EXAMINATION FOR LAND SURVEYORS.

THE Board of Examiners for candidates intending to qualify as surveyors authorized to effect surveys for the Government of Victoria, which has been appointed in connection with the Department of Lands and Survey, hereby notifies that the next Examination will be held in the Office of the Department of Lands and Survey, commencing on Thursday the 12th July next.

No candidate will be allowed to present himself for examination unless he produces evidence that he has been engaged for at least eighteen months in practical surveying in the field, the last twelve under a duly qualified surveyor recognized by the Department and constantly engaged in selection and departmental surveys.

Candidates will be required to give at least fourteen days' notice of their wish to present themselves for examination, enclosing with said notice the necessary certificate from a qualified surveyor, copies of any testimonials they may have, and a specimen of their drawing. (If original testimonials are forwarded they will be returned after the examination is completed.)

The Board will, at least seven days before the date fixed for the commencement of the examination, inform intending candidates whether they will be allowed to come up for examination or not, and they (candidates) must then pay the required fee of £2 2s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board.

Candidates must be provided with the following:—A book of logarithms, a 40 and 20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, pencil, and all necessary appliances for plan drawing.

All applications must be in the hands of the Secretary by the 27th June next.

SOUTH ENTRANCE TO MORETON BAY.

THE detached bank at the outer edge of the Bar at the South Passage—which, by the notice published in June 1875, had to be passed at a short cable's distance—having now worked further to the southward, the directions for crossing the Bar with the knoll in line with the triple hill are no longer applicable. The Bar should now be crossed with the beacons in line, or open to the southward about four or five times their own width, when a depth of not less than 14½ feet will be found at low-water springs.

There is now a depth of 5 feet at low water over the detached bank.

ENTRANCE TO BURNETT RIVER.

A SPIT having extended from the north side of the entrance to the Burnett River, nearly as far as the line of leading beacons, vessels entering the port must, after passing the second black buoy, open the beacons slightly to the southward and keep them in that position until the trees on the outer end of the island are reached, when the line of beacons may be again followed.

Similar directions must be followed when entering by the leading lights at night.

A red beacon marks the position of the Spit.

PLENTY RANGES TIMBER RESERVE.

IN pursuance of the 108th Section of *The Land Act 1869*, the Board of Land and Works do hereby make the following Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the reserve forming the watershed of the Plenty River and its tributaries, and the Yan Yean reservoir, together with the Timber reserve lying north of the crest of the Dividing Range, the boundaries of which are described in the proclamation dated 28th April 1873, published in the *Government Gazette* of the second day of May 1873.

1. No person will be allowed to trespass upon Crown lands forming the watershed of the Plenty River, its tributaries, or the Yan Yean reservoir, or upon that portion of the timber reserve extending one mile north from the crest of the Dividing Range, for the purpose of cutting and removing timber, or for excavating and removing soil, clay, rock, or other material, or for diverting, damming, or polluting any stream, watercourse, or reservoir, or causing injury of whatever kind to the property of the Board or of Her Majesty.

2. Permission to enter upon that portion only of the timber reserve situated within its northern boundary and one mile south of such boundary in the parishes of Kinglake, Flowerdale, and Glen Burnie, in the county of Anglesey, for the purpose of felling, cutting, splitting, and removing timber, for a period ending on 30th day of June 1878, subject to the following rules and conditions, may (if the Board think fit) be granted by the Board upon written application addressed to the Honorable the Commissioner of Public Works:—

i. The fee to be paid with such application shall be the sum of Two pounds per annum.

ii. Traffic for drays, waggons, carts, or other vehicles will not be permitted, except upon proclaimed roads, or such other roads as hereinafter described, or as may from time to time be authorized by the Board for temporary use.

iii. No trees shall be felled except those pointed out and marked by the ranger.

iv. When a tree is felled the trunk shall be worked up, and the branches lopped and properly stacked for burning at the proper season, and they shall be so burned under the inspection of the ranger. No second tree will be allowed to be felled by any woodman or splitter, or by any one of his party, until the first part of this condition shall have been observed.

v. No person shall burn off scrub or underwood for the purpose of making roads or tracks, or obtaining access to timber, except at the proper season, and then only under the inspection of the ranger.

vi. Barking trees is strictly prohibited unless a license for that special purpose is obtained, and in such cases no standing trees shall be barked, but they shall be cut down, and the trunks, branches, and tops treated as described in paragraph iv.

vii. Saplings or trees of less than twelve inches diameter are not to be felled.

viii. Access will be allowed during the months of December, January, February, and March to any of the unenclosed portions of this reserve, for the purpose of removing dry timber only.

ix. Tracks or roads for obtaining access to such portions of this reserve may be formed and maintained by and at the expense of the splitters, carters, and others engaged in the removal of timber, worked or unworked, subject to the approval of the proper officer of the Melbourne Water Supply Department, provided that no such road or track shall join the Yea road south of Tommy's hut, or shall in other places approach closer than five chains, or as near that distance as practicable, to the crest of line dividing the southern from the northern watershed.

x. The before-mentioned permission to enter for the said purposes may be revoked by the Board at any time without giving any compensation.

