3. Exceptions .- All fees under the said enactments not of right payable into the Consolidated Revenue of the colony of Victoria. 4. Stamps to be adhesive.—Stamps to be used under the Statute shall be adhesive.

5. All fees to be paid in stamps.—Save as hereinbefore excepted, every fee payable under any of the said enactments shall be paid by stamps affixed as hereinafter provided to some paper or document having reference to that in respect of which the fee is navable. paper or document have which the fee is payable.

6. Documents to be stamped.—Stamps for fees payable in respect of the several matters specified in the first column of the schedule hereto shall be affixed to the corresponding documents specified in the second column of the schedule hereto.

7. Affixing of stamps in other cases.—Stamps for every other fee payable under any of the said enactments shall be affixed to a short written or printed note or pracipe asking for that in respect of which the fee is payable, and signed by or for the person by whom the fee is payable; and the heads of the several departments of the public service in which fees under the said enactment are respectively payable shall from time to time prescribe the form in which such notes or pracipes are to be taken and preserved. taken and preserved.

8. Cancellation of stamps.—Before anything is done, or permitted to be done, in respect of that for which a fee is payable by stamps, the stamps by which the fee is paid shall be cancelled in manner provided by section 12 of the Statute.

9. Record of cancellation.—The heads of the several departments in which fees payable by stamps shall be collected shall cause an exact account or record to be kept of the number and denomination of all stumps cancelled by the officers of their several departments, and of the dates of such cancellation

10. Allowance for spoiled stamps.—Where, through any mistake or inadvertence, any stamp has been used and cancelled unnecessarily by any officer in the public service, the head of the department may certify in writing signed by him that such stamp is fit subject for allowance, and on production of the certificate and the stamp to which it relates, the Minister administering the Act may issue a stamp or stamps of equivalent value to the applicant.

TREATY FOR THE MUTUAL SURRENDER OF BRITISH AND HAYTIAN FUGITIVE CRIMINALS.

Sin,-I have the honor to transmit to you, for publication in the colony under your Government, a copy of a Treaty between Her Majesty and the Republic of Hayti for the mutual surrender of fugitive criminals, as well as a copy of the Order in Council of the 5th instant for carrying that Treaty into effect.

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament made and passed in the Session of Parliament holden in the thirty-third and thirty-fourth ' years of the reign of Her present Majesty intituled An Act for amending the law relating to the Extradition of Criminals, and also by an Act of Parliament made and passed in the Session of Parliament holden in the thirty-sixth and thirty-seventh years of the reign of Her present Majesty intituled An Act to amend the Extradition Act 1870, it was amongst other things enacted, that where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council; direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that Her Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of Her Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the seventh day of December One thousand eight hundred and seventy-four between Her Majesty and the President of the Republic of Hayti, for the Mutual Extradition of Fugitive Criminals, which Treaty is in the terms following :-

Treaty is in the terms following:—

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and His Excellency the President of the Republic of Hayti, having judged it expedient, with a view to a better administration of justice, and to the prevention of crime within the two countries and their jurisdictions, that persons charged with or convicted of the crimes hereinafter enumerated, and being fugitives from justice, should, under certain circumstances, be reciprocally delivered up;
Her Britannic Majesty and the President of Hayti have named as their Plenipotentiaries to conclude a Treaty for this purpose, that is to say:
Her Mritanic Majesty and the President of Hayti have named and Ireland, Spenser St. John, Eaq., Minister-Resident Britain and Ireland, Spenser St. John, Eaq., Minister-Resident and Consul-General of Her Britannic Majesty in the Republic of Hayti and Her Chargé d'Affaires in the Dominican Republic:

And His Excellency the President of the Republic of Hayti, M. Surville Toussaint, ex-Senator;
Who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon and concluded the following Articles:—

Article I.

ARTICLE I.

The High Contracting Parties engage to deliver up to each other those persons who, being accused or convicted of a crime committed in the territory of the one Party, shall be found within the territory of the other Party, under the circumstances and conditions stated in the present Treaty.

 16. Arson.

 20. Sinking or destroying a vessel at sea, or attempting or conspiring to do so.
 21. Assaults on board a ship on the high seas with intent to destroy life, or to do grievous bodily harm.

ARTICLE III.

No Haytian shall be delivered up by the Government of Hayti to the Government of the United Kingdom, and no subject of the United Kingdom shall be delivered up by the Government thereof to the Government of Hayti.

ARTICLE IV.

