FURTHER PROROGUING THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Constitution Act* it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he might think fit; and also from time to time to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he should deem it expedient: And whereas the said Council and Assembly, called "The Parliament of Victoria," now stand prorogued until Tuesday the ninth day of May instant, and it is expedient to prorogue the same further: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria from Tuesday the ninth day of May instant until Friday the ninth day of June next ensuing.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fifth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, and in the thirty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign.

HYDROGRAPHIC NOTICES.
[The information contained in this notice is to be carefully considered, to be noted in the Sailing Directions, and compared with the Chart when the ship is navigating the part to which it refers.]

NEW ZEALAND PILOT.—1875.
The following observations relating to the ports and shores of New Zealand, made by officers of H.M. ships employed on the Australian station, 1873-75, were communicated by the late Commodore J. G. Goodenough.*
All bearings are magnetic.
Variation in 1875—*Parenga-Renga harbour* 13° 30' Easterly.
Auckland ... 14° 0' Easterly.
Queen Charlotte Sound 15° 0' Easterly.
The Snares ... 18° 0' Easterly.

NORTH ISLAND.—EAST COAST.
Auckland Harbour.—Two fixed white harbour lights, horizontal, are exhibited from the western extremity of the Commercial Wharf. These lights, together with the three triangular lights situated on the eastern extremity of the same wharf, are elevated 29 feet above high water, and in clear weather are visible from a distance of six miles.
The triangular lights and horizontal lights in line will lead clear of the shoal water on the south side of Auckland Harbour.

MIDDLE ISLAND.—COOK STRAIT.
Queen Charlotte Sound.—The red light exhibited from the end of the wharf at Picton is elevated 20 feet above high water, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of six miles. †
Kakaho Channel.—The beacon on Oke Rock is surmounted by a ball. †

FOVEAUX STRAIT.
Bluff Harbour (Awarua † §).—On Bluff Hill there is a signal station, with which vessels requiring pilots should communicate, or, when it is obscured, with the station on Starling Point.
There is also a semaphore arm on the flagstaff on Starling Point, which is only used should a vessel be seen standing into danger.
Buoy.—A red buoy marks the south-west end of the shoal on the east side of the south passage, and lies in 6 fathoms, with Starling Point bearing N. by W. ¼ W. and Lookout point W. by S.
Beacons.—On the north shore of Bluff Harbour are two white beacons, the northern one having a small triangular top. The beacons in line, bearing N. by E., lead towards Starling Point, off which the pilot boat should be seen.
There are also two white beacons (the western one having a small triangular top), which lead through North Passage, when in line, bearing W. by N., and close to the black buoy marking the north-east end of the shoal on the south side of the passage.

Directions.—Vessels of 14 feet draft taking the South Passage should haul up for Tewaewae point when abreast of Starling Point, as the beacons in line, when to the northward of this point, lead into 2½ fathoms at low water.
Vessels from the eastward should not bring Dog Island to bear to the northward of West, until Green Island bears S. by W. ½ W., in order to clear a dangerous break lying about two miles N.N.E. ¼ E. from Green Island.
There is no steam tug at Bluff Harbour, but the services of coasting steam vessels can often be obtained at moderate rates.
There is a wharf in the harbour with a depth of 20 feet alongside at low water.
Sunken Rocks.—A sunken rock with two feet on it at low water spring tides is reported to lie a quarter of a mile from the west end of Dog Island, with the lighthouse on the island bearing S.E. Another rock, which is awash at low water spring tides, is also reported to lie a quarter of a mile from the east end of the island, with the lighthouse bearing W. by S.
The following information relating to The Snares is derived from a report made to the Marine Department, New Zealand, by Captain R. Johnson and Mr. J. Blackett Marine Engineer, on visiting these off-lying dangers in the Government steam vessel *Luna*, 1875. ¶

THE SNARES.
North-east Island.—The coast generally of the north-east and largest of these islands is formed of precipitous cliffs, nearly perpendicular, except on the north-east side, where the land rises gradually from the sea. The island is composed of rough coarse granite, covered with a chocolate-coloured vegetable mould of variable thickness, in which are numerous bird burrows, every available piece of soil being made use of by them.

Vegetation.—This island is tolerably well covered with vegetation, consisting chiefly of a heavy scrub, varying in height from 10 to 15 feet, and coarse, high broad-bladed grass growing in tufts, together with a finer wiry kind of grass, on stems two to three feet high.

Boat Harbour.—About the centre of the north-east side of this island there is a good boat harbour, the shores of which are rocky; the entrance is about 30 yards wide, with a depth of 9 fathoms in the centre, decreasing gradually to 3 fathoms near the head of the boat harbour, on the north side of which is the landing place.

