AGRICULTURAL STATISTICS, 1876-77.

SUPPLEMENTARY RETURN.—Classification of Holdings, as to size, during the last Four Years.

\*\*\* The "extent of land in occupation" being derived from the returns furnished by the Collectors of Agricultural Statistics is always considerably less than the whole area alienated. The collectors are not required to take account of holdings of a smaller extent than one acre, nor of gardens or grounds attached to residences which are kept merely for ornament or pleasure; nor of any lands which are unoccupied or which are used for other purposes than agriculture or the keeping of live stock. It is moreover possible that in a few instances the collectors may not be aware of the existence of, and consequently may not penetrate to, some isolated blocks of purchased land held in connection with squatting stations at a distance from agricultural districts. Returns are obtained without much trouble from the small and medium-sized holdings, but difficulty is often experienced in getting a correct account of the land embraced in large estates. Each distinct occupation is considered to be a holding without reference to its proprietorship, and each of several holdings in different localities occupied or owned by one person is necessarily reckoned as a distinct holding.

## BYE-LAW No. 29, FOR REGULATION OF THE TOWN MARKET.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1874, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Richmond order as follows:—

1. That the market situate within the town of Richmond, commencing at the north-east angle of the Town Hall reserve; bounded thence by that reserve and the Court House and Church of England reserves bearing west nine chains; thence by Church street bearing north eight chains sixty links; thence by Highett street bearing east nine chains; and thence by Glendell street bearing south eight chains sixty links to the point of commencement; shall be open for public use on Tuesday in each week from sunrise till Eleven o'clock a.m., and on Saturdays from Four o'clock p.m. till Eleven o'clock p.m. (Christmas Day excepted), for the supply and sale of provisions, that is to say:—Butchers' meat, pork, poultry, fish, rabbits, wild fowl, butter, cheese, eggs, vegetables, fruits, roots, shrubs, plants, bulbs, seeds, hay, straw, grain, green fodder, and all garden and farm produce, with such other articles as the town council may allow to be sold in the said market; and it shall not be lawful for any person to expose or offer for sale or to sell in the market any other article or thing than is herein enumerated or referred to.

2. That it shall be lawful for the said council to let for any period not exceeding the current municipal year, at such rent as they may fix thereon, any shed, stall, standing, or other convenience within the market, and to re-let the same as often as the periods of such letting shall expire, or be otherwise determined; and for the good regulation of the said market each or every lease or arrangement shall contain a clause setting forth the class of articles for which such shed, shop, or other convenience has been let, and that no other class of article shall be exposed or offered for sale in or on the said shed, shop, stall, site, or other convenience than is named or referred to in the said agreements, except with the consent, in writing, of the said council.

3. That it shall be lawful for the said council, and they are hereby empowered to impose and collect all such rents, rates, tolls, and dues, in respect of and on all such articles which are enumerated in Schedule A appended to this bye-law which may be brought into the said market to be sold therein.

4. That any person wishing his or her name or business affixed to any stall, shed, &c., or to have the stall or shed, &c., enclosed in any particular way, shall apply to the Market Inspector, under whose directions the same may be done at the cost of the applicant and under the supervision of the Town Surveyor.

5. That any person guilty of the following offences, omissions, or neglect, shall, on conviction thereof, for every such offence or omission pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling:—

1. Selling or exposing for sale in the said market any marketable commodity before the times appointed for opening, or after the times appointed for closing such market, or on other days than those named for holding the market.
2. Selling or offering for sale in the said market any commodity not named in and allowed by this bye-law to be sold there.
3. Refusing or neglecting to pay on demand being made by the officer appointed by the council to collect the same any rate, rent, toll, or due which may be due for any shed, stall, or convenience, or for any article sold or exposed for sale in the market.
4. Placing any matter or thing so as to cause an obstruction, and refusing or neglecting to remove the same on being requested to do so by the Market Inspector.
5. Placing or keeping any cart, carriage, barrow, or other vehicle in any part of the said market contrary to the direction of the Market Inspector.
6. Placing any hook, nail, or peg, or otherwise injuring or defacing any part of the market buildings, or fitting up or enclosing any part of it without the consent or contrary to the directions of the Market Inspector, or refusing to remove any hook, nail, peg, or fittings when requested to do so by the Inspector.
7. Sweeping or causing to be swept, or placing any dirt or rubbish into or upon any of the paths, gutters, roads, &c., of the said market, and allowing the same to remain.
8. Being in the market in a drunken or disorderly state, or exciting any riot or disturbance, or cursing or swearing, or using any gross, indecent, or abusive language, or being guilty of any gross or indecent conduct therein.
9. In any way obstructing the Market Inspector in the discharge of his duties.
10. In any other manner than those specified interfering with the proper regulation and good management of the market.

6. That the council shall appoint an officer to be called the "Market Inspector," whose duties shall be generally as described in Schedule B.

7. That the said council shall from time to time, as they may see fit, repeal any of the rules and conditions contained in this bye-law, and substitute others for those repealed; or alter or

Provided that this bye-law shall not apply to any nightsoil or manure produced upon the premises where such nightsoil or manure shall be deposited, put, placed, kept, or used.

Every person guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of the foregoing bye-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Ten shillings.

Every person guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of the foregoing bye-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Ten shillings.
