QUARANTINE OF THE "BANGALORE."

A CASE of Small-pox having appeared on board of the Mail Steamship *Bangalore* in the course of the voyage from Ceylon to this Port, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the provisions of *The Public Health Act*, No. 264, § 90, has ordered the said vessel, together with her crew and passengers, to be detained in Quarantine for a period of fourteen days from the date when the patient suffering from Small-pox was landed at King George's Sound, viz., 25th March last; and S. W. Spark, Esq., to be Acting Health Officer for the Port of Port Phillip during the detention of Dr. Williams in Quarantine.
