PUBLIC HIGHWAYS IN THE SHIRE OF JIKA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette* to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and such land should thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Jika has requested that certain streets, lanes, and roads within the said shire be so declared public highways: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the lands acquired or used for the streets, lanes, and roads hereinafter named and described and situate in the Shire of Jika to be respectively public highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz. :-

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.—STORE REGULATIONS.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the following alterations in respect to the Victorian Railways Store Regulations.

JOHN WOODS,

THE Regulations for the management of the Stores Branch of the Victorian Railways, published in the *Government Gazette* under date of the 12th October 1863, together with the amended regulations referring to clauses 17, 18, and 19 of the same, and bearing date the 8th February 1871, are hereby rescinded, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—

1. The Railway Department shall as heretofore be exempt from the Stores and Transport Regulations, in respect of all supplies for Victorian Railways, the purchase of which shall, as hereinafter specified, be under the control of the heads of the various branches, and in all matters relating thereto they shall be directly responsible to the Commissioner of Railways, and to the Secretary acting under the authority of the Commissioner of Railways.

2. The Board of Land and Works shall open and consider all tenders for supplies, and enter into contracts for the same, in accordance with these Regulations.

3. The Secretary shall cause lists to be printed as per Form A whenever contracts are required for supplies, showing a classified schedule, and correct description by reference to samples or otherwise, of the several articles of probable requirement, and also of the quantities at which the contract rates are to be tendered for per ton, per gross, &c., &c., with blank columns for the insertion of the rates and amounts.

4. All orders on contractors or others for supplies shall be on the forms provided (Form B), and shall be made only on the authority of the heads of branches, or such officers as they may appoint, a list of whom shall be furnished to the Accountant.

5. All orders issued by heads of branches or other officers for articles in stock shall be forwarded direct to the Store Clerk, Williamstown, upon the form provided (Form C).

6. No article shall be ordered unless required for immediate use, or where it shall be deemed necessary to keep a small stock on hand to meet urgent cases.

7. Articles not specified in contract schedules may be ordered by heads of branches from such persons as they may deem fit, due care being taken in such cases that the market price of such articles is not exceeded.

8. Contractors will be required to furnish with each delivery of stores a complete bill of parcels in duplicate, together with the departmental order for the goods; and in no case will receipts for goods be given, either as to quantity or value, until the said bills of parcels are furnished.

9. Claims by contractors and others for goods sold and delivered under these regulations shall be made on the usual L. 2 Account Forms of the department. (Form D.) These claims are to be rendered to the Accountant, who will, when satisfied of their correctness, certify to the same, and after their certification by the Head of the Branch ordering the goods, and the Secretary, forward them to the Treasury for payment.

10. Each officer receiving goods shall give a receipt for the same in the manner hereinafter provided. (*Vide Instructions to Officers.*)

11. The Accountant shall prepare, whenever he may deem necessary, or whenever instructed by the Commissioner of Railways, or the Secretary, an inventory of all Stores, unserviceable or not required, which may be on hand, and forward the same to the Secretary for the information of the Commissioner of Railways, who shall take such steps for the survey and disposal of the same as he may think fit.

12. Stock of all perishable articles shall be taken annually at the 31st December, and of all other articles at least once in every two years, and a return thereof, showing the quantity and value of each article on hand shall be prepared and certified by the Accountant, and submitted through the Secretary for the inspection and information of the Commissioner.

13. As often as may be necessary, the Accountant shall average the several prices of any one article to a uniform rate; provided always that such rate, when computed on the total stock of that article, shall represent the total cost of the same.

14. All stores in stock (except fuel) at the various locomotive depôts shall be under the control of the Accountant, and a daily return of the issues shall be furnished to him on the form provided (Form E) by the person in charge at each depôt.

15. No stores whatever are to be lent, sold, or exchanged, except on the authority in writing of the Commissioner.

16. The Accountant shall be held responsible only for such stores as are in or may be delivered into Store, and not for any stores delivered direct to Heads of Branches, or those whom they may appoint to receive the same.

