## SUBDIVISIONS OF THE BOROUGH OF ST. KILDA.

At the Executive Council Chambers, Melbourne, the twenty-first day of March 1876.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor

Sir James McCulloch | Mr. MacPherson.

**WHEREAS** by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted that, every order severing any district from any subdivided municipal district might abolish all the subdivisions and either constitute the municipal district an unsubdivided municipal district or resubdivide the same. In case any such order did not abolish all the subdivisions, the same should be deemed to cancel every entire subdivision severed, and as regards every subdivision of which a portion only was severed, should either cancel such subdivision and annex the residue thereof to some other subdivision or in separate portions to some other subdivisions or should declare that such residue should thenceforth be deemed such subdivision. And it was also enacted that every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council, made on the seventh day of February, now last past, a portion of the Borough of St. Kilda was severed therefrom and attached to the Shire of Caulfield; and it is expedient to declare that the residual portions of the north and south wards of the said borough shall be deemed subdivisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order declare the residual portions of the north and south wards of the Borough of St. Kilda, remaining after severance of the parts thereof as hereinbefore mentioned, to be the north and south wards of the said borough, the boundaries whereof are, as follow, that is to say:—

**THE NORTH WARD.**—Beginning at the intersection of Barkly and Wellington streets; thence eastward along Wellington street and the Main Dandenong road to Hotham street; south along this street to and west along Inkerman street to Barkly street; and north by this street to the starting point.

**THE SOUTH WARD.**—Beginning at the junction of Inkerman street with Barkly street; thence eastward along Inkerman street to and south along Hotham street to the Glen Huntly road; west along this road to and south along St. Kilda street to Park street; west along Park street and to the shore of Port Phillip Bay; northward by the shore to its junction with Barkly street; and up this street to the starting point.

The centre of the several streets and roads is to be taken as the boundary-line.

And the Honorable John Alexander MacPherson, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

# REGULATIONS UNDER THE STATUTE OF GAOLS 1864 AND THE CRIMINAL LAW AND PRACTICE STATUTE 1864.

**THE** following regulations for the safe custody, classification, hours of labor, and mode of employment of offenders confined in any gaol or hulk, and otherwise for the management and good government of such offenders and gaols and hulks, and for granting remissions of sentence, have been made by the Governor in Council, under the provisions of the 9th section of *The Statute of Gaols 1864* and the 318th section of *The Criminal Law and Practice Statute 1864*.

1. Remissions of sentence will be granted to prisoners convicted after the 31st day of March 1876, on the following conditions, viz.:—

1st. To prisoners under sentences amounting to six months and less than two years, when they shall have completed seven-eighths of their sentences, provided their conduct and industry are favorably reported on by their officers. Such periods will, however, be increased by the term of all punishments for offences within the prison or by absence from hard labor. In the case of confined misconduct prisoners will forfeit all claim to such remissions.

2nd. To prisoners under sentences of two years and upwards, when they shall have completed not less than three-fourths of their sentences in accordance with the number of marks allotted them for industry and good conduct, as follows:—

a. Every sentence will be reduced to a certain number of marks: nine (9) of which marks will represent an ordinary day, three (3) for labor, three (3) for conduct while at work, and three (3) for conduct beyond labor hours. If a prisoner behaves well and works fairly he will be given nine (9) marks. If not the number of marks may be reduced by one third; and if his conduct be very good and he works willingly and well the number may be increased by one-third.

b. Such prisoners will be divided into six classes, and the period to be served in each class will be represented by a stated number of marks.

c. The first-class will be kept in separate confinement, in which prisoners will serve from three to six months, according to the length of their sentences. While in this class no marks will be given beyond the fixed daily number. The above period may for misconduct be increased to any term not exceeding nine (9) months.

d. The marks a prisoner may earn after conviction before being placed in separate confinement as prescribed for the first class will be allowed in reduction of the number to be earned in the second class.

e. Whatever number of marks such prisoners may have failed to obtain, according to the standard of nine per day, on their release from separate confinement they will be required to earn at the same rate before promotion to the second class. The marks allowed for any period in hospital, before emerging from the first class are not to be counted as for service in that class, but are to be carried forward and credited to the second class.

