RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT.

THE subjoined Rules of the Supreme Court of Victoria having been duly laid before Parliament, are now published in compliance with the requirements of the 32nd section of the Act 15 Vict. No. 10.

In the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria.

REGULÉ GENERALES.

Tuesday the fifteenth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-six.

It is ordered that the practice to be observed in this Court with respect to the matters hereinafter mentioned shall be as follows (that is to say):—

1. *Crown cases reserved, T. and M., app. vi.*—Where any case shall be transmitted by any court of criminal jurisdiction for the consideration of the judges of this Court the original case (signed by the judge or other person presiding in such first-mentioned court) reserving the question of law shall be delivered or sent by the General Post to the Prothonotary.
2. *Case to state question reserved.*—Every such case shall briefly state the question or questions of law reserved, and such facts only as raise the question or questions submitted. If the question turns upon the presentment, or upon any count thereof, then the case must set forth the presentment or the particular count.
3. *And whether judgment was passed.*—Every such case shall state whether judgment on the conviction was passed, or postponed, or the execution of the judgment respited, and whether the person convicted be in prison or has been discharged on recognizance of bail to appear and receive judgment, or to render himself in execution.
4. *Copies of Crown cases.*—The Prothonotary, as soon as possible after the receipt of such case, shall cause to be made three copies thereof, and shall cause such copies respectively to be forthwith left at the chambers of the three judges who will sit for the consideration of such case.
5. *Appeal books in equity to be delivered by both parties, Act No. 274, s. 74.*—Three days before the day appointed for the sitting of this Court to hear appeals from the decree, decretal, or

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other order of any one judge in any suit or matter depending in this Court in its equitable, insolvency, or probate jurisdiction, the appellant shall deliver copies of the appeal case to the Chief Justice and Senior Puisne Judge, and the respondent shall deliver copies to the other judges (excepting the judge who made such decree or order), and in default thereof by either party the other party may on the day following deliver such copies as ought to have been so delivered by the party making default, and the party making default shall not be heard until he shall have paid for such copies, or deposited with the Master a sufficient sum to pay for such copies.

6. *Appeal from Justices and General Sessions, 2 H. and N., 624.*—In cases of appeal to this Court under *The Justices of the Peace Statute 1865*, and also where any Court of General Sessions of the Peace shall state a case in respect of any appeal or any question of law arising thereon for the opinion of this Court, the practice prescribed by the seventy-third and seventy-fourth sections of *The Common Law Procedure Statute 1865*, so far as the same is applicable, shall be observed.

7. *All cases to be in numbered paragraphs, 11 C.B. (N.S.), 477.*—Every case transmitted by any court of criminal jurisdiction for the consideration of this court, and every special case, special verdict, and appeal case, whether from a single judge or from any county court or justices, and every case stated by any court of general sessions of the peace in respect of any appeal or any question of law arising thereon respectively set down in this Court, shall be divided into paragraphs, each of which, as nearly as may be, shall be confined to a distinct portion of the subject, and every paragraph shall be numbered consecutively; and the Master and Prothonotary respectively on taxation shall not allow the costs of drawing and copying any special case, special verdict, or appeal case, or case stated by any court of general sessions as aforesaid, not in substance in compliance with this rule, without the special order of the Court.

8. *All copies to be made on brief paper.*—Every copy of a case transmitted by any court of criminal jurisdiction for the consideration of this Court, and every copy of a demurrer-book, special case, special verdict and appeal case, whether from a single judge or from any county court or justices, and of any case stated by any court of general sessions as aforesaid, delivered to the judges, shall be fairly written on brief paper in the manner that briefs are now usually written, with a margin on the left hand side of one-fourth of the width of such paper, and no costs shall be allowed for any copy not in substance in compliance with this rule, without the special order of the Court.

9. *Actions on Bills of Exchange, 17 Com. B. 2. S. E. & B., 949.*—No other claim than a claim on a bill of exchange or promissory note is to be included in writs issued under the first part of *The Instruments and Securities Statute 1864*, but where a defendant obtains leave to appear, according to any such writ, the plaintiff may include in his declaration causes of action of whatever kind in like manner, and subject to the same restrictions as in case of a declaration in an action commenced by writ of summons in the form contained in the fifth schedule to *The Common Law Procedure Statute 1865*.

