A white light will, on and after the 11th November next, be exhibited from the shore lighthouse in addition to the present red light.

**WHEREAS** by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim as Commons the Crown lands hereinafter described, that is to say:—

TRARALGON PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. The charges for burying in or otherwise using the cemetery must be paid before an order can be given for the particular work or privilege required.
2. The charge for occupying ground may be remitted by the trustees when it is shown to their satisfaction that the relatives or friends of the deceased are unable to pay the charge; but all such burials must be made in that part of the cemetery marked "free ground" on the plan; and if the sexton be required to dig the grave, then the usual fee for that service must be paid.
3. Orders for interments must be given to the sexton at least twelve working hours before the time appointed for the burial, so as to allow sufficient time for digging the grave within working hours, otherwise the charge for digging will be increased by one-half.
4. The sexton will dig all ordinary graves, but when the friends of any indigent person deceased wish to dig the grave themselves, or when brick graves or vaults are required, then the excavations must be made and the ground filled in or removed under the inspection and to the satisfaction of the sexton.
5. The hours fixed for interments are from Ten o'clock a.m. till Six p.m. from September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. till Four p.m. during the other four months, except on Sunday, when the hours are from Two o'clock till Five p.m. throughout the year.
6. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences must be kept in proper condition and repair by the owners, otherwise they may be removed by the trustees after having given notice of their intention to remove them by posting such notice to the last known address of one of the parties concerned.
7. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave must be bricked in and cemented, and covered in by a slab of stone, slate, iron, good blue or red gum planking.
8. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, also fence, and a copy of every inscription, must be submitted to the trustees, without whose approval it shall not be erected or inscribed.
9. No grave will be allowed to be reopened for further interment at a shorter interval than twelve years, except it be to place a second coffin or more in such grave, and this will be allowed only when the grave has been originally sunk to admit of such interments.

10. No new grave can be made without paying for the ground or satisfying the trustees that it has been already paid for.

11. It is provided by *The Cemeteries Act* that any person who shall wantonly or wilfully destroy, or attempt to destroy, or do, or cause to be done, any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, shall, on conviction before any two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a sum as a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

12. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, shall be kept at the Secretary's office.

13. No servant or other person employed by, or engaged in any duty on behalf of, the said trustees, will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

14. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery, nor will smoking be allowed.

15. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these regulations.

WHEREAS by *The Electoral Act Amendment Act 1876* (No. 548), it was amongst other things enacted that the boundaries and divisions and the names of the electoral districts should be those set forth in the Second Schedule thereto, and should be substituted in lieu of the boundaries and divisions repealed by the said Act, but the Governor in Council might, by an Order to be published in the *Government Gazette* before the first day of January One thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, alter, vary, extend, subdivide, or abolish any of such divisions: And whereas it is expedient that the Maryborough Division of the Electoral District of Maryborough and Talbot should be subdivided: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order abolish the said Maryborough Division, and doth hereby subdivide the area thereof into two Divisions, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follow, that is to say:—