f. The number of marks to be earned after promotion to the second, and before entering the fourth class, will be equally divided between the second and third, and prisoners in these classes will work in association, but be lodged separately. Prisoners in the remaining classes, if eligible for public works at out-stations, will be allowed a ration of tobacco, or its equivalent in money; and if in the fourth class and at hard labor a gratuity at the rate of One penny (1d.) for every nine marks gained on days they may be actually at work; and if in the fifth class and at hard labor the gratuity will be increased to Twopence (2d.); and if in the sixth class and at hard labor to Fourpence (4d.), with a ration of tea and sugar in addition. If not so eligible, or if at light labor, or sentenced to imprisonment only, prisoners will be allowed the same indulgent rations but only one-half the gratuities, except when specially recommended by the labor officers for attention to work in which cases the amounts may be increased to three-fourths. Females, however, will not be employed at out-door labor, will not be allowed tobacco, nor more than one-half the gratuities allowed to males.

g. Such prisoners, if under sentences of eight years or less, will be eligible for the fourth class when they shall have gained a number of marks sufficient to represent one-half of their sentences. Prisoners under longer terms will be eligible for the fourth class when they have arrived at the period of four years from the probable date of their discharge, as ascertained by the number of marks they shall have obtained. The marks to be earned in the fourth, fifth, and sixth classes will be allotted in the proportion of one-half to the fourth, one-third to the fifth, and one-sixth to the sixth respectively.

h. Such prisoners will not be allowed any marks or other indulgence while undergoing secondary punishment, and will receive marks for conduct only on Sundays and holidays. While in hospital they may, if well conducted, be credited with nine marks on working days and six on Sundays; and if at light labor, or sentenced to imprisonment only, will, for work, be credited with not more than two marks per working day.

i. No prisoner under fifty years of age, who has had the opportunity of attending school for the period of nine months from the date of these regulations, will be promoted to the fifth class until he can read fluently in the second reading book; if for a period of eighteen months, until he can read well in the third book, write fairly from print, and work sums readily as far as simple long division; and if for a period of three years unless he has attained the standard of the fourth class in reading, writing, and arithmetic, according to the present school programme at the Penal Establishment, Pentridge; but such disqualification will not operate so as to retard liberation.

j. Prisoners who may have previously undergone sentences which were not considered by the court at the time they were last convicted will only be allowed three marks per diem for conduct beyond labor hours.

k. The promotion of prisoners from one class to another, and their liberation from prison, will entirely depend on the number of marks they may earn; they will never be promoted until they have gained the full number fixed for each class. Should they misconduct themselves after gaining the fourth class they will be reduced to the third, until by conduct deserving again of promotion.

2. No gratuity to the credit of a prisoner will be forfeited except for absconding, attempting to abscond, or other indictable offence. All moneys accrued to prisoners on discharge, will be handed over for their benefit to a Prisoners Aid Society.

3. Prisoners who have once passed through the system of discipline provided for by any regulations in force after the 1st August 1873 will not during any subsequent sentence be allowed gratuities under such regulations; but they may apply to remain and work on pay, under the Order in Council of the 30th of March 1863, for a period graduated by the length of their sentences, but not exceeding in the whole twenty (20) days.

4. Prisoners convicted between the 1st August 1873 and the 1st day of April 1876 are subject to these regulations, except as provided for by sub-section j.

5. Prisoners convicted before the 1st August 1873 will be dealt with under the previously existing regulations; provided, however, that for former convictions alone the minimum period of service for such prisoners shall in no case be extended by more than one-fourth.

6. These regulations apply as specified to all prisoners whether male or female, except those confined for contempts, non-payment of fines or other moneys, or in default of bail.

# CLEAN DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 66th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Administrator of the Government in Council has revoked all previous orders relating to the Clean Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter defined shall be Clean Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

Applications must be accompanied with certificates in accordance with the subjoined regulations.

The candidate will be required to produce a reliable medical certificate of sound constitution; nor will he be admitted if affected with any physical infirmity which may in any way interfere with the efficient discharge of the duties he may be called on to perform.

### QUALIFICATIONS FOR ADMISSION.

1st. Having completed the first and second years of the course for the certificate of engineer in the Melbourne University, and his age at time of application must not exceed 24 years.

2nd. Having completed the first year of the course for the certificate of engineer in the Melbourne University. His age at time of entry must not exceed 23 years.

