This nearly agrees by bearings with the position of Port Hutt, as ascertained by the U.S. Transit of Venus Expedition, December 1874. The relative position of West Reef and other places to the northward and westward of Waitangi, appears to be correct, and the whole island seems to be placed 9 miles to the westward of its true position.

NOTE.—The Melbourne Hospital and the Gaol are in Gipps Ward; the Alfred Hospital is in Albert Ward; the Immigrants' Home is partly in Albert Ward and partly in Emerald Hill; the Lying-in Hospital is in Smith Ward; the Children's Hospital is in La Trobe Ward; the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum is in Kew Borough; the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum and the Pentridge Stockade are in "Remainder of District;" the Benevolent Asylum is tabulated in Hotham Town.

The births of 672 children, viz., 336 boys and 336 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of March. In the month of February 576 births were registered, or 96 less than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in March numbered 448, viz., 239 of males and 209 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 224. The deaths were less than those in February by 29, and exceeded the average of March during the previous ten years by 8 only. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than the average of those ten years by 73.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 89°8' on the 9th and 23rd, and the lowest was 47°2' on the 17th. The mean temperature of the month (63°8') was half a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (31°9') took place on the 9th, viz., from a maximum of 89°8' to a minimum of 57°9'. The least range (8°7') was on the 16th, viz., from a maximum of 63°9' to a minimum of 55°2'. The mean daily range was 19°0'. The mean atmospheric pressure (30'033 inches) was '056 above the average.

Males contributed 53 per cent. and females 47 per cent. to the total mortality. 49 per cent., or nearly half, were of children under the age of 5 years as against 50 per cent. in March 1876; 58 per cent. in March 1875; 46 per cent. in March 1874; 49 per cent. in March 1873; 55 per cent. in March 1872; 52 per cent. in March 1871; 47 per cent. in March 1870; 48 per cent. in March 1869; 61 per cent. in March 1868; and 63 per cent. in March 1867.

Only 7 deaths of persons of the age of 75 years or upwards were registered during the month, viz.:—Those of a female, aged 76, of cancer; a laborer, aged 78, and a female, aged 81, of paralysis; a female, aged 83, of dysentery; a bricklayer, aged 85, of congestion of the lungs; and a farmer, aged 78, and a female, aged 80, of old age.

Sixteen deaths from external violence were recorded during the month. Ten are ascribed to accident, 1 to homicide, 4 to suicide, and 1 was from execution. The following are the particulars:—A coachdriver, aged 20, died of an injury to the spine, caused by a fall from a horse; a barber, aged 62, was found dead with fracture of the skull (no evidence as to how caused); a farmer, aged 66, was passed over by a dray; a male infant, aged 12 days, died of umbilical hæmorrhage; a telegraph messenger, aged 14, and a seaman, aged 25, were accidentally drowned, the latter in the River Yarra; a carpenter, aged 50, was found drowned in Hobson's Bay; 2 male infants, aged 1 day and 14 days respectively, were suffocated. The only murder which occurred was that of a male infant, age unknown, whose skull was fractured. Of those who committed suicide, a tailor, aged 50, and a clerk, aged 55, cut their throats whilst of unsound mind; a laborer, aged 37, caused his head to be severed from the body by placing it on a railway line; a female, aged 34, poisoned herself with strychnine whilst suffering from unsoundness of mind; and a female, aged 20, drowned herself, also when of unsound mind. The execution was that of a laborer, aged 41, who was judicially hanged in the Melbourne Gaol.

