APPREHENSION OF DESERTERS FROM MERCHANT SHIPS OF THE KINGDOM OF HAWAII.

SIR,—I have the honor to transmit to you for your information and for publication in the colony under your government, a copy of an Order of Her Majesty in Council, dated the 23rd October 1876, providing for the apprehension of deserters from merchant ships belonging to the Kingdom of Hawaii, under *The Foreign Deserters Act 1852*.

PRESENT:

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by *The Foreign Deserters Act 1852*, it is provided that whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities are or will be given for recovering or apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in the territories of any Foreign power, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council stating that such facilities are or will be given, declare that seamen, not being slaves, who desert from merchant ships belonging to such power when within Her Majesty's dominions shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships, and may limit the operation of such Order, and may render the operation thereof subject to such conditions and qualifications, if any, as may be deemed expedient; and whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities are given for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British ships in the territories of His Majesty the King of Hawaii:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Her by the said *Foreign Deserters Act 1852*, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared that from and after the publication hereof in the *London Gazette*, seamen not being slaves, and not being British subjects, who within Her Majesty's dominions desert from merchant ships belonging to the Kingdom of Hawaii, shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships.

Provided always, that if any such deserter has committed any crime in Her Majesty's dominions he may be detained until he has been tried by a competent Court, and until his sentence, if any, has been fully carried into effect.

And the Secretaries of State for India in Council, the Home Department, and the Colonies are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REVISED DIRECTIONS FOR KURRACHEE HARBOR.

Latitude of lighthouse on Manora Point, 24° 47' 21" N.
Longitude, 66° 58' 15" E.
The light is a fixed one, 120 feet above the sea level, visible in clear weather sixteen miles.
In hazy weather, prevalent during the south-west monsoon, about seven miles.
Present light very inferior. A dioptric light of the 2nd order sanctioned, and will shortly be exhibited.
The new light will be 150 feet above the sea level, and visible in clear weather twenty miles.

Tides.

High water, full and change, 10h. 30m.
Average rise and fall—Spring tides, 9 feet 6 inches.
Average rise and fall—Neap tides, 5 to 4 feet.
Depth of Water in Entrance Channel at High Water.
Spring tides, 29 feet.
Neap tides, 24 to 25 feet.

Draught of Vessels Entering or Leaving Port.

Vessels with a draught not exceeding 22 feet can now enter and leave the port without difficulty or delay during all seasons of the year.

During the fair season, from October to 15th May, vessels with a draught not exceeding 24 feet can enter and leave the harbor.

Fixed moorings are placed for vessels of the largest class.

Time of Tide for Entering Port.

Sailing vessels should enter port on the ebb tide.
Steamers can enter either flood or ebb, at the pilot's discretion.
Masters of ships should not on any account attempt to enter the harbor without a pilot.

Harbor Improvements.

Among the extensive works executed, a breakwater has been built, running out from Manora Point in a S. by E. direction to a distance of 1500 feet into five fathoms of water, this affords complete shelter to the entrance channel during the south-west monsoon; also a channel has been opened through the bar with a depth of 20 feet at low water spring tides, 500 feet in breadth; the entrance is marked by buoys one on each side of the channel.

NOTE.—A mail steamer arriving off the port at night should burn two blue lights in quick succession; during the fair

season a pilot will at once board, but during the monsoon she must keep off the port until daylight.
A red light is exhibited at the extreme end of the break-water during the fair season only.

Approaching the Port—Coast of Sind, Indus Banks.

The coast of Sind should be approached with great caution; too much attention cannot be paid to the lead, more especially in passing the banks of the Indus, which are extending considerably to seaward.

By night, a vessel should give the banks a berth of fifteen to twenty miles, and if after passing the "Swatch" she does not get less than eighteen to twenty fathoms, she may haul to the northward, not coming into less than fifteen fathoms until the Kurrachee light is seen.

By day, the breakers on the edge of the banks are a good guide, unless the water is quite smooth; but it is hardly possible for a vessel to run ashore by day on account of the marked discoloration of the water, which extends some distance outside the banks.

The tides during the springs are strong, the flood sets to the S.E., and the ebb to the N.W.

From February to end of monsoon a strong south-easterly current may be expected, running at a rate of from fifteen to forty-five miles a day.

During the south-west monsoon, vessels should make Ras Manri (Cape Monze), which is eighteen miles W. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. from Manora Lighthouse, and keep to windward of the port, if the weather is thick or if the tide does not suit for entering the harbor. Allowance must also be made for a strong set to the south-east, which prevails more or less during the south-west monsoon.

Do not bring Manora Point to the southward of E. by N., or go under fifteen fathoms near Cape Monze.

