SOUTH PACIFIC OCEAN.

Position of Boscawen and Keppel Islands and of Curaçoa Reef.

Information has been received from Mr. E. Layard, Her Majesty's Consul at Fiji, that the brig *Vision* on a recent voyage from Samoa to Levuka passed within 100 yards of a dangerous coral patch, the position of the vessel being then from 16 to 20 miles distant from, and bearing a little to the east and north of, Boscawen Island.

The sea broke on the danger with great violence, and though under water it was distinctly seen, and estimated to be about 60 yards in extent.

The reef, which is believed to be that discovered by H.M.S. *Curaçoa* in 1865, does not always show, as on this occasion the brig *Vision* had passed before the break was observed: it is therefore very dangerous.

From a re-investigation of the positions of Boscawen and Keppel islands and that of Curaçoa Reef, included in the above particulars, the following positions have been assigned to them respectively on the Admiralty Charts, Nos. 780 and 2483, viz.:

Boscawen Island, lat. 15° 58' S., long. 173° 52' W.
Keppel Island, " 15° 52' S., " 178° 52' W.
Curaçoa Reef, " 15° 31' S., " 178° 44' W.

AUSTRALIA—NEW SOUTH WALES.

(1) Green Light in Sugar Loaf Point Lighthouse.

With reference to the fourth paragraph of Notice to Mariners, No. 173, dated 29th November 1875, on the exhibition of a green additional light from Sugar Loaf Point Lighthouse:—

The Colonial Government of Queensland has given notice, that the green light is visible between the bearings of south and S.E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. for a distance of about 3 miles, including in this arc the Seal rocks and adjacent dangers, but not Edith breaker, which is out of the fairway, and from which the green light cannot be seen.

NOTE.—Vessels standing towards, or rounding, Sugar Loaf Point must keep out of the range of the green light.

TORRES STRAIT.

(2) Shoal in Prince of Wales Channel.

The Colonial Government of New South Wales has received information that the barque *Moneta* grazed over a shoal in Prince of Wales Channel in July 1875, not laid down in the charts.

The following compass bearings were taken whilst the vessel was on the shoal, viz.:

West extreme of Goode Island ... S.E. by E.
Hammond Rock ... N.E. by E. easterly.
Booby Island ... W. by S. $\frac{1}{2}$ S.

These bearings will not give the exact position of the shoal, but it is assumed to be nearly one mile from the west end of Goode Island, and approximately in lat. 10° 33' S., long. 142° 8' 15" E.

NOTE.—Mariners should use due caution when navigating this channel in the neighborhood of the west point of Goode Island.

The births of 692 children, viz., 368 boys and 324 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of June. In the month of May 767 births were registered, or 75 more than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in June numbered 412, viz., 242 of males and 170 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 280. The deaths were fewer than those in May by 77, but exceed the average of June during the previous ten years by 95. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of the month during those ten years by 37 only.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 63.5° on the 5th, and the lowest was 33.1° on the 29th. The mean temperature of the month (48.1°) was nearly two degrees and a half below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (22.5°) took place on the 6th, viz., from a maximum of 59.6° to a minimum of 37.1°. The least range (6.6°) was on the 27th, viz., from a maximum of 53.0° to a minimum of 46.4°. The mean daily range was 14.0°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.051 inches) was a little above the average.

Males contributed 59 per cent. and females 41 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Thirty per cent. of the deaths were of children under the age of 5 years, as against 32 per cent. in June 1875 and 1874; 33 per cent. in June 1873; 42 per cent. in June 1872; 37 per cent. in June 1871 and 1870; 40 per cent. in June 1869; 45 per cent. in June 1868; 51 per cent. in June 1867; and 41 per cent. in June 1866.

Eighteen deaths of persons of the age of 75 years or upwards were recorded during the month, viz., those of a gentleman, aged 76, of dysentery; a female, aged 75, of old age; a laborer, aged 76, of cancer; a laborer, aged 76, of phthisis; a female inmate of the Lunatic Asylum, aged 76, of disease of the brain; an engineer, aged 76, of general debility; a female, aged 77, of congestion of the brain; another female of the same age, of congestion of the liver; a tailor, aged 78, of dysentery; two females, each aged 79, the one of paralysis, the other of old age; a gardener, aged 80, of bronchitis; a female, aged 80, of old age; a dairyman, aged 82, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 82, two females, aged 83 and 88, respectively, and a laborer's wife, aged 95, of old age.