17. It will be the duty of the Accountant, or such officer (acting under his instructions) as he may appoint, to inspect, as often as he may deem necessary, the stores under his control at Williamstown and elsewhere, making such inspections without previous notice, checking the stock of certain items, by ascertaining the weight, tale, or measurement thereof, and generally taking measures to ensure the correct record of receipts and issues.

18. The Accountant shall exercise strict supervision over all stores in stock, and accounts, as well as returns, relating to the same; and report generally upon any irregularities, defects, or omissions in the working of these regulations.

19. Instructions for the guidance of contractors and officers of the department will be found in the Appendix to these Regulations, and all such are enjoined to make themselves acquainted with, and pay strict attention to, the same.

General Ironmongery, &c.

The whole of the articles in the following Schedule, ordered by the Department of Railways, are to be in accordance with the samples and specifications, and in every respect to be of the very best description, quality, and manufacture—subject to the approval of the Engineer-in-Chief, the Traffic Manager, and the General Overseer of Locomotives. The goods will be subject to the examination and test of an Inspecting Officer appointed by any of the above. The Government will not be bound to issue Orders upon the Contractor for all the Articles enumerated in this Schedule, but only for such Articles and such quantities of those Articles as the Government may order from the Contractor from time to time; neither will the Government be bound to take from the Contractor any larger supply of any of the Articles than the orders which have been issued during the period of contract, viz. from 1st July 1877 to 31st December 1878; nor will they be bound to take any of the Articles enumerated in the Schedule for which orders have not been issued. Should the Government require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in this Schedule, or should Articles of a particular manufacture be ordered, the Contractor will be bound to supply the same at the Contract rate.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

Instructions for the guidance of Officers respecting the ordering and supply of Stores, &c., for the use of the Department.

1. All requisitions for stores, &c., must be made upon the proper printed form provided for each branch, which, before being forwarded to the contractor or the store, as the case may be, must be signed by the head of the branch ordering, or by such officer as he may appoint.

2. A complete list of the articles at present in stock for the use of each branch will be furnished for the information of officers authorized to requisition for the same, and all articles required shall be taken from those in stock, if suitable, until such stock is exhausted.

3. Such articles as are not kept in stock at the Railway Store will be furnished direct by the contractors, accompanied by the requisition and invoice in duplicate.

4. It will be the duty of the officer receiving the goods to see that both they and the invoiced quantities agree with the order; he will make any corrections necessary on the invoices as to quantity, weight, or description, but must not concern himself with the cash extensions, which will be duly checked and verified in the Accountant's office. When articles are purchased outside the contracts, he will have to report as to whether the rates are fair and reasonable.

When alterations are made by him on the invoices, in consequence of errors or omissions in quantities, weights, or descriptions, the reasons for such alterations must be given in a footnote.

5. When invoices have been dealt with as above, they are to be received by the officer receiving the goods, and sent to the Accountant, accompanied by the requisition.

6. When articles are rejected, through being of inferior quality, or from whatever cause, they must be immediately returned to the contractor, and a rejection notice in Form F. sent to him through the head of the branch. A press copy of the rejection notice must be kept by the officer rejecting.

7. Any delay in receiving the goods ordered, or irregularity on the part of the contractor, must be reported by the officer receiving the same, to the head of his branch.

8. Officers requiring stores will be held responsible for requisitions being forwarded in time, so that the department may not suffer through their negligence.

9. When goods are received by officers from store, the receipt for the same is to be given at the foot of the order in the place set apart for that purpose, and the order receipted, forwarded at once to the Accountant.

10. For any further information on the subject of these instructions, apply without delay to the Accountant.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

Instructions for the guidance of Contractors and others supplying Stores, &c., to the Railway Department.

1. All requisitions for Stores will be made upon the printed forms of the department, and no goods are to be supplied unless so ordered.

2. The requisition will state where, and to whom, the goods are to be sent, and such order must be satisfied, if possible, within 48 hours as per conditions of contract. (Clause 8.)

