PROCLAMATION

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Str George Feriguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Passengers, Harbors, and Navigation Statute 1865 it was amongst other things enacted that the Government Gazette, from time to time frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of ports in Victoria and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs, and might appoint officers to carry out and enforce such rules and regulations; and stropt time to time in like manner might alter amend, or repeal any such limits, boundaries, rules, and regulations, and substitute others in their stead: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby repeal all rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of the said ports and for the regulation of shipping in the same hitherto in force, and do declare that the following shall be the general rules and orders applicable to all ports and harbors within Victoria, that is to say.

Flag for vessels from other than Australasian ports.

I. The person in charge of any ship from other than Australasian ports.

1. The person in charge of any ship from other than Australasian ports shall, when entering any port of Victoria, hoist and keep her ensign flying at the manmast-head, until the vessel has been boarded and cleared by the Health Officer, when the ensign is to be hauled-down and a blue flag hoisted and kept flying until the ship has been cleared by the Immigration Officer, if such vessel have passengers on board.

Flag for vessels from Australasian ports.

2. The person in charge of any ship having passengers on board from any Australasian port (not in Victoria) shall, when entering any port in Victoria, hoist a blue flag at the mainmasthead, and keep it flying until cleared by the Immigration Officer

Ship entering port.

Ship entering port.

3. No person, except the Pilot and Health and Immigration Officers, and boatmen employed to convey them, shall, with any vessel or boat whatever, go alongside of, nor shall any person, except the pilot and such officers, board any ship from other than an Australasian port when entering or within any port in Victoria, before she has been cleared by the Health Officer, nor in the case of ships carrying passengers shall any person on board leave such vessel before she has been so cleared by the Immigration Officer.

Blue flag.

4. No person, except the Pilot and other duly authorized officers of Government, and such reporters for the press as hold a written authority from the Government, shall go on board of or leave any ship carrying passengers entering or within any port, 'until such vessel has been cleared by the Immigration Officer, which clearance will be indicated by the blue flag being hauled down.

hauled down.

5. The Health Officer boards all ships arriving at any port in Victoria, from any port beyond Australusia, between sunrise and sunset. All such vessels arriving at 1'ort Phillip Heads between sunrise and sunset must remain off Shortland's Bluff until cleared by the Health Officer.

Should any ship arrive at 1'ort 1'hilip Heads after sunset, and not anchor off Shortland's Bluff, but proceed to Melbourne, she will be inspected and cleared by the Health and Immigration Officers on anchoring in Hobson's Bay. The person in charge of, any ship not cleared by the Health Officer at the Heads shall hoist and keep her ensign, with a blue flag under, flying until cleared by the Health and Immigration Officers in Hobson's Bay.—Vessels calling at Australasian ports on their way to Victoria, and all vessels from affected Australasian ports, or having infectious diseases on board, shall come under rules 1 and 5.

Master to report to boarding officer.

Master to report to boarding officer.

6. The master or person in charge of any ship entering any port in Victoria is required to furnish both the Health Officer and Immigration Officer, or Immigration Officer only, as the case may be (rude rules 1 and 2), with a written report of such particulars of his voyage, cargo, and passengers, and such information relating to the same as may be required.

Blue flag.

7. No boat shall make fast to, or tow alongside of any inward-bound ship carrying passengers under weigh within any port, except steamtugs and those duly authorized by Government, before the ship is properly anchored and the blue flag hauled

Heave to for boarding officer.

8. The Pilot, master, or person in charge of any vessel entering, departing from or within any port, shall by every means in his power, consistent with the safety of such ship, assist every duly authorized public officer in boarding or leaving such ship, and no person on board of any such ship shall interfere with or obstruct any Government officer or pilot whilst carrying out their duties respectively.

National colors.

- 9. Every ship must, between sunrise and sunset hoist her national colors under the following circumstances:—
 - 1. When entering any port, the colors to be kept flying until the vessel has arrived at her final destination.
 2. On Sundays and public holidays, weather permitting.
 3. On leaving port.

Show number.

10. The person in charge of any vessel entering or departing from any port shall, as the vessel approaches any signal station, hoist the vessel's number or distinguishing flag; and if inward bound, the number of the port the vessel is from. Such flags shall be kept flying until answered from the station.

Crew on board.

11. All ships plying within any port must be in charge of a competent master, and also be manned by a sufficient number of experienced scamen.

Anchor buous.

12. All ships must have proper buoys and sufficient buoyropes to their anchors. Any anchor, kedge, cable, or mooring slipped, parted, or cut from, if not weighed within twelve hours, may be weighed by order of the Harbor-master, at the risk and avenues of the owner. risk and expense of the owner.

Firearms.

13. All vessels must unshot their guns immediately after entering any port, and no guns or firearms are to be discharged by any person on board any ship or boat or on the shore within any port, nor any blue-lights, rockets, or other combustibles burned unless permission in writing has been obtained from the Harbor-master, except only when urgent assistance is

Vessels moored.

14. Vessels moored with two anchors are always to have both cables clear. (1.) Vessels lying at single anchor are to have the second anchor clear. (2.) In both cases the cables must be kept in readiness to be slipped, veered, or hove in, in case of fire or other accident. fire or other accident.

Government boats.

15. All boats alongside of ships, wharfs, or jetties, shall give way to Government boats on duty.

16. No vessels (except steamers plying with passengers only) shall be unmoored on Sunday from her anchorage, or from her berth alongside any quay; and no work shall be done on any ship in harbor on Sundays, except such as may be necessary for the cleanliness or safety of the ship, or for the navigation of steamers aforesaid, unless by the express permission in writing of the Harbor-master.

Boats, &c., astern of vessels.

17. No boat or lighter shall be allowed to ride astern of any vessel at anchor within the ports of Melbourne or Geelong at a greater distance from such vessel than three fathoms, nor shall any deeply laden boat, log or logs of timber, or other floating objects likely to injure other vessels or boats, be allowed to remain astern of any vessel.

Boats near wharfs.

18. No lighter or boat shall anchor at less distance than one hundred fathoms from any wharf or jetty, except for the purpose of immediately hauling alongside.