3. Cattle may be depastured on those portions of the said reserve forming the Farmers' Common, and the owners of such cattle shall upon notice being given by the ranger immediately cause to be destroyed, removed, burned, or buried, any diseased cattle, sheep, or carcasses found on the reserve.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and St. George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that the Governor might from time to time by a notice in the *Government Gazette* proclaim as a street or road or as a town or village any portion or portions of Crown lands, and the lands in such town or village should be sold by auction in the manner therein provided for the sale of Crown lands by public auction, and the lands upon which such street or road should have been proclaimed should be and be deemed to be thenceforward dedicated to the public: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice proclaim as a Village the portion of Crown lands hereinafter described, viz.:-

TARKEDIA VILLAGE RESERVE.—Forty-eight acres two roods twenty-six perches, county of Borung, parish of Kellalac: Commencing at a point bearing east three chains twenty-eight links from the north-east angle of T. McLean's 19th section block, No. 45002; and bounded thence by roads bearing respectively east twenty chains eighty-one links and south forty-six chains seventy-four links; and thence by the road from Minyip to Warracknabeal bearing N. 24° W. fifty-one chains seventeen links to the point of commencement.—(T.232.)—(76.H.2378.)

REGULATIONS UNDER THE "STATE FORESTS ACT 1876."

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fifteenth day of May 1877.

PRESENT :

His Excellency the Governor.

WHEREAS by *The State Forests Act 1876* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time make regulations prescribing the duties of Local Forest Boards, the purposes for which licenses may be granted by such Boards, the fees they may collect and recover, the manner in which all moneys received or collected by such Boards shall be applied, the form, mode, terms, and conditions in and on which licenses shall be applied for, granted, and issued, and all matters whatever necessary for enabling such Boards to manage, control, and improve the reserves or portions of Crown lands assigned to their care: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor in Council doth by this present Order make the Regulations following:—

1. Every Local Forest Board shall, at the first meeting thereof and in the same month in every year afterwards, appoint one of their number as chairman for the year following such appointment. Appointment of chairman.
2. Every Local Forest Board shall hold such periodical meetings as shall from time to time be appointed by them, and such special meetings as may be necessary. At such meetings three members shall form a quorum, and all questions at any meeting shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the members present; and, in the case of an equal division of votes, the chairman shall have a second or casting vote in addition to his vote as a member. Times of meeting.
3. Every Board may from time to time appoint or remove a secretary, at such salary as the Minister may approve, who shall conduct the correspondence, keep the accounts and the minutes of the proceedings, receive all moneys, and generally conduct the business of the Board, subject to the control of the Board. The secretary shall provide such security for the faithful discharge of his office as the Board may deem sufficient. Appointment and duties of secretary.
4. All moneys received or collected by any Board shall be forthwith paid to the credit of an account to be kept in such bank as the Minister may approve in writing, and to be styled the _____ Local Forest Board account. Moneys—how applied.
5. The moneys to the credit of such account may be applied by any Board as follow:—
 - (a.) For surveying, fencing, planting, and construction of roads and bridges within any reserve or other portion of Crown lands assigned to their care.
 - (b.) In payment of the salaries and allowances of duly appointed officers of the Board.
 - (c.) In payment of stationery accounts and other necessary office expenditure.
 Every account shall be certified by the secretary and approved by the chairman of the Board, and shall, except in the case of accounts for incidental expenses, be paid by cheque signed by the chairman and countersigned by the secretary.
6. Immediately after confirmation a duplicate copy of the minutes of each Board's proceedings, signed by the chairman, shall be forwarded to the Secretary for Agriculture, Melbourne. Duplicate copy of minutes to be forwarded to Secretary for Agriculture.
7. In respect of any reserve or other portion of Crown lands assigned to the care of any Board, every such Board may issue licenses for the undermentioned purposes subject to the prepayment of fees, according to a scale to be approved by a separate regulation for each Board, and to these regulations generally:— Licenses.