Eighty deaths, or 18 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—40 in the Melbourne Hospital, 8 in the Immigrants' Home, 1 in the Children's Hospital, 18 in the Alfred Hospital, 1 in the Lying-in Hospital, 4 in the Benevolent Asylum, 3 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Melbourne Industrial Schools, and 3 in the Female Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 219, of which 112, or 51 per cent., were of males; and 107, or 49 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 160 were under one year of age, 45 were between one and two, 5 were between two and three, 5 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 229. Of these, 127, or 55 per cent., were males, and 102, or 45 per cent., were females; 15 were between five and ten, 11 were between ten and fifteen, 9 were between fifteen and twenty, 13 were between twenty and twenty-five, 15 were between twenty-five and thirty, 17 were between thirty and thirty-five, 19 were between thirty-five and forty, 29 were between forty and forty-five, 26 were between forty-five and fifty, 22 were between fifty and fifty-five, 13 were between fifty-five and sixty, 18 were between sixty and sixty-five, 10 were between sixty-five and seventy, 4 were between seventy and seventy-five, 3 were between seventy-five and eighty, 4 were upwards of eighty, and 1 was unspecified.

The mortality still continues low, and was, as in the preceding month, less than in the corresponding month during either of the last three years. As to the various causes, zymotic diseases were the most fatal—the prominent diseases in that class being diarrhoea with 70 deaths, and typhoid fever with 27. Forty-eight deaths resulted from phthisis as against 37 in February; and four deaths were set down to childbirth and metria, or one death of a mother to every 168 births registered.

The number of deaths in the quarter ended 31st March 1877 was 1,416; and the mean temperature in the shade was 64.7°. The deaths thus exceeded the average of the corresponding quarter during the first ten years by 33; but if allowance be made for the increase of population they will be found to have been 222 below that average. The mean temperature was nearly half a degree below the average.

POWER TO COMPEL CESSPOOLS AT QUEENSCLIFFE TO BE FILLED UP.

PROCLAMATION  
By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign, called *The Public Health amendment Act 1876*, it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend the provisions of the twentieth section of the said Act to any part of Victoria, and from and after three months from the coming into operation of the said section in any part of Victoria if the owner of land whereon there should be a cesspool for the reception of nightsoil, which cesspool in the opinion of the local board should be in such a condition or position as to be calculated to generate disease or be a public nuisance, should be required by notice from the local board to fill up the same within a time to be expressed in such notice not being more than one month from the date thereof, such owner should be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day from the expiration of the time mentioned in such notice that such cesspool should not be filled up as thereby required: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation extend the provisions of the above-recited twentieth section of the said Act to the Borough of Queenscliff.

A Bye-law of the City of Sandhurst, made under the 213th section of the Local Government Act 1874, for controlling, managing, and preserving the public reserve called Rosalind Park, in the City of Sandhurst, vested in the council of the said city.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1874, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Sandhurst order as follows:—

1. No person shall interfere with or damage the trees, shrubs, statuary, labels, fountains, fish, or birds in Rosalind Park, or engage in any sports or game, or throw stones, or commit any nuisance therein, or leave any bottles, orange-peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or litter therein, or light fires therein, or annoy visitors.

2. No person shall climb or jump over the seats or fences in the park, or stick bills on such fences or on the gates, or cut names, letters, or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or write thereon, or otherwise damage or deface the same.

3. No person shall bring any dog into the said park unless held by a chain or cord.

4. All dogs, goats, or poultry found in the park may be destroyed by a police constable, the keeper, or curator.

5. Children under six years of age shall not be allowed within the park unless accompanied by adult friends or nurses, whom they shall not leave while in the said park.

6. Entrance into plots of ground specially enclosed in the park for plantations and for other purposes is prohibited, and no assemblies for fêtes, picnics, or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character, shall take place in this park without the permission, in writing, of the Council of the City of Sandhurst.

7. No person shall offer any article for sale in this park without the permission, in writing, of the Council of the City of Sandhurst.

8. No person shall behave in a disorderly manner or create or take part in any disturbance, or commit in the said park any act of indecency.

9. No person on horseback or leading any horse shall enter Rosalind Park, and no vehicle shall be allowed therein without the permission of the Council of the City of Sandhurst.

10. No person in a state of intoxication shall enter or remain within the park.

11. Any person offending against any of the provisions of this bye-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.
