The births of 695 children, viz., 359 boys and 336 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of May. In the month of April 627 births were registered, or 68 less than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in May numbered 458, viz., 244 of males and 214 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 237. The deaths exceeded those in April by 16; and were also in excess of the average of May during the previous ten years by 99. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of those ten years by only 43.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 69.7° on the 14th, and the lowest was 39.9° on the 28th. The mean temperature of the month (53.0°) was about a third of a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (24.4°) took place on the 2nd, viz., from a maximum of 68.9° to a minimum of 44.5°. The least range (3.9°) was on the 23rd, viz., from a maximum of 55.1° to a minimum of 51.2°. The mean daily range was 13.9°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.844 inches) was below the average.

Of the deaths recorded during the month those of males were in the proportions of 58 per cent. to the total number, and those of females in the proportion of 47 per cent. The mortality of children under the age of 5 years amounted to 34 per cent. as against 38 per cent. in May 1876; 37 per cent. in May 1875; 39 per cent. in May 1874; 40 per cent. in May 1873; 46 per cent. in May 1872; 39 per cent. in May 1872; 39 per cent. in May 1872; 39 per cent. in May 1873; 45 per cent. in May 1874; 45 per cent. in May 1876; 39 per cent. in May 1876; 30 per cent. in May

Twenty-one deaths of persons of the age of 75 years or upwards were registered during the month, viz.:—Those of a male, occupation unstated, aged 76, of erysipelas; an agent, aged 86, of influenza; two females, aged 75 and 77 respectively, of diarrhea; a gardener, aged 87, and a female, aged 78, of apoplexy; a vocalist, aged 80, of disease of the brain; a female, aged 86, of disease of the heart; a wood broker, aged 76, a male, of occupation unstated, aged 77, and three females, aged respectively 9, 83, and 84, of bronchitis; a dressmaker, aged 76, of peritonitis; a butcher and a groom, each aged 75, a laborer, aged 78, a linen manufacturer, aged 77, and three females, aged respectively 77, 79, and 80, of old age.

Twelve deaths from external causes were recorded during the month, all of which are ascribed to accident. The following are the particulars:—A female child, aged 4, died of the result of a spinal injury, caused by a fall from a bed; a male child, aged 5, died of the effects of fractured ribs (how caused unknown); a carter and a laborer, both aged 35, were passed over by vehicles, the latter whilst intoxicated; a female, aged 41, died of tetanus, resulting from a cut in the thumb; a female child, aged 2, died of scalds; a shopman, aged 17, and a brassmoulder, aged 33, died of burns, in the former case caused by the upsetting of a jar of sulphuric acid; a haircurler, aged 14, succumbed to an attack of tetanus, induced by a poisoned wound: a seaman, aged 29, was accidentally drowned in the River Yarra, at Footscray; a female infant, aged 5 months, was suffocated in bed; a male child, aged 4 years, was cheked whilst cating.

^{*} In cases where the minus sign (-) is prefixed to any number it implies that the deaths exceeded the births by that number.

One hundred and ten deaths, or 24 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—68 in the Melbourne Hospital, 5 in the Immigrants' Home. 3 in the Children's Hospital, 12 in the Alfred Hospital, 2 in the Lying in Hospital, 4 in the Benevolent Asylum, 3 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 8 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 4 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Blind Asylum.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 156, of which 79, or 51 per cent., were of males; and 77, or 46 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 82 were under one year of age, 33 were between one and two, 12 were between two and three, 19 were between three and four, and 10 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 302. Of these, 165, or 55 per cent, were males, and 187, or 45 per cent, were females; 20 were between five and ten, 16 were between ten and fifteen, 16 were between fifteen and twenty, 18 were between twenty and twenty-five, 19 were between twenty-five and thirty-five, 26 were between thirty-five and forty, 28 were between fifty-five and firty-five, 19 were between fifty-five and firty-five, 20 were between firty-five, 14 were between fifty-five and sixty-five, 14 were between sixty-five, 14 were between sixty-five, 14 were between sixty-five and eighty, and 7 were upwards of eighty.

Typhoid fever caused 54 deaths in May as against 29 in April. Since the commencement of the year 142 deaths in Melbourne and suburbs have been set down to that complaint. Diarrhea and dysentery caused 26 deaths as against 61 in April, and phthisis caused 46 deaths as against 47 in April. Seven women died in childbirth, and as the births registered numbered 695, it follows that one mother died to every 99 births.