Boats at landing-place.

19. No boat shall remain at any landing-place after discharging her cargo and passengers (or make fast to the steps or handrail belonging thereto), unless there be some person in charge ready to remove such boat when required to do so by the Harbor-master or person deputed by him.

Boiling pitch, tar, &c.

20. No pitch, tar, resin, oil, or other such like combustible matter shall be heated by fire on board any vessel or boat without the permission in writing of the Harbor-master. [But this rule is not to be understood to prevent the burning of any lamp or candle for giving light on board, or the lighting of any fire for the purpose of cooking or working the machinery of any vessel, although such permission may not have been given.]

Fires.-Smoking ships.

21. Between the hours of ten o'clock p.m. (10 p.m.) and four a.m. (4 a.m.) no fires, except the furnaces of steamers, shall be lit, or unenclosed lights allowed to burn on board any vessel in any port or harbor where vessels lie for the purpose of loading and discharging cargo or effecting repairs; nor shall any vessel be fumigated or smoked, except the vessels be moored at a sufficient distance from other vessels, and permission in writing be obtained from the Harbor-master. All fires and lights allowed must be properly enclosed.

Fire-buckets.

22. All vessels under four hundred tons are required to be provided with fire buckets in the proportion of four to every hundred tons, and two for every additional hundred tons above four hundred, one-half of which buckets shall be constantly hung up in some convenient place, with lanyards attached ready for drawing water.

Lights must be enclosed.

23. No artificial light is to be used in any part of any vessel, except the same be securely closed, and in charge of some trustworthy person.

Lights out.

24. After work has ceased for the day on board of any vessel all hatches are to be put on and properly closed to prevent accidents, and before closing the hatches, an officer shall go into the hold and into the between decks and satisfy limself. that—(1.) There are no signs of fire. (2.) That all lights have been put out except those authorized in clause 21, and an entry thereof shall be made in the log-book.

Ship on fire.

25. In the event of fire occurring on board any vessel in port, all persons in charge of or otherwise belonging to any vessel or boat are to afford such assistance towards extinguishing the fire and the protection of neighboring vessels as the Harbormaster or person deputed by him may demand.

Beacons not to be made fast to.

26. No person in charge of any vessel shall moor or make fast any such vessel to any buoy or beacon not being a mooring or warping buoy or beacon.

Dead animals.

27. No person shall throw, place, or leave any dead body within the boundary of any port, or any dead animal on the shores thereof.

Death on board.

28. In the event of the death of any person on board of any vessel in port, the master of such vessel is to cause the body to be buried on shore, previously reporting the particulars to

Watch on board.

Watch on board.

29. All vessels in port shall always have at least one seaman as watch on deck, with the following exceptions:—(1.) Vessels laid up, coal hulks, ballast or other lighters lying within such limits as the Harbor-master authorized them to occupy; such vessel or vessels shall always have one person on board. (2.) Vessels (not being vessels moored to or lying at any pier or jetty) and boats lying within the limits marked A are not required to keep a person constantly on board. All persons aforesaid, and all persons in charge of boats, shall answer the challenge of the water police or other public officer.

Anchor lights.

30. All vessels and boats at anchor within Hobson's Bay must, from sunset to sunrise, exhibit a bright white light in a globular lantern, of eight inches in diameter, and so constructed as to show a clear, uniform, and unbroken light visible all round the horizon, and at a distance of at least one mile, except ships and boats moored to the shore, or to any wharf, pier, or jetty, or within the limits marked A.

Limits marked A.

- A line drawn from the end of the Sandridge town pier to the south end of the steamboat jetty on the east side of the Sandridge railway pier.
- 2. A line drawn from the south end of the steamboat jetty on the west side of the Sandridge railway pier to the red dolphin at the northern side of the entrance to the River Yarra.
- 3. A line drawn from the black dolphin at the southern side of the entrance to the River Yarra to the end of the Ann street wharf, and thence to the end of the railway and breakwater piers at Williamstown.

Careening, &c.

31. Masters requiring to careen, heave down, or haul their vessels or boats on shore for the purpose of inspection or repairs, must obtain permission of the Harbor-master of the port, except where such work is proposed to be done on private property.

Gangway ladder or stage.

32. Every vessel lying in the bay and not alongside any pier shall be provided with a good and sufficient gangway ladder. Every vessel lying alongside any pier or wharf, or alongside any vessel moored to any pier or wharf, shall be provided with a good and sufficient stage for the use of persons coming from or going on board such vessel, and every such stage shall be made of not less than two (2) inch planks, and be at least three (3) feet broad, with cross battens and ropes on both sides from the vessel to the wharf or from vessel to vessel, supported by wooden or iron stanchions not less than three (3) feet high, and also with a good and sufficient net of not less than the following dimensions placed underneath the stage to prevent accidents, viz.:—Length eighteen (18) feet, to readth eight (8) feet, to be made of one and a half (14) inch rope, to be seven and a half (74) inches from seizing to seizing so as to form fifteen (15) inch meshes.

Report of accidents.

Report of accidents.

33. Accidents involving personal injury, loss of life or property, from loss or collision of vessels or boats, are to be reported in writing by the person in charge of the vessel or boat concerned to the nearest Harbor-master as soon as possi-

Landing passengers.

34. Masters of vessels arriving from ports beyond the Australasian colonies shall not compel their steerage passengers to leave their vessels for the purpose of landing at Melbourne or Geelong after two o'clock p.m. during the months of April, May, June, July, August and September, nor after three o'clock p.m. during the remaining months of the year, unless with the consent of the Immigration Officer.

Berthing vessels.

35. The Harbor-master, or a person deputed by him, shall appoint the place where all vessels, lighters, and boats shall lie within any port.

Removing vessels.

36. It shall be competent at any time for the Harbor-master, or a person deputed by him, to order any vessel, lighter, boat, timber, or other article, to be removed from any berth alongside any quay or anchorage from or to any part of the harbor. ' General order.

