VICTORIAN RAILWAYS. — LIGHTERAGE AT WILLIAMSTOWN PIER AND BREAKWATER.

THE Board of Land and Works, by virtue of the powers and authorities vested in them by *The Public Works Statute* 1865, do hereby make the following Bye-law for fixing the Amount of Tolls to be paid by lighters, steamers, or other craft coastwise or foreign, lying alongside vessels moored at the Williamstown Pier or Breakwater for the purpose of receiving or discharging cargo from or into the said vessels:—

In addition to the charges leviable by the Bye-laws of the Board of Land and Works, dated 29th April 1864 and the 16th August 1876, there shall be leviable 6d. per bale upon leather, rabbit-skins, scrolls, pelts, basils, or sheepskins loaded into ships at the Pier or discharged therefrom, by means of lighters, steamers, or other craft coastwise or foreign.

There are only 9 feet 6 inches at high water at the present time, and he does not consider it safe for sailing vessels drawing more than 8 feet 6 inches.

SOUTH AUSTRALIA.—SAILING DIRECTIONS FOR THE MOUTH OF
THE RIVER MURRAY.

[Bearings are magnetic. Variation 5° 30' east.]

THE following Sailing Directions are published for the information of masters and pilots of vessels navigating the entrance to the River Murray.

THE SEA MOUTH.

The sea mouth of the Murray may be recognized by Barker's Knoll, about 70 feet high, the first bare sandhill of any elevation or extent to the eastward of the high land of Encounter Bay.

This sandhill, ever changing in form and appearance, according to the prevailing winds, is receding to the eastward, and forms the eastern side of the entrance to the Murray, the western side being the termination of the low sand flats of Sir Richard's Peninsula.

SAND BANKS.

Nation Bank, an extensive one, nearly surrounding Barker's Knoll, and running out about 900 feet in a westerly direction from the base of Barker's Knoll, forms the eastern limit of the channel; on the western shore Pullen Spit forms the western boundary of the channel.

THE BAR.

By a recent survey the least depths of water on the bar were found to be from 7 to 9 feet at low water springs. It is generally considered that the channel will be deeper and more direct in the winter months than in summer.

The bar is composed of sand covered with seaweed. Inside the bar the soundings vary in depth considerably, but all places between Goolwa and the mouth afford plenty of water for all vessels that can pass the bar.

NEW BUOY.

A new cheese-shaped buoy, painted red, has been placed on the above-named tongue of sand, and is moored in 9 feet of water at low water, and will soon be recognized after bringing the last-named beacons in line.

FLAGSTAFF AND SEMAPHORE.

A large flagstaff has been erected on Mundoo Island, from which the tidal and other signals will be made.

The semaphore arm affixed to the lower mast of the flagstaff is intended to guide vessels into and out of the Murray over the bar, and will be worked by the signalman thus:—

The arm showing to the eastward means port the helm, or steer in the direction indicated;

When lowered means steady;

When showing to westward means starboard the helm, or steer in the direction indicated.

Any shipmaster paying attention to the above signals can hardly make a mistake.

DIRECTIONS.

The following directions are printed by the Hydrographic Office:—

"Masters of vessels having a limited knowledge of Encounter Bay will be only acting prudently if they avail themselves of the services of the Assistant Harbor-master, or any other duly qualified pilot stationed at Victor Harbor to guide them through the entrance. The presence of an officer properly qualified for this duty, who is directed to afford every information respecting the Murray, will enable masters to acquire the necessary experience to enable them to conduct their own vessels in future.

"In the event of a vessel arriving off the sea mouth of the Murray River, and finding the surf too heavy for her to attempt the bar, she is recommended to proceed to Victor Harbor, in which place she may safely wait for a favorable opportunity to cross the bar, which is not likely to occur whilst the sea breaks heavily on Seal Rock, as by this a fair estimate may be formed of the state of the bar.

"No sailing vessel should at any time attempt the passage with a scant or light wind, unless it be quite smooth on the bar.

TIDES.

"The ebb stream runs out of the mouth from 3½ to 4½ knots. This strong set opposing the ocean swell causes heavy rollers

in bad weather to break with great violence outside the bar. The flood which rarely runs longer than three hours does not often attain a greater velocity than two knots. During neaps the tides are irregular, the sea breeze which generally sets in at about noon often bringing in the flood. Westerly gales, as usual on all parts of this coast, bring in the highest tides."

Lieut. Goalen, R.N., who has recently surveyed the bar and the mouth of the Murray reports that from September to March the high tide is in the morning or night. From March to September the high tide is in the afternoon or day time, except for three or four neap tide days. It is high water on the bar within two hours of time of high water full and change every day, or from 11 o'clock when the moon is ten or twenty-six days old to 3 o'clock when twenty or seven days old respectively.