10. *Entry of satisfaction on a judgment, 2 C.B. (N.S.) 92.*—Upon a satisfaction piece duly signed and attested, in accordance with the three hundred and sixth section of *The Common Law Procedure Statute 1865*, being presented to the Prothonotary he shall file the same and enter satisfaction in the action-book against the entry of the said judgment, and no roll shall be required to be carried in for the purpose of entering satisfaction on a judgment.

11. *Memorandum of satisfaction on a Bill of Sale, No. 274 s. 806.*—For the purpose of obtaining a judge's order for the entry of a memorandum of satisfaction on a bill of sale or copy

thereof, it shall be requisite only to produce to the judge a satisfaction piece in the form hereinafter prescribed, and such satisfaction piece shall be signed by the party or parties acknowledging the same, or their personal representatives, and such signature or signatures shall be witnessed by a practising attorney of this Court expressly named by him or them and attending at his or their request to inform him or them of the nature and effect of such satisfaction piece before the same is signed, and which attorney shall declare himself in the attestation thereto to be the attorney for the person or persons so signing the same and state he is witness as such attorney, and in cases where the satisfaction piece is signed by the personal representative of the deceased, his representative character shall be proved in such manner as the judge may direct.

12. *Form of satisfaction piece and order.*—Every such satisfaction piece and judge's order respectively shall be on the same piece of paper and in the forms following (that is to say):—

Satisfaction is hereby acknowledged by me [O. P., executor of the last will and testament of] A. B. of a bill of sale dated the day of One thousand eight hundred and and made between C. D. of the one part and the said A. B. of the other part, and numbered in the office of the Registrar-General; and I do hereby expressly nominate and appoint E. F., attorney-at-law, to witness and attest my execution of this acknowledgment of satisfaction.

Signed by the said A. B., in the presence of me E. F., of &c., one of the attorneys of the Supreme Court of the colony of Victoria, and I hereby declare myself to be attorney for and on behalf of the said A. B., expressly named by him, and attending at his request to inform him of the nature and effect of this acknowledgment of satisfaction (which I accordingly did before the same was signed by him), and I also declare that I subscribe my name hereto as such attorney.

13. *Consequence of Departure from forms.*—If the form of satisfaction piece hereinbefore prescribed shall not be followed, no order will be made that a memorandum of satisfaction be written on the bill of sale or copy thereof without a previous summons to show cause; and no costs shall be allowed for any memorandum of satisfaction not in substance in compliance with this rule without the special order of a judge.

14. *Abandonment of Appeals to the Privy Council.*—When any person or persons feeling aggrieved by any judgment, decree, order or sentence of this Court shall apply to the said Court by motion or petition for leave to appeal therefrom to Her Majesty, her heirs and successors, in Her or their Privy Council, the party or parties appellant shall prepare and deliver to the Master or Prothonotary (as the case may be) a transcript or copy of the evidence, proceedings, judgment, decree or order, so far as the same have relation to the matters of appeal, in order that the same may be certified and sent or transmitted to England; and if such transcript or copy shall not be so prepared and delivered within three months from the date of such motion or petition, or within such further time as may be allowed by the court or a judge, or by consent the appeal shall be deemed to have been abandoned.

15. *Discontinuance of such appeals.*—The party or parties appellant may at any time before the transcript, or copy of the evidence, proceedings, judgment, decree, or order shall have been despatched to England, discontinue the appeal by giving to the respondent, or his attorney, solicitor or proctor, a notice headed in the court and cause, stating that he discontinues such appeal.