Of the seventeen deaths registered during the month from external causes 13 are ascribed to accident, 1 to homicide, and 3 to suicide. The following are the particulars:—A boy, aged 13, was killed by a blow on the head by a steam saw; a compositor, aged 19, died of the effects of injuries to the legs caused by a fall when running; a laborer, aged 26, was crushed by a falling tree; a clerk, aged 45, was killed by falling into a cutting; a carter, aged 26, and a butcher, aged 43, were passed over by vehicles; a chemist, aged 35, was accidentally poisoned with opium; a midshipman, aged 21, died of the effects of an overdose of laudanum, self-administered, with what intent unknown; a fisherman, aged 53, was accidentally drowned; a ship's carpenter, aged 55, was found drowned in Hobson's Bay; three infants, viz., a male, aged 9 days, and two females aged 3 and 5 months respectively, were suffocated in bed; a laborer, aged 32, died of fracture of the skull caused by a blow on the head inflicted by a person who was found guilty of manslaughter; a house-painter, aged 49, is supposed to have drowned himself whilst in a state of suicidal mania brought on by drink; a laborer, aged 28, committed suicide by cutting his throat; and a draper, aged 23, hanged himself.

Seventy-four deaths, or 18 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—35 in the Melbourne Hospital, 8 in the Immigrants' Home, 3 in the Children's Hospital, 1 in the Alfred Hospital, 1 in the Lying-in Hospital, 1 in the Benevolent Asylum, 2 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 10 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in St. Vincent de Paul's Orphanage.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 124, of which 72, or 58 per cent., were of males; and 52, or 42 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 70 were under one year of age, 23 were between one and two, 13 were between two and three, 10 were between three and four, and 8 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 288. Of these, 170, or 59 per cent., were males, and 118, or 41 per cent., were females; 23 were between five and ten, 14 were between ten and fifteen, 16 were between fifteen and twenty, 12 were between twenty and twenty-five, 8 were between twenty-five and thirty, 27 were between thirty and thirty-five, 31 were between thirty-five and forty, 25 were between forty and forty-five, 29 were between forty-five and fifty, 24 were between fifty and fifty-five, 21 were between fifty-five and sixty, 16 were between sixty and sixty-five, 16 were between sixty-five and seventy, 8 were between seventy and seventy-five, 11 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 7 were upwards of eighty.

The number of deaths registered during the quarter ended 30th June 1876 was 1,384, and the mean temperature in the shade for the same period was 52.4°. The deaths thus exceeded by 345 the average of the corresponding quarter during the previous ten years, or by 153 if allowance be made for the increase of population. The mean temperature in the shade was more than one and a half degrees below the average, and was the lowest on record for the June quarter since the publication of these reports was first commenced in 1860.

ADDITIONAL LAND REGULATIONS UNDER "THE LAND ACT 1869."

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-fourth day of July 1876.

PRESENT :

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, or rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby rescind, to the extent hereinafter mentioned, all rules, regulations, schedules, and orders hereinafter expressed to be rescinded, and doth make in lieu thereof the Regulations following; to commence and come into force on the passing hereof.

1. Except as to all matters done, rights acquired, and obligations incurred thereunder, the Regulations specified in Schedule I. hereto are hereby rescinded.
2. The schedules hereto shall be taken as part of these Regulations, and may be modified by the Minister.
3. These Regulations shall be read and construed with the Regulations dated 7th February 1876.
4. Any applicant for the forfeiture of any license issued under *The Land Act 1869* shall support his application by a statutory declaration setting forth the grounds and particulars on which such application is made, under the following heads, viz.:—
 - a. The time when the license was issued, the situation and area of the land, and the name of the licensee.
 - b. The nature of improvements (if any) on the land.
 - c. The name of the person or persons (if any) resident on the land.
 - d. The use to which the land has been applied.
 - e. Particulars of the conditions of the license which are alleged to have been broken or not fulfilled, or of the acts of fraud, illegality, or violation of the Act on the part of the licensee.
 - f. The occupation of the applicant for forfeiture, and the extent of land (if any) held by him in fee-simple or under lease or license, and the use to which such land is applied.
5. The application for forfeiture with the declaration shall be forwarded to the district surveyor in whose district the land is situated, who shall report thereon to the Minister.
6. The Minister may, if he think fit, call upon the licensee to show cause before a Local Land Board against the forfeiture of his license.
7. The Local Land Board may, if it recommend forfeiture of the license, at the same time recommend that the land shall be made available for selection under *The Land Act 1869*, or disposed of in any other manner.
8. The improvements upon any forfeited land shall be valued and disposed of in such manner as the Minister may deem fit.
9. No applicant for forfeiture shall by reason of such application be deemed to have any claim or prior right to the issue of a license for the land referred to, nor shall any Local Land Board recommend the issue of such a license.
10. All licenses issued under Part II. of *The Land Act 1869* shall be subject to the condition specified in Schedule II. hereto.
11. Whenever it shall appear that any land is within the limit of deviation of any proposed line of railway, or whenever, from any cause, it may be deemed desirable, the Minister may, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, order that all applications for land within the boundaries mentioned in such notice shall be accompanied by an undertaking in the form of Schedule III., to be signed by the applicant in the presence of a witness, whose address shall be given; and all licenses issued for any such land shall be subject to the conditions specified in Schedule IV.
12. All licenses issued under section 49 shall be subject to the condition specified in Schedule V. hereto.
13. Notwithstanding anything contained in Regulation 10 of 7th February 1876, the Governor may, if he think fit, order that a license may bear such date as shall equitably meet the circumstances of any special case.