37. All masters, pilots, or other persons in charge of vessels, shall, when called upon by the Harbor-master, or a person

deputed by him to do so, immediately strike their topgallant yards and masts, have their jib, spanker and all booms rigged close in, top up, and brace fore and aftall yards, and moor with two anchors, or clear hause, and shall obey the lawful orders of the Harbor- or Pier-master, and generally follow such directions as the weather, the crowded condition of the port, or other circumstances may render necessary or expedient in the judgment of the Harbor- or Pier-master, with a view to the safety and interest of the whole shipping.

Compulsory removal of vessels.

Compulsory removal of vessels.

38. In the event of any hostile attack or other emergency necessitating, in the Harbor-master's opinion, the immediate removal of any vessel from one part of any harbor to another, the Harbor-master is empowered to order such vessel to be removed at once, and should the owner, master, or person in charge not immediately, on being called upon, take the most prompt measures to carry the Harbor-master orders into effect, the Harbor-master is authorized to hire such steam-tugs and men, tackle or ballast, as may be required to effect such removal; and no such vessel shall be cleared out at the Custom-house until the expense so incurred in such removal has been paid, due notice thereof having been given to the Collector of Customs; and no responsibility shall attach to the Harbormaster for any damage that may be occasioned by his act done in such emergency in accordance with this rule. done in such emergency in accordance with this rule

Obstructions to be removed.

Obstructions to be removed.

39. No wharf, pier, jetty, tramway, landing, wool or hide washing stage or fencing of any description shall be crected by any person on the margin of any bay, river, or navigable creek in any port without the permission of the Harbormaster; and if any obstruction whatever be found to interfere or likely to interfere with the free and safe navigation of any port, it shall be competent for the Harbor-master to remove it, and the owner thereof shall pay all expenses incurred for such removal, or require the person who was owner of such obstruction at the time it arose, or who may have become the owner, to remove it; and such owner shall exhibit on or near such obstruction such flags, masts, or lights as the Harbor-master may direct, until it is removed to his satisfaction.

FAIRWAYS, CHANNELS, AND RIVERS. No vessel to lie in fairways.

No vessel, lighter, boat, or raft shall be anchored in the middle of any fairway, channel, or river; but when detained there, they shall lie close over on either side of such fairway, channel, or river; nor shall any cable, chain, hawser, or rope be placed across any such fairway, channel, or river, without permission from the Harbor-master; and such Harbor-master may define, by bearings or otherwise as he may deem most convenient, the limits of the fairway in any port or place within his jurisdiction within which no ship or vessel shall bring un.

$Hobson's\ Bay\ anchorage.$

- 41. A pilot in charge of any vessel (not coming within the gunpowder anchorage regulations) bound to Hobson's Bay, shall ascertain from the master whether such vessel is to discharge her cargo at the Sandridge or Williamstown pier, and moor her accordingly; but should there be no vacant berth, or should the vessel not be going alongside either pier, he is to moor such vessel with two anchors in a clear berth within the inner anchorage as close over to Sandridge or Williamstown side as her draught of water will permit.
- 42. Masters of vessels exempt from pilotage are to comply with clause 40, so far as relates to the anchorage within Hobson's Bay.

Fairway to be kept clear.

43. Any vessel compelled by unavoidable circumstances to let go an anchor in the middle of any fairway, channel, or river, shall, as soon as possible, lift the same, and place it in such a situation as not to interrupt or interfere with the free passage of other vessels.

Rafts, &c.

44. No raft or timber shall be taken up the Yarra without a written order from the Harbor-master.

Yards to be peaked or braced, and booms, &c., to be rigged in.

45. Every vessel in tow of a steamer proceeding up or down the River Yarra shall have the yards apeak or braced fore and aft, and the jibboom and flying jibboom rigged in to within three feet from the cap, and all running bowsprits run in close to the stems; the studding-sail booms and irons taken from the yards; the quarter and stern davits, the main and mizen booms and bumpkins, rigged in; and while lying in the river shall peak the yards as directed by the Harbor-master.

Berth alongside wharfs.

46. No vessel shall go alongside any wharf or jetty without the authority of the Harbor- or Pier-master.

Vessel about to be docked to be reported to Harbor-master.

47. No vessel shall be taken up the River Yarra for the purpose of being admitted into dock, nor shall any vessel be docked, undocked, or removed to or from any wharf, quay, pier, or anchorage, to or from any dock or dock-wharf without due notice thereof being given to the Harbor-master.

Geelong channel.

48. No sailing vessel shall enter the new channel leading into Geelong whilst any other vessel is passing through it from the opposite direction.

Ships to be berthed in rotation.

49. All vessels, on application being made to the Harbor- or Pier-master, will be provided with vacant berths in rotation, according to their time of arrival in the port. Any vessel on being appointed a discharging berth must immediately proceed to occupy it, otherwise the berth will be given to the vessel next in turn.

Hatches to be on.

50. All vessels, when not engaged in loading or unloading, shall uniformly have their hatchways and coal scuttles securely

Stray boats, &c., to be handed to water police.

51. All stray boats, timber, or other articles found within any port, must be immediately delivered up to the water police, in whose custody they shall remain until claimed by the proper owner, who must pay all reasonable expenses thereon.

PUBLIC WHARFS AND JETTIES.

Time allowed ships at wharfs.

52. The time allowed vessels with full cargoes on board to occupy berths at public quays, for the purpose of discharging cargo, shall be (exclusive of Sundays and holidays) as

and so on at the rate of one (1) day for every additional hundred tons register. Vessels not having full cargoes on board shall be allowed time in proportion.

Taking in cargo.

53. Vessels taking in cargo shall remove to any berth pointed out for that purpose by the Harbor- or Pier-master.

Discharging.

54. Vessels discharging cargo shall have prior claim to the wharf to vessels taking in.

The cargo of any vessel loading or discharging at any wharf shall not occupy a greater space on any such wharf than the length of such vessel, except by special permission of the Harbor-master.

Outside berth.

- 55. Vessels discharging or taking in cargo at outside berths shall be allowed two days for one of the foregoing scale.
- 56. Cargo may be discharged from or taken in by any ship lying outside, over and across the deck of any vessel lying alongside of any quay.

Placing goods on jetty.