16. *Costs of appeal where it is not prosecuted.*—If the security required by law shall not be entered into by the party or parties appellant, within three months from the date of the motion, or petition for leave to appeal, or if the appeal shall be abandoned or discontinued as hereinbefore mentioned, the respondent's costs of and occasioned by the motion or petition for leave to appeal, and all subsequent costs *bona fide* incurred by him and rendered useless by the failure to enter into the said security or by the abandonment or discontinuance of the appeal shall be taxed by the Master or Prothonotary (as the case may be) in like manner as the costs of an action or suit, and in case of non-payment thereof within two days after such taxation the respondent may apply by summons to a judge in chambers for an order that the party or parties appellant shall pay the amount so taxed to the respondent, and such judge may make an order accordingly with or without costs.

17. *Summons not attended may be dismissed.*—When a judge's summons is taken out and served, and no one appears in support thereof, the party thereby required to appear may have the same dismissed with costs without prejudice to a fresh application, provided he shall have attended the judge before the expiration of half an hour next immediately following the return of the summons and shall produce to the judge an affidavit of such attendance verifying the copy served, and deposing that no one appeared in support of such summons.

DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870" ALTERED.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, in pursuance of the 5th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, revoked all previous Orders constituting the Scab Districts designated respectively the Sandhurst district and the Castlemaine district, and has directed that the district hereinafter defined shall be a district under and for the purposes of the said act, that is to say:—

SANDHURST DISTRICT.—Commencing at the point on the River Murray where the eastern boundary of the Murrabit run abuts thereon; thence by the said boundary of that run and the eastern and southern boundaries of the Reedy Lake run to the Quambatook East run; thence by the northern boundary of that run and by the northern, western, and southern boundaries of the Quambatook West run to the Avoca River; thence up that river to the Spring Bank West run; thence by the northern boundary of that run and the western boundaries of that run and of the Coouover A and Yawong Springs run, also by the southern boundary of the last-named run to the Avoca Forest West run; thence by the western and southern boundaries of that run to the Avoca River aforesaid; thence again up the Avoca River to the Amphitheatre run; thence by the north-western and western boundaries of that run to the Langi-Kalkal run; thence by the northern boundary of that run to the Burrumbeet run; thence by the northern and eastern boundaries of that run to the Dowling Forest run; thence by the northern and eastern boundaries of that run to Wyndham run; thence by the north-eastern boundaries of that run and Warrenheip runs and the north-western and eastern boundaries of the Peerwerth run to the Main Dividing Range; thence by that range to the western boundary of the Panne-Banwar run; thence by the said boundary and the northern boundary of that run to the before-mentioned range; thence again by that range to the source of the Campaspe River; thence down that river to the Langwornier run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to the Coliban River; thence down that river to the Campaspe River aforesaid; thence again by that river to the Axedale East run; thence by the southern, eastern, and northern boundaries of that run to the Campaspe River; thence again by that river to the Campaspe River run; thence by the southern, western, and northern boundaries of that run to the Campaspe River; again by that river to the Wharparella run; thence by the southern and eastern boundaries of that run to the River Murray; and thence by that river to the commencing point.

INSTRUCTIONS TO MEASURING SURVEYORS.

International Tonnage.

THE Board of Trade forward herewith, for the information and guidance of officers concerned in the duties of measurement and registry of ships, a copy of a recently issued Order in Council, which extends to vessels of the Kingdom of Norway the advantages held out by the 60th section of *The Merchant Shipping Act 1862*.

In consequence of the amount of deduction for propelling power being different in the two countries, option is granted by the enclosed order to the masters of steam ships of the kingdom of Norway whereby the said masters may elect to have the engine-room measured under the rules relating to British ships.

When the engine-room is measured according to the British rules in such cases, a "Certificate of British Tonnage" is to be granted, adopting thereon the gross tonnage as stated in the Norwegian Certificate of Registry, and deducting from the gross tonnage the allowance for engine-room under the British rules, and also the allowance on account of spaces occupied by seamen or apprentices, and appropriated to their use.

A copy of the document furnished to the Norwegian master is to be sent to the principal surveyor for tonnage, with a note thereon of the measurement of engine-room and the amount of deduction under the Norwegian rule.

The fees for admeasurements under the accompanying Order in Council are to be the same as for the admeasurements of British ships for the time being, but only for the spaces actually measured.