3. In case the Contractor shall be unable to comply with the requisition within the specified time, he shall give immediate notice of such inability to the Officer ordering.

4. The goods, when forwarded by the Contractor, must be accompanied by the requisition and invoice, in duplicate, and the certified duplicate invoice only will be returned to the Contractor duly receipted, to enable him to make out his monthly account.

5. All goods must be brought to the Spencer-street Station, from whence they will be carried free of charge to Contractors to places upon the lines of railway, but delivery of the goods will not be deemed to have been taken by the department until they have arrived at their destination as indicated on the requisition.

6. When goods are rejected by the Department from any cause whatever, Contractors will be required to pay the return Railway freights from any part of the line to which they may have been forwarded.

7. All goods supplied upon a Construction order (red) for places other than Melbourne, must be accompanied by the Engineer-in-Chief's consignment note as heretofore.

8. All invoices must be rendered on the forms supplied by the department, which can be had on application to the Accountant.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to the Heathcote Common the Crown lands hereinafter described, that is to say:—

SHIRE OF WINCHELSEA.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE WINCHELSEA UNITED TOWN AND FARMERS' COMMON, THE MODEWARRE FARMERS' COMMON, THE WURDIE BOLUC FARMERS' COMMON, AND THE LORNE COMMON, WITHIN THE SHIRE OF WINCHELSEA.

These Regulations are in lieu of the regulations approved of by the Governor in Council on the 10th October 1870, which are hereby repealed.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council to frame regulations for the management of commons, and, in pursuance of the provisions of Chapter XIII. of the Regulations made under the said Act by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of May 1873, the Council of the Shire of Winchelsea, as managers of the Winchelsea United Town and Farmers' Common, the Modewarre Farmers' Common, the Wurdie Boluc Farmers' Common, and the Lorne Common, within the said shire, submit to the Board of Land and Works for approval the following regulations for the management of the said commons respectively.

1. The managers shall appoint a secretary to keep the books and accounts relating to the said commons, and to make entries of the proceedings of the managers in such books under their superintendence, and shall appoint a herdsman to each common, who shall be responsible for the efficient carrying out of the regulations for the management of such common, and shall conform to any special instructions issued to him by the managers relative to the registration, custody, and delivery to the owners, of the cattle thereon, and to the prevention of trespass thereon of animals for which no commonage fees have been paid, or which are not allowed to depasture as hereinafter provided. Such herdsman shall be remunerated for his services out of the fund derived from the commonage fees.

2. The managers shall at any time, if they deem fit, have power to cancel the appointment of the secretary or of any herdsman, and remove him from such his office. If any herdsman desire to resign his office, he must give at least one month's notice in writing thereof to the managers.

3. The managers shall, from time to time, make rules for the time and manner of reception of cattle on the commons, for their removal, and for periodical mustering and branding; they shall also issue such orders and instructions to the herdsman as they think fit and necessary for the proper management and care of the cattle depastured on the common under his charge; every such order and instruction shall be given in writing, and shall be signed by the secretary.

4. All householders and farmers shall be respectively entitled to depasture on any one of the said commons, within five miles of their places of residence, four (4) head of large cattle (two horses, or four head of small cattle, to be equivalent to four head of horned cattle). In addition to the above, any ratepayer in the shire having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him will be allowed to depasture on such common one head of large cattle for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him. In no case shall any person be allowed to depasture more than six (6) head of large cattle on any of the said commons; and every person entitled to commonage must be the *bona fide* owner of every animal depastured by him on any common in the shire; and no person will be allowed to transfer any animal during the currency of each half-year.

5. All fees must be paid half-yearly in advance to the herdsman of the common; licenses to date from the first day of April and the first day of October in each year. The depasturing fees on each of the commons shall be as follows:—

	Per each half-year.
For every horse or mare	Five (5) shillings.
For every head of horned cattle	Three (3) shillings.
For every goat or sheep	Two (2) shillings.

No fee will be charged for foals or calves under three months old if running with their mothers.