57. All goods or other articles landed on any wharf or jetty shall be so placed as to keep the mooring posts or rings free, and allow a clear passage of at least five feet from the edge of the wharf nearest the vessel, upon which space no goods shall be allowed to remain.

Space round cranes to be kept clear.

58. No goods shall be allowed to remain after being landed upon any wharf or wharf-road within the radius of any of the public cranes, nor shall any goods or other articles be deposited for shipment or otherwise upon any wharf or wharf-road within the above-named radius and an approach of twenty-five (25) feet wide of the wharf-roads in front of and in line with the public cranes, which must at all times be kept clear, and upon which no goods, carts, carriages, or other articles shall be placed or deposited so as to prevent the free use and working of the cranes.

Wharfs to be cleared.

59. No vessel shall be removed from the wharf until the portion of it opposite to or required for the use of such vessel has been thoroughly cleared of all rubbish, and swept clean by a person belonging to her or hired by the master or owner of such vessel, to the satisfaction of the Harbor- or Pier-master.

Removing goods from wharfs.

Removing goods from wharfs.

60. In the event of any goods which may be landed or placed for shipment on any of the public wharfs being allowed to remain on such wharf more than twenty-four hours, notice will be served on the owner, consignee, or exporter of such goods, and if the owner, consignee, or exporter of such goods cannot be ascertained or found, a notice will be posted upon or affixed to some conspicuous part of such goods; and if they are not removed within three days from the date of such notice, the goods will be taken by the officer discharging the duties of wharfinger to the Customs Reserve, or some other place duly appointed for that purpose, and there dealt with according to the 43rd section of The Passengers, Harbors, and Navigation Statute 1865. Statute 1865

Goods outwards.

- 61. No goods shall be placed on any of the public wharfs for shipment until the vessel for which the goods have been entered outwards has been berthed at the wharf.
- 62. No person shall carry on any retail trade in timber or other goods on the wharf or wharf-land.

Improper use of wharfs.

68. No sorting, bulking, or repacking of timber or other goods, nor screening of coals, will be permitted on any portion

of the wharf, and no coals shall be placed on any wharf except in bags, nor shall any goods or other articles be put on any wharf which, in the opinion of the Harbor-master, are likely to occasion damage to such wharf, nor shall any goods or other articles be placed on any wharf so as to be an impediment to the wharf approaches or an obstacle to the removal of other goods from the wharf.

64. For the preservation of good order, and for the convenience of the shipping generally, all watermen, stevedores, porters, carters, and others engaged on any wharf, jetty, or pier, shall obey the lawful orders of the Harbor- or Piermaster; and no carriage, cab, dray, or other vehicle drawn by horses or other animals, nor the owner nor driver thereof, shall ply on any pier or jetty without the permission of the Harbor- or Piermaster; nor shall any person without such consent as aforesaid leave any carriage, cab, dray, or other vehicle, or any horse upon such pier or jetty.

No person shall take, lead, drive, or conduct any horse or other animal, or any carriage, cab, dray, lorry, or any vehicle whatever drawn by any horse or horses, animal or animals, upon or along any public pier, jetty, or wharf, without the consent of the Harbor-master or Pier-master in charge of such public pier, jetty, or wharf; and no owner or person in charge of any carriage, cab, dray, lorry, or vehicle shall, without the consent of the said Harbor-master or Pier-master, leave the same or allow or permit or suffer the same to be left on such pier, jetty, or wharf:

Ship at owner's risk.

65. The Government take no charge of vessels or boats lying within any port; their security and safety, whether at an anchor or moored alongside any pier or jetty, is at the risk of the owners.

Rubbish.

66. No ballast, rubbish, gravel, earth, stone, wreck, filth, or refuse shall be thrown from any boat, ship, or vehicle by any person into any port, river, or anchorage, or be placed, landed or shipped in any port, except at the places and in the manner pointed out by the Harbor-master; and all such ballast, gravel, rubbish, earth, stone, wreck, filth, or refuse shall be removed as and where such Harbor-master may direct.

Steam hoisting machinery.

- Steam hoisting machinery.

 67. The master of any vessel within the meaning of The Passengers, Harbors, and Navigation Statute 1865, or any person under his command, shall not permit any steam machinery to be used on any public wharf for hoisting cargo into or out of such ship, or for any other purpose in connection with such ship, unless the owner of such steam machinery shall be the holder of an uncancelled certificate from the Chief Harbormaster that such machinery is in good order, and that the person in charge thereof is duly qualified; and such master or other person shall, while such machinery is being so used, keep possession of such certificate, and shall produce it on demand to the Harbor- or Pier-master in charge of the wharf, pier, or jetty. Such certificates will be issued by the Chief Harbormaster, subject to the following conditions:—

 1. All steam hoisting-engines, and the persons in charge
 - 1. All steam hoisting-engines, and the persons in charge thereof, shall be examined by the Engineer Surveyor to the Steam Navigation Board, and passed by him.
 - 2. These engines to be examined once every six months.
 - 3. A fee of twenty shillings (20s.) shall be paid for each survey of an engine, and a fee of twenty shillings (20s.) for each person so examined and passed.

BALLAST.

68. No sand ballast or other material shall be raised from below high-water mark for ballasting vessels, except under conditions approved and at places appointed by Chief Harbor-

Tarpaulins to be used.

69. Proper tarpaulins or shoots shall be used in discharging or taking in ballast, coals, rubbish, gravel, earth, or filth, so as to effectually prevent any part thereof falling overboard; and no ballast shall be taken on board or discharged from any vessel after dark without special permission of the Harbor-

Ballast vessels and persons in charge to be licensed.

Ballast ressels and persons in charge to be licensed.

70. The master or any other person in charge of any vessel within the meaning of The Passengers, Harbors, and Navigation Statute 1865 shall not receive ballast into any ship under his command unless the owner of the lighter supplying it shall be in possession of an uncancelled certificate from the Chief Harbor-master that such lighter has been duly measured and marked, and is in good order, and that the person in charge of such lighter is duly licensed; and such master or other person shall, while such lighter is employed supplying ballast to the ship under his command, keep possession of such certificate, and shall produce it on demand to the Chief Harbor-maater, or any other officer deputed by him; and no ballast shall be supplied by a ballast lighter except she, as well as the master, is duly licensed by the Chief Harbor-master.