This boat harbour is open to the north-east, but safe in all weathers for boats. About three-quarters of a cable in a south easterly direction from the entrance lies a sunken rock.

Temporary Anchorage.—The Snarcs are surrounded with deep water, and there is no anchorage except close under, and to the eastward of North-east Island, where a steam vessel may ride with a stream anchor in 40 fathoms during moderate weather.

Water.—Fresh water is plentiful on North-east Island, but strongly impregnated with peat and guano.

Eastward of North-east Island lies a smaller island of much the same character; there is a boat passage between them.

Western Islets.—The largest of the four western islets is about a quarter of a mile long, and the smallest about half that size.

The islets lie in a north and south direction, and extend over a mile, forming a rugged ridge of almost inaccessible rocks, the highest of which are 290 feet high.

No vegetation or water appears on any of the western islets, and landing can only be effected in the finest weather.

SUNKEN VESSEL, RIVER YARRA.

MASTERS of vessels and others navigating the River Yarra are hereby notified that the *Kohinoor* lies sunk about 300 yards below the powder-magazine dock. She lies between the last two mooring piles on east bank in 12 feet water. Distance between sunken vessel and west bank is 162 feet. Abreast of the vessel there is a navigable space of about 50 feet. The vessel has a strong list to port.

Masters of vessels must observe extreme caution in passing the wreck.

Until removed, two bright lights will be exhibited from sunset to sunrise—one in the fore stay, the other in the mizzen rigging, and red flags will be hoisted by day.

FISHERIES ACT 1873.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Fisheries Act 1873* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council from time to time, by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, might substitute other weights for the weights set opposite the names of every or any of the species of fish mentioned in the second schedule thereto, or for the weights substituted for any of such weights by any previous proclamation, and might prescribe for every or any of the species of fish in the second schedule mentioned a size less than which it should be unlawful to take, sell, or expose for sale, or possess fish of such species: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby substitute other weights for the weights set opposite the names of the fish hereinafter mentioned in the second schedule to the said Act, and do prescribe for the species of fish hereinafter mentioned a size less than which it shall be unlawful to take, sell, or expose for sale, or possess fish of such species, that is to say:—

- Schnapper shall be 12 ounces in lieu of 8 ounces,
- Soles shall be 5 ounces in lieu of 3 ounces,
- Flounders shall be 5 ounces in lieu of 3 ounces.

CLEAN DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 66th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Administrator of the Government in Council has revoked all previous orders relating to the Clean Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter defined shall be Clean Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz. :-

BALLARAT CLEAN DISTRICT.—(being the late Ballarat Clean Districts No. 1 and 2 amalgamated).—Commencing on the Werribee River where it is intersected by the eastern boundary of the town of Ballan; thence by the east, west, and north boundaries of that town bearing respectively north, west, and south to the before-mentioned river; thence up that river to its source in the Main Dividing Range; thence by that range bearing south-westerly to the Peerwerth run; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of that run to the Warrenheip run; thence by the north-eastern boundaries of that and Wyndham runs to the Dowling Forest run; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of that run to Burrinbeet run; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries thereof to Langi Kalkal run; thence by the northern boundaries of that and Eurambeen runs to the above-mentioned dividing range; thence by that range to the northern boundary of the United Ararat and Burrumbeep Goldfields and Farmers' Common; thence westerly by that common to the Armstrong Common; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of that common to the Black range; thence southerly by that range to the Ararat Common; thence by the west boundary of the Ararat Common to the boundary of the Lexington run; thence by the eastern and southern boundaries of that run to Barton run; thence by the eastern, southern, and portion of western boundaries thereof to Mount Burchett run; thence by the eastern, southern, and western boundaries thereof to La Rose, Mokepille, and Lexington run; thence by the western boundary of that run to Woortook run thence by the southern boundaries of that run, Rosebrook, and Brim Spring runs to Glenisla run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that run and Markanger run to the Plains run; thence, by the north-eastern boundaries of that run, Mount Sturgeon Plains North, and Mount Sturgeon Plains run to Lintithgow Plains run; thence by the northern boundaries of that run, Burril-burril, and Glenrouald runs to Greenvale run; thence by the southern and eastern boundaries of that run to the Lake Manonia run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to View Lake run; thence by the western and southern boundaries of that run and the southern boundaries of Fiery Creek and St. Enoch's runs to the Benjamin run; thence by the south-western and south-eastern boundaries thereof to the Mount Emu run; thence by the southern boundaries of that and Carnham, Nuntingbool, Bantaw, Warrenheip, Peerwerth, Borambeeta, Bunterston, and Ballan runs to the southern boundary of the before-named town of Ballan; and thence by the southern and eastern boundaries thereof to the commencing point.

