## CLOSE SEASON FOR ENGLISH PERCH.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and St. George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Fisheries Act 1873* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council from time to time, by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, might for any species of fish prescribe a close season or close seasons in every year, and that any proclamation made under the said Act might be explained, varied, revoked, annulled, or superseded by any other such proclamation published subsequently to the one to be so explained, varied, revoked, annulled, or superseded: And whereas by a proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-fifth day of September 1876, the period from the first day of May to the thirty-first day of October in each year (both days inclusively) was prescribed to be a close season for the fish known as "English Perch": Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the before-mentioned proclamation, and do hereby prescribe the close season for English Perch to be the period from the first day of May to the thirtieth day of November in each year (both days inclusively).

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eleventh day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, and in the fortieth year of Her Majesty's reign.

# "WINES, BEER, AND SPIRITS SALE STATUTE 1864 AMENDMENT ACT."

## FISHERIES ACT 1873.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Fisheries Act 1873* it was amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council from time to time by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, might define the limits of and what waters should be deemed to be and what should be deemed the mouth or other boundary of any river, creek, stream, bay, estuary, or lake, and might fix a distance from the mouth of any or every river, creek, or stream within which nets and fixed engines are not to be used: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby define the limits of, and what waters shall be deemed to be, and what shall be deemed the mouth or other boundary of, the rivers, creeks, and streams below mentioned, and to fix the distance from the mouth of the said rivers, creeks, or streams within which nets and fixed engines are not to be used, as follows, viz.:

A line running from the extreme seaward or outward point of either bank or side to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of such rivers, creeks, or streams enter the ocean, or any bay thereof.

Moyno River.—A line running north-west from the extreme westerly point of Griffith's Island to the nearest point on the mainland, and a line running north-north-west from the extreme northern point of Griffith's Island to the nearest point of the peninsula of Belfast.

La Trobe River. } The points at which they respectively  
Avon River. } enter Lake Wellington.  
Mitchell River. } The points at which they respectively  
Tambo River. } enter Lake King.  
Nicholson River. }

The channel of communication between Lake Wellington and Lake Victoria, known as McLennan's Strait (which is to be deemed a "stream" within the meaning of *The Fisheries Act 1873*).—A line running from point to point of the two terminal points at which such stream communicates or abuts on Lake Wellington and Lake Victoria respectively.

Barwon River.—A line running north-east from the extreme point of the point known as Point Flinders to the nearest land on the opposite shore.

Yarrum Creek.—A line running north and by east from the point known as the Spit, forming the southern entrance to Swan Bay or Ponds, to a point on Swan Island known as Lock's Point, and by a line running north and by east half east from a point on the northern point of Swan Island, known as Pigdon's Point, to a point on the opposite shore or mainland, known as Sheoak Point or Point Edward, forming the northern entrance to Swan Bay or Ponds.

The distance from the mouth of any of the before-mentioned rivers, creeks, streams, or strait within which nets or fixed engines shall not be used to be a radius of one-quarter of a mile from any portion or point of the line defining the mouth of any river, creek, or stream.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eleventh day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, and in the fortieth year of Her Majesty's reign.

**WHEREAS** by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described as commons, that is to say:—

**DARGO FLAT COMMON.**—Three thousand acres, more or less, county of Dargo, parish of Dargo, being the unappropriated Crown land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.: Commencing at a point on the right bank of the River Dargo where the southern boundary of suburban allotment 32 at Dargo Flat abuts thereon; bounded thence by that allotment and allotment 33 bearing south-westerly and west to the south-west angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence again by that allotment and allotment 32 bearing north to Wood's Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the range dividing the waters of the Dargo River aforesaid from those of the Mitchell River; thence by that range south-easterly to the confluence of the said rivers; and thence by the River Dargo aforesaid upwards to the point of commencement.—(76.C.8445.)

**ROKEWOOD UNITED TOWN AND FARMERS' COMMON.**—The Rokewood United Town and Farmers' Common, proclaimed

by Order of 3rd July 1866, and increased by Orders dated respectively the 27th January 1868 and the 25th November 1872, is hereby further increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown land within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.:—Five thousand nine hundred and sixty acres, more or less, county of Grenville, parishes of Dereel and War-rabine: Commencing at a point on Mount Misery Creek where the north boundary of the existing common abuts thereon; bounded thence by that common and a line bearing east to a point formed by the prolongation of the eastern boundary of the Hardies Hill Farmers' Common extension, proclaimed by order of the 18th December 1869; thence by a line bearing north to that common; thence by that common bearing west, south, and west to the Dereel Timber Reserve; thence by that reserve bearing south, west, and north to the north-west angle thereof; thence by the north boundary of the parish of Dereel bearing west to Mount Misery Creek aforesaid; and thence by that creek southerly to the point of commencement.—(76.C.8409.)

