**REGULATIONS FOR THE TRANSMISSION OF DUTY-PAID OR VICTORIAN MANUFACTURED GOODS FROM VICTORIAN PORTS VIA SOUTH AUSTRALIA TO PLACES ON THE WESTERN FRONTIER OF THIS COLONY, AND FOR THEIR RE-INTRODUCTION WITHOUT PAYMENT OF DUTY.**

PERSONS desirous of conveying duty-paid goods or those manufactured in this colony *via* South Australia from Melbourne or other ports of Victoria to places on the western frontier of Victoria, and of re-introducing such goods without payment of duty, should apply to the Collector of Customs at the port of export, furnishing invoices of particulars for an officer who will satisfy himself as to the contents being correct, and mark the packages for identification.

A copy of invoice of contents should also be deposited with the Collector of Customs, who will forward it to the customs officer at the station where the goods will be introduced.

Upon the goods being found to correspond with the invoices transmitted, they will be delivered without payment of duty.

Any goods brought into Victoria except under these regulations will be treated as goods imported, and be liable to duty.

SPECIAL PLACE FOR GRANTING PUBLICANS' LICENSES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FRERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* it was amongst other things enacted that notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim

THE PARISH OF WYCHETELLA

to be a district where publicans' licenses may be specially granted.

**R**EFERRING to Land Regulations of the 26th day of May 1873, chapter VIII, div. 2, sec. 5, it is hereby notified that the price of a license to cut, split, and take away eucalyptus timber from State forests will be, on and after the 1st of September next ensuing, reduced from £4 per annum to £2 per annum, payable quarterly in advance.

CUTTING OR REMOVING TIMBER, ETC., IN CERTAIN  
LOCALITIES PROHIBITED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight  
Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint  
Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-  
Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Depen-  
dencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything therein before contained the Governor might by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber, or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare as follows, viz.:—

**BENALLA TOWNSHIP.**—No person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber, or particular description of timber or bark, from that portion of the township of Benalla shown by pink tint upon plan marked A, attached to correspondence 77.B.8042, deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(B.390 & 392c.)

**WOMBAT OR BULLAROOK STATE FOREST.**—No person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber, or particular description of timber or bark, from the land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, and situate in the Wombat or Bullarook State Forest, viz.:—County of Bourke, parish unnamed, situate in the Wombat or Bullarook State Forest: Commencing at the north-west angle of Crawley and Fitzpatrick's saw-mill site at Spargo's Creek; bounded thence by a line bearing north one hundred and fifty-five chains, more or less, to the summit of the Bald Hill Range; thence south-easterly and southerly by the summit of that range to a point thereon bearing east from the north-west angle of Crawley and Fitzpatrick's saw-mill site aforesaid; and thence by a line bearing west to the point of commencement. The bearings have reference to the magnetic meridian.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight

dencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that the Governor might from time to time by a notice in the *Government Gazette* proclaim as a street or road or as a town or village any portion or portions of Crown lands, and the lands in such town or village should be sold by auction in the manner therein provided for the sale of Crown lands by public auction, and the lands upon which such street or road should have been proclaimed should be and be deemed to be thenceforward dedicated to the public: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice proclaim as a Village the portion of Crown lands hereinafter described, viz.:—

**OMEO VILLAGE RESERVE.**—County of Benambra, parish of Cobungra: Commencing at a point on the right bank of Livingstone Creek bearing N. 17° W. from the north-west angle of allotment 58; bounded thence by a line, a road, and a

line bearing S. 17° E. to the north-west angle of allotment 77; thence by that allotment and allotments 78 and 79 bearing N. 73° E. to the north-angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence by a direct line bearing easterly to the north-west angle of allotment 80; thence by that allotment bearing S. 75° 52' E. nine chains seventy-five links, S. 81° 49' E. twelve chains thirty links, and S. 40° 38' E. six chains eighty links; thence by a direct line bearing south-easterly to the north angle of allotment 103; thence by that allotment bearing S. 52° 11' E. to Black Gully; thence by that gully bearing north-easterly to Day's Creek; thence by that creek downwards to its junction with Livingstone Creek aforesaid; and thence by that creek upwards to the point of commencement. (O.18.) (77.O.1908.)

**W**HEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed; paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described as a Common, that is to say:—

## BALLAN TOWN COMMON.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE  
BALLAN TOWN COMMON.

In lieu of the Regulations approved by the Governor in Council on the 20th day of October 1873.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council to frame regulations for the management of commons, and in pursuance of the provisions of chapter xiii. of the regulations made under the said Act by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of May 1873, the Council of the Shire of Ballan, as managers of the Ballan Town Common, submit to the Board of Land and Works for approval the following regulations for the management of the said common:—

1. All ratepayers resident within the township boundary will be allowed to depasture on the common not more than four (4) head of large cattle or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head

of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. Bulls or entire horses will not be allowed on the common without the permission of the managers.