SCHEDULE IV.

It shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, and at any time during the continuance of this license, to resume all or any portion of the land hereby licensed if the same should be required for [here insert the purpose specified in the notice requiring this special condition] purposes, repaying to the licensee a sum equal to the amount paid by him as rent or license fee in respect of every acre of such land so resumed, but the licensee shall not be entitled to receive nor be paid any compensation for severance, improvements, or fences thereon.

If the licensee shall apply for a lease of the land held under the within license and such application be granted, such lease shall be made subject to a similar condition to the above, without prejudice to the right of the Governor in Council to insist on such other conditions as may be deemed necessary.

SCHEDULE V.

Notwithstanding anything contained in the 4th and 5th conditions of this license any holder of a miner's right or lessee under the Gold Mining Leases Regulations, shall be allowed to enter upon the land and search for gold, and to mine thereon, and to erect and occupy mining plant or machinery within the area without making compensation to the licensee for surface or other damage. Provided always that such portions of the land as shall be occupied by buildings shall be secure from such intrusion unless with the consent of the licensee.

LOWAN SHIRE COMMONS.

Regulations made by the Council of the Shire of Lowan for the management of commons within the shire, as provided under "The Land Act 1869" relative to commons.

1. The assessment on stock depasturing on commons within the shire shall be respectively as follows. Large cattle over six months old, 4s. per head per year; horses over six months old, 6s. per head per year; sheep over six months old, 1s. 4d. per head per year; goats over six months old, 3s. per head per year.
2. Special licenses to depasture sheep intended for slaughter will be issued to any butcher approved of by the managers; the number not to exceed 100 sheep at one time; fees, 12s. 6d. per quarter.
3. All fees to be paid quarterly, in advance; the quarters to commence on the 1st day of January, 1st day of April, 1st day of July, and 1st day of October in each year.
4. Bulls and entire horses will not be permitted to run on the common without the written consent of the council.
5. The herdsman will be required to muster the stock as often as the council shall think necessary, in some convenient place, to be appointed by the council, to be branded with the common brand; public notice to be given by placards posted by the herdsman not less than three days previously. All stock to be branded by the herdsman; horses to be exempted from being branded.
6. All stock must be branded before being registered, and all goats over the age of six months must wear round their necks a wooden collar after the form of a triangle; each arm of such collar shall be eighteen inches in length. Goats found depasturing on the common without such collar shall be deemed trespassing, and will be dealt with accordingly.
7. No stock of any kind shall be turned on the common without giving due notice to the herdsman, with description of brands, otherwise they will be impounded.
8. The fees to be paid on stock remaining on a common over twenty-four hours shall be as follows:—Large cattle, 3d. per head per night; horses, 3d. per head per night; small cattle, 4d. per head per night.
9. All stock upon which the fees due have not been paid, when demanded by the herdsman, will be impounded.
10. The herdsman shall have authority to impound all straying or unauthorized stock found on the common, a registry of which he will be required to keep, so that all damages and fees arising therefrom may be properly accounted for.
11. It shall be necessary for the owners of any cattle or sheep diseased, or supposed to be diseased, to remove such cattle or sheep from the common within twenty-four hours after notice, in writing, requiring them so to do has been given them by the herdsman or one of the managers, and in the event of the owner's refusal or neglect so to do, he shall be considered as a trespasser, and be proceeded against accordingly.
12. Should the council have any reasonable suspicion that the stock applied for to be depastured on the common is not

the *bona fide* property of the applicant, the council may, if it think proper, before granting a license, require the person or persons so applying to make a declaration on oath, before some justice of the peace, specifying that the stock applied for to be licensed are his property and not that of any other.

13. The council is not to be held responsible for any neglect or any irregularities of the herdsman.

14. Each herdsman shall provide security for the honest and faithful discharge of his duties in the sum of Twenty pounds sterling.

15. Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice of the peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

The foregoing regulations were adopted at a meeting of the Council of the Shire of Lowan, held at Dimboola, on Wednesday the seventh day of June A.D. 1876.

Names of trustees.—The Most Reverend James Alipius Goold, D.D.; Very Reverend John Fitzpatrick, D.D.; and Thomas Edmund Verga.

Power of disposition.—Power to sell, lease, mortgage, or exchange, subject to the written approval of the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Melbourne for the time being, or (in case of his death) of the person or persons administering the affairs of the archdiocese. The Archbishop or such person as aforesaid to have power to remove trustees, and to appoint new trustees, and to fill up all vacancies occurring in trusteeship.

Purposes to which proceeds of disposition are to be applied.—To such purposes of the Roman Catholic Church as may from time to time be agreed upon by the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Melbourne and a majority of the trustees.

THE MELBOURNE HOSPITAL.