6. No bulls nor entire horses over the age of nine months will be allowed on any common without the written sanction of the managers. And sheep shall be allowed to depasture on such portions only of the said commons as may be set apart for that purpose by the managers.

7. The managers shall cause their books to be kept in the forms prescribed by the Governor in Council the 26th day of May 1873; and in such books shall be recorded the descriptions and brands of the cattle depastured on the commons, the moneys received for depasturing fees, the payments made from the common's fund, and the date of such payments; and the managers shall, by their herdsman, give receipts in proper form for the fees paid for all cattle depastured or intended to be depastured on the common under the charge of such herdsman.

8. Before the herdsman of any common enters upon his duties he shall furnish security to the satisfaction of the managers in the sum of Twenty pounds (£20) sterling.

9. The herdsman on receipt of any cattle into his charge, and after payment to him of the proper amount of depasturing

fees thereon, shall, with the assistance of the owner or other person in charge, immediately pitch-brand such cattle in a plain and conspicuous manner with the common brand; and such brand shall be renewed whenever necessary, so as to become plainly legible during the whole period that such cattle are depasturing on the common.

10. The herdsman shall impound all cattle trespassing on the common whose owners are not known, travelling cattle excepted, provided that notice has been given in accordance with the Act No. 370 (Diseases of Animals).

11. No cattle duly registered in the books of the managers shall be removed from any common without and unless notice be first given to the herdsman, who shall obtain a receipt for the same from the owner.

12. The herdsman shall, on any cattle straying or being otherwise removed without the owner's consent, notify such owner thereof within ten days; and in default of giving notice within that time, if the cattle should be lost, the herdsman shall be held responsible for the loss, to be computed at a rate not exceeding Two pounds sterling per head for horses, and Two pounds sterling per head for horned cattle; such amount, when determined, shall be deducted from the herdsman's salary.

13. The herdsman of each common shall be in attendance at a place to be named on the seven days immediately preceding the first day of each half-year, for the purpose of registering cattle intended to be depastured, and to receive the fees thereon; due notice of such attendance and of the time and place thereof shall be given by the managers.

14. Every person offending against any regulation for the management of the said commons respectively shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

15. The managers of the said commons may sue for and recover any fees for depasturing stock on such common, or any penalty for breach of any regulation for management of such common.

16. The herdsman of each common shall take the necessary steps for the effectual destruction of all thistles growing upon the respective commons, the expenses incurred in such work to be defrayed out of the common's fund; provided that express authority for such expenditure be first obtained from the managers.

17. The herdsman shall pay over all moneys received by him in respect of depasturing fees to the treasurer of the shire, and deliver therewith a statement of the particulars of such moneys so received.

18. The managers shall, within one month after the termination of each year, publish in a newspaper circulating in the district wherein the commons are situated a certified account of the receipts and expenditure for the year, and forward copy thereof to the Board of Land and Works.

19. The herdsman shall report immediately on the indication of any contagious disease in any cattle on the common under his charge to the managers or the secretary, and shall give notice to the owner of such cattle. The managers shall at once take precautionary measures to remove such cattle from the common; but they shall not be responsible for any loss the owners of such diseased cattle may sustain.

The above Rules and Regulations were made and approved by the Council of the Shire of Winchelsea this first day of June 1877.

DISPOSITION OF CHURCH LANDS ALLOWED.

A STATEMENT of Trusts having been submitted by the head or authorized representative of the denomination of The Presbyterian Church of Victoria, under the provisions of the Act to provide for the Abolition of State Aid to Religion, for allowance by the Governor, the same was allowed by him on the tenth day of September 1877, and the following is the form in which such statement of trusts has been allowed:—

Description of land.—One acre, county of Bourke, municipal district of St. Kilda, parish of Prahran: Commencing at a point on the east side of Chapel street, being the south-west angle of the Church of England Reserve; bounded thence by that reserve bearing east four chains; thence by the Public Recreation Reserve bearing south two chains fifty links; thence by a line bearing west four chains; and thence by Chapel street aforesaid bearing north two chains fifty links to the point of commencement.