GREYLONG CLEAN DISTRICT.—Commencing at Cape Otway; thence by a line bearing northerly to the south-east angle of the Forrest run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that and Pirron Yallock runs to the shore of Lake Craugamite; thence by the eastern boundary of that lake to the Junction Creek which forms the southern boundary of the Poliah run; thence by the said southern boundary and the north-eastern boundary of said run to the Frenchman's station; thence by the eastern boundaries of that and Glenfine runs, and by the northern boundary of the last-named run to the Nairngal run; thence by a portion of the eastern boundary of Nairngal run and the eastern boundary of Mount Bute run to the south-east corner of allotment 80 parish of Mannabadar; thence by a straight line easterly to the junction of a small creek with the River Leigh about twenty-six chains north of the Mount Mercer Cattle Station pre-emptive right; thence down the said River Leigh to the boundary of Golf Hill property easterly and southerly to the boundary of Native Creek property; thence southerly by the boundary of said property to the Burnside property; thence southerly and westerly by the boundaries of Barwon Park, Murdiduke, Ingelby, and Yan-yan Gurt properties to the west corner of allotment 20 A, parish of Bamhra; thence southerly by the surveyed road to Loutitt Bay, and thence south-westerly by the sea shore to the point of commencement.

GIPPSLAND CLEAN DISTRICT.—Commencing at the point on the sea-coast where the eastern boundary of the county of Morrimington abuts thereon; thence northerly by the said boundary to the Powlett West A run; thence by that run to Mountain Glen run; thence northerly, easterly and northerly by that run to the Mog; thence across the Mog to the eastern boundary of Tanjil Hills run; thence by that boundary to the north-eastern corner thereof; thence by a straight line to Mount Baw-baw; thence by the south-eastern and eastern boundaries of Mount Useful run to the Main Dividing Range; thence by that range to Mount Hotham; thence north-easterly by the watershed between the head waters of the Little River and the head waters of the Cobungra and Bundarah creeks to Mount Cope; thence northerly by the watershed between the head waters of the Little River and the head waters of the Big River to Mount Nelson, Bogong; thence south-easterly by a range dividing between the waters of the Big River and the heads of Snowy Creek to Mount Wills; thence easterly by Wombat Creek, being the south boundary of Mount Martin run, to its junction with the Mitta-mitta River; thence north-easterly by the south-east boundary of the Gibbo run to the south-east corner of said run; thence by the north-east boundary of said run to the north-west corner of Buemba run; thence easterly by the northern boundary of Buemba run to the trigonometrical station on Mount Gibbo; thence by a straight line to the north-west corner of the Tom Groggin run, as gazetted in

Government Gazette of 16th February 1872; thence by the north boundary of said run to the Indi River; thence up the Indi and Upper Indi River, being the boundary between the colonies of Victoria and New South Wales, to Forest Hill; thence south-easterly by the boundary-line between said colonies to Cape Howe; and thence south-westerly by the sea-coast to the point of commencement.

KILMOOR CLEAN DISTRICT.—Commencing at the junction of the Goulburn River with the Murray River; thence up the Goulburn River to the Muddy Creek; thence up the Muddy Creek to the north-west corner of the Killingworth run; thence south by the west and south-west boundary of that run to the north-east corner of Murrindindi East run; thence south by the east boundary of that run and Muddy Creek or Lambourne run to the source of the Muddy Creek in the Main Dividing Range; thence by that range to the Glenvale run; thence by the eastern, northern, and western boundaries of that run to the aforesaid range; thence again by that range to the source of the Campaspe River; thence down that river to the Langwornen run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to the Coliban River; thence down that river to the Campaspe River aforesaid; thence again by that river to the Axedals East run; thence by the southern, eastern, and northern boundaries of that run to the Campaspe River; thence again by that river to the Campaspe River run; thence by the southern, western, and northern boundaries of that run to the Campaspe River; again down that river to the Wharparrella run; thence by the southern and eastern boundaries of that run to the River Murray; and thence up that river to the commencing point. The Murrindindi East and Muddy Creek runs are now included in this district.

