PROPOSED TRANSFER OF AREA UNDER THE
"LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1874."

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Local Government Act 1874* (No. 506, § 46), the substance and prayer of a petition, in accordance with the 44th section of the said Act, which have been presented to His Excellency the Administrator of the Government in Council, are published, viz.:—

The petitioners state that they are a majority of the rate-payers in that portion of the parish of Prahran which is described in their petition, and which is included in both the borough of St. Kilda and the shire of Caulfield according to the boundaries of their municipal districts as set forth in the second schedule of *The Local Government Act 1874*.

Area described in the petition:—

"In the parish of Prahran, county of Bourke, bounded on the north by the Main Dandenong road; on the east by a road on the east side of allotment N 176 B, parish of Prahran—known as the Ororong road; on the south by the Glen Huntly road; and on the west by a road intersecting the Dandenong road on the west side of the cemetery reserve known as Hotham street."

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore pray that, in the exercise of the powers conferred by *The Local Government Act 1874*, Your Excellency will be pleased to make an order to sever the portion of Victoria situated in the parish of Prahran, hereinbefore described, from the borough of St. Kilda, and that the said area may be a portion of the shire of Caulfield, as the same is now described in the second schedule of *The Local Government Act*, and may be a new subdivision of the said shire to be called the East St. Kilda riding of the said shire."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir WILLIAM FOSTER STAWELL, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Colony of Victoria, and the Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the Malakoff Agricultural Area Farmers' Common, by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

THE MALAKOFF AGRICULTURAL AREA FARMERS' COMMON, described in a proclamation bearing date the 1st February 1870, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown land comprised within the boundaries described as follow, viz.:—Commencing at a point on the west boundary of the Woodlands run at its intersection with the north boundary of the parish of Malakoff; bounded thence by the parish boundary bearing east and south (true) to the road from Stawell to Navarre; thence by that road bearing north-easterly and east to an angle on the northern side thereof opposite the west angle of allotment 229, parish of Navarre; thence by a line bearing north to the northern boundary of the run; thence by that boundary bearing westerly and south (true) to the point of commencement. 2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses be required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desire it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. 4. 5. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

6. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.