Conditions upon which certificates will be granted.

- Certificates shall be issued by the Chief Harbor-master subject to the following conditions
 - 1. All ballast lighters and persons in charge thereof shall be examined by an officer acting under the orders of the Chief Harbor-master and passed by him.
 - 2. All ballast lighters shall be surveyed once in every twelve months or within such shorter period as may be found necessary by the Chief Harbor-master.

- 3. Every lighter shall have the number of her certificate painted on both bows in figures (white on black ground) of not less than twelve (12) inches deep and two (2) inches
- 4. An iron batten three (3) inches wide shall be secured to the sides of the stem and stern posts, or other convenient place to be decided by the Chief Harbor-master or other officer acting under his orders, and so marked as to show the draught of water for every five (5) tons weight of ballast carried or discharged, such marks to be in white figures where practicable of not less than one and a half (1½) inches deep, or of such dimensions as shall be approved by the Chief Harbor-master.

 5. Two (2) grooves shall be entitled the planking from
- as shall be approved by the Chief Harbor-master.

 5. Two (2) grooves shall be cut into the planking from stem to stern post of not less than two (2) inches in width, and painted white, to denote the loaded and light draught lines; the lower edge of these grooves to be on a level with the water's edge to mark these measurements; such marks and corresponding draught of water shall be endorsed upon the certificates.
- endorsed upon the certificates.

 6. Such licenses may be cancelled or suspended when it shall be found to the satisfaction of the Chief Harbormsster that the owner or master has defrauded or attempted to defraud the master, owner, or charterer of any ship, by altering the marks or figures on any ballast lighter, or by delivering or attempting to deliver short weight of ballast to any vessel, or from any other cause whatever, or has been guilty of such misconduct as in the opinion of the Chief Harbor-master constitutes a sufficient cause for the cancellation or suspension of any such license or certificate. Masters of vessels shall have power to inspect any lighter bringing ballast along-side such vessel for ballasting purposes, and to test the accuracy of the measurement of the ballast lighter, and the weight of ballast she supplies; and no master or owner of any lighter shall refuse to allow such master or owner of a ship to examine such lighter, or test the weight of the ballast during her discharge; or to pump out water from the said lighter, when requested so to do.

 Complaints to be made to Harbor-master.

Complaints to be made to Harbor-master.

72. Masters of vessels having any complaint are to report the same to the Harbor-master.

Lighters to be inspected.

73. The Chief Harbor-master, or any person acting under his orders, may inspect or remeasure any ballast lighters, or test the accuracy of such measurement, and appoint the place and method where and how such measurement shall be made.

74. The expense of measuring and marking ballast lighters shall be borne and paid by the owner or owners of such ballast

GUNPOWDER.

Gunpowder flag.

75. Vessels and boats must not approach any licensed powder-hulk nearer than 200 yards, unless duly authorized; and every person in charge of a vessel or boat shall observe due caution when approaching any vessel having the gunpowder flag hoisted.

No fire allowed.

76. No fire or light is to be burning on board any vessel or boat during the time gunpowder is being discharged from or taken on board of such vessel or boat.

Stores.

Stores.

77. All gunpowder and other explosive materials retained on board any vessel as stores must, during the time such vessel is within the precincts of any port, be securely kept in a suitable copper magazine.

78. All boats specially licensed to convey gunpowder either to or from ships, wharfs, or other places, shall be subject to all the regulations, so far as the same may be applicable, now in force for the management of powder-hulks; and no boat having gunpowder on board shall be towed by a high-pressure open-decked steamboat whose furnaces are exposed, nor shall be towed by any other steamer with less tow-line between her and the steamer than 60 feet.

79. Boats conveying gunpowder to or from any vessel or magazine shall not remain at anchor in the River Yarra or elsewhere, except as hereinafter provided; but if unable to discharge all the powder with which they may be laden into the magazine or vessel, as the case may be, between the hours of Seven a.m. and Five p.m., or Seven a.m. and Four p.m. respectively, must return and anchor within the limits prescribed for any powder-hulk licensed under The Importation and Custody of Gunpowder Statute 1864.

The following extracts from The Gunpowder Statute of 1864 are here published for general information, and not as part of these regulations:—

Vessels having more than Twenty pounds of Gunpowder to anchor within Prescribed Limits until gunpowder landed.

nanded.

Sec. 4. The Governor in Council may prescribe the limits within which no ship or vessel having more than twenty pounds of gunpowder on board arriving in or off any of the ports or harbors of Victoria shall be permitted to anchor, and if the master of any such ship or vessel shall anchor within the limits so prescribed before all such gunpowder shall have been landed, he shall forfeit a sum and exceeding Fifty pounds for every barrel or package of gunpowder which shall not have been so landed previously to anchoring within such limits.

Master of Vessel to Report having Gunpowder on Board.

Sec. 6. The master of every ship arriving in any part of Victoria with gunpowder on board, whether as stores or cargo, shall at the time of making entry at the Custom-house specially report the same; and if any gunpowder be not so reported it shall be forfeited, and the master neglecting to make such report shall forfeit and pay a penalty for such omission or neglect any sum not exceeding One hundred pounds.

Gunpowder not to be landed except between Seven a.m. and Five p.m.

Sec. 7. No gunpowder shall be landed from any ship except between the hours of seven in the morning and five in the after-noon, and any person who shall land, or be concerned in landing, any gunpowder contrary hereto shall forfeit and pay the sum of five pounds for every barrel or package of gunpowder so landed contrary to this provision.

Vessels with gunpowder to hoist flag.

Sec. 8. Every ship or vessel having gunpowder on board exceed-ing twenty pounds in all, shall, immediately on entering any port in Victoria, hoist a union jack at the mainmast-head, which union jack shall not be hauled down until the gunpowder on board be landed according to law.

Importers to enter gunpowder, and get permit to land and store it.