3rd. Having matriculated at the Melbourne or other recognized University; after passing in Algebra, Euclid, and Arithmetic; or passed the Civil Service Examination, including the subjects above named; or produce such a certificate of competency in such subjects as shall satisfy this department. His age at time of application must not exceed 22 years, nor be less than 16 years.

### PERIOD OF SERVICE.

1st. An applicant of the first class will be required to pass six months in the offices of the Lands Department as a draftsman, and eighteen months in the field under the direction of a departmental surveyor.

2nd. An applicant of the second class will be required to pass one year in the offices of the Lands Department, and two years in the field under the direction of a departmental surveyor.

3rd. An applicant of the third class will have first to pass a probationary period of three months in the offices of the Lands and Survey Department, after which period, if his progress is considered satisfactory, he will remain in the offices of the department as a draftsman for one year and nine months, when he will be examined in trigonometric computation by logarithms, including computation of areas and reduction of traverse surveys, plotting from field-book, plan drawing, including feature delineation; and, if he pass satisfactorily, will be required to spend two years in the field under the direction of a departmental surveyor.

### REMUNERATION.

1st. Applicants of the first class will be paid at the rate of £78 per annum during the period of six months passed in the offices of the department, and £91 during the year passed in the field.

2nd. Applicants of the second class will be paid at the rate of £52 during the nine months passed in the offices of the department, £65 for the first year in the field, and £91 during the last year in the field.

3rd. Applicants of the third class will not be remunerated for the first three months of probation, but during the remainder of the period spent in the offices (one year and nine months) will be paid at the rate of £52 per annum. The salary during the first year in the field will be £65, during the second £91. In the case of an applicant in this class passing the specified examination at the end of the first year, he will be paid during the first and second years in the field at the rate of £65 per annum, and for the third year in the field £91.

To obtain certificate of competency as a qualified surveyor it will be required of the candidate, after the end of the term spent in the field, that he pass two months in the Melbourne Observatory to acquire a knowledge of such branches of practical astronomy as are necessary in the duties he would be called on to perform as a departmental surveyor. He will also be required to make a traverse and topographical survey of a portion of land to be shown him; to establish the true meridian by transit observation, from which meridian the bearings of his survey will be reckoned; to level over a line to be pointed out to him, and to make a subdivision also as pointed out. Then to produce plan showing construction lines, subdivision section line, topographical features, with areas and dimensions of subdivisions, accompanied by regulation field-book of survey, and the various computations.

To obtain a certificate as qualified draftsman the applicant of the third class would have to pass the first two years as before specified; then six months in the field, the latter period at a salary of £52 per annum, and afterwards pass an examination in trigonometric computation, by logarithms, including areas and reductions of traverses, plotting from field-books, and their construction, including feature delineation.

## PART II. OF "THE PUBLIC HEALTH AMENDING STATUTE 1867" EXTENDED TO THE SHIRES OF WODONGA AND YACKANDANDAH.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight  
Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint  
Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-  
Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Depen-

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-first year of  
Her present Majesty's reign, intituled *An Act to amend  
the Laws relating to or affecting Public Health* (31 Vict. No.  
310), it was amongst other things enacted, that Part II. of  
the said Act should apply to all places where the Part of the  
Act thereby repealed, or any portion thereof, had been in  
force, and all or some of the provisions of Part II. aforesaid  
should also apply to every such city, town, borough, shire,  
district, or place in Victoria as the Governor in Council  
should by Proclamation direct; and the Governor in Council  
might at any time, and from time to time, alter, repeal, or re-  
voke any such Proclamation theretofore or thereafter made:  
And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Go-  
vernor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the tenth  
day of July 1865, Part I. of *The Public Health Statute 1865*, was  
extended to the Shire of Yackandandah: And whereas a por-  
tion of the said shire has been separated therefrom and con-  
stituted the Shire of Wodonga: And whereas it is expedient  
to extend Part II. aforesaid to the Shire of Yackandandah  
as now constituted, and to the new Shire of Wodonga: Now  
therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the  
Executive Council do by this my Proclamation, direct that  
all the provisions of Part II. of the above-recited Act 31 Vict.  
No. 310, shall apply to the respective shires hereinafter men-  
tioned, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF WODONGA and

THE SHIRE OF YACKANDANDAH.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE USE OF THE FIFTY-TON CRANE ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF THE RIVER YARRA.