NORTH-EASTERN CLEAN DISTRICT.—Commencing at the junction of the Goulburn River with the Murray River; thence up the Goulburn River to the Broken River; thence up that river to the eastern boundary of the Benalla run; thence northerly to the south-east corner of the Yubba-yubba run; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of that run to the south-west corner of St. James' run; thence south-easterly by the southern boundary of that run to the western boundary of the Peechelba run; thence southerly and easterly by the western and southern boundaries of that run to the Killawarra run; thence southerly by the western boundary of that run to the north-west corner of Springs Station run; thence by that run southerly to the north-west boundary of Emu station run; thence south-westerly by the north-west boundary of that run to the Broken River aforesaid; thence up that river to the Samaria run; thence by the northern and eastern boundaries of Samaria run to Fern Hill run; thence by the western and southern boundaries of Fern Hill run to Dueran run; thence easterly by the northern boundary of Dueran run to the King River; thence by that run and by a line bearing south-easterly to Mount Howitt, in the Main Dividing Range; thence by that range to the Mount Hotham; thence north easterly by the watershed between the head waters of the Little River and the head waters of the Cobungra and Bundarah creeks to Mount Cope; thence northerly by the watershed between the head waters of the Little River and the head waters of the Big River to Mount Nelson Bogong; thence south-easterly by a range dividing between the waters of the Big River and the heads of the Snowy Creek to Mount Wills; thence easterly by Wombat Creek, being the south boundary to Mount Martin run, to its junction with the Mitta-mitta River; thence north-easterly by the south-east boundary of the Gibbo run to the south-east corner of said run; thence by the north-east boundary of said run to the north-west corner of Buemba run; thence easterly by the northern boundary of Buemba run to the trigonometrical station on Mount Gibbo; thence easterly by a straight line to the north-west corner of Tom Groggin run, as gazetted in *Government Gazette* of 15th February 1872; thence by the north boundary of said run to the Indi River; thence by that river to the Murray River; and thence down that river to the point of commencement: Provided that the Roschial run and the following allotments in the Agricultural area of Verden, county of Delatite, viz.: allotments B, 16, 19, 20, 23, 50, E, 46, 41, 40, 39, 49, 45, 42, 38, 69, 43, 44, 62, 63, 65, 61, 103, 102, F, 64, 67, 70, 71, 72, 73, 65, 66, 94, 95, 96, 89, 88, 82, 81, 74, 93, 91, 86, 87, 83, 75, 80, 79, 84, 85 are also included in this district.

SANDHURST CLEAN DISTRICT.—[The boundaries of this district are co-terminous with the Sandhurst district.]—Commencing at the point on the Murray River where the eastern boundary of the Murrabit run abuts thereon; thence by the said boundary of that run and the eastern and southern boundaries of the Reedy Lake run to Quambatook East run; thence by the northern boundary of that run and by the northern, western, and southern boundaries of the Quambatook West run to the Avoca River; thence up that river to the Spring Bank West run; thence by the northern boundary of that run and the western boundaries of that run and of the Coonover A and Yawong Springs runs; also by the southern boundary of the last-named run to the Spring Hill run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to the Brennath run; thence by the western and north-western boundaries of that run to Powlett Plains run; thence by the southern boundaries of that run easterly to the north-west angle of Catto's run; thence by the northern and eastern boundaries of that run to the Inflexwood and Wedderburn road; thence by that road south-easterly to the north-west angle of the township of Marong; thence by lines easterly to the south-east angle of the parish of Nerrang; thence by the west boundary of the parish of Sandhurst bearing south three miles; thence east sixty chains to the south-west boundary of the borough of Sandhurst; thence easterly, north-easterly, and northerly to its intersection with the Sandhurst and Axedale road; thence by that road easterly to the north-west angle of the township of Axedale; thence south to the south-west angle of that township reserve; thence easterly to the Campaspe River; thence down that river to its junction

with the Murray River; and thence down that river to the point of commencement: Provided that the whole of the Warparilla and Axedale runs, and also the whole of the borough of Sandhurst, shall belong to this district.

SEYMOUR CLEAN DISTRICT.—Commencing at the junction of the Broken River with the Goulburn; thence up that river to the west angle of the Kathkin run; thence northerly by the western boundaries of that run and of the Gobur run to the northern boundary of the last-mentioned run; thence easterly by the northern boundary of that run and the northern boundaries of Borodomanin South, Borodomanin North, and Junction runs to the Barjarg run; thence northerly by the western boundary of that run to the Lima run; thence westerly and northerly by the southern and western boundaries of that run to the Broken River; and thence down that river to the north-west corner of the Emu Station run; thence north-easterly by the north-west boundary of that run to the western boundary of Spring Station run; thence northerly by that boundary to the south-east boundary of Killawarra run; thence northerly by the western boundary of that run to the south-east corner of the Peechelba run; thence westerly and northerly by the southern and western boundaries of that run to the southern boundary of St. James' run; thence north-westerly by that boundary to the eastern boundary of the Yabba-yabba run; thence southerly by the eastern boundaries of the Yabba-yabba and Benalla runs to the Broken River aforesaid; and thence down that river to the point of commencement.