Sec. 9. The importer of gurpowder at any port where a public magazine shall have been appointed or a private magazine shall have been ticensed, shall, within twenty-four hours after the arrival of the importing ship, enter such quipowder at the Custom-house, and shall obtain from the Collector or other principal officer, a permit for the same to be landed and deposited in one of such magazines, which permit shall describe the said gunpowder and name the magazine in which it is to be deposited.

Boats only specially licensed to carry guinowder. See. 10. No boat shall be used for the conveyance of yunpowder either to or from any ship or wharf or other place unless duly licensed for that purpose in accordance with the provisions of the Act now in force, or some Act hereafter to be in force, relating to the Customs; and no gunpowder shall be landed or conveyed from any ship until notice shall have been given to the water police, if any there be at the port or place where such ship shall lie, in sufficient time to enable the police to give such directions as may be necessary to prevent danger, which directions the officer or person in charge of such gunpowder shall in all things obey. Boats only specially licensed to carry gunpowder.

Gunpowder not to be removed from vessel to magazine except between Seven a.m. and Four p.m.

Sec. 11. No gunpowder shall be removed from any vessel for conveyance to any magazine except between the hours of seven in the morning and four in the afternoon, or shall be permitted to be be deposited in the magazine except between the hours of seven in the morning and four in the afternoon.

Coasting steamers not to carry gunpowder.

Sec. 11. No steam vessel arriving in, or departing from, or employed within or on the coast of Victoria, shall carry gunpouder, either as stores or cargo, except such reasonable quantity as may be required for the purpose of making signals.

Vessels receiving gunpowder to be anchored in certain limits.

Sec. 19. No gunpowder shall be put on board any ship unless she be anchored beyond the limits within which importing ships having gunpowder on board are not permitted to anchor, nor except between the hours of seven in the morning and four in the afternoon.

Penalty on offences against this Act not otherwise provided for.

provided for.

Sec. 24. If any gunpowder shall be kept, landed, carried, or shipped contrary to this Act, it shall be forfeited, or if any person shall violate any of the provisions of this Act with respect which no penalty (or the confiscation of gunpowder only) is specified, he shall on conviction forfeit a sum not exceeding One hundred pounds.

GUNPOWDER HULKS.

- GUNPOWDER HULKS.

 1. The vessel proposed to be licensed must be inspected and approved by the Chief Harbor-master.

 2. All projecting iron bolts must be removed or carefully covered over with wood or lead secured with copper nails.

 3. The hold to be decked over and fitted with partitions fore and aft, so as to afford a clear passage up the centre, and proper bins to be creeted for holding powder. No iron to be used; all to be secured with copper nails or wooden pegs.

 4. Copper lightning-conductors to be placed on each side of each mast, and carried well below the light water-line. The pumps to be of wood or copper.

 5. All tools used in coopering casks or for any other purpose on board, all locks, hatchbars, and hoops of casks or buckets, must be copper.

 6. No one shall be permitted on board who has matches, knives, or articles of steel or iron on his person.

 7. No person shall go on board except with magazine slippers on or barefooted, and then only in the presence and with the permission of the person in charge of the hulk.

 8. No fire or smoking is to be permitted on board. The light in the watch-room to be in a carefully secured lantern.

9. An approved trustworthy person must be in charge of the hulk, and a requisite number of assistants be employed to secure safety and despatch in receiving and delivering powder; and a careful and constant watch must be kept on deck, night

secure safety and despatch in receiving and delivering powder; and a careful and constant watch must be kept on deck, night and day.

10. The hulk must be always open for the inspection of any public officer.

11. All persons in charge must live in a house on the upper deck, and all the hatches must be carefully closed and tarpaulined over, except when powder is being received or delivered 12. Before any barrel, box, or case is received on board, it is to be carefully examined, and if it is not perfectly closed so that no powder or combustible matter can escape, or should any iron be found to have been used either in its construction or repair, it is not to be received on board.

13. No barrel, box, or case is, on any account, to be opened in the hold, but when required is to be taken on deck to the shifting shed.

14. All powder to be carefully and securely stowed,
15. The hulk is to be, kept strictly clean and free from all gravel; sand, or grit, and no iron, greased rag, or anything liable to cause combustion is to be permitted on board.

16. The hulk is to be moored in such place and manner as the Chief Harbor-master may direct, beyond the limits prescribed by section 19 of The Importation and Custody of Cunpowder Statute 1864.

MAILS.

Mail flags.

80. All vessels having mails on board for Melbourne or any other port of the colony except Geelong shall, on approaching the anchorage, hoist a white flag at the foremast-head, which flag must be kept up until the mails are taken out of the vessel.

Mails for Geelong.

81. All vessels having mails on board for Geelong shall, on entering between the heads of Port Phillip, hoist a white flag at the foremast-head, as a signal for the mail boat to come off, and shall heave to or anchor within a reasonable distance of Shortland's Bluff until such mails are taken out of the vessel.

Mail boats.

82. All mail boats shall have a preference of berth, whether alongside vessels or wharfs, during such time as they are occupied in shipping or landing mails.

PILOTS.

83. No unqualified person shall assume or continue in charge of a vessel after a licensed pilot has offered to take charge of her; and no person shall use a license which he is not entitled to use for the purpose of making himself appear to be a quali-

Tugs under pilot's orders.

Tugs under pilot's orders.

84. All steamers or boats employed to tow, or in any way move or assist any vessel in charge of a licensed pilot, shall be (whilst employed on such service) under the orders of such pilotin all matters connected with the navigation of such vessel.

85. The master of every vessel not by law exempt from the necessity of employing the service of a pilot shall place her in charge of the first licensed pilot that may come alongside.

Flag.

Flag.

86. The master of any vessel about to enter any port (unless there be a qualified pilot on board, or such ship is exempted from pilotage by law) shall, when within five leagues of the entrance, or until a licensed pilot has come on board, display and keep flying the usual signal for a pilot; and such master shall, by every means in his power consistent with the safety of his ship, facilitate such pilot getting on board.

87. The master of every vessel which by law is exempt from payment of pilotage shall, on arriving within four leagues of any port or harbor, cause a white flag to be hoisted (below the blue flag mentioned in clause 1) at the mainmast-head, and keep it flying until the vessel is anchored within the port.