1. Any person desirous of using the crane must make appli-  
cation to be registered on the form to be obtained from the  
office of the Chief Harbor-master, such application to be  
lodged between Nine a.m. and Four p.m. on week days, which  
will be duly registered in order of receipt.

2. With application for registration and before registration  
is made a deposit of £3 shall be paid to the Secretary for Har-  
bors and Navigation, which sum shall be allowed as part pay-  
ment of crane rates, provided such rates shall be settled within  
seven (7) days after delivery of the account for same, other-  
wise such deposit shall be absolutely forfeited, and the dues  
paid in full.

3. Ships requiring the use of crane and for which deposit  
has been paid shall have prior claim to use of wharf abreast  
of crane so long as they are using the crane.

4. Should any vessel not be in position to use the crane at  
such times as may be specified by the Chief Harbor-master or  
Harbor-master, Melbourne, the turn of such vessel will lapse,  
and fresh application for registration must be made, the de-  
posit-fee being liable to be forfeited, subject to the decision of  
the Honorable the Commissioner of Trade and Customs; and  
the applicant will be responsible for any expenses already in-  
curred in getting crane ready for use, unless the inability to  
use the crane shall have occurred through stress of weather  
or other circumstances, which the Chief Harbor-master shall  
determine, when such vessel may retain her position upon the  
register without forfeiture of the deposit.



5. The working day shall consist of eight (8) hours, between Seven a.m. and Five p.m. For every hour earlier or later than the fixed working day, Ten shillings (10s.) is to be paid in addition to the rates.

Or, in the option of the parties using the crane, Nine shillings per ton weight when a portion of the machinery or boilers only are taken out, or put on board; these rates to include all necessary use of the crane from or to the ship or carriage; water-tanks are, to be held as included in the fitting up rates, but all spare propellers or spare machinery lifted to be charged additional.

Boilers or machinery and other heavy articles, shipped as cargo or lifted from or on to the quay or vessel, nine shillings per ton.

Where two lifts of the same article are made, rate and a half to be charged.

No single employment of the crane when steam has specially to be raised to be for a less sum than £3, and if during the day of eight hours the rates do not exceed £3, the charge to be for such day, £3.

When a lift is made from one vessel afloat and deposited into another, half rates in addition to be charged.

The crane is not to be used for breaking out weights from vessels, but for lifting and landing only.

#### BYE-LAWS FOR REGULATION OF MARKET YARDS.

1st. That the cattle market shall be open for the reception and delivery of cattle and other live stock on every day until noon (Sundays excepted).

2nd. That there shall be appointed for such cattle market an officer, to be called an inspector thereof, whose duties shall be as follows:—

*First.* To see that the market regulations be duly observed.

*Second.* To demand and receive all market tolls, and pay same over to the treasurer within forty-eight hours of receiving.

*Third.* To allot the principal and drafting yards to the use of the parties bringing stock to the market for sale, in such manner as in each particular case may seem to such inspector to be most convenient.

*Fourth.* To preserve order and cleanliness within such market, and to summarily eject therefrom any persons creating a riot or disturbance, or cursing or swearing, or using any gross or indecent language, or being guilty of gross or indecent conduct therein.

3rd. That every person or persons who may obstruct the inspector or his assistants in the performance of his or their duties, or shall release any stock from the market, or shall remove the same from one part of the market to another without the authority of the inspector, or shall wilfully break down or damage any of the gates, fences, or premises of the market, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding Five pounds sterling, and in addition thereto be required to make good any such damage at his or her private expense.

4th. That any person who may be found drunk or disorderly within the market, or cursing or swearing, or using gross or profane language, or abusive language therein, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding Forty shillings sterling.

5th. That the parties or party placing stock in the market for sale shall be responsible for all market dues and tolls accruing thereon, and in no case shall any stock be taken out of the market until all dues, tolls, and charges demandable on such stock under these regulations shall have been first fully paid and satisfied.