[The boundaries of the above described Seymour Clean district are co-terminous with the Seymour district.]

WESTERN CLEAN DISTRICT (being the late Wimmera and Hamilton Clean Districts amalgamated).—Commencing on the Murray River at the point where the western boundary of the colony of Victoria abuts thereon; thence up that river to the eastern boundary of the Murrabit run; thence by the said boundary of that run and the eastern and southern boundaries of the Reedy Lake run to the Quambatook East run; thence by the northern boundary of that run and by the northern, western, and southern boundaries of the Quambatook West run to the Avoca River; thence up that river to the Spring Bank West run; thence by the northern boundary of that run and by the northern boundaries of that run and of the Coonover A and Yawong Springs runs, also by the southern boundary of the last-named run to the Avoca Forest West run; thence by the western and southern boundaries of that run to the Avoca River aforesaid; thence again by that river to the Amphitheatre run; thence by the north-western and western boundaries of that run to the Main Dividing Range; thence by that range to the north boundary of the United Ararat and Hurrumbheep Goldfields and Farmers' Common; thence westerly by that common to the Armstrong's Common; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of that common to the Black Range; thence southerly by that range to the Ararat Common; thence by the west boundary of the Ararat Common to the Lexington run; thence by the eastern and southern boundaries of that run to the Barton run; thence by the eastern, southern, and western boundaries of that run to the northern boundary of the Mount Burchett run; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of that run to the Moora-moora run; thence by the eastern, northern, and western boundaries of that run, the western boundaries of Victoria Valley and Mount Sturgeon No. 1 runs, the western and southern boundaries of Mount Sturgeon No. 2 run, and the southern boundaries of Mount Sturgeon No. 3 and No. 4 runs to Pullockdale run; thence by the southern and part of the eastern boundaries of that and Greenvale runs easterly to the southern boundary of Lake Manonia run; thence by the southern boundary of that lake, by part of the western boundary of View Lake run, by the southern boundaries of that and Fiery Creek runs and part of the southern boundary of St. Enoch's run to the Benjamin run; thence by the western, southern, and eastern boundaries of that run and part of the southern boundary of Mount Emu run to the north-western corner of the Emu Hill run; thence by the western boundary of that and of Western Piggorett runs, the western and southern boundaries of Mindi, and the western and part of the southern boundaries of Commercial to Kuriook-kuriook run; thence by the western and part of the southern boundaries of that run to Yairam run; thence by the western boundary of that run and the northern boundary of Watch Hill run westerly to lake Corangamite; thence along the eastern shore of that lake to the eastern boundaries of Farring Yaloc and Forrest runs; thence from the south-east corner of the last-named run by a direct line to Cape Oway; thence by the sea-coast westerly to the boundary line between South Australia and Victoria; thence along that line northerly to the Murray River; and thence up that river to the commencing point.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: And whereas by a proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony bearing date the ninth day of May 1864 the United Town and Gold Field Common of Buninyong was increased, and it is expedient further to increase the same: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the Buninyong United Town and Goldfield Common by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.:-

5. The Superintendent of the State Nursery will pack, address, and deliver the trees at the Macedon railway station, unless any purchaser should elect personally to superintend the same or should appoint another to do so in his behalf, but in such case no deduction in the prices will be made as an allowance for cost of packing.

6. All charges levied upon the trees subsequent to their delivery at the railway station, Macedon, shall be borne by the consignee.

Crown) to be made of flour the produce of prime wheat, from which twelve per cent. has been extracted in bran and waste.

8. Milk.—The milk must be fresh, pure, and of the best quality.

4. Fresh meat is to be supplied in such proportions as may be required, and, when the quantity admits, to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately, also buttocks only when ordered. When shins of beef form a portion of the supply, a fair proportion of the bone, not less than ten inches, must have been cut off. The sticking pieces must be removed from the fore quarters of beef.

5. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department concerned.

11. THIRD CALL. FIFTY-TWO SERVICES.

TENDERS are hereby invited, and will be received until Noon of Tuesday the 9th May 1876, for the Conveyance of Post Office Mails as undermentioned, from the 1st July 1876, for two years, to 30th June 1878.

The covers of Tenders for these services must be endorsed "Tender for Third Call."

Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and may be forwarded (if by post, prepaid) addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for the Conveyance of Mails" endorsed on the cover, or placed in the tender-box at the General Post Office.

Tenders are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender, and every tender will be taken to include the entire service as called for. The amount of the tender must be stated in words as well as figures.

Every tender must bear the *bonâ fide* signatures and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit-receipt for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.