The Queen's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by *The Merchant Shipping Act amendment Act 1862* it is enacted that whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships for the time being in force under the Principal Act have been adopted by the Government of any foreign country, and are in force in that country, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by Order in Council, to direct that the ships of such foreign country shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other national papers, and thereupon it shall no longer be necessary for such ships to be remeasured in any port or place in Her Majesty's dominions; but such ships shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their Certificates of Registry or other papers, in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes, in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the Certificate of Registry of British ships is to be deemed the tonnage of such ships.

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships now in force under *The Merchant Shipping Act 1854* have been adopted by the Royal Norwegian Government, with the exception of a slight difference in the mode of estimating the allowance for engine-room, and such rules are now in force in the kingdom of Norway, having come into operation on the 1st day of April 1876, Her Majesty is hereby pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to direct as follows:

1. As regards sailing ships, that merchant sailing ships of the said kingdom of Norway, the measurement whereof shall, after the said 1st day of April 1876, have been ascertained and denoted in the registers and other national papers of such sailing ships, testified by the date thereof, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such registers and other national papers in the same manner, and to the same extent, and for the same purpose, in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of British sailing ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships.

2. As regards steam-ships, that merchant ships belong to the said kingdom of Norway, which are propelled by steam or by any other power requiring engine-room, the measurement whereof shall, after the said 1st day of April 1876, have been ascertained and denoted in the registers, and other national papers of such steam-ships, testified by the dates thereof,

shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such registers, or other national papers, in the same manner, and to the same extent, and for the same purpose, in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of British ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships; provided nevertheless, that if the owner or master of any such Norwegian steam-ship desires the deduction for engine-room in his ships to be estimated under the rules for engine-room measurement, and deduction applicable to British ships instead of under the Norwegian rule, the engine-room shall be measured and the deduction calculated according to the British rules.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed by the Parliament of Victoria in the twenty-fifth year of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to consolidate and amend the Law relating to the Distillation, Rectifying, and Compounding of Spirits, to the granting a Duty upon Spirits Distilled in Victoria, and to regulate the Brewing of Beer and the Sale of Fermented and Spirituous Liquors in certain cases*, it was amongst other things enacted, that any person, except as thereafter excepted, who should carry on the business of a distiller or rectifier and compounder of spirits, or who should have in his possession, or who should make use of any still or other utensil for distilling or rectifying or compounding spirits, excepting in such place as the Governor in Council should by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* direct, should be liable to a penalty of not less than One hundred pounds nor more than Five hundred pounds: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the undermentioned premises as a place wherein the rectifying and compounding of spirits may be carried on, viz.:

Place for Rectifying and Compounding Spirits.

All that portion of allotment U, in the colony of Victoria, county of Bourke, parish of South Melbourne, bounded as follows, viz.:—Commencing at the west angle of allotment 2 and bounded on the north-east by the said allotment bearing south twenty-seven degrees east four chains; on the south-east by a road bearing south sixty-three degrees west three chains fifty-one links; on the south-west by a road bearing north forty-seven degrees twenty-nine minutes west three chains sixty-seven links; and on the north-west by lines bearing north forty degrees thirty-one minutes east one chain thirty-nine links; and north sixty-three degrees east three chains fifty-one links to the point of commencement. DARLINGFORD PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the 8th section of *The Cemeteries Statute 1864*, whereby it is enacted that the trustees of any such cemetery shall have power and authority to make such rules and regulations, and to do and perform and cause to be done and performed all such acts, matters, and things as may be necessary and proper for any of the purposes aforesaid, and for directing the positions of all graves and vaults to be made in the said cemetery, the depths of the graves and construction of coffins to be admitted into vaults, and the covering of vaults so as to prevent the escape of any noxious exhalation or evaporation in the said cemetery, and for protecting the buildings, monuments, shrubberies, plantations, and enclosures therein and thereof from destruction or damage. The trustees of the above-named cemetery make and promulgate the following rules and regulations:—

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
2. By the 19th section of the statute, any person making a vault or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons and his or their representatives for ever.

