## VICTORIAN VOLUNTEER FORCE.

THE 38th clause of the Regulations of 30th March 1874, for the government of the Volunteer Force, issued under the authority of *The Volunteer Statute* 1865, directs that "in the event of any corps (troop of cavalry) or detachment failing to be entitled to the effective allowance for 50 per cent. of its maximum establishment, such corps or detachment shall be disbanded." ## MANAGER OF A COMMON-TOLL ROAD.

THE Governor in Council, on the 18th August 1877, made the following arrangement with reference to the Common-toll Road hereinafter mentioned, under the provisions of the Act 38 Vict. No. 506, § 435, viz. :-

JOHN COSGRAVE  
having been appointed Manager of that portion of the Sydney road extending from Elizabeth street, in the city of Melbourne, to the northern boundary of the shire of Coburg, proclaimed a Common-toll Road under Order in Council of 21st August 1865, shall, upon the first day of each calendar month receive from the collectors and lessees of all tolls upon the portion of the roads so proclaimed, and upon the bridges thereon, all moneys collected by them as and for such tolls, or due by them as the rents thereof; and that he shall, within four days after the receipt distribute the tolls so collected amongst the local bodies interested therein, in the proportions prescribed by Order in Council of 14th February 1876; such appointment to be in force from 1st July to 31st December 1877.

## SPECIAL PLACE FOR GRANTING PUBLICANS' LICENSES.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* it was amongst other things enacted that notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim

THE KANGAROO DIGGINGS

to be a district where publicans' licenses may be specially granted.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described as a Common, that is to say:—

**AVENEL COMMON.**—One thousand two hundred and seventy acres, more or less, county of Delatite, parish of Avenel, being the unappropriated Crown land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.: Commencing at the north-east angle of the town of Avenel; thence by a line, allotments 28, 27, 20, 19, 18 of section G, a line, and allotment 11, bearing N. 0° 10' W. to the south-eastern side of the North-Eastern Railway; thence north-easterly by that railway one hundred and fifteen chains; thence by a line bearing S. 31° E. to the north-western side of the Sydney road; thence south-westerly by that road to the eastern boundary of the aforesaid town; and thence northerly by that boundary to the point of commencement.—(77.1.2218.)

**WHEREAS** by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that the Governor might make and proclaim reserves for the preservation and growth of timber, and might from time to time, after one month's notice should be given in the *Government Gazette*, alter and revoke any such proclamation, and the Board of Land and Works might issue licenses to cut timber upon such reserve or any part thereof on such terms and conditions, and subject to the payment of such license fee, as should from time to time be approved of by the Governor and be set forth in such license: And whereas by a proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony bearing date the seventeenth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, a certain area was proclaimed a reserve for the preservation and growth of timber under the designation of the Victoria State Forest: And whereas it is expedient to diminish the said reserve: Now, therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, do hereby alter the proclamation hereinbefore mentioned, and do, with the advice aforesaid, diminish the area of the reserve described in such proclamation for the preservation and growth of timber by deducting therefrom the portion comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, that is to say:—

The area of the Victoria State Forest, proclaimed by Order of the 17th March 1873, is hereby diminished by deducting therefrom the portion of land hereinafter described, viz.:—Twenty-one acres two roods twenty-six perches, county of Anglesey, parish of Nar-be-thong, being allotment 26.—(N.96.) (77.D.2423.)

**SHIRE OF ECHUCA.**

**REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE TALLYGAROOPOONA COMMON WITHIN THE SHIRE OF ECHUCA.**

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council to frame regulations for the management of commons, and in pursuance of the provisions of chapter xiii. of the regulations made under the said Act by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of May 1873, the Council of the Shire of Echuca, as managers of the Tallygaroopna Common, submit to the Board of Land and Works for approval the following regulations, viz.:—

1st. In the construction and for the purposes of these regulations the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules; the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep; the word "farmer" shall mean a person who resides on and uses for the purpose of agriculture or dairying land held by that person, either in fee or under lease or license issued under *The Land Act 1862*, *The Amending Land Act 1865*, or *The Land Act 1869*.

2nd. Chapter xiii. of the regulations made under *The Land Act 1869*, by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of May 1873, is hereby adopted in so far as its provisions can apply to commons proclaimed under the said Act.

3rd. The fees for depasturing shall, in all cases, be payable quarterly in advance on the first days of January, April, July, and October in each year, and so on in proportion for any less period not under one month; and all cattle remaining on the above-named common seven days after the period for which payment has been made, may be impounded without notice.

4th. The fees to be paid for depasturing on the above-named common shall be as follows:—For every cow, heifer, bullock, or steer, at the rate of four shillings per annum; for every mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, or mule, at the rate of five shillings per annum; for every sheep at the rate of two shillings per annum.

5th. No person shall be allowed to transfer his or her right of commonage.

6th. No entire horse, bull, or ram shall be allowed to run on the above-named common.

7th. All sheep depasturing on the above-named common must be tended by and in charge of a shepherd.

8th. Persons depasturing sheep shall be responsible for the same being kept on such portion of the common as the managers may from time to time set apart for their use; and sheep trespassing on any other part of the common may be impounded.