88. No inward-bound vessel shall exhibit a white flag at the mainmast-head unless the master of such vessel holds an exemption ecrificate from the Plot Board.

89. Pilots shall, while on board any vessel, see that the Port and Harbor Regulations of the colony are strictly complied with by the master or other person in charge of such vessel; and pilots will be held responsible for any neglect or breach of such regulations during the time they are on board of any such vessel.

90. Certificates of pilotage shall be filled up and signed by

90. Certificates of pilotage shall be filled up and signed by the master or person in charge of each vessel piloted, and delivered to the pilot.

Pilot wanted.

91. The master of any ship in port requiring a pilot must make an application in writing twelve (12) hours previously, at the pilot office of the port.

REGULATIONS FOR STEAMBOATS, AND FOR VESSELS MEETING AND PASSING.

Steamer's furnace.

92. The masters of steam-vessels shall, as soon as their vessels are berthed, cause the furnaces and dampers to be so regulated as to prevent the possibility of accidents by fire, and shall so adjust their furnace doors and temper their furnace fires as

that no more than the smallest practicable quantity of smoke

that no more than the smallest placetons of the shall pass therefrom.

33. When steamers have vessels in tow, and are steering opposite courses, the steamer towing a vessel bound inwards before meeting the steamer with a vessel in tow bound outwards shall slack her speed, when practicable, until the other

Steamers to go slow.

94. Steamers about to pass any dredging-machine at work in any river or channel, or any licensed ferry, or public work in progress, must slow their engines to less than half speed for at least one hundred yards before arriving abreast of the dredge ferry or work dredge, ferry, or work.

Dredge.

Dredge.

95. All vessels must pass the dredges on the side indicated by a red ball being displayed by day and a red light by night; when the ball is down they may pass on either side without slacking their speed.

96. Steamers must proceed at moderate speed whilst navigating amongst the shipping in any port. Steamers when navigating the River Yarra must slow, and keep their engines at less than half speed between the Melbourne town boundary post and the Melbourne wharfs, and when passing shipping moored at any wharf in the said river, either above or below the town boundary, shall further reduce their speed to less than three nautical miles per hour.

Man on look-out.

Man on look-out.

97. Every steamer, at all times when under weigh within any port, must have a competent man on the bridge in charge of the vessel, in addition to the helmsman, and also a competent person in charge of and attending to the engine. The tumost care must be taken by the person or persons in charge to prevent accidents to other vessels and boats.

98. No steamer shall tow vessels between the upper and lower legal wharfs at Melbourne, nor tow two vessels abreast of each other, without the sanction of the Harbor-master.

99. All steamers going down the River Yarra from the Melbourne wharfs shall proceed at the time advertised.

100. All sailing vessels will be required, if possible, to swing at their berths at the Australian wharf, and not, as hitherto, at the basin.

at the basin.

101. Vessels coming up the river to the wharfs shall, when in the vicinity of the Queen's wharf, give way to vessels proceeding down the river.

PENAL HULKS.

102. No vessel or boat shall pass between the hulks and the line of buoys moored round those vessels. All persons in charge of boats or vessels passing near said hulks are to answer the sentries' challenge.

MISCELLANEOUS REGULATIONS.

White flag.

103. All vessels outward bound requiring their clearances are to hoist a white flag at the mainmast-head when the ship is ready for sea.

Clearance.

104. After the clearance has been delivered to the master, no passenger shall be taken on board any ship outward bound. 105. A copy of these regulations, together with the Health Officer's report, shall be delivered to the master of every ship or vessel required to take a pilot on her entering any port by the pilot, who must take a receipt for the same.

Every ship to have a copy of Regulations,

106. The master of every ship not required to take a pilot shall have a copy of these regulations delivered to him by the boarding officer; provided that it shall not be necessary in any case to issue a second copy of the regulations to the master, unless proof be given that the regulations previously issued have been lost. Every master or other officer of a ship or vessel to whom a copy of these regulations shall have been delivered shall give, on demand, an acknowledgment in writing to the officer delivering the same.

Complaints to be made to Harbor-master.

107. All complaints against any person connected with the Harbor department must be made in writing to the Chief Harbor-master.

108. The expression "Australasian" shall apply to ports in New Zealand and Tasmania as well as in Australia proper; the expression "immigration officer" shall include any immigration or emigration agent or officer, or any assistant immigration or emigration agent or officer duly appointed to carry out these regulations.

Penalty on Masters and others for non-observance of Port rules. 109. Extract from Passengers, Harbors, and Navigation Statute, No. 255 of 1865:—

255 of 1865:—

51. If the master of any ship, or any person under his command or on board such ship, or if any pilot or other person shall fail or neglect to observe all or any of the rules or regulations to be framed as aforesaid, or shall do or commit anything contrary to the true intent or plain meaning thereof, such master for every such offence committed, either by himself or such person under his command or on board such ship, and such pilot or other person for any such offence committed by himself, shall forfeit and pay a sum not less than Five pounds and not exceeding One hundred pounds.

The births of 538 children, viz., 297 boys and 241 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of December. In the month of November 689 births were registered, or 151 more than in the month under review.

The deaths in December numbered 585, viz., 829 of males and 256 of females; the deaths thus exceeded the births by 47. The deaths were 5 less than those in November, but exceeded the average of December during the previous ten years by 141. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of those ten years by 45.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 93.2° on the 20th and the lowest was 44.9° on the 7th. The mean temperature of the month (61.2°) was more than 2½° below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (34.6°) took place on the 18th, viz., from a maximum of 84.5° to a minimum of 49.9°. The least range (87.7°) was on the 31st, viz., from a maximum of 64.9° to a minimum of 56.2°. The mean daily range was 19.8°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.743 inches) was a fraction below the average.

Males and females died during the month in the proportion of 56 and 44 per cent. respectively. Children who had not reached their fifth year contributed 45 per cent. to the mortality, as against 60 per cent. in December 1874; 48 per cent. in December 1873; 55 per cent. in December 1872; 53 per cent. in December 1871; 52 per cent. in December 1870; 53 per cent. in December 1868; 54 per cent. in December 1867; 69 per cent. in December 1868; and 65½ per cent.

