GAOL AT DUNOLLY DISCONTINUED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FRASERSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the colony of Victoria, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of March One thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, the building and premises therein referred to and situate at Dunolly were declared to be a gaol, prison, and house of correction: And whereas by another proclamation bearing date the twenty-fifth day of April One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, the said building and premises were re-proclaimed a public gaol, prison, and house of correction: And whereas the said premises have ceased to be used for the confinement of prisoners: Now therefore, I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the first proclamation hereinbefore referred to, and so much of the second proclamation as relates to the buildings and premises at Dunolly aforesaid, used as a gaol, prison, and house of correction, and do declare that the said buildings and premises shall from henceforth cease to be a gaol, prison, and house of correction.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-second day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, and in the thirty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign.

**REGULATIONS FOR PORTS AND HARBORS.**

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Passengers, Harbors, and Navigation Statute 1865* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of ports in Victoria and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs, and might appoint officers to carry out and enforce such rules and regulations; and from time to time in like manner might alter, amend, or repeal any such limits, boundaries, rules, and regulations, and substitute others in their stead: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby repeal No. 89 of the existing rules and regulations, and do substitute therefor the following rule, which is applicable to all ports and harbors within Victoria, that is to say—

89. Every pilot while employed in piloting any ship or vessel shall inform the master or person in charge of same of the requirements of the Port and Harbor Regulations, and shall report to the Chief Harbor-master in the event of any such master or person in charge neglecting, failing, or refusing to comply with any of the said Regulations: Provided that if such pilot shall neglect to report such breach he shall be deemed guilty of misconduct and neglect of duty, and shall be liable to be punished under section 51 of *The Passengers, Harbors, and Navigation Statute 1865*.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Order, amongst other things, altering, for the purpose of adjusting the boundaries of contiguous municipal districts, being shires, without any petition; and it was further enacted that every Order under the provisions of Part I. of the said Act should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect, as from the day of such publication: And whereas it has been deemed expedient that a portion of the boundary-line between the Shires of Wimmera and Lowan should be altered: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby alter and adjust the boundaries of the said Shires of Wimmera and Lowan, and doth re-define the boundaries thereof respectively in manner following, that is to say:—

**THE SHIRE OF WIMMERA.**—Commencing at the intersection of the north boundary of the parish of Werrigar with the Yarrambiack Creek; thence southerly up the course of said creek to its intersection by the northern boundary of the Kewell run, eastward by the boundaries of Kewell, Kirkwood, and Rich Avon west runs to the Avon River; thence by that river and the Richardson River, southerly to a point north of the east boundary of allotment 192, parish of Wirchibela; thence to the south-east angle of said allotment: west to the north-east angle of allotment 226, parish of Riachella; south to the road between Navarre and Horsham opposite the south-east angle of allotment 205 in the same parish; westward along same road to the south-west angle of allotment 197 of the aforesaid parish; north and west by the parish boundaries of Riachella and Marma to the main road between Glenorchy and Horsham; along this road to opposite the southward angle of allotment 43, parish of Marma; west to the River Wimmera; up this river to a point north-east from Briggs' Bluff, Grampian Range to said bluff and along the watershed of the Grampians to the north-east angle of the county of Dundas; thence north-westerly by that county boundary to the most northern bend of the River Glenelg; thence following a right line between that point and a point on the western boundary of the colony three miles north-easterly from Lake Cadmite until its intersection by the north-western boundary of the Maryvale run; thence north-easterly by the boundary of that run to its north angle; thence south-easterly by the boundary of the Spring Bank run to its south angle; thence by the south-eastern boundaries of the Spring Bank and Spring Hill runs to the south-east angle of the latter run; thence by the western, north-western, and northern boundaries of the Wyn Wyn run and the north boundary of the Polkemet run to the River Wimmera; thence down that river to the south boundary of the parish of Dimboola; thence east by the south boundary of the said parish to its south-east angle; thence by the east boundary of the parishes of Dimboola, Katyil, and Terranyurk, to the north-eastern angle of the last-named parish; thence by the north boundaries of the parishes of Cannum and Werrigar East to the commencing point.

**THE SHIRE OF LOWAN.**—Bounded by a line commencing at a point on the western boundary of the colony sixty-six miles south of the River Murray; thence east by a right line to the east boundary of the Electoral District of the Wimmera; southward along this boundary to its intersection by the northern boundary of the parish of Werrigar; thence west by the north boundaries of the parishes of Werrigar and Cannum to the north-east angle of the parish of Terranyurk; thence by the east boundaries of the parishes of Terranyurk, Katyil, and Dimboola to the south-east angle of the last-named parish; thence by the south boundary of the parish of Dimboola to the Wimmera River; thence southerly up the course of that river to the intersection of the northern boundary of the Polkemet run; thence westerly by that boundary and the north boundary of the Wyn Wyn run to the north-western boundary of the latter run; thence south-westerly and southerly by the north-western and western boundaries of the Wyn Wyn run

**BALLARAT CLEAN DISTRICT**—(being the late Ballarat Clean Districts No. 1 and 2 amalgamated).—Commencing on the Werribee River where it is intersected by the eastern boundary of the town of Ballan; thence by the east, west, and north boundaries of that town bearing respectively north, west, and south to the before-mentioned river; thence up that river to its source in the Main Dividing Range; thence by that range bearing south-westerly to the Peerwerth run; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of that run to the Warrenheip run; thence by the north-eastern boundaries of that and Wyndham runs to the Dowling Forest run; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of that run to Burumbet run; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries thereof to Lanni Kalkal run; thence by the northern boundaries of that and Eurumbet runs to the above-mentioned dividing range; thence by that range to the northern boundary of the United Ararat and Burumbet Goldfields and Farmers' Common; thence westerly by that common to the Armstrong Common; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of that common to the Black range; thence southerly by that range to the Ararat Common; thence by the west boundary of the Ararat Common to the boundary of the Lexington run; thence by the eastern and southern boundaries of that run to Barton run; thence by the eastern, southern, and portion of western boundaries thereof to Mount Burchett run; thence by the eastern, southern, and western boundaries thereof to La Rose, Mokepille, and Lexington run; thence by the western boundary of that run to Woortook run thence by the southern boundaries of that run, Rosebrook, and Brim Spring runs to Glenisla run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that run and Markanger run to the Plains run; thence by the north-eastern boundaries of that run, Mount Sturgeon Plains North, and Mount Sturgeon Plains run to Linlithgow Plains run; thence by the northern boundaries of that run, Burril-burril, and Glenonald runs to Greenvale run; thence by the southern and eastern boundaries of that run to the Lake Manonia run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to View Lake run; thence by the western and southern boundaries of that run and the southern boundaries of Fiery Creek and St. Enoch's runs to the Benjamin run; thence by the south-western and south-eastern boundaries thereof to the Mount Emu run; thence by the southern boundaries of that and Carubham, Nundingbool, Banshaw, Warrenheip, Peerwerth, Borumbeta, Rutherford, and Ballan runs to the southern boundary of the before-named town of Ballan; and thence by the southern and eastern boundaries thereof to the commencing point.

*Government Gazette* of 16th February 1872; thence by the north boundary of said run to the Indi River; thence up the Indi and Upper Indi River, being the boundary between the colonies of Victoria and New South Wales, to Forest Hill; thence south-easterly by the boundary-line between said colonies to Cape Howe; and thence south-westerly by the sea-coast to the point of commencement.

*Purposes to which proceeds of disposition are to be applied.*—To such purposes of the Roman Catholic Church as may from time to time be agreed upon by the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Melbourne and a majority of the trustees.