In no case shall any fee so prescribed by regulation for a license for any purpose above mentioned exceed the maximum or be less than the minimum set opposite to such purpose.

8. Every license shall be in the form of Schedule I, and subject to such of the conditions specified in Schedules II, and III, respectively, and to such other conditions prescribed in regulations made under the Act No. 563 as may be applicable thereto.

9. No license shall be issued for a period exceeding twelve months.

Application for sawmill and factory licenses—how made.

10. Every applicant for a license to occupy a site for a sawmill or factory shall place a conspicuous post, not less than three inches square, and standing at least three feet out of the ground, at each corner of the land for which he applies, and shall affix thereto a notice in the form of Schedule IV.; and within seven days of marking out the site shall post at the office of the secretary, and at the nearest post office, a notice in the form of Schedule V. Within twenty-eight days of the said date the applicant shall forward to the secretary his application, accompanied by a plan of the site prepared by an authorized surveyor. The area of each such site shall not exceed six acres.

Authority to make temporary clearing for pasture or otherwise—how obtained.

11. Every applicant for a license to make a temporary clearing for pasture, or any other description of cultivation, shall mark out the proposed site by placing a conspicuous post, not less than three inches square, and standing at least three feet out of the ground, at each corner thereof, and shall, within twenty-eight days from the date of marking out the site, forward to the secretary his application, accompanied by a plan of the site prepared by an authorized surveyor. The area of each such site shall not exceed one hundred acres.

Application for tramway license—how made.

12. Every applicant for a license to form a tramway shall mark out the proposed line of tramway by placing at intervals not exceeding five chains a post, not less than three inches square, and standing at least three feet out of the ground, and shall affix a notice in the form prescribed in Schedule VII. on the post at the commencing point of the proposed tramway, and a similar notice on the post at the end thereof, and shall, within seven days of such marking-out, post at the office of the secretary, and at the nearest post office, a notice in the form prescribed in Schedule VII. Within twenty-eight days of the said date the applicant shall forward to the secretary his application, accompanied by plans and sections prepared by an authorized surveyor. The plans shall show the lands proposed to be licensed, and every proposed diversion of existing roads. Where a projected line of tramway would cross an existing surveyed road, transverse and longitudinal sections drawn to scale shall be given, whether such crossing be level or otherwise, showing the manner in which it is proposed to obviate obstruction or interruption of traffic on the said road, and the provision for the prevention of accident at such crossing.

Allotment of areas to sawmill and factory proprietors.

13. Any Board may allot to a sawmill or factory proprietor, subject to the prepayment of a minimum fee at the rate of £25 per quarter and a maximum fee at the rate of £75 per quarter, an area, in no case exceeding fifty acres, of forest to supply his mill, for any period not exceeding six months. Every such area shall be allotted in the bed of timber that may be nearest to the sawmill or factory of the applicant. When, however, timber of the requisite size and description for the supply of a special order cannot be obtained within the said area, the Board may grant the owner of the mill or factory, authority, in writing, to obtain outside his area, but within limits to be prescribed by such Board, not being within the area of any other sawmill or factory proprietor, any timber that he may require for the supply of such special order.

Board may dispose of timber at auction or by tender.

14. Any Board, where it shall appear to better enable them to manage, control, or improve any reserve or other portion of Crown lands assigned to their care, may, with the Minister's sanction in writing, dispose of standing or felled timber at auction or by tender, or may impose a fixed rate upon timber, at rates not to exceed £3 per 100 cubic feet in the log, or 5s. per 100 feet superficial converted; but no timber shall be taken away unless by the holder of a special license, under this clause or a permit under these regulations. The fee payable in respect of any such special license shall be the amount so fixed at auction or by tender, or the amount payable at the fixed rate imposed as hereinbefore mentioned on the whole of the timber to be removed thereunder.

Board may let grazing by auction or by tender.

15. Any Board may let at auction or by tender the right to graze cattle upon any area of any reserve or other portion of Crown lands assigned to their care; but no person shall depasture cattle within any such reserve or other portion of Crown lands unless he be a licensee under these regulations. The fee payable by such licensee shall be the amount so fixed at auction or by tender.

Passes and permits may be issued or revoked.

16. Every Board may from time to time issue or revoke passes or permits to persons to enter upon or work in any reserve or other portion of Crown lands assigned to their care; and no person shall be employed in any such reserve or portion of Crown lands unless duly authorized under license, permit, or pass.

Licenses, permits and passes to be returned.

17. All licenses, permits, or passes must be returned to the Board issuing the same immediately after the expiry of the term for which the same shall have been issued.

Board to have brand.