2. The following fees shall be paid for depasturing cattle on the common, viz.:—For every head of large cattle, ten (10) shillings; horses, twenty (20) shillings; and small cattle, five (5) shillings per annum, paid quarterly in advance.

3. Applications for licenses to depasture cattle on the common to be made to the secretary of the shire, at the Shire Hall, Ballan, who will on the receipt of the proper fees issue such license, also an order to the herdsman to receive cattle described therein on the common.

4. Licensees taking cattle to the common shall deliver them to the herdsman and produce the secretary's order. The herdsman shall sign the order and enter a copy thereof in the herd-book; and with the assistance of the licensee or his agent brand the cattle with the common brand in pitch.

5. In the event of any registered cattle being missed from the common, the herdsman shall give notice to the licensee forthwith; and in case such cattle shall be impounded previous to the giving of such notice, the herdsman shall release the said cattle at his own cost. The herdsman shall impound all unregistered cattle found trespassing on the common, or otherwise deal with them in accordance with the provisions of any Act then in force for the impounding of cattle.

6. The herdsman shall reside within the township, and enter into a sufficient bond with the managers for the proper discharge of his duties, but the managers will not be responsible for any cattle depastured on the common.

7. The herdsman shall see all cattle under his care at least once in every twenty-four (24) hours.

8. All diseased cattle found upon the common shall be immediately removed, and any owner of cattle who shall refuse or neglect to remove such cattle after receiving written notice from the herdsman to do so, shall be liable for all expenses incurred by the herdsman in removing or destroying such cattle.

9. All stock put upon the common will be entirely at the risk of the owners, and must be the *bona fide* property of those entitled to commonage.

10. The managers shall within one month after the termination of each year publish, in a newspaper circulating in the District wherein the common is situated, a certified account of their receipts and expenditure for the year in the form prescribed in schedule 25 of the regulations of the 26th May 1873, and forward copy thereof to the Board of Land and Works.

11. Every person offending against any regulation for the management of this common shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty (£20) pounds for each offence.

12. The managers of this common may sue for and recover any fees for depasturing stock on the common or any penalty for breach of any regulation for management of the common.

13. The foregoing regulation shall be in lieu of the regulation approved of by the Governor in Council on the 20th October 1873, which are hereby repealed.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE BEAUFORT, RAGLAN,  
CHARLTON, AND EURAMBEEN UNITED GOLDFIELD AND FARMERS'  
COMMON.

1. *Interpretation clause.*—In the construction and for the purposes of these regulations the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules; the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats; and the word "farmer" shall mean a person who resides on and uses for the purpose of agriculture or dairying land held by that person, either in fee or under lease or license issued under *The Land Act 1862, The Amending Land Act 1865, or under The Land Act 1869.*

2. *Persons entitled to commonage.*—Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business or carriers' licenses, and farmers shall be respectively entitled to depasture on the above-named common twelve (12) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him, shall be allowed to depasture on such common one (1) additional head of large cattle or the equivalent in small cattle for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.

3. *Scale of fees.*—

For large cattle, per head, per annum ...	£0 4 0
For sheep, per head, per annum ...	0 8 0
For goats, per head, per annum ...	0 1 4
For each pig, per annum (where permitted by the managers) ...	0 2 6

4. *Special licenses.*—The managers may issue to butchers and slaughtermen special licenses to depasture any number of small cattle intended for slaughter, not exceeding two hundred (200), and any number of large cattle intended for slaughter, not exceeding twenty (20), on payment of the fees specified in clause 3. No joint licenses to be issued.

5. *Dairymen's licenses.*—The managers may issue special licenses to dairymen to depasture any number of large cattle, not exceeding twenty (20), on payment of the prescribed

fees, and two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) extra for each license.

6. *Substituted stock.*—Holders of licenses, on substituting any stock in lieu of any that they may have disposed of during the currency of their license, shall give notice in writing to the herdsman, stating the brands and number of stock so substituted.

7. *Brands.*—All stock must be ear-marked or branded with the owner's brand before being registered, and also with the common brand. Stock found without such brands shall be deemed trespassing and may be impounded. Horses only are exempt from the common brand.

8. *Yarding goats.*—All goats found trespassing on the common will be yarded in yards provided for the purpose, and if not claimed, and the fees paid, within forty-eight (48) hours after being yarded, will be sold or destroyed. Public notice of intention to yard goats, stating situation of yards, shall be given by the herdsman.