3. Application for such permission to be made at the office of the secretary; a certificate of permission, in the form set out in the schedule, will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the proper charges.
4. Orders for interment to be given to the secretary of the cemetery; only such order to be given between the hours of Nine a.m. and Three p.m. the previous day.
5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug; parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the surveyor; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent, in writing, of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.
6. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.
7. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.
8. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. throughout the year.
9. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
10. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.
11. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription, to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are required by the 7th section of the Act to determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument according to description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.
12. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
13. The ground will be open daily from sunrise to sunset.
14. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected, and registers of all parties are kept by the secretary.
15. Persons committing any trespass, injury to trees, flowers, or erections, or otherwise infringing the said statute, will be proceeded against according to the provisions of the said statute.
16. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and St. George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute 1864 amendment Act* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon the application in writing of the council of any shire or road district, to proclaim any part of such shire or road district, to be defined by such council, and not being in or within one mile of any city or town, a part within which the licensing magistrates for such district might grant certificates for publicans' licenses as aforesaid for which should be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds; and on the like application of the council of any borough, not being within fifty miles of the city of Melbourne, the Governor in Council might if he should think fit proclaim any portion of such borough as a part within which the licensing magistrates for the district might grant certificates for such publicans' licenses, and for which license should be charged a like fee of Ten pounds; and the said Governor in Council might from time to time revoke any such proclamation, such revocation to take effect from the time of the expiration of the last issued license under such proclamation: And whereas by a proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the fourth day of April 1871, the shire of Avon (excepting certain portions thereof) was amongst other localities constituted a district in which certificates for Publicans' £10 licenses might be granted: And whereas it is expedient to alter the above-mentioned proclamation so far as it relates to the above-mentioned proclamation so far as it relates to the shire of Avon: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the proclamation hereinbefore referred to so far as it relates to constituting the shire of Avon (excepting certain portions) a district within which licensing magistrates may grant certificates for publicans' licenses for each of which shall be charged an annual license fee of Ten pounds, by reducing the exempted area around the boundaries of the township of Stratford from two miles to a quarter of a mile.

BYE-LAW No. 1.

PART IX.—SECTIONS 2 AND 3.—MISCELLANEOUS MATTERS.

2. *Damaging trees.*—If any person shall wilfully, and without the authority of the council, cut, break, bark, root up, or otherwise destroy or damage the whole or any part of any tree, sapling, shrub, or underwood growing in or upon any street, road, or place under the management of the council, although the injury done shall not be to the amount of one shilling, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

3. *Removing soil, &c., from public places.*—If any person shall, without the authority of the council, break, displace, or remove the surface or soil of any land belonging to or under the control or management of the council, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

BYE-LAW No. 2.

PART XI.—REGULATIONS OF PROCEEDINGS OF COUNCIL, OFFICERS, ETC.

1. *General conduct of business.*—In all cases not herein provided for, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the council.

2. *Minutes of meeting to be read at next subsequent meeting.*—At every meeting of the council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and

the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed as by this Act required.

3. *Order of business at meetings.*—After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the council at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

1. Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the council.
2. Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
3. Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
4. Presentation of reports of committees.
5. Payments.
6. Ordinary business.
7. Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
8. Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
9. Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
10. Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4. *Divisions.*—Whenever a division shall be demanded by any councillor, the councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman.

5. *Addresses to Governor.*—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and the clerk of the municipality, unless otherwise ordered by the council.

6. *Motions.*—All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the municipal clerk at the close of the meeting of council, or if not required by law to be given at a meeting, then three clear days prior to the next meeting of council; and such clerk shall enter the same in the notice of motion book, in the order in which they may be received.

7. *Motions to be moved in order in motion-book.*—Except by leave of the council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the municipal clerk in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

8. *Motion to be proceeded with by councillor giving same except with consent.*—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the councillor who gave notice of the same, unless by some other councillor producing written authority from him to that effect.

9. *Order, &c., of debate.*—Any councillor desirous of making a motion or amendment or taking part in discussion thereon shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the councillor (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon and the question of order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

10. *Nature of motion to be stated.*—Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the council thereon.

11. *Motion not to be withdrawn without leave.*—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the council.