18. Every Board shall have a brand for marking timber and other property; and no person, unless authorized by the Board, shall be permitted to use such brand.

Registration of brands.

19. Every person having timber or other produce in any reserve or other portion of Crown lands assigned to the care of any Board, shall register a brand with some duly appointed officer of such Board, and shall mark his timber or other produce with such brand.

Unbranded timber to be collected.

20. Any Board may direct the collection of timber found unbranded in any reserve or other portion of Crown lands assigned to their care, and the branding thereof with the brand of such Board; and all timber so branded may in default of any claim being established thereto be sold by tender or at auction, but shall not be removed except by the holder of a license or permit under these regulations.

Branded timber not to be felled.

21. No timber that bears the brand of any Board shall be felled or removed, except by an officer of such Board, or other duly authorized person.

Timber to be removed on registered vehicles.

22. No timber or other forest produce shall be removed from any reserve or other portion of Crown lands assigned to the care of any Board except in a vehicle registered by some duly appointed officer of the Board. No charge shall be made for such registration.

Reserves may be closed.

23. Any Board may, with the Minister's approval, in writing, close any reserve or other portion of Crown lands assigned to their care. Notice of any such closing shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and posted in the locality. Every person trespassing in such reserves or lands after such publication shall be deemed guilty of a breach of these regulations.

Ingress or egress prohibited except by authorized roads.

24. Any Board may from time to time prohibit ingress or egress to or from any reserve or other portion of Crown lands assigned to their care, except by authorized roads, and may regulate the use of such roads. Any person acting contrary to such prohibition shall be deemed guilty of a breach of these regulations. Notice of the opening or closing of any forest road shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and posted in the locality.

25. No person, unless an officer of a Board, shall light fires in any portion of any reserve, except under the supervision of a forester, or at times and in places to be appointed by the Board. Lighting of fires prohibited.
26. No person shall girdle, burn, bark, or in any way injure any trees, shrubs, or other plants within any reserve or other portion of Crown lands assigned to the care of any Board. Girdling, &c., of trees prohibited.
27. No surface soil shall be removed except where necessary for the prosecution of quarrying operations. Surface soil not to be removed.
28. Any Board may revoke, forfeit, or cancel any license, permit, or pass issued by such Board for infraction of any of the conditions thereof. Licenses, &c., may be revoked, forfeited, or cancelled.
29. Any Board may appoint depôts for the collection of any fees or other charges due upon timber. Notice of all such appointments to be published in the *Government-Gazette*, and posted in the locality. Appointment of depôts.
30. In these regulations, except where the context is inconsistent therewith, the word "Minister" shall mean the responsible Minister of the Crown administering the Act No. 563; the word "Board" shall mean any Local Forest Board; the word "secretary" shall mean the secretary for the time being to any Local Forest Board; the singular number shall include the plural, and the plural the singular. SCHEDULE II.

CONDITIONS OF LICENSE TO CUT AND TAKE AWAY TIMBER.

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

- The license fee shall be payable in advance.
- No tree shall be felled so as to obstruct any track in use for the transport of timber or stores.
- The licensee shall within one month from the felling of any tree dispose of the portions not required for use in such manner as the forester may direct.
- One person only shall cut or take away timber under this license, and if any timber cut by the licensee be transported by any other person such other person also shall hold a similar license.
- The licensee shall not reside upon nor cultivate any portion of the Crown lands specified in this license.
- This license is available only for the Crown lands specified therein.
- This license may be transferred on payment of a fee of 5s. to the Secretary of the Board issuing the same.
- This license shall be produced by the licensee upon the request of any forester bailiff of Crown lands or member of the police force.
- This license may be revoked at any time by the Board issuing the same, on a breach by the licensee of any of the conditions thereof, without entitling such licensee to any compensation.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS.

- If the license be to cut eucalyptus timber (other than redgum, bluegum, and ironbark) for the supply of a sawmill or factory. No live tree shall be felled that measures less than 5 feet 6 inches circumference at 2 feet above the ground. No tree shall be felled at a greater height than 2 feet above the ground. Every log shall have the brand of the licensee marked on the butt thereof.
- If the license be to cut eucalyptus timber (other than redgum, bluegum, and ironbark) for splitting. No tree shall be felled that measures less than 5 feet 6 inches circumference at 2 feet above the ground. No tree shall be felled at a greater height than 2 feet above the ground. No more than three trees shall be felled prior to the cutting and splitting up of such trees. No logs shall be cut for the supply of a sawmill or factory, nor removed. No timber shall be squared nor squared timber removed. No live tree shall be felled merely for the purpose of obtaining bark or firewood therefrom. Every stack of split timber shall have the brand of the licensee marked thereon.
- If the license be to cut redgum, bluegum, and ironbark for the supply of a sawmill or factory. No live tree shall be felled that measures less than 7 feet 6 inches circumference at 2 feet above the ground. No tree shall be felled at a greater height than 2 feet above the ground. Every log shall have the brand of the licensee marked on the butt thereof.