## SHIRE OF KILMORE.

### BYE-LAWS FOR REGULATION OF MARKETS.

1st. That the said market shall be open every Thursday, from sunrise till eleven o'clock p.m. (Christmas day excepted), for the supply and sale of provisions, that is to say:—Butchers' meat, pork, fish, poultry, rabbits, wild fowl, fresh butter, cheese, eggs, vegetables, fruits, roots, shrubs, plants, bulbs, seeds, hay, straw, grain, green fodder, and all garden and farm produce, with such other articles as the municipal council may allow to be sold in the said market; and it shall not be lawful for any person to expose or offer for sale or to sell in the market any other article or thing than is herein enumerated or referred to.

2nd. That it shall be lawful for the said council to let for any period not exceeding the current municipal year, at such rent as they may fix thereon, any shed, stall, standing, or other convenience within the market, and to re-let the same as often as the periods of such letting shall expire, or be otherwise determined; and for the good regulation of the said market, each or every lease or arrangement shall contain a clause setting forth the class of articles for the sale of which such shed, shop, or other convenience has been let, and that no other class of article shall be exposed or offered for sale or be sold in or on the said shed, shop, stall, site, or other convenience than is named or referred to in the said agreements, except with the consent, in writing, of the said council.

3rd. That it shall be lawful for the said council and they are hereby empowered to impose and collect all such rents, rates, tolls, and dues in respect of and on all such articles, which are enumerated in Table A in the schedule appended to this bye-law, which may be brought into the said market to be sold therein.

4th. That any person wishing his or her name or business affixed to any stall, shed, &c., or to have the shed or stall, &c., enclosed in any particular way, shall apply to the market inspector, under whose directions the same may be done, at the cost of the applicant, and under the supervision of the Shire Engineer.

5th. That any person guilty of the following offences, omissions, or neglect, shall on conviction thereof for every such offence or omission pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling:—

A. Selling or exposing for sale in the said market any marketable commodity before the times appointed for opening and closing such market, or on other days than those named for holding the market.

B. Selling or offering for sale in the said market any commodity not named in and allowed by this bye-law to be sold there.

C. Refusing or neglecting to pay, on demand being made by the officer appointed by the council to collect the same, any rate, rent, toll, or due which may be due for any shed, stall, or convenience, or for any article sold or exposed for sale in the market.

D. Placing any matter or thing so as to cause an obstruction, and refusing or neglecting to remove the same on being requested to do so by the market inspector.

E. Placing or keeping any cart, carriage, barrow, or other vehicle in any part of the said market, contrary to the direction of the market inspector.

F. Placing any hook, nail, or peg, or otherwise injuring or defacing any part of the market buildings, or fitting up or enclosing any part of it without the consent or contrary to the directions of the market inspector, or refusing to remove any hook, nail, peg, or fittings, when requested to do so by the inspector.

G. Sweeping or causing to be swept, or placing any dirt or rubbish into or upon any of the paths, gutters, roads, &c., of the said market and allowing the same to remain.

H. Being in the market in a drunken or disorderly state, or exciting any riot or disturbance, or cursing or swearing, or using any gross, indecent, or abusive language, or being guilty of any gross or indecent conduct therein.

I. In any way obstructing the market inspector in the discharge of his duties.

J. In any other manner than those specified interfering with the proper regulation and good management of the market.

6th. That the council shall appoint an officer to be called the "Market Inspector," whose duties shall be generally as described in Appendix B.

7th. That the said council shall from time to time, as they may see fit, repeal any of the rules and conditions contained in this bye-law, and substitute others for those repealed; or alter or amend all or any of the said rules and forms in this bye-law, or in the schedule or appendix attached; and such substitutions and emendations shall, when sanctioned by His Excellency the Governor, have the same force and effect as they would have had, had they been in the original.

### APPENDIX B.

#### DUTIES OF MARKET INSPECTOR.

To see that the market regulations, as provided for in this bye-law, are duly observed. To preserve order and regularity in the market, and to cause to be apprehended all persons causing a riot or disturbance, or offending against decency, or in any manner or way provoking to a breach of the peace, within the precincts of such market.

To inspect all articles exposed for sale in the market, and to seize such as are bad or unwholesome, and on such being examined by any two members of the municipal council, and declared by them, in writing, to be bad or unwholesome, to cause the same to be destroyed, and to prohibit the sale of any articles in such market which he may consider noisome or offensive.

To inspect all scales, weights, and measures used in the market, and to seize such as are found fraudulent or defective.
