PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* it was amongst other things enacted that notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation; Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the localities hereinafter mentioned to be respectively districts where publicans' licenses may be specially granted, that is to say:—

BUNEEF, including the locality at and around the railway station of that name;

THE PARISH OF DROUIN.

WEIGHT OF GARFISH.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Fisheries Act 1873* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council from time to time, by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, might substitute other weights for the weights set opposite the names of every or any of the species of fish mentioned in the Second Schedule thereto, or for the weights substituted for any of such weights by any previous proclamation, and might prescribe for every or any of the species of fish in the Second Schedule mentioned a size less than which it should be unlawful to take, sell, or expose for sale, or possess fish of such species: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby substitute another weight for the weight set opposite the name of the fish hereinafter mentioned in the Second Schedule to the said Act, and do prescribe for the species of fish hereinafter mentioned a size less than which it shall be unlawful to take, sell, or expose for sale, or possess fish of such species, that is to say:—

Garfish shall be $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. in lieu of 1 oz.

SHEPPARTON COUNTY COURT.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the eighth day of October 1877.

WHEREAS by *The County Court Statute 1869* it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council to direct that county courts should be holden for the determination of certain actions cognizable by courts of common law, and with a limited jurisdiction in equity, probate, and administration, under the said Act, and, with the advice aforesaid, to alter the place of holding any such court, or to direct that the holding of any such court be discontinued, and from time to time, with the advice aforesaid, to direct in what towns and places a county court should be holden; and it was also enacted that the judge of each county court should attend and hold such court at the place where the Governor in Council should have directed that

such court should be holden at such times as such judge should appoint for that purpose, so that a court should be holden in such place once at least in such interval as the Governor in Council should in each case direct: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that a County Court for the determination of certain actions cognizable by courts of common law, and with a limited jurisdiction in equity, under the said Act, shall be holden at the town and within the interval hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

At SHEPPARTON, once at least in every six calendar months.

And the Honorable James Macpherson Grant, Her Majesty's Minister of Justice for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

KYNETON DISTRICT WEIGHTS AND MEASURES UNION.

BY-LAW No. 1.

A Bye-law made under section 30 of the Weights and Measures Statute 1864, and numbered 1, for regulating the meetings for the transaction of the business of the Union, appointment of chairman, &c., and fixing the amount of fees to be paid to the inspector for examining and comparing weights and measures within the said Union.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Weights and Measures Statute 1864, the Councils of the Shires of Kyneton, Newham, Metcalfe, and the Borough of Malmesbury, proclaimed under the said Statute to be a Union for the purposes of the said Act, order as follows:—

The By-law of the said union, dated the 10th day of July, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, for fixing the amount of fees to be paid to the inspector for examining and comparing weights and measures within the said union, shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

The Councils of the said shires and borough forming the said union doth further order that By-law No. 1 shall be in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

1. *Ordinary Meetings.*—That the union shall hold ordinary meetings for the transaction of general business at the Shire Office, Kyneton, quarterly, in the months of September, December, March, and June, and the secretary shall have power to fix the days and hours on which such meetings shall be held.

2. *Special Meetings.*—Two members of the union, or the secretary, shall have power to call special meetings for the transaction of special business; no meeting of the union shall be held unless four clear days' notice thereof, at least, be given to each of the members of said union.

3. *Election of Chairman.*—On the day of the September quarterly meeting in each year, the members present shall proceed to the election of a chairman.

4. *Quorum.*—All powers vested in the union may be exercised at any legally constituted meeting by any three members present, and no business shall be transacted at any meeting of the union unless the said number of members be respectively present.

5. *Adjournment of Meetings.*—The members present at any meeting may from time to time adjourn such meeting, and if at any meeting of the Council there be not present within half an hour after the time appointed for holding such meeting the number of members hereby authorized to exercise the powers vested in the union, the members present, or the major part of them, or any one member (if only one be present), or the

secretary if no member be present, may adjourn such meeting to any time not further distant than fourteen days from the date of such adjournment.

6. *Fees for Comparisons.*—The following fees shall be paid to the Inspector of Weights and Measures for the time being for the said union for comparing any weights, measures, scales, balances, steelyards, beams, or other weighing machines, with the "authorized copies" of the standard weights and measures in his possession according to the said Act, viz:—