9. *Mustering stock.*—Twice in each year, of which forty-eight (48) hours' notice in writing will be given by the herdsman, all holders of stock depasturing on the common shall be required to muster their stock in their own yards, or some other more convenient place, as may be hereafter provided by the managers, for the purpose of branding; and any owner or owners of stock refusing or neglecting to comply with this rule, after receiving notice as aforesaid, their stock shall be deemed trespassing, and may be impounded.

10. *Herd-book.*—The herdsman shall, at the time of such muster, enter in a book to be called the herd-book the name of the owner, the number, brands, and description of stock so entitled to be depastured during the current half-year, and the amount of fees payable, and shall deliver to the owners or their agent a notice in the form of Schedule A herewith annexed, to be delivered to the secretary prior to registration.

11. *Commencement of term.*—All fees must be paid half-yearly in advance. Licenses to date from the 1st of August and the 1st of February in each year.

12. *Entire stock.*—No entire stock shall be permitted to depasture on the common without special authority in writing being obtained from the managers.

13. *Diseased stock.*—When any animal is infected with any contagious disease, the owner of such animal shall remove the same from the common on receiving twelve (12) hours' notice from the secretary or herdsman; and such animal shall not again be put upon the common without special permission from the managers.

14. *Dead carcasses.*—All dead carcasses found upon the common, after due notice has been given to the owners, the herdsman shall, at the owners' expense, remove or destroy the same.

15. *Conditions of special licenses.*—The managers may, if they think necessary, define the portion of said common on which the holder of a special license will be entitled to depasture, and holders of special licenses not confining their stock to such defined portion of the said common will be treated as trespassers. Should it be deemed necessary to have any stock depasturing under special license yarded for the purpose of counting, such stock shall be at once yarded by the owner after receiving due notice from the secretary or herdsman.

16. *Exemption clause.*—All large cattle under the age of twelve (12) months, and all small cattle under the age of six (6) months, the same being the progeny of stock licensed to depasture on the common, shall be exempt from fees.

17. *Secretary.*—The managers may appoint a secretary, who shall attend at his office at such times as the managers may direct, for the purpose of receiving fees and issuing licenses and perform such other clerical duties as the managers may deem necessary.

18. *Registration book.*—The general registration book of the common shall be open for public inspection during office hours.

19. *Repeal clause.*—All regulations heretofore in force for the management of the Beaufort, Raglan, Charlton, and Eurambeen United Goldfield and Farmers' Common shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

*Penalty.*—Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO TIMBER CUTTING,  
ETC.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Land Act 1869*, § 110, the Governor in Council has rescinded Schedule 15 of the Regulations made under the said Act, and bearing date the 26th of May 1873, and has made the subjoined Schedule of Conditions in lieu thereof, viz. :-

## Conditions.

1. No tree of less diameter than eighteen inches shall be felled.
2. No greater number of trees shall be felled than is required for the current supply of the mill.
3. All trees felled and not delivered at the mill at the expiry of the license shall revert to the Crown.
4. No tree on the block under license shall be used merely for the purpose of obtaining bark therefrom.
5. The license shall protect saplings and young seedling indigenous trees, and neither he nor any other person shall depasture goats on the block under license to him, or cultivate any part of such block.
6. The license fee, amounting to \_\_\_\_\_ pounds shillings \_\_\_\_\_ pence, shall be paid in advance on \_\_\_\_\_ to the Receiver and Paymaster at \_\_\_\_\_, or to any other officer who may be authorized by the Board to receive the same.
7. The license shall be produced by the holder thereof when asked so to do by any bailiff of Crown lands or police constable.
8. Non-compliance with or non-performance of any of the foregoing conditions shall render this license null and void, and shall empower the Board to re-enter the lands referred to in this license, and to deal therewith as if it were unoccupied Crown lands.
9. This license shall be in force for one month from the date hereof, and no longer, and shall be renewable by endorsement of the Secretary for Agriculture.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, called *The Weights and Measures Statute 1864*, it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, at the request of and pursuant to any agreement made by the Councils or Boards of any two or more of any adjoining boroughs, shires, and road districts, might proclaim such boroughs, shires, and districts to be a Union for the purposes of the said Act, and by such Proclamation fix the proportion in which the expenses devolving upon such union under the said Act should be borne by the several bodies corporate of such boroughs, shires, or districts: And whereas the Councils of the Shire of Creswick and Borough of Creswick have requested that the said shire and borough may be proclaimed a Union, and that the expenses devolving upon such union under the said Act may be borne in the proportion of one-half by the Shire of Creswick and one-half by the Borough of Creswick: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Shire of Creswick and the Borough of Creswick to be a Union for the purposes of the said Act, and do fix the proportion in which the expenses devolving upon such Union under the said Act shall be borne as follows, One half by the Council of the Shire of Creswick and one-half by the Council of the Borough of Creswick.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this sixteenth day of July in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, and in the forty-first year of Her Majesty's reign.