Names of trustees.—Sir James McCulloch, Knight, John Thomas Clarke, David Ross, Alexander McAdam, and John Charles Lloyd.

Power of disposition.—Power to mortgage for Two thousand pounds, also with the consent of the Moderator for the time being of the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church of Victoria as directed by the said Assembly to mortgage for further or other sums, and to sell, exchange, or lease.

Purposes to which proceeds of disposition are to be applied.—To pay such proceeds to the treasurer for the time being of The Presbyterian Church of Victoria, to be by him applied, first, in payment of all incidental costs, and then to apply or cause to be applied the residue of such proceeds towards the erection of a church, manse, and other buildings as may from time to time be required.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE TOOLAMBA CEMETERY.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is open.

2. Any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon the payment of the proper charges, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the separate use of such person or persons, or his or their representatives.

3. Application of such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the party applying for such permission, on payment of the proper charges.

4. The charge will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, on a certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence, proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

5. Orders for interment to be given between the hours of Ten a.m. and Three p.m. on the previous day.

6. The name, age, late place of residence, and date of death of the deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.

7. Unless otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. in the month of September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other four months, except Sundays, when the only hours for funerals will be from Eleven a.m. to Four p.m. throughout the year.

8. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and in proper condition at the expense of the owners.

9. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

10. The position of all graves to be determined by the trustees.

11. All graves must be sunk to a depth of not less than 6 feet.

12. A drawing of every stone, font, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are to determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument, according to description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan of ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner.

13. A plan of the cemetery showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office of the trustees and may be inspected, and a register of grants is kept by the secretary.

14. The keeper has orders to turn out or to take into custody (as the case may require) any person who shall behave indecorously or commit any trespass or injury to trees, flowers, or other erections, or otherwise infringe the Act of the council relating to the cemetery or the regulations for the protection of the same, and such persons will be proceeded against according to law.

15. The trustees reserve the right to make any alteration from time to time, in these charges and regulations.

THE accompanying Notice, which has been extracted from the *Queensland Government Gazette*, is published for general information.

CORAL SEA AND WESTERN PACIFIC.

From information obtained from Mr. Eury, master of the whaling barque *Adventurer*, who has been cruising in the Western Pacific for many years, and also from the circumstances attending the recent loss of the barque *Banda*, it would appear that the eastern edge of the Bampton Reef extends considerably further to the eastward than it is shown on the chart, probably nearly to long. 159° E., and also that in the neighborhood of that reef the current, though slack in the summer, runs W.N.W. during the winter at a rate of from 1 to 1½ knots.

Captain Eury also reports a 5-fathom rocky patch in lat. 20° 20' S. and long. 159° E.

That New Shoal, the position of which is stated as doubtful, but is placed on the charts in 20° 55' S., 160° 28' E., does not exist.

That a shoal (probably part of Kelso Bank), with 11 fathoms, exists in lat. 24° 6' S., long. 159° 45' E.

That Tamar Reef, supposed to be in lat. 21° 21' S., and long. 161° 36', and which Captain Denham, in H.M.S. *Herald*, could not find, does not exist.

That N.N.E. from Walpole Island—the land just dipping from the masthead—there is a coral shoal 1 mile in diameter, with 7 fathoms of water over it.

That Onaseuse or Hunter Island does not exist in the doubtful position assigned to it on the chart. As this island is reported to be volcanic and well peopled and cultivated, it has possibly been placed on the chart, in east instead of west longitude, and is the same as Ninifu or Good Hope Island, which corresponds with this description.

Also, that on the equator, in long. 146° E., there are two small islands not marked down on the charts. Captain Eury reports them as being each half-a-mile in extent and connected by a reef. They are uninhabited and covered with low trees.

Mr. Powell, of the ketch *Star of the East*, reports that the position of Greenwich Island, as shown on the chart, is 1° too far to the westward.