12. *Motion to be seconded.*—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the council unless it be seconded, but a councillor may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the council by directing the mayor's or chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

13. *Mover of motion.*—A councillor moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a councillor merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

14. *Designation of councillors.*—The councillors in meeting of council shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of mayor, president, chairman, or councillor, as the case may require.

15. *Priority of councillors.*—If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

16. *Chairman to rise in addressing council.*—The chairman shall rise in addressing the council to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

17. *Councillor not to speak second time on same question.*—No councillor shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

18. *Points of order.*—The chairman when called upon to decide on points of order or practice shall state the provision,

rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

19. *Councillors not to digress, &c.*—No councillor shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other councillor in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on councillors shall be deemed highly disorderly.

20. *Councillors to apologize for disorderly, &c., expression.*—Whenever any councillor shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, the councillor so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression and to make a satisfactory apology to the council.

21. *Councillor called to order to sit down.*—A councillor called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.

22. *Councillor twice offending guilty of an offence.*—Any councillor using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw and to apologize for such conduct and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

23. *Strangers.*—Any person not being a councillor who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the council, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

24. *Councillor not attending order for call.*—Any councillor not attending in compliance with an order for a call of the whole council without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof shall be guilty of an offence.

25. *Councillor may demand documents.*—Any councillor may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the council applying to the question under discussion.

26. *Voting.*—The council shall vote by show of hands, and any councillor present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

27. *Question, how declared.*—The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the council, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

28. *Motions, &c., to be in writing.*—At every meeting of the council all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover, and delivered to the chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

29. *No second amendment until previous one disposed of.*—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

30. *Effect of rejection of words in original motion.*—If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

31. *If amendment be negatived, a second one may be moved.*—If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the council for discussion at a time.

32. *Mover of motion to have right of reply.*—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

33. *Motion for adjournment.*—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council; but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice-paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

34. *Protests.*—Any councillor may protest against any resolution of the council, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting; and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the council by the protesting councillor in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the municipal clerk, and signed by such councillor, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the council to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the council.

35. *Lapsed questions.*—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the councillors present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

36. *Lapsed order of the day may be restored.*—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice-book for a future day, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

37. *Committees.*—Minutes of all proceedings of committees as well as of their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committees' minute-book, and being signed by the chairman of the committee shall be presented to the council; and the municipal clerk, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of committees.

38. *Meetings of the committee.*—The town clerk shall convene every committee within twenty days of its first appointment, or at any other time thereafter by order of the council, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee or of any two members of the committee.

39. *Petitions.*—No petition shall be presented after the council shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

40. *Petitions to be respectful.*—It shall be incumbent on every councillor presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the council, and that the contents do not violate any bye-law or any provision hereof.

41. *Councillors to affix their names.*—Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

42. *Petitions to be in writing.*—Every petition shall be in writing, and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every skin or sheet on which it is written.

43. *To be signed by petitioners.*—Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

44. *No letters, &c., to be attached.*—No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

45. *Councillors confined to statement of certain facts.*—Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

46. *Appointments, &c., of officers.*—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the council shall take place until fourteen clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the shire inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

47. *Salaries of officers, &c.*—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the council shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

48. *No councillor, &c., to be surety for officer.*—No councillor or officer of the council and no assessor or auditor of the municipality shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the council or for any work to be done for the council.

49. *Expense of preparing security.*—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty or contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

50. *Miscellaneous.*—All the plans and specifications for any public work shall be laid before the council prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, and be open for inspection by any ratepayer during that time.

51. *Treasurer to disburse moneys in certain cases.*—It shall be lawful for the treasurer of the municipality from time to time, on the written order of the municipal clerk, to disburse such moneys as shall have been appropriated by the council for the purposes of this clause, and as shall be required for any necessary occasion, not exceeding in the whole in any interval between two ordinary meetings of the council the sum of Five pounds.

52. *Suspension of rules.*—Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained in this subdivision may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the council.

53. *Penalty.*—If any person shall be guilty of any wilful offence or misfeasance or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission contrary to any provision contained in this subdivision, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding five pounds.