High water full and change Murray mouth bar 0h. 50m.

Ordinary springs rise 3 to 4½ feet; ordinary neaps rise 2 to 3 feet; high springs rise 6 feet.

DIRECTIONS TO MASTERS OR PILOTS OF VESSELS.

Masters or pilots of vessels, having taken all the requisite precautions, if at all acquainted with the entrance, should steer towards it, but before shoaling the water to less than five (5) fathoms they should bring the leading beacons in line; if the bar be not quite smooth they will do well to keep the vessel in this position in order to observe steadily if the rollers do not break with sufficient force to endanger the steering of the vessel.

Having satisfied themselves that the condition of the bar is safe they may steer boldly in. Great care must be taken that the signals from the semaphore are promptly followed. Having passed Barker's Knoll where the channel is somewhat narrow, keep boldly on, and leave the red buoy on the starboard hand.

RIVER BEACONS.

Beacons have been placed on the sides of the steep banks forming the channel to the Goolwa. The black beacons have round tops, and must be kept on the port hand in ascending the river; the red beacons, with lozenge-shaped heads, are to be kept on the starboard hand in proceeding up the stream, and *vice versa* in returning. The channel to the Goolwa is deep, varying from twelve (12) to twenty-four (24) feet; no difficulty can be experienced in navigating this portion of the river, if due attention be paid to the chart published by the Government and the position of the beacons, with the use of the lead.

ANCHORAGE OFF GOOLWA.

On arriving off Goolwa ample space will be found convenient to the jetty

TIDAL SIGNALS.

The following signals will be displayed from the flagstaff on vessels approaching the bar from seaward or intending to proceed to sea:—

First Quarter Flood.—Red flag at mast-head.

Half Flood.—Red flag at mast-head; ball at east yard-arm.

Last Quarter Flood.—Red flag over ball at east yard-arm.

High Water.—Red flag over ball at mast-head.

First Quarter Ebb.—Blue flag at mast-head.

Half Ebb.—Blue flag at mast-head; ball at west yard-arm.

Last Quarter Ebb.—Blue flag over ball at west yard-arm.

Low Water.—Blue flag over ball at mast-head.

As it frequently occurs, that owing to freshes and other causes, the tide rises without the stream setting over the bar from seaward, the following distinctive signals in such cases are rendered necessary, viz.:—Instead of *one* ball with the flood tide signals *two* will be used.

Masters of vessels must therefore be prepared, at these times, to enter the river without the assistance of the in-going current.

BAR DANGEROUS.

When the bar is dangerous, and should not be approached, a blue flag over a red flag will be hoisted at the mast-head. Masters of vessels should obtain all information about the channel and bar at Goolwa or from the signalman on Mundoo Island before proceeding to sea.

MARINE BOARD.

NOTICE is herewith given that the entrance to George's Bay has been beaconed, buoyed, and staked by the authority of the Hobart Town Marine Board, and the following remarks are issued for public information:—

From Cape St. Helen's to the Rocky Islets (called Elephant) off Grant's Point the shore was a considerable indentation on the eastern coast, rugged and rocky. The sand bank from

the north shore to that on the south forms the bar to the entrance of the bays, having near the centre of the outer bay two channels, the northern one only practicable for small craft. The south channel, fit only for boats, is at times practicable when the north is not; owing to the partial protection from breakers by the middle shoal during N.N.W. winds.

The entrance to the bay is by the channel between the north and middle shoals, and only offers in fair weather a navigation to small coast craft. The depth in the north channel is very uneven, 30, 20, 15, and 12 feet will be obtained by the lead in the space of 50 yards; but a course can be shaped preserving a depth over 8 feet low water spring tide over the bar.

The bar is about W.S.W. from Cape St. Helen's nearly 1 mile; the deepest part has from 8 to 10 feet at low water springs, but the highest rise of spring tide is only $3\frac{1}{2}$ feet; the depth is never more than 10 to 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet, shallow enough to break in all weather and winds from seaward. In fact the practicable navigation for vessels of any draught not over 7 feet is only safe and judicious when the bar is perfectly still, a circumstance very rare with any winds from N.N.W. round N. and E. to south.

In consequence of the detached rocks off Dora Point, the direction of the channel from the bar becomes circuitous. The end of the shoal between Dora and Clark Points has 4 feet on its extreme edge, and confines the channel between it and the western side of the Horseshoe Bank, to a width of 50 or 60 yards, with depths varying from 15 to 7 feet.

For crossing the bar keep the two beacons erected at Granite Rock in one.