THE following are the Bye-laws of the Melbourne Hospital, made by the Committee thereof, and confirmed by a General Meeting of Contributors specially convened for that purpose on the 21st day of July 1876.

INTRODUCTORY.

1. *Repeal of former Bye-laws.*—All bye-laws made prior to the date of the making of these bye-laws shall be, and the same are hereby repealed.

2. *Meaning of "Governor."*—In these bye-laws the word "Governor" shall mean and be equivalent to the word "Contributor" in the Act of the Parliament of Victoria, No. 220.

OBJECT.

3. *Object of the Institution.*—The object of the Melbourne Hospital shall be to afford medical and surgical aid to the sick poor, and to relieve casualties.

COMMON SEAL.

4. *Custody of Seal.*—The common seal of the corporation shall be kept at the hospital in a box having two differing locks; one key shall be kept by the treasurer, and the other by some officer appointed by the committee for that purpose.

5. *Affixing of Seal.*—The common seal shall not be affixed to any deed, instrument, or writing, except by order of the committee at a meeting at which seven members at least are present at the time of making such order, and for which meeting notice to make such order has been given.

GOVERNORS AND THEIR PRIVILEGES.

6. *Annual Governors and Life Governors.*—Any person who shall contribute the sum of £1 per annum shall be an annual governor, or not less than £20 in one donation shall be a life governor of the hospital, and shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings, and to recommend four out-patients in every year. And any person who shall contribute the sum of £5 per annum, shall be an annual governor, or not less than £100 in one donation, shall be a life governor, and shall be entitled to two votes at all general meetings, and to recommend two in-patients and twelve out-patients in every year. And any person who shall contribute the sum of £10 per annum, shall be an annual governor, or not less than £200 in one donation, shall be a life governor, and shall be entitled to three votes at all general meetings, and to recommend four in-patients and twenty out-patients in every year.

7. *Life Governors on Collections.*—Any person who shall pay to the hospital in one year in one sum, collections to the amount of £50 or upwards, shall be enrolled a life governor, and as such shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings, and to recommend one in-patient and four out-patients in every year.

8. *Contributions by Corporations.*—Any public or corporate body which shall contribute the sum of £5 annually, shall be authorized to nominate some one person to be enrolled an annual governor, who shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings, and to recommend one in-patient and ten out-patients in every year; and if the contribution shall amount to £20 per annum, such nominee shall be a life governor, and be entitled to two votes at all general meetings, and to recommend two in-patients and twenty out-patients in every year.

9. *Life Governors under Bequests.*—The executor first named in any will through which the hospital shall receive the sum of £100 shall be enrolled a life governor, and shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings, and to recommend one in-patient and four out-patients in every year.

10. *Absent Governors may act by attorney.*—Any governor being absent from the colony of Victoria may, by power of attorney containing the necessary powers, exercise all the privileges to which he would be entitled if personally present; but such power of attorney shall be deposited with the committee for record at least seven days before the same can be used in exercise of such privileges.

11. *Payment of Subscriptions.*—Every yearly subscription shall be paid in advance, and every first yearly payment shall be calculated from the date of such payment, but no such first yearly payment shall entitle to a vote at a general meeting within three months from the date of such payment.

12. *Privileges suspended on unpaid Subscriptions.*—The privileges of annual governors shall be suspended until all arrears are paid.

13. *Contributions by Firms.*—Every firm or partnership subscribing may exercise their privilege through some one member of such firm.

14. *Honorary Life Governors.*—Persons who shall have conferred any signal benefit on the hospital, irrespective of subscription, may be elected honorary life governors at any general meeting, on the recommendation of the committee, and shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings, and to recommend one in-patient and five out-patients in every year.

OFFICERS AND COMMITTEE.

15. *Officers of the Corporation.*—There shall be a president, two vice-presidents, a treasurer, and three auditors, who shall be elected by the governors as hereinafter provided.

16. *Officers' tenure.*—The president, vice-presidents, treasurer, and auditors, respectively, shall hold office for one year and thereafter until the election of their successors, but shall be capable of re-election.

17. *Number of elective Committeemen.*—The elective members of the committee of the hospital shall be eighteen in number.

18. *All Governors eligible for office.*—Except as hereinafter provided, all governors of the hospital shall be capable of being elected as officers of the corporation or as members of the committee.

19. *But subject to certain disabilities.*—No person who shall hold any office or place of profit under the corporation, or be concerned or participate in anywise in any contract with the committee, or in the profit thereof, or of any work to be done under the authority of the same, shall be capable of being or continuing a member of such committee; provided that such disability shall not apply to any member of any company, partnership, or association consisting of more than ten persons, when such contract shall be entered into for the general benefit of such company, partnership, or association. But no member of the committee shall vote or take part in the discussion of any matter in or before the committee in which he shall, directly or indirectly, by himself or his partners, have any pecuniary interest.