9th. At the time of depasturing cattle, the owners thereof shall hand to the herdsman a memorandum, in writing, setting forth the extent of the land in their occupation, the number of acres of such land under cultivation, and specifying also the number, brands, and description of the cattle depastured.

10th. Cattle shall not be taken off the above-named common without notice to the herdsman from the owners thereof, except in cases where they may be frequently required, when the managers may, if they think proper, grant permission to the owners to remove and replace the same at pleasure, in a quiet manner, so as not to interfere with or disturb other stock unnecessarily, but the herdsman shall not be considered to have any supervision whatsoever over such cattle.

11th. Any person having right of commonage, or the managers of any neighboring common, may register with the herdsman of any common the description and brands of any missing cattle in a book to be kept for that purpose, upon payment of a fee of One shilling for every head of cattle so registered, and such cattle, if found on such common, shall not be impounded until notice has been given to the owners

or person registering, who shall be required to remove the same within fourteen days from such notice being given, otherwise they shall be impounded.

12th. Cattle becoming diseased, after being placed on the above-named common, shall be removed within twenty-four hours after notice by the herdsman to the owner thereof; and in case such cattle be not removed within the time specified, the same shall be removed or destroyed at the expense of the owner. No dead cattle shall remain on the common; should such not be removed within twelve hours after notice has been given to the owner thereof, they shall be removed at the owner's expense.

13th. Managers shall not be responsible for any cattle placed on the common.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

### VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.—COMMUNICATION WITH THE GUARD IN TRAINS.

**THE** Board of Land and Works, by virtue of the powers and authorities vested in it by *The Public Works Statute* 1865, doth hereby make the following Bye-law, for facilitating train communication from a passenger to the guard in any case arising during a journey where such communication is absolutely necessary for the safety of life or property:—

1. In the roof of each carriage compartment fitted with the signal apparatus is a pendant cord or chain, which, on being pulled, will intimate to the guard that there is danger, and that the train is to stop.

2. Any person wilfully or frivolously stopping a train by the above means, or breaking, obstructing, or damaging the communication, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

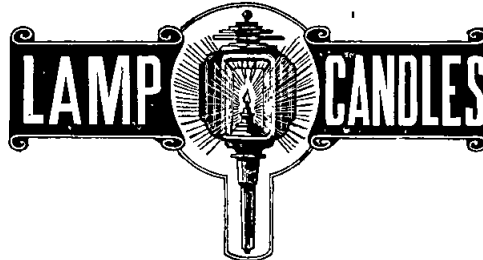

## BOROUGH OF WANGARATTA.

## BYE-LAW No. 8.

*Bye-law making a Rate for Water Supply purposes.*

THE Council of the Borough of Wangaratta doth hereby, pursuant to, and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by "The Local Government Bodies Loan Act 1872," make the following rate from the date hereof upon all lands and tenements within the water supply district, that is to say:—

1. The bye-law heretofore made relating hereto shall be, and the same is hereby repealed, except as to anything done or committed, or the recovery of any rates due and payable thereunder.

2. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes:—

On every house or tenement of the annual value of £20 and under, the annual sum of One pound. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £20, the annual sum of Five pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.

Warehouses and wholesale stores, not being domiciles or used in retail business, the annual sum of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.

Livery and coach horse stables and other premises where horses are kept shall use meter, or in addition to the foregoing scale shall pay Four shillings for each and every stall per annum.

In hotels one stall shall be allowed for every £50 annual value, and for every additional stall (except where the supply shall be taken by meter) the sum of Four shillings per annum shall be paid.

For water troughs One pound each per annum shall be paid.

For water supplied at stand-pipes, Sixpence per load, not exceeding 100 gallons, shall be paid.

For water supplied by measure, Two shillings per 1000 gallons shall be paid.

3. All persons using or requiring a supply of water for other than domestic purposes must consume by meter and shall provide such meter of approved gauge at their own expense, and, in the event of the rate per meter not amounting to the rate as per valuation, the latter must in every instance be paid.

4. The keys of all meters in use within the water supply district shall be in the custody of the council, or such officer or servant as they may appoint.

5. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

6. Water-closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

7. Before any person shall affix any service pipe of the council, or any service pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the council, he shall obtain from the council a license in that behalf to execute such work; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

8. Before any such license shall be granted by the council, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the council that he is a competent plumber, and pay the sum of One pound as the fee for such license, and shall furnish an approved security to the council in the sum of Thirty pounds sterling to provide for any damage he may do, cause, or allow to be done to the property of the council; and the council shall have power to cancel such license at any time.

9. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service pipe, or branch service pipe, with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding

Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the council.

10. No person but an officer or servant of the council, duly authorized in that behalf, shall be allowed to shut off and turn on water in the main pipes of the council, when required for the purpose of affixing service pipes thereto.

11. In the construction of this bye-law, the word council shall mean the Borough Council of Wangaratta.

12. The foregoing bye-law was made and passed by the Council of the Borough of Wangaratta the 13th day of June A.D. 1877, confirmed on the 8th day of August 1877.