Masters of ships should endeavor to make the port at daylight, and can with safety approach into eight fathoms to about two miles distance from the lighthouse, keeping it on any bearing from N.E. to N.N.E., and heave to for a pilot.

Anchorage in the Roads.

From June to the middle of September, ships should not on any account anchor, but stand off and on, keeping the lighthouse bearing from N.N.E. to N.E. one to two miles distance, until boarded by a pilot or directed by signal.

September to end of March.—Anchorage: Lighthouse N. by E. to N.N.E. distance one mile, seven fathoms.

April and May.—Anchorage: Lighthouse N.N.E. to N.E. distance half a mile, eight fathoms.

NOTE.—Since 1851, the ships *Admiral Boxer*, *Alicia*, and *John Starr* have been totally lost on or near the banks of the Indus; and the ships *Thomas Campbell*, *Augusta*, *Diadem*, and the steamer *Pioneer* have grounded on them, but eventually floated off.

Two large troop ships have also in the same period touched on them.

All these casualties were principally owing to not making allowance for a strong set to S.E., and not using the lead.

[Extract from letter of proceedings of Lieutenant Carey, H.M.S. *Conflict*, dated 26th October 1876.]

"The *Conflict* sailed over the position assigned for the 43 fathom shoal in latitude 15° 55' S., longitude 166° 10' E., without seeing it.

"The *Conflict* also sailed over the northern part of the shoal shown on chart No. 1,380, 12 miles N.W. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. from Pussey Point, and obtained a depth of 9 fathoms; the bottom was clearly seen.

"The master of the schooner *Zephyr* states that he had sailed over this shoal with 11 fathoms."

VICTORIAN GOVERNMENT RAILWAYS.

THE Board of Land and Works, by virtue of the powers and authorities vested in it by *The Public Works Statute 1865*, doth hereby make the following Bye-laws for the several purposes therein respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

1. No passenger by any Victorian Government Railway shall get into or alight from, or open the door of, any railway carriage while the train of which such carriage forms a part is in motion; and any person committing a breach of this Bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding Twenty pounds.

2. Any passenger by any Victorian Government Railway who shall, while the train is stationary, get in or out of any railway carriage forming part of such train except from or on to the proper platform at any railway station, shall do so at his or her own risk; and any person so getting in or out as aforesaid, without reasonable or probable cause for so doing, will be liable to a penalty of not exceeding Twenty pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR CRUSHING MAIZE IN BOND.

1. The crushing of maize in bond will be allowed for home consumption or exportation upon the following conditions:—

2. Applications to be made in writing specifying the building in which it is desired that crushing maize in bond shall be carried on.

3. The building shall be subject to the approval of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, and shall be capable of containing all the maize which it is intended to crush.

The maize to be crushed shall be removed into the crushing houses, and after being crushed shall be returned into the bond before being delivered either for home consumption or exportation.

The crushing house shall be capable of being secured under the locks of the Customs Department, as well as the place appointed for bonding purposes.

4. The proprietor or occupier shall provide at his own cost all such locks and weighing-machines as the Collector of Customs may require, and a suitable locker's office, and shall keep the same in good repair.

5. Maize may be entered direct from the ship, or transferred from any bonded warehouse to the receiving store into which it must be weighed, and a correct account thereof kept by the locker.

6. The hours of attendance shall be the same as at the other bonded warehouses, viz.: from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., but if any extended time be required the same may be allowed by the collector. The charge made for the attendance of an officer shall be at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per hour, and for any time after the hours above specified, the same charge shall be made.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that the Governor might make and proclaim reserves for the preservation and growth of timber, and might from time to time, after one month's notice should be given in the *Government Gazette*, alter and revoke any such proclamation, and the Board of Land and Works might issue licenses to cut timber upon such reserve or any part thereof on such terms and conditions, and subject to the payment of such license fee, as should from time to time be approved of by the Governor and be set forth in such license: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, proclaim the lands hereinafter described to be a reserve for the preservation and growth of timber, that is to say:—

LAEN TIMBER RESERVE.—Nine hundred and twenty acres, more or less, county of Borung, parish of Laen: Commencing at the north-west angle of J. Dickeson's 19th section block, No. 484; bounded thence by that block bearing S. 82° 27' E. thirty-nine chains eighty-four links; thence by the land applied for by J. Dickeson bearing N. 7° 33' E. thirteen chains eighty-five links, S. 82° 27' E. ten chains, and S. 7° 33' W. seventy chains; and thence by roads bearing respectively S. 82° 34' E. one hundred and four chains eighty-nine links, N. 7° 26' E. seventy-nine chains seventy-two links, westerly one hundred and fifty-four chains, more or less, and S. 7° 33' W. twenty-three chains eighty-five links to the point of commencement.