During the month under review eleven deaths occurred of persons of the age of 75 years or upwards. The following are the particulars:—A bricklayer and a carpenter, each aged 75, died of old age; a carpenter, aged 75, of dropsy; a publican, aged 76, drowned himself whilst of unsound mind; a drayman, aged 77, died of old age; a clerk, aged 78, of hepatitis; a laborer, aged 82, of clod age; a female, aged 83, was killed by a fall down stairs; a farmer, aged 84, died of cancer; a laborer, aged 85, of congestion of the lungs; and a female, aged 90, of old age.

Forty* deaths from violent causes were registered during the month, thirty of which are assigned to accident, nine to suicide, and the remaining one was from execution. The following are the particulars:—A boy, aged 9, died of fracture of the neck, a carter, aged 37, of fracture of the ribs, a bricklayer, aged 48, of fracture of the spine, a male, of unstated occupation, aged 59, of fracture of the skull, and a female, aged 83, of concussion of the brain—all caused by accidental falls; a carter, aged 50, was found dying on the road, having met with an accident whilst carting; a carrier, aged 49, died of compound fracture of the leg, caused by a waggon-wheel passing over it; a seaman, aged 16, died of pymmin, the result of an accidental injury to the knee; a carter, aged 30, and a bootmaker, aged 49, died of the effects of accidental injuries to the hand and thumb respectively; a carter, aged 57, died of compound fracture of the leg; a girl, aged 11, died of the effects of injuries accidentally caused by machinery; a nightman, aged 39, died of rupture of the urethra—the result of an accident; a boy, aged 2, died of strychnine poisoning (how administered unknown); three boys, aged 7, 9, and 14 respectively, and a female, aged 35 were accidentally drowned; a boy, aged 13, as eaman, aged 32, and two males, aged 40 and 60 respectively, were found drowned in the River Yarra; two female infants, aged 1 and 4 months respectively, and a male infant, aged 6 months, were accidentally operation; a boy, aged 67, was choked with food; a boy, aged 14, died of the effects of chloroform administered for a surgical operation; a boy, aged 67, died of infammation of the lungs, caused by a cherry-stone slipping down the windipje. A hotel-aged 48, committed suicide, by cutting his throat whilst of unsound mind; a solicitor, aged 47, poisoned himself with prussic acid; a seaman, aged 28, a laborer, aged 27, a female, aged 45, a carpenter, aged 59, and a publica

Of these, 199, or 62 per cent., were males, and 123, or 38 per cent., were females; 85 were between five and ten, 20 were between ten and fifteen, 15 were between fifteen and twenty, 8 were between twenty and twenty-five, 22 were between twenty-five and thirty, 18 were between thirty and thirty and try, 22 were between fifty and forty, 21 were between fifty and fifty-five, 23 were between fifty and fity-five, 23 were between fifty and sixty, 18 were between sixty-five and seventy, 7 were between seventy and seventy-five, 6 were between seventy-five, and 5 were upwards of eighty eighty.

The number of deaths in the quarter ended 31st December 1875 was 1,637, and the mean temperature in the shade was 585°. The deaths thus numbered 600 more than the average of the corresponding quarter during the previous ten years, or exceeded that average by 376 if allowance be made for the increase of population. The mean temperature was the lowest recorded for the December quarter since 1864, being nearly 2° below the average.

During the year 1875 the number of births in Melbourne and suburbs amounted to 8,227, and the number of deaths to 6,317 being in the proportion of 3415 and 2622 respectively to every 1,000 of the living population. The gain to the population by excess of births over deaths was 1,910.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations for Commons.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE TALLAROOK, SEYMOUR, TRAAWOOL, AND TORRENSDALE FARMERS' COMMONS.

COMMONS.

WHEREAS by The Land Act 1869 power is given to the Governor in Council to frame regulations for the management of commons, and in pursuance of the provisions of chapter XIII of the regulations made by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of May 1873: The Council of the Shire of Seymour, as managers of the above commons, has submitted to the Board of Land and Works the following draft regulations for the management of such commons.

All persons entitled to depasture cattle on the above commons, in pursuance of the provisions of The Land Act 1869, shall conform to the following regulations.

1. The agistment fee for horses will be six shillings per head, and for cattle four shillings per head per annum. Teams of

horses or bullocks of any number will be charged, after the first twenty-four hours, sixpence per head daily for the former and threepence per head for the latter.

2. The fees-for depasturing on these commons must be paid half-yearly in advance, and the half-year shall commence on the 1st day of February and 1st day of August in each year. Any cattle registered half-yearly will be charged for from the commencement of the half-year then current.

3. Cattle to be admitted on these commons must be delivered, twice in each year, at such place and within such hours as the council shall notify for the purpose of being branded. The cattle of any person not strictly adhering to this rule will be considered as not registered.

4. No bulls or entire horses will be allowed on these commons without the consent, in writing, of the managers/first obtained.

5. Should any registered cattle he invocuded the headwale.

mons without the consent, in writing, of the managers/first obtained.

5. Should any registered cattle be impounded the herdsmin will be required to release them forthwith.

6. The herdsman shall impound all unregistered cattle found trespassing on these commons.

7. Any person or persons found disturbing cattle of any of these commons, without first having given notice to the herdsman, will be considered as trespassing on the common, and liable to be prosecuted for so doing.

8. That no person will be allowed to depasture more than four head of large cattle on any of these commons, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle; if farmers having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by them they may depasture on such common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

9. That every person depasturing cattle on these commons give the full brands and description at the time of registration.

10. Should any registered cattle be lost or found trespassing off the common the council will not be held responsible for the same.

11. Should registered cattle be found affected with "any contagious disease the herdsman shall give the owner notice to remove such cattle off the common, and in default of such removal after twenty-four hours from the time of giving such notice the cattle described in the notice may be destroyed by order of the council.

12. In the event of any registered cattle being lost off the common the herdsman shall give notice of such to the owner or owners within forty-eight hours after such loss being discovered.