If the license be to cut redgum, bluegum, and ironbark for splitting.

If the license be to cut blackwood, beech, pine, sassafras, other than for the supply of a sawmill or factory.

If the license be to cut blackwood, beech, pine, sassafras, other than for the supply of a sawmill or factory.

If the license be to cut dead timber for firewood.

If the license be to cut wattle trees for bark.

If the license be to cut offshoots and suckers from the stumps of felled trees.

If the license be to cut piles and telegraph poles.

If the license be to cut timber on any defined area for sawmill or factory purposes.

No live redgum or bluegum that measures less than 7 feet 6 inches circumference at 2 feet above the ground, and no live ironbark that measures less than 5 feet 6 inches circumference at 2 feet above the ground shall be felled. No tree shall be felled at a greater height than 18 inches above the ground. No more than three trees shall be felled prior to the cutting and splitting up of such trees. No logs shall be cut for the supply of a sawmill or factory, nor removed. No timber shall be squared nor squared timber removed. No live tree shall be felled merely for the purpose of obtaining bark or firewood therefrom. Every stack of split timber shall have the brand of the licensee marked thereon.

No live blackwood or beech that measures less than 4 feet circumference at 12 inches above the ground, and no live pine or sassafras that measures less than 3 feet circumference at 12 inches above the ground, shall be felled. No tree shall be felled at a greater height than 12 inches above the ground. Every log shall have the brand of the licensee marked on the butt thereof.

No live blackwood or beech that measures less than 4 feet circumference at 12 inches above the ground, and no live pine or sassafras that measures less than 3 feet circumference at 12 inches above the ground, shall be felled. No tree shall be felled at a greater height than 12 inches above the ground. No timber shall be supplied to a sawmill or factory, and no logs shall be removed. No tree shall be felled merely for the purpose of obtaining bark or firewood therefrom. Every stack of timber shall have the brand of the licensee marked thereon.

No live tree shall be felled. No timber shall be supplied to a sawmill or factory, and no logs shall be removed. Every dead tree felled shall be wholly utilized and removed from the reserve.

No live tree shall be felled that measures less than 2 feet 6 inches circumference at 12 inches above the ground. No tree shall be felled at a greater height than 12 inches above the ground. No bark shall be stripped from a standing tree. Every stack of bark shall have the brand of the licensee marked thereon.

No offshoots or suckers shall be cut, except in the places where and the manner in which the forester may direct. Every stack of timber shall have the brand of the licensee marked thereon.

No tree shall be felled unless branded with the brand of the Board, and such brand shall not be obliterated until the tree shall have been removed from any reserve or portion of Crown lands assigned to the care of such Board. Every pile and every telegraph pole shall, in addition to bearing the brand of the Board, have the brand of the licensee marked on the butt thereof.

No redgum or bluegum, that measures less than 7 feet 6 inches circumference, and no other species of eucalyptus that measures less than 5 feet 6 inches circumference at 2 feet above the ground, shall be felled. No tree shall be felled that bears the Board's brand. The licensee shall be responsible for the proper conservation of the young timber growing upon the area specified in his license, undue damage to which will render his license liable to forfeiture without any claim for compensation. The licensee shall effect, without remuneration, such reasonable planting of indigenous and other trees as the Board may require and shall be responsible for the proper care and protection of such trees; and all such planting shall be done under the supervision of the forester and shall be subject to his approval. The licensee shall not be entitled to obtain another license until he shall have worked the area allotted to him under this license to the satisfaction of the Board. All logs must be removed within one month from the date of the expiry of this license. The licensee shall cut no timber outside his area unless specially authorized by the Board in writing.

SCHEDULE III.

CONDITIONS OF LICENSE TO OCCUPY SITES FOR SAWMILLS, FACTORIES, AND FOR GRAZING.