For entering the channel between Dora and Clark Points pass between a large white buoy off Dora Rocks and stakes placed on the western edge of the south shoal and a stake placed on the northern point of the Horseshoe Bank, leaving a small white buoy on another rocky patch between Dora and Clark Points S.W. by W. 1 cable from the large buoy on the starboard side.

The channel is further marked by stakes on the edge of the banks of the channel leading into George's Bay; and by passing those colored white on the starboard side and the black on the port, keeping as near mid-channel as possible, a depth of from 15 to 30 feet of water will be found.

The beacons, buoys, and stakes to mark the entrance to the bays and channels into George's Bay have been erected by Captain Edward Lucas at the suggestion and authority of the Hobart Town Marine Board.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1859* it was amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained the Governor might by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act; Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live Red Gum timber from the Crown lands hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

THE GUNBOWER STATE FOREST described in a Proclamation bearing date the twelfth day of January 1874.

THE MURRABIT TIMBER RESERVE described in a Proclamation bearing date the sixth day of March 1877.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this third day of September in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, and in the forty-first year of Her Majesty's reign.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE DRYSDALE
COMMON AND OF THE PORTARLINGTON TOWN COMMON,
SITUATED WITHIN THE SHIRE OF BELLARINE.**

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council to frame regulations for the management of commons, and, in pursuance of the provisions of Chapter XIII. of the Regulations made under the said Act by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of May 1873, the council of the Shire of Bellarine, as managers of the Drysdale Common and the Portarlington Town Common, submit to the Board of Land and Works for approval the following regulations for the management of such commons.

1. Ratepayers in the shire, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within five miles of either of the above-named commons, may respectively depasture on the common nearest to their residences: four head of large cattle or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle.

A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on such common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. That no person be permitted to graze more than four goats on the common.

3. That the fees to be paid for depasturing be as follows, and be paid in advance:—

Horses, ten shillings per annum.

Foals, ten shillings per annum.

Horned cattle, four shillings per annum.

Calves or young cattle under 12 months old, four shillings per annum.

Goats, four shillings per annum.

4. The depasturing of sheep upon these commons shall be restricted to such portions thereof respectively as may from time to time be fixed by the managers, and for each sheep depasturing thereon there shall be paid a fee of eight shillings per annum.

5. No pigs to be permitted to run on the common or be depastured thereon.

6. The year to commence at the beginning of the quarter during which the cattle are entered.

7. The quarters to commence on the 1st of January, the 1st of April, the 1st of July, and the 1st of October.

8. That the managers shall appoint times and places for the registering and branding of cattle, and shall give notice thereof by placard at the shire pound, at the branding yard, and at the office of the shire council, and shall, by their herdsman, attend at such times and places for the purposes aforesaid; and all persons desirous of depasturing cattle shall be in attendance, with their cattle, at the time and place appointed for the purpose of assisting to brand the same, and shall pay the prescribed fees for such cattle before the same shall be branded.

9. That all cattle found upon the commons not registered and without the commons brand shall be deemed to be trespassing thereon, and shall be forthwith impounded; and all sheep, unless on such portions of the said commons as may be

fixed by the managers as aforesaid, and pigs found on the commons shall be forthwith impounded, or the owners of such cattle, sheep, or pigs may be proceeded against by summons.

10. That no bull or entire horse shall be depastured on the commons without the sanction of the managers.

11. That the managers shall not be responsible for any loss or injury of or to any cattle depasturing on the commons.

12. That the managers may destroy any goats found upon the commons unless such goats are registered and branded with the commons brand, and unless the fees for the depasturing such goats be duly paid.

13. That every person offending against any regulations for the management of these commons shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

BYE-LAW No. 42.

A Bye-law of the Shire of Colac, made under section 16 of "The Abattoirs Statute," and numbered 42, for regulating the issue of slaughtering licenses, and the conditions on which such licenses are issued, and for fixing penalties.

THE sum to be paid to the shire fund for a slaughtering license within the Shire of Colac shall be the sum of One pound for each license.

The conditions on which such license shall be granted are as follows:—

I. The licensee shall only be allowed to slaughter cattle at the particular place mentioned in such license.

II. The slaughter-yard licensed shall be at all times open to the inspection of the inspector of nuisances of the Shire of Colac, or any other person authorized by him or by the secretary of the shire.

III. All slaughter-yards shall be kept in a cleanly and proper state, and all filth shall be removed once in every twenty-four hours.

IV. All slaughter-yards shall be provided with a sufficient supply of water.

Any person guilty of any breach of the provisions of the foregoing bye-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds and not less than Ten shillings.