20. *Powers of Committee.*—The committee shall direct all the business of the hospital; shall provide all requisites for its use; may appoint and discharge all paid officers and servants; may from time to time make rules not inconsistent with these bye-laws for the regulation of the hospital and of such paid officers and servants, and for the admission and instruction of medical and surgical pupils, and for the fees to be paid by them; and generally for all matters, whether of the same kind as those hereinbefore mentioned or of a different kind, not provided for by law or by these bye-laws that they think proper.

MEETINGS IN GENERAL.

21. *Presidency at meetings.*—At all meetings of governors or of committee the president, or in his absence one of the vice-presidents, or in their absence the treasurer shall take the chair; but in the absence of all these officers the meeting shall choose its own chairman.

22. *Chairman to have double vote.*—At all meetings of the governors or of the committee, the chairman shall have a deliberative vote, and also a casting vote whenever the numbers are equal.

23. *Decision of questions.*—All questions other than elections at meetings of governors, and all questions at meetings of the committee, shall be decided by a show of hands, and if it be demanded by any member, by a division.

24. *Procedure on vacancy in corporate office.*—When any vacancy occurs, or is by effluxion of time about to occur, in any office of the corporation other than the committee, the committee shall give public notice by advertisement that such vacancy has occurred, or is about to occur, and shall fix therein a time, not less than three clear days from the date of such notice, within which candidates for any such vacancy shall send to the committee their notice of candidature, and a day on which in the event of a contest the election shall be held.

25. *Candidates to give notice.*—No person shall be admitted as a candidate at any such election unless he have notified his candidature to the committee in writing under his hand within the time so limited.

26. *Uncontested elections.*—Where at the expiration of the time fixed for receiving notice of candidature there is the same number of candidates as there are vacancies in each office respectively, the committee shall declare such candidates duly elected.

27. *Contested elections.*—Where at the expiration of the time so fixed there are more candidates than vacancies, the committee shall in some daily newspaper published in Melbourne give not less than three days' notice of the names of such candidates, and the governors shall upon the day appointed for the election elect by ballot some one or more of such candidates to fill the vacant office or offices as the case may be.

28. *Filling up extraordinary vacancy.*—If any vacancy occur in any office of the corporation other than the committee, from any other cause than effluxion of time, the person chosen to fill such vacancy shall hold office only until the expiration of the term for which the original holder of such office was elected.

29. *Mode of election of members of Committee.*—All vacancies in the committee caused by the annual retirement of members thereof, in pursuance of the provisions of the Act of the Parliament of Victoria numbered 220, shall be filled in the same manner as is hereinbefore provided in the case of officers of the corporation other than the committee.

MEETINGS OF GOVERNORS.

30. *Annual meeting of Governors.*—In the month of January in every year, on some day other than the day, if any, fixed for the polling at any election under these bye-laws, a meeting of the governors shall be held for the reception and the adoption of the annual report and balance-sheet, as hereinafter mentioned, and for the transaction of any other business of which notice has been given in the advertisement convening such meeting.

31. *Quorum of Governors.*—At all general meetings of the governors, except at meetings for balloting, twelve shall constitute a quorum; but if no quorum be present within half-an-hour of the time named, such meeting shall stand adjourned for the following week at the same day and hour.

32. *Special meetings, how convened.*—The committee at their discretion may, and upon the written request of twenty or more governors under their hands stating the purpose of such meeting shall, summon a special meeting; and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting except that for which it shall have been summoned.

33. Every meeting of governors shall be called by advertisement, in two at least of the public newspapers published in Melbourne, at least one week before the day of meeting.

34. *Committee to make Annual Report.*—The committee shall present a general report of the affairs of the hospital at the meeting of governors in the month of January in each year, together with a full statement, duly audited, of the accounts of the corporation for the preceding year, from 1st January to 31st December inclusive.

35. When a ballot is held in pursuance of any of these bye-laws, all governors in Victoria who desire to vote shall attend in their proper persons, and the poll shall be kept open from Nine a.m. to Four p.m., and the committee shall make provision for the orderly conduct of such ballot and for the proper counting of the votes, and the publication of the result.

MEETINGS OF COMMITTEE.

36. *Ordinary meetings of committee.*—The committee shall meet at the hospital at Three o'clock p.m. on Tuesday in each week.

37. *Special meetings of committee.*—Special meetings of the committee may be convened on the requisition of the president or one of the vice-presidents, or of any four members of the committee; and notice shall be given of the business to be transacted at such meeting, at which no other business shall be considered.

38. *Appointment of sub-committees.*—The committee shall, at its first meeting in each year after the annual general meeting, appoint a finance committee, and may from time to time appoint such sub-committees as it thinks fit, and may appoint any members of the honorary staff, although not members of the committee, to act on any such sub-committee.

39. *Ex officio members of sub-committees.*—The president, vice-president, and treasurer shall be *ex officio* members of all sub-committees, but it shall not be necessary to send to any such members notice of the meetings of such sub-committees.