The extradition shall not take place if the person claimed on the part of the Government of the United Kingdom, or the person claimed on the part of the Government of the Republic of Hayti, has already been tried and discharged, or punished, or is still under trial in Hayti or in the United Kingdom respectively, for the crime for which his extradition is demanded.

If the person claimed on the part of the Government of the United Kingdom, or if the person claimed on the part of the Government of the Republic of Hayti should be under examination for any other crime in Hayti or in the United Kingdom respectively, his extradition shall be deferred until the conclusion of the trial, and the full execution of any punishment awarded to him.

ARTICLE V.

The extradition shall not take place if, subsequently to the commission of the crime, or the institution of the penal prosecution, or the conviction thereon, exemption from prosecution or punishment has been acquired by lapse of time, according to the laws of the State applied to.

A fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered if the offence in respect of which his surrender is demanded is one of a poli-tical character, or if he prove that the requisition for his sur-render has, in fact, been made with a view to try or punish him for an offence of a political character.

A person surrendered can in no case be kept in prison, or be brought to trial in the state to which the surrender has been made, for any other crime or on account of any other matters than those for which the extradition shall have taken place. This stipulation does not apply to crimes committed after the extradition.

ARTICLE VIII.

The requisition for extradition shall be made through the Diplomatic Agents of the High Contracting Parties respec-

The requisition for the extradition of an accused person must be accompanied by a warrant of arrest issued by the competent authority of the State requiring the extradition, and by such evidence as, according to the laws of the place where the accused is found, would justify his arrest if the crime had been committed there.

If the requisition relates to a person already convicted, it must be accompanied by the sentence of condemnation passed against the convicted person by the competent Court of the State that makes the requisition for extradition.

A requisition for extradition cannot be founded on sentences passed in contumaciam.

If the requisition for extradition be in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the competent authorities of the State applied to shall proceed to the arrest of the fugitive. The prisoner is then to be brought before a competent magistrate, who is to examine him, and to conduct the preliminary investigation of the case, just as if the apprehension had taken place for a crime committed in the same country.

ARTICLE X.

The extradition shall not take place before the expiration of fifteen days from the apprehension, and then only if the evidence be found sufficient, according to the laws of the State applied to, either to justify the committal of the prisoner for trial in case the crime has been committed in the Territory of the said State, or to prove that the prisoner is the identical person convicted by the Courts of the State which makes the requisition.

ARTICLE XI.

ARTICLE XI.

In the examinations which they have to make in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the authorities of the State applied to shall admit as entirely valid evidence the sworn depositions or statements of witnesses taken in the other State or copies thereof, and likewise the warrants and sentences issued therein, provided such documents are signed or certified by a judge, magistrate, or other officer of such State, and are authenticated by the oath of some witnesses, or by being sealed with the official scal of the Minister of Justice or some other Minister of State.

The High Contracting Parties renounce any claim for the reimbursement of the expenses incurred by them in the arrest and maintenance of the person to be surrendered, and his conveyance till placed on board ship: they reciprocally agree to bear such expenses themselves.

ARTICLE XV.

ARTICLE XV.

The stipulations of the present Treaty shall be applicable to the Colonics and foreign possessions of Her Britannic Majesty.

The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal who has taken refuge in any of such Colonies or foreign possessions shall be made to the Governor or chief authority of such Colony or possession by the chief Consular Officer of Hayti in such Colony or-possession.

Such requisitions may be disposed of, subject always, as nearly as may be, to the provisions of this Treaty, by the said Government or chief authority, who, however, shall be at liberty either to grant the surrender or to refer the matter to his Government.

Her Britannic Majesty shall, however, be at liberty to make special arrangements in the British Colonics and foreign possessions for the surrender of Haytian criminals, who may take refuge within such Colonics and foreign possessions, on the basis, as nearly as may be, of the provisions of the present Treater

basis, as nearry as may be, or the surrender of a fugitive criminal from any colony or foreign possession of Her Britannic Majesty shall be governed by the rules laid down in the preceding articles of the present Treaty.

ARTICLE XVI.

The present Treaty shall come into force ten days after its publication, in conformity with the forms prescribed by the laws of the High Contracting Parties. It may be terminated by either of the High Contracting Parties, but shall remain in force for six months after notice has been given for its termination.

The President of the Republic of Hayti engages to apply to the Senate for the necessary authorization to give effect to the present Treaty, immediately after its meeting.

The present Treaty shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged as soon as possible.

In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the same, and have affixed thereto the seals of their arms.