It is, he says, composed of a number of islands enclosed in a coral reef of a somewhat triangular form, with its base to the northward. The group is about 14 miles in extent from north to south and 8 or 9 miles from east to west. The islands are on the west side and at the southern elbow of the reef. Only two are inhabited, both at the south-westernmost portion of the group. On one of these is a mound, about 80 feet high, formed of dead coral. At the eastern extremity of the reef is a sandbank. The native name of the group is Kapinga Malang.

INNER ROUTE TO TORRES STRAITS.

REEF, CLAREMONT ISLANDS.

MR. F. BLANCHARD, master of the Claremont Island Lightship, reports the existence of a reef lying between No. VI. and VII. Claremont Islands. He states that it is nearly a mile wide, trending to the north-east, and is dry at low-water springs. Off its western extreme is a detached coral patch, on which there is a depth of 4 feet at low water. It lies in the following position, viz.:—

Beacon, No. VII. Island	...	N.N.W.
" Heath Rocks	...	S.W. ½ S.
" No. VI.	...	S. by E.

There are also some mushroom coral patches between this rock and the shoal water to the southward.

These dangers are out of the fairway of the channel, but vessels working through, should be careful not to stand inside a line drawn between the western edge of No. VI. and VII. reefs.

MR. HUNTER, of the cutter *Pearl Hunter*, reports the existence of a reef about ¾ of a mile in length, north and south, with its north point in the following position, viz.:—

False Orford Ness	...	N. ¼ W.

He found 8 fathoms of water close to its outer side, and 6, 5, and 4½ fathoms extending from it towards the shore. Though out of the track of steamers and vessels running, it is a danger to vessels beating through that portion of the passage.

To allot the principal and drafting yards to the use of parties bringing cattle to the market for sale, in such manner as in each particular case may seem to such collector to be most convenient, and to prevent any unbroken horses or cattle from being roped within the market before Five o'clock p.m.

d. To preserve order and cleanliness within such market, and to take proceedings against any person or persons creating a riot or disturbance; or cursing, or swearing; or using any gross or indecent language, or of being guilty of gross or indecent conduct therein.

e. Notwithstanding anything herein contained as to hours during which the market shall be open, the market collector shall at all times give such facilities for the reception and delivery of stock as may in any case be actually necessary.

BYE-LAW No. 1.

To provide for the examining, comparing, and stamping weights and measures, and the fees to be paid thereon, within the "Union" formed by the Shire and Borough of Creswick.

THE copies of the standard weights and measures shall be entrusted to the custody of the inspector to the union for the time being, who shall give security to the joint councils forming the union for the proper use and safe custody of the same, as also for the due payment of all moneys received by him, and the surrender of the said weights and measures, and all other things the property of the joint councils, when he may be required to do so.

The inspector shall attend at the office of the union the first and third Mondays in every month, from Nine o'clock in the forenoon until Four o'clock in the afternoon, unless such day shall be appointed a public holiday, or that he may of necessity be absent, notice of which absence shall be posted on the door of the office; and when the said inspector is so in attendance, he shall examine, compare, and stamp, if necessary, all weights and measures which may be brought to him, and shall demand and take such fees for so doing as are mentioned in the schedule to this bye-law marked A.

The inspector shall once in six months travel the town of Creswick, and once in twelve months travel the townships of Kingston, Smeaton, Bullarook, Rocky Lead, and Eganstown, for the purpose of detecting any person or persons who may be using unjust weights and measures.

The inspector shall on or before the third day of each month make a return to the treasurer to the union of all moneys received by him during the past month, showing the several particulars for which the same were received, the number of prosecutions under the Act, and how the same were disposed of. He shall also keep a diary of the whole of the transactions under the Act.

If any person shall refuse to pay the inspector the fees for examining, comparing, and stamping any weights or measures after having requested him to do so, such person shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty shillings in addition to the amount of the fees, and which may be recovered before any two or more justices of the peace; and the inspector shall be at liberty to detain the said weights and measures until the fees are paid.