40. *Commencement of committee meetings and lapsed meetings.*—The committee shall commence business as soon after the time notified as there is a sufficient number of members present to constitute a quorum; but if at the expiry of twenty minutes from the time specified there is not a quorum present, the meeting shall stand adjourned to the following Tuesday.

41. *Reading of minutes.*—No business shall be entered upon until the minutes of the previous meeting have been confirmed, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy.

42. *Notice of new legislation or of altering resolution.*—No proposition to enact or amend a by-law, or make or vary any rule, shall be entertained unless one month's previous notice has been given; and no resolution of the committee shall be varied or rescinded for one month after such resolution has been passed, except at a special meeting of the committee or by an absolute majority of the whole committee.

43. *Notices of motion.*—No motion, except on current business, shall be entertained, unless three days' notice of the same shall have been given, and shall have been notified in the summons to each member of the committee.

44. *Disputed elections.*—When any election is disputed, if the person aggrieved complain in writing to the committee within seven days after such election, the committee may either itself or by a sub-committee appointed for the purpose hear and determine such complaint, and its decision therein shall be final.

THE HONORARY STAFF.

45. *Division and titles of honorary staff.*—The honorary staff of the hospital shall consist of three parts:—

(1.) The consulting physicians and the consulting surgeons.

(2.) The physicians and the surgeons.

(3.) The assistant-physicians and the assistant-surgeons.

46. *Charge of in-patients.*—There shall be four physicians and four surgeons, who shall have charge of the in-patients.

47. *Charge of out-patients.*—There shall be four assistant-physicians and four assistant-surgeons, who shall have charge of the out-patients.

48. *Physicians and surgeons must have been assistants.*—Except as hereinafter provided, no person shall be capable of being elected as a physician or as a surgeon unless he have previously held office for not less than two years as an assistant-physician or an assistant-surgeon, as the case may be, or

unless he have been engaged in the actual practice of his profession for a period of not less than ten years.

49. *Qualifications for physicians and assistant-physicians.*—Except as hereinafter provided, no person shall be capable of being elected a physician or an assistant-physician, unless in addition to the requirements of the *Medical Practitioners Statute 1865* he possess the degree of Doctor of Medicine from some university in the United Kingdom or in the Australian colonies, or from some foreign university recognized by the University of Melbourne, or the diploma of Fellow from some college of physicians in the United Kingdom, or, in the case of a person who has been engaged in the actual practice of his profession for not less than five years, the diploma of Member from some such college.

50. *Qualifications for surgeons and assistant-surgeons.*—Except as hereinafter provided, no person shall be capable of being elected a surgeon or an assistant-surgeon unless in addition to the requirements of the *Medical Practitioners Statute 1865* he possess the degree of Master of Surgery from some university in the United Kingdom or in the Australian colonies, or from some foreign university recognized by the University of Melbourne, or the diploma of Fellow from some college of surgeons in the United Kingdom, or, in the case of a person who has been engaged in the actual practice of his profession for not less than five years, the diploma of Member from some such college.

51. *Saving of existing claims.*—Every person who, prior to the first of January 1876, has been elected as an honorary physician or an honorary surgeon, or as an honorary assistant-physician, or an honorary assistant-surgeon of this hospital, shall, without further or other qualification, be capable of being elected as a physician or as a surgeon, or as an assistant-physician or as an assistant-surgeon, or of succeeding to the office of physician or of surgeon, according to the nature of his former office, or if he possess the degree of Bachelor of Medicine of the University of Melbourne, of being elected either as physician or a surgeon.

52. *On change of sides, former honorary officer exempt from service as assistant.*—Where, prior to the 1st January 1876, any person has been elected as an honorary physician or as an honorary surgeon of this hospital, if having been an honorary physician he possess the degree or the diploma herein required for the office of surgeon, or if having been an honorary surgeon he possess the degree or the diploma herein required for the office of physician, he shall be eligible for election in the former case to the office of surgeon, and in the latter case to the office of physician, notwithstanding that he has not served as assistant-surgeon or as assistant-physician.

53. *Tenure of office of physicians and surgeons.*—Except in the case of officers elected before the 14th day of January 1875, every physician and surgeon, now in office or hereafter elected, shall, subject to the by-laws and rules of the hospital now or hereafter in force, hold office for the period of four years from the date, of his election, and no longer, but shall be eligible for re-election.

54. *Tenure of office of assistant physicians and surgeons.*—Every assistant-physician or assistant-surgeon now in office shall, subject to the bye-laws and rules of the hospital now or hereafter in force, hold office for the period of four years and no longer, and every assistant-physician or assistant-surgeon hereafter elected shall, subject as aforesaid, hold office for the period of two years and no longer, and every assistant-physician or assistant-surgeon shall be eligible for re-election.

