REGULATIONS FOR THE RECREATION RESERVE AT THE CAMP, CASTLEMAINE.

WE, the Council of the Borough of Castlemaine, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Land at the Camp, Castlemaine, reserved for recreation purposes, and gazetted 16th March 1877, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management of the above-mentioned Recreation Reserve, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
 2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards his dress, language, or conduct.
 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
 4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
 5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.
 6. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the committee of management being first obtained.
 7. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots which may be enclosed within the reserve for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
- Every person offending against any of these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds sterling.

RULES OF THE EDDINGTON PUBLIC CEMETERY.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
2. By the nineteenth section of *The Cemeteries Statute 1864*, "any person making a vault or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons and his or their representatives for ever."
3. Applications for such permission to be made to the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the party applying on payment of the charges in the schedule.
4. Orders for interment to be given to the secretary or sexton on the previous day, between the hours of Eight o'clock a.m. and Five o'clock p.m.
5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees or their surveyor; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.
6. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.
7. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hour fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten o'clock a.m. to Six o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten o'clock a.m. to Four o'clock p.m. throughout the rest of the year.
8. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and proper condition, at the expense of the owners.
9. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.
10. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are required by the eighth section of the Act to determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument, according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.
11. No catacomb or any wooden fencing allowed without first submitting a plan for the approval of the trustees.
12. No person or servant employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

13. The ground will be open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.

14. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected, and registers of all grants are kept by the secretary.

15. Any person who shall wantonly or wilfully destroy, or cause to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, will be proceeded against as directed by the said Statute.

16. The trustees will not permit any "body" to be buried less than six feet from the surface.

17. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these rules and regulations.

THE Board of Land and Works, by virtue of the powers and authorities vested in it by *The Public Works Statute 1865*, doth hereby make the following Bye-law for fixing the Charges and Regulations for the Carriage of Wool upon Railways vested in the Board, that is to say:—

Wool unpressed will be charged double the above rates.

The above mileage rates do not apply to the Williamstown line, or to wool consigned from country stations direct to the pier, upon which 6d. per bale in addition to the above rates will be charged.

New South Wales wool delivered by teams at Echuca, Wodonga, and Springs, will be allowed 6d. per bale on above mileage rates.

Consignments of wool borne by rail from Stawell to Geelong or Melbourne, and amounting in the aggregate for the year ending 30th June 1878 to 4,000 bales and upwards, and forwarded by one and the same consignor, will be allowed 6d. per bale.

Wool to the Williamstown Pier may be consigned direct from country stations, but only provided that the name of the vessel it is intended for be given on the consignment note. If the vessel is not at the Pier or not ready to ship the bales on their arrival, then the trucks may be brought back to Melbourne and unloaded there, all at the cost and risk of the owner.

An allowance will be made of 1s. per bale upon dumped wool carried by railway over 150 miles.

If from delay in this respect, or from any cause not due to the department, the vessel is not ready to receive wool or general cargo within twelve hours after the arrival of the trucks, demurrage will be strictly enforced at the rate of 10s. per truck per diem until the trucks are unloaded by the consignee, or until the department, at the cost and risk of the consignee, unloads the trucks and sends the goods to store. Wool consigned for shipment, and requiring to be dumped, will be deliverable at the dumping sheds, where a receipt must be given on behalf of the ship.

All bales of wool carried on the above lines weighing over 4 cwt. each will be charged twenty-five per cent. per bale additional upon the rate for a 4 cwt. bale for every cwt. or portion of a cwt. in excess.

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

The above rates are subject to minimums of three, four, five, and six shillings for each consignment, according to distance and conditions in goods classification.

Twelve hours will be allowed for the removal of wool after arrival of the trucks. From that time storage will be charged, and strictly enforced, at the rate of One penny per bale per diem until the wool is removed by the consignee, or sent to store by the department at the consignee's cost and risk. All wool is carried at owner's risk as to condition, and will be signed for accordingly. If detailed weight lists are furnished by the department for the use of consignees, the charge for weighing will be Fourpence per bale; if weighed by the owners, One penny per bale will be charged for the use of the scales. Consignors requiring weight lists must pay for same at sending station.

All previous wool rates are now cancelled.

A bye-law of the Shire of Glenelg, made under the 213th section of the Local Government Act 1874 for regulating the deposit of inflammable materials and generally maintaining the good rule and government of the municipality.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1874, the president, councillors, and ratepayers of the shire of Glenelg order as follows:—

1. No person shall make or place any stack of hay, straw, corn, or other produce, or deposit any combustible material within a distance of 60 feet from any building in any township or village in the shire of Glenelg, and every occupier of any premises whereon any stack shall be placed or any combustible material deposited, contrary to the tenor of this bye-law, shall forfeit on conviction for such offence a sum not exceeding Ten pounds, and in every such case a further sum not exceeding Forty shillings for every day after such conviction during which such stack or material shall so continue.

2. Any person who shall light any bonfire, tar barrel, or firework upon or within 60 yards of any public or private street, or any public place within the townships of Casterton, Merino, and Sandford, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

3. If any person shall wilfully and without the authority of the council cut, break, bark, root up, or otherwise destroy or damage the whole or any part of any tree, sapling, shrub, or underwood growing in or upon any street, road, or place under the management of the council, although the injury done shall not be to the amount of one shilling, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