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

1. The land specified in this license shall be used solely for the purpose for which this license has been granted, and shall not be sublet.
2. No goats shall be kept by the licensee.
3. This license may be transferred on payment of a fee of £1 to the secretary of the Board issuing the same.
4. This license shall be produced by the licensee upon the request of any forester bailiff of Crown lands or police constable.
5. The licensee may within one month of the expiration of his license remove any building or other improvement that he may have placed upon the land, but he shall be held liable for any injury to the forest resulting from the removal thereof; and if he should fail to remove such buildings or other improvements within the time specified he shall not be entitled to receive compensation therefor.
6. If the holder of this license do any act which if it were done without license would be punishable as trespass, if he fail to produce his license when asked so to do by any forester bailiff of Crown lands or police constable, he shall be conclusively deemed to be a person not licensed or otherwise authorized to do such act within the meaning of the 93rd and 94th sections of *The Land Act 1869*.
7. The non-compliance with or the non-performance of any of the obligations specified in this license shall render the same null and void; and the land in respect to which such license has been granted may be dealt with as unoccupied Crown land.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS.

No building shall be erected outside of the boundaries of the site. The machinery must be erected and in working order within six months of the date upon which this license is granted. The licensee must utilize the timber standing nearest to his sawmill or factory.

The licensee shall enclose the land within six months of the date upon which this license is granted.

The licensee shall be responsible for any damage done to the timber. The licensee shall not be entitled to fell any standing timber, nor to remove any fallen timber from the land.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND
 MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVES FOR PUBLIC
 PURPOSES AT LAKE LEARMONTH (INCLUDING
 THE LAKE).

WHEREAS by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869* power is
 given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules
 and regulations for the care, protection, and management of
 all public parks and reserves, and for the preservation of good
 order and decency therein: Now therefore the Board of Land
 and Works doth hereby make the following Rules and Regu-
 lations to be observed and enforced in respect of the land
 reserved for Public purposes at Lake Learmonth (including
 the lake).

1. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may
 offend against decency as regards his dress, language, or
 conduct.
2. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or
 flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
3. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates,
 stick bills thereon, or cut their names on the fences, seats, or
 trees, or throw stones in the reserve.
4. No person shall shoot, snare, or destroy any game within
 the reserve without the written permission of the Council of
 the Shire of Ballarat.
5. All goats or poultry found within the reserve may be
 destroyed.

6. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle or pigs
 without the written permission of the council, and any person
 allowing their cattle, including horses, mares, geldings, colts,
 fillies, oxen, heifers, bulls, steers, calves, sheep, or goats to
 wander within the reserves, shall be prosecuted under the
 provisions of *The Land Act 1869*.

7. No person shall bathe in the waters of Lake Learmonth
 except where the bathing houses are erected.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in
 accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on convic-
 tion before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceed-
 ing Five pounds sterling for each offence, and any person who
 shall wilfully and knowingly offend against any such regula-
 tion, and who shall not after he shall have been warned by a
 bailiff of Crown lands or any constable desist from so offend-
 ing, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable
 and be taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall on
 conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds
 sterling.

COLAC BOTANIC GARDEN AND RECREATION RESERVE.

THE Colac Shire Council, the duly appointed committee of management of the land at Colac reserved for Botanic Gardens and recreative purposes, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management of the above-mentioned Recreation Reserve, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency, as regards his dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein without the authority in writing of the said Council.
6. No person shall erect any dwelling on the reserve nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the said council first obtained.
7. No person except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve shall enter any plots which may be enclosed within the reserve for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and any person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

The Board of Land and Works in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Land Act 1869*, section 108, doth hereby make the foregoing regulations in respect of the Colac Public Gardens and Recreation Reserve.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE PENSHURST PUBLIC PARK.

WHEREAS by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted that the Board of Land and Works shall have power from time to time to make and alter or rescind rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves; And whereas certain rules and regulations for the management of the Penshurst Public Park were made by the said Board on the 4th day of November 1873; And whereas it has been considered necessary to alter and rescind one of the said regulations: Now therefore the said Board of Land and Works, in exercise of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby rescind regulation number 9 of the said rules, and doth make the following regulation in lieu thereof:—

No cattle of any description shall be allowed to graze in the park, except such young cattle under the age of eighteen months, and sheep the agistment of which in the park shall have been let by the council by public tender, subject to the condition that such agistment shall not interfere with the right of the public to the free use of the park. The rent derived from such agistment shall be expended solely on the improvement of the park.

DISPOSITION OF CHURCH LANDS ALLOWED.