**WHEREAS** by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby diminish the area of the Rosedale Town Common (described in two several Proclamations bearing date respectively the fifth day of March 1866 and the fifth day of January 1869) by deducting therefrom fifty-two acres two roods and twenty-five perches of land, comprising allotments 91, 94, and 95 in the parish of Rosedale.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-seventh day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, and in the fortieth year of Her Majesty's reign.

## MECHANICAL REAPER-AND BINDER.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the following Regulations for the expenditure of the sum of £1200 for the encouragement of the invention and manufacture of a mechanical Reaper and Binder, subject to the vote being sanctioned by Parliament.

1. One thousand pounds will be paid to any person or company who may produce a machine that, in the opinion of judges to be appointed by the Minister of Agriculture, is capable of satisfactorily performing the operations of Reaping and Binding.

2. No greater number of persons shall be employed to work a combined Reaper and Binder than is required to work an ordinary reaper.

3. The bands should be made of the material that is being cut by the machine, but the use of cord or wire is not prohibited.

4. The machine must combine simplicity of construction and lightness of draught with strength and durability.

5. Special attention must be paid to economy. The judges will be instructed to disqualify a machine that will not cut and bind a crop for a less cost, per acre, than that for which the same work could be performed by an ordinary reaper with the aid of manual labor for binding.

6. One or more trials, as circumstances may demand, will be held at times and in localities to be hereafter fixed, notice of which will be duly advertised.

7. Expenses connected with the trials and judges' expenses shall be charged on the vote.

8. The total expenditure shall not exceed Twelve hundred pounds.

## AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES.

1. Each society shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 5th February 1877, a statement in the form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the form marked B.

2. The distribution of the vote will be made one month after the above-mentioned date, when a sum equal to two-thirds of the amount shown to have been awarded and paid away in prizes (except for the exhibits mentioned in the statement above referred to) will be allotted to each society and be made payable to the treasurer thereof, on condition that this sum do not exceed the amount raised by members' subscriptions and private donations; and if it do exceed the same, that it be in that case reduced to a sum equal to the amount so raised.

3. Of the whole grant (£7000) a sum not exceeding Six thousand five hundred and seventy-seven pounds shall be so divided; and if the sums claimable be in excess of this amount, they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

4. Four hundred and twenty-three pounds shall be paid to the Bendigo Agricultural Society towards the expenses of its annual spring show, held on the 24th, 25th, and 26th October 1876, under the patronage of the Department of Agriculture.

5. No society whose expenditure in prizes between the 1st of January 1876 and the 31st December 1876 amounts in the total to less than One hundred pounds (£100) shall be entitled to participate in the vote.

## INSTRUCTIONS.

1. The blank spaces in the declaration form E for the sums awarded and paid in prizes, and raised by members' subscriptions and private donations, between the 1st January 1876 and the 31st December 1876, must be filled up in words as well as in figures, and the declaration must be made before a justice of the peace by the treasurer of the society.

2. The account is then to be prepared by making the Government Dr. for two-thirds of the amount declared to have been awarded and paid in prizes, if the members' subscriptions and private donations were not less than two-thirds. If the members' subscriptions and private donations were, however, less than two-thirds of the amount awarded and paid in prizes, the amount of the claim must be made equal to the amount of the members' subscriptions and private donations.

3. The account must be signed by the treasurer and be countersigned by the president, or the vice-president, or by two members of the committee of management. It should then be returned to the Department of Agriculture, with the declaration and statements appended.

[It may expedite the payment of the money to fill in at the top of the account the name of the nearest pay office in the space left blank for the purpose. It is also necessary to bear in mind that, if that space should not be filled up, the account will be payable at Melbourne only. ## PUBLIC PARKS AND GARDENS.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the following Regulations in connection with the vote of £6000 for Fencing and Improving Public Parks and Gardens under the control of Borough Councils, Trustees, Committees of Management, &c. (Division 53, No. 2.)

1. Every city, town, borough, or shire council, committee of management, or other body having control of any public park or garden, such park or garden being beyond the limits of the City of Melbourne, shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 5th March 1877, a statement in the form hereto marked A, which statement (and vouchers if called for) must be verified by statutory declaration, in form hereto marked B, by the town clerk of a city, town, or borough, the secretary of a shire, the clerk of a road board, or by such trustee or member of a committee of management who may have acted as treasurer.

2. On receipt of the above-mentioned statement so verified, the Minister of Lands and Agriculture may cause to be paid to the proper officer of each city, town, borough, or shire council, or other body, a sum equal to one-half of the difference between the expenditure incurred and the Government subsidy received; provided that, if the claims are in excess of the vote, they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

3. In cases where no subsidy was received in 1876, claims must be accompanied by a statement showing in detail how the subsidy last received has been applied.

4. Moneys expended in street planting must not be included in any claim upon the vote.

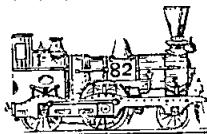