55. *Succession of assistant physicians and surgeons.*—If any vacancy occur in the office of physician or of surgeon from any other cause than effluxion of time, the senior assistant-physician or the senior assistant-surgeon, as the case may be, shall according to the order of his length of service on the honorary staff, or in the case of equal lengths of service according to the order of his seniority in his profession, or in case of equal professional degrees, then as the committee may determine, succeed to such vacancy for the remainder of the term thereof, and shall thereby vacate his former office, and the committee shall thereupon forthwith publish a notification accordingly.

56. *Vacancies of assistant physicians and surgeons.*—If any vacancy occur in the office of assistant-physician or assistant-surgeon from any other cause than effluxion of time, the vacancy shall be filled by election in the manner hereinafter provided, but the person so chosen shall hold office only until the expiration of the term for which the original holder of such office was elected.

57. *Procedure upon vacancy among physicians, surgeons, or assistants.*—When any office of physician or surgeon becomes vacant by effluxion of time, or when any office of assistant-physician or of assistant-surgeon becomes vacant from any cause, the committee shall give public notice by advertisement in some daily newspaper published in Melbourne that such vacancy has occurred, and shall fix therein a time within which candidates shall send to the committee their notice of candidature and the evidence of their qualifications.

58. *Committee to decide questions of qualifications.*—The committee shall determine all questions as to the sufficiency of the qualifications of any candidates, and its decision thereon shall be conclusive.

59. *Uncontested elections.*—Where, at the expiration of the time so fixed, there is only one duly qualified candidate, the committee may declare him to be duly elected; or, in their discretion, may from time to time postpone the election, and advertise anew as hereinbefore directed. Provided that no vacancy shall remain unfilled for more than six weeks.

Contested elections.—Where, at the expiration of the time so fixed, there is more than one duly qualified candidate, the

committee shall convene a general meeting of governors, for the election by such meeting by ballot of some one or more of such candidates to fill the vacant office or offices, as the case may be, and shall give not less than seven days' notice in some daily newspaper published in Melbourne of such meeting, and of the names of such candidates.

61. *Declaration by honorary staff.*—Every person elected or succeeding to any office on the honorary staff shall, before he enters upon the duties of his office, make and subscribe the following declaration :—

I do solemnly promise that while I hold the office of in the Melbourne Hospital, I will faithfully obey the bye-laws and rules of the said hospital now or hereafter in force, so far as they apply to me, and I acknowledge that I hold my said office subject to the condition of such obedience.

62. *Attendance of honorary staff.*—No physician, surgeon, assistant physician, or assistant surgeon shall be absent from the hospital for more than fourteen consecutive days without the leave of the committee.

63. *Suspension of honorary staff.*—The committee may, by an absolute majority of the whole committee, suspend any member of the honorary staff, and shall, within two weeks after the order of suspension, convene a special meeting of the governors, and shall report to such meeting such suspension and the reason thereof. If the governors at such special meeting confirm the order of suspension by the committee, the office of the officer so suspended shall thenceforth become vacant; and if the governors refuse to confirm such order, the suspension shall thenceforth cease.

64. *Consulting physicians and surgeons.*—When any physician or surgeon has served as such for twelve years, and has ceased to hold such office, the committee shall, upon his request, declare him to be a consulting physician or a consulting surgeon, as the case may be. But in case of his subsequent election as physician or surgeon, or assistant-physician or assistant-surgeon, his office of consulting physician or of consulting surgeon shall, during his continuance in such former office, be suspended.

ACCOUNTS.

65. *Banking accounts.*—All sums received on account of the hospital shall be paid into the Bank of New South Wales, or such other bank as the committee may appoint, to one or other of the following accounts, as the case may be, viz. :—

Melbourne Hospital Maintenance Fund.	
" " Building "	
" " Convalescent "	
" " Endowment "	

66. *Bequests, how dealt with.*—All bequests made to the institution shall be paid to a separate fund, to be called the endowment fund, due regard being had to the conditions under which such bequests are made. And all such moneys shall be invested from time to time in such manner as the committee shall direct; the interest of such endowment fund may be available for the maintenance of the institution.

67. *Accounts to be certified by finance committee.*—All accounts, before they are discharged, shall be submitted to the finance committee, who shall certify as to their correctness.

68. *Duties of finance committee.*—On the first Tuesday of each month, or such other times as the committee may appoint, the finance committee shall examine all accounts for disbursements, and certify as to their correctness, and also see that the money received by the collectors, as checked by some officer appointed by the committee for that purpose, has been paid into bank to the credit of the hospital.

69. *Payments made by committee.*—All payments shall be made by order of the committee.

70. *Cheques, how signed.*—All cheques shall be signed by the chairman of the committee, countersigned by the treasurer, or in his absence by the chairman of the finance committee for the time being and two members of the finance committee.

71. *Audit of accounts.*—The accounts of the hospital shall be audited prior to the annual meeting in the month of January in every year, by two at least of the auditors, who shall sign a statement of accounts exhibiting a summary of receipts and expenditure.