A STATEMENT of Trusts having been submitted by the head or authorized representative of the denomination of The United Church of England and Ireland in Victoria, under the provisions of the *Act to provide for the Abolition of State Aid to Religion*, for allowance by the Governor, the same was allowed by him on the fourteenth day of May 1877, and the following is the form in which such statement of trusts has been allowed:—

Description of Land.—Two roods, county of Grant, township of Steiglitz, being allotments 3, 4, and 5, and part of allotment 2 of section 22: Commencing at the junction of the south-eastern side of Carr street with Molesworth street; bounded thence by the first-mentioned street bearing S. 50° 4' W. three chains thirty-one links; thence by a line bearing S. 39° 56' E. two chains thirty-five links; thence by allotment 6 bearing N 27° 45' E. two chains forty-one links; and thence by Molesworth street aforesaid bearing N. 3° 3' W. one chain eighty links to the commencing point.

Names of Trustees.—The Honorable James Wilberforce Stephen, of Caulfield, a Judge of the Supreme Court of the colony of Victoria; The Honorable Thomas Turner a Beckett, of Brighton, a Member of the Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria; William Edward Morris, of Lotham street, East Melbourne, Deputy-Registrar of the Diocese of Melbourne.

Power of Disposition.—Power to sell, lease, mortgage, or exchange, subject to the approval of the Bishop, or, during the absence of the Bishop from the diocese or the vacancy of the see, to the approval of the person for the time being administering the affairs of the diocese. The Bishop or such person aforesaid to have power to remove trustees and appoint new trustees, and to fill up vacancies occurring in trusteeship. The land, until otherwise disposed of, to be held for the purposes for which it was granted or reserved by the Crown.

Purposes to which Proceeds of Disposition are to be applied.—To such purposes of the Church of England as may be agreed upon by—(1) the Bishop, or, during his absence from his see or during the vacancy thereof, by the person for the time being administering the affairs of the diocese, (2) the trustees, and (3) the minister entitled to officiate in or occupy any building on the land.

AGRICULTURAL STATISTICS OF THE COLONY OF VICTORIA FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 1877.

MEMORANDUM.—The Agricultural Statistics in parts of the colony included within Municipal Districts are rendered by the Local Bodies in pursuance of the provisions of the Local Government Statute. In other parts of the colony special collectors are employed by the Government. The returns should be sent in by the 31st March at the latest. Those gathered by special collectors are always forwarded in good time, as also are those from many of the Municipal Districts. There are, however, generally some districts in which the returns are much behind time, and there are others from which the work is forwarded in so imperfect and manifestly incorrect a condition that it becomes necessary to return it for amendment. On the present occasion only a portion of the returns of the Shire of Portland have been received, therefore the figures of 1875-6 have been inserted. The returns of the Shire of Rosedale are not quite complete, but the figures received, being in excess of the totals of 1875-6, have been published. A few slight alterations may possibly be made in the returns of some of the other districts.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1874, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Wimmera order as follow:—

Sections 1 to 57, excluding Nos. 42, 44, 47, and 48 of Part XI. of the 13th schedule of the Local Government Act 1874 is hereby adopted in and for the Shire of Wimmera.

BYE-LAW No. 1.

1. *General conduct of business.*—In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the council.

2. *Minutes of meeting to be read at next subsequent meeting.*—At every meeting of the council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings of the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee

presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed as by this Act required.

3. *Order of business at meetings.*—After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follow, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the council at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (1) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the council.
- (2) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (3) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (4) Presentation of reports of committees.
- (5) Payments.
- (6) Ordinary business.
- (7) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (8) Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
- (9) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (10) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4. *Divisions.*—Whenever a division shall be demanded by any councillor, the councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman.

5. *Addresses to Governor.*—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and the clerk of the municipality, unless otherwise ordered by the council.

6. *Motions.*—All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the municipal clerk at the close of the meeting of council, or if not required by law to be given at a meeting then three clear days prior to the next meeting of council; and such clerk shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

7. *Notice of motion to be given.*—No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

8. *Petitions.*—No motion except that for receiving the same shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of council after that at which it has been presented.

9. *Motions to be moved in order in motion book.*—Except by leave of the council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the municipal clerk in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

10. *Motion to be proceeded with by councillor giving same except with consent.*—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the councillor who gave notice of the same, unless by some other councillor producing written authority from him to that effect.

11. *Draft of address or petition to be submitted at previous meeting.*—No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

12. *Order, &c., of debate.*—Any councillor desirous of making a motion or amendment or taking part in discussion thereon shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the councillor (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon and the question of order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

13. *Nature of motion to be stated.*—Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the council thereon.

14. *Motion not to be withdrawn without leave.*—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the council.

15. *Motion to be seconded.*—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the council unless it be seconded, but a councillor may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the council by directing the chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

16. *Mover of motion.*—A councillor moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a councillor merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

17. *Designation of councillors.*—The councillors in meeting of council shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of president, chairman, or councillor, as the case may require.

