern and southern boundaries of the Reedy Lake run to Quambatook East run; thence by the northern boundary of that run and by the northern, western, and southern boundaries of the Quambatook West run to the Avoca River;

TOWN OF EMERALD HILL.

BYE-LAW No. 55.

A Bye-law of the town of Emerald Hill, made under section 213 of "The Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 55 (fifty-five), for the regulation of the deposit, &c., of inflammable materials, &c., within the town of Emerald Hill.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1874, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Emerald Hill order as follows, that is to say:—They hereby adopt section 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 of part 7 (2) of the thirtieth schedule to the Local Government Act 1874, and hereby order and declare that the same and every of them shall be applicable and in force in the whole of the municipal district of the said town, the boundaries of which are set forth in the second schedule to the said Act, and which sections are as follows (that is to say):—

3. It shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make regulations for all or any of the purposes following (that is to say):—

For prescribing the distance from any adjoining land or from any building within which it shall not be lawful to make or keep any stack of hay, corn, straw, or other produce, if not placed under roof or cover, and the like were placed under roof or cover, and for prohibiting or restraining the use for such covering of such inflammable materials as shall be described in such regulation:

For prescribing the distance from any adjoining land, or from any street or public place, or from any building, within which it shall not be lawful to deposit such combustible materials as shall be specified in the regulation, or save in some properly constructed fireplace within some building, to make or light any fire:

And every such regulation may be made to apply to the whole or separately to any part or parts of the municipal district described by boundaries in such regulation, and may provide as to the subject-matter thereof either absolutely or with relation to the consent of the council, or of the proper officer of the council, to be given or withheld in any case to be in question under such regulation.

4. Every person who shall make or place any stack of hay, corn, straw, or other produce, or place as or for the covering of any such stack any inflammable material, or deposit any combustible material, or light any fire contrary in any such case to regulation under this subdivision, and every occupier of any premises whereon any stack or any such covering of a stack shall be, or any combustible materials have been deposited, if the same, though lawfully made, placed, or deposited before the coming into force of any such regulation, shall be there contrary to the tenor of such regulation, who shall not within seven days after notice from the council so to do remove such stack, covering, or materials, or who shall suffer to remain any such stack, covering, or materials unlawfully made, placed, or deposited before the coming into force of such regulations, shall forfeit on conviction for such offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and in every such case a further sum not exceeding Forty shillings for every day after any such conviction during which such stack, covering, or materials shall so continue.

5. Every person who wilfully sets fire to any inflammable matter whatsoever in the open air without having given notice in writing to the occupiers of the land adjoining to the land upon which such matter shall be, and also to the municipal clerk, of his intention so to do, or within twenty-four hours after giving the last given of such notices, or between the hours of Four in the afternoon of any day and Eight in the morning of the following day, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Every person who shall light any bonfire, tar barrel, or firework upon, or within sixty yards of any public or private street or any public place, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

7. It shall not be lawful for any person to make, or place, or to keep, or continue any fence of brushwood, bushes, or other like material; and every person who shall make or place any such fence, and every owner or occupier of any premises who for seven days after notice from the council to remove any such fence thereto appertaining, if lawfully made or placed before the coming into operation of this subdivision, shall suffer any such fence or any part thereof to remain, or who shall suffer to remain any such fence unlawfully made before such coming into operation, shall forfeit on conviction for such offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and in every such case a further sum not exceeding Forty shillings for every day after such conviction during which such fence shall continue.

8. From and after the coming into force of this bye-law, no store or warehouse or other building shall be used for the deposit of inflammable materials, unless and until the license of the said town of Emerald Hill be obtained therefor, which said license shall prescribe the conditions under which such store, warehouse, or other building shall be and for the purpose aforesaid.

9. Any person who shall commit any wilful act or be guilty of any wilful default contrary to the provisions of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; for a second offence he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds; and for a third or any subsequent offence, not exceeding Twenty pounds; and the act complained of, whether

omission or commission, shall be deemed to be wilful in case the party charged shall not, after the service upon him, or left at his house or place of business, of a notice in writing from the council of the said town, specifying the act or default required to be done or omitted respectively.

10. In the construction of this bye-law the words "inflammable material" or "combustible materials" shall be construed to mean and embrace all or any of the substances or fluids mentioned in the schedule to this bye-law annexed.

Petroleum, kerosene, paraffine, benzine, naphtha (mineral and vegetable), gas-oil (produced from gas-tar), nitro-glycerine, lithofracteur, dynamite, gun-cotton, gunpowder, blasting-powder, nitric sulphuric and muriatic acids, turpentine, matches (wax and every other description), phosphorus, and all other explosive or inflammable fluids and substances whatsoever, by whatever names the same may be called or known.

WHEREAS by *The Electoral Act 1865* it was amongst other things enacted, that where any accidental or unavoidable impediment, misfeasance, or omission should have happened in the preparation or transmission or printing of any general roll or supplementary roll or ordinary electoral roll or roll of ratepaying electors, the Governor in Council might take all such measures as might be necessary for removing such impediment or rectifying such misfeasance or omission, or might declare any such roll valid as to and notwithstanding such impediment, misfeasance, or omission; and every such Order in Council should state specifically the nature of the impediment, misfeasance, or omission, and should be forthwith published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas in the preparation of the Roll of Ratepaying Electors of 1875 for the Western Road Division of the Electoral District of Ballarat West the names set forth in the subjoined schedule were accidentally omitted to be included therein: And whereas the said names have since been incorporated in the Roll aforesaid: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power in him vested by the 68th section of *The Electoral Act 1865*, doth hereby declare valid the said Roll of Ratepaying Electors notwithstanding such omission and subsequent incorporation of names.