ADMISSION OF IN-PATIENTS AND OUT-PATIENTS.

72. *Conditions of admission of patients.*—Every sick person may be admitted as in-patient or as out-patient, if he be recommended by a governor, and if he appear to the committee to be a proper object of charity, and if the physician or the surgeon of the week report that such person is likely to receive benefit by treatment in the hospital, or if the committee think fit.

73. *Recommendations, how far dispensed with.*—Accidents and cases of emergency are at all times admissible without letters of recommendation; but no person who, in the opinion of the committee, is able to pay for aid shall receive further than temporary assistance.

74. *Admission of seamen.*—The committee may admit articleed seamen on payment of 25s. per week, or, in that proportion, on the order of the shipping master of the port, countersigned by the captain or agent of the vessel, in accordance with an agreement made with the Government.

75. *Admission when house is full.*—Whenever the applications for admission are more than can be accommodated in the house, those cases only will be admitted which in the opinion of the committee, upon the recommendation of some medical officer, are the most urgent.

SHIRE OF GISBORNE.

PROPOSED BYE-LAW.

BYE-LAW of the Council of the Shire of Gisborne, made under and in pursuance of Part 12 of the Shires Statute, for regulating the conduct of their officers and servants, and for providing for the due management of the affairs and proceedings of the council. The Council of the Shire of Gisborne ordain as follows (that is to say) :—

BYE-LAW No. 1 OF THE COUNCIL OF THE SHIRE OF GISBORNE. General Conduct of Business.

1. In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be made to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the council.

2. At every meeting of the council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed as by this Act required; and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the council at any meeting may be read at the close of such meeting.

3. After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follow, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the council at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect :—

- (1) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the council.
- (2) Reading letters received and considering and ordering thereon.
- (3) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (4) Presentation of reports of committees.
- (5) Payments.
- (6) Ordinary business.
- (7) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (8) Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
- (9) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (10) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4. Whenever a division shall be demanded by any councillor, the councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the president.

5. All addresses to the Governor shall be presented through the president and the shire secretary, unless otherwise ordered by the council.

Motions.

6. All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered and given by the intending mover to the secretary at the close of the meeting of council, and the secretary shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

7. No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of the notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

8. No motion except that for receiving the same shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of council after that at which it has been presented.

9. Except by leave of the council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the shire secretary in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

10. No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the councillor who gave notice of the same, unless by some other councillor producing written authority from him to that effect.

Orders, &c., of Debate.

11. Any councillor desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the councillor (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

12. Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the council thereon.

13. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the council.

14. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the council unless it be seconded, but a councillor may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the council by directing the president's or chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

15. A councillor moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a councillor merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

16. The councillors in meeting of council shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of president, chairman, or councillor, as the case may require.

17. If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time, the president or chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

18. The president or chairman shall rise in addressing the council to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

19. No councillor shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

20. The president or chairman when called upon to decide on points of order or practice shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

21. No councillor shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other councillor in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on councillors shall be deemed highly disorderly.

22. Whenever any councillor shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, the councillor so offending shall be required by the president or chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the council.

23. A councillor called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.

24. Any councillor using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw and to apologise for such conduct, and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

25. Any councillor may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the council applying to the question under discussion.

26. The council shall vote by show of hands, and any councillor present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

27. The president or chairman shall in taking the sense of the council put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

28. At every meeting of the council all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing if required, signed by the mover, and delivered to the chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

29. No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

30. If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

31. If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the council for discussion at a time, and no further amendment shall be moved.

32. The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

33. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council; but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice-paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

Lapsed Questions.

34. If a debate or any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the councillors present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at a point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.

35. If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice book for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

Committees.

36. Minutes of all proceedings of committees, as well as of their reports numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committee's minute book, and being signed by the chairman of the committee shall be presented to the council; and the shire secretary, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of committees.

37. The shire secretary shall convene every committee within a reasonable time of its first appointment or at any other time thereafter by order of the council, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee or of any two members of the committee.

Petitions.

38. No petition shall be presented after the council shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

39. It shall be incumbent on every councillor presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the council, and that the contents do not violate any bye-law or any provision hereof.

40. Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

41. Every petition shall be in writing and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and shall be signed by at least one person on every skin or sheet on which it is written.

42. Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

43. Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number or signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

Appointments, &c., of Officers.

44. No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the council shall take place until fourteen clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the shire, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

45. The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the council shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, and before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

46. No councillor or officer of the council, and no assessor or auditor of the shire, shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the council or for any work to be done for or under the council.

47. No officer of the council shall be permitted to interfere in elections for the council beyond recording his vote.

48. In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty or contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same, and in the case of security for the faithful performance of the duties of officers, that of guarantee societies alone shall be taken.

Miscellaneous.

49. Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained in this bye-law may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by majority of the whole council.

50. If any person shall offend against any provision contained in this bye-law he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.