18. *Priority of councillors.*—If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

19. *Chairman to rise in addressing council.*—The chairman shall rise in addressing the council to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

20. *Councillor not to speak second time on same question.*—No councillor shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

21. *Points of order.*—The chairman when called upon to decide on points of order or practice shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

22. *Councillors not to digress, &c.*—No councillor shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other councillor in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on councillors shall be deemed highly disorderly.

23. *Councillors to apologize for disorderly, &c., expression.*—Whenever any councillor shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, the councillor so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression and to make a satisfactory apology to the council.

24. *Councillor called to order to sit down.*—A councillor called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.

25. *Councillor twice offending guilty of an offence.*—Any councillor using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw and to apologize for such conduct and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

26. *Strangers.*—Any person not being a councillor who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the council, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

27. *Councillors not attending order for call.*—Any councillor not attending in compliance with an order for a call of the whole council without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof shall be guilty of an offence.

28. *Councillor may demand documents.*—Any councillor may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the council applying to the question under discussion.

29. *Voting.*—The council shall vote by show of hands, and any councillor present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

30. *Question how declared.*—The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the council, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

31. *Motions, &c., to be in writing.*—At every meeting of the council all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover, and delivered to the chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

32. *No second amendment until previous one disposed of.*—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

33. *Effect of rejection of words in original motion.*—If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

34. *If amendment be negatived a second one may be moved.*—If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the council for discussion at a time.

35. *Mover of motion to have right of reply.*—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

36. *Motion for adjournment.*—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council; but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice-paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

37. *Protests.*—Any councillor may protest against any resolution of the council, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the council by the protesting councillor in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the municipal clerk, and signed by such councillor, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the council to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the council.

38. *Lapsed questions.*—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the councillors present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted, on motion upon notice.

39. *Lapsed order of the day may be restored.*—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice-book for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

40. *Committees.*—Minutes of all proceedings of committees as well as of their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committees' minute-book, and being signed by the chairman of the committee shall be presented to the council; and the municipal clerk, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of committees.

41. *Meetings of the committee.*—The municipal clerk shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment or at any other time thereafter by order of the council, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee or of any two members of the committee.

42. *Petitions to be respectful.*—It shall be incumbent on every councillor presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the council, and that the contents do not violate any bye-law or any provision hereof.

43. *Petitions to be in writing.*—Every petition shall be in writing and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every skin or sheet on which it is written.

44. *To be signed by petitioners.*—Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

45. *Appointments, &c., of officers.*—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the council shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the shire inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

46. *Salaries of officers, &c.*—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the council shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

47. *No councillor, &c., to be surety for officer.*—No councillor or officer of the council and no assessor or auditor of the municipality shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the council or for any work to be done for the council.

48. *Expense of preparing security.*—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty or contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

49. *Miscellaneous.*—All the plans and specifications for any public work shall be laid before the council at least six days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, and be open for inspection by any ratepayer during that time.

50. *Treasurer to disburse moneys in certain cases.*—It shall be lawful for the treasurer of the municipality from time to time, on the written order of the municipal clerk, to disburse such moneys as shall have been appropriated by the council for the purposes of this clause, and as shall be required for any necessary occasion, not exceeding in the whole in any interval between two ordinary meetings of the council the sum of five pounds.

51. *Common seal.*—The common seal of the municipality shall be kept in a box having two locks, of one of which locks each councillor shall have a key and of the other of which locks the key shall be kept by the municipal clerk; and the corporate seal shall not be affixed to any document unless the chairman of the municipality and one other member of the council or in the absence of such chairman unless two councillors be present.

52. *Suspension of rules.*—Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained in this subdivision may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the council.

53. *Penalty.*—If any person shall be guilty of any wilful offence or misfeasance or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission contrary to any provision contained in this subdivision, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding five pounds.

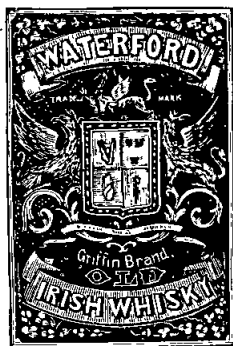

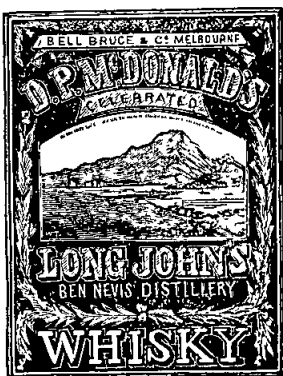
