Victorian pilots are not to pilot ships of war of either Turkey or Russia, except in Victorian waters, within three miles of the shore, or do more than pilot such ships into or out of Victorian ports or roadsteads when they are not at the time engaged in any hostile operations; but ships of war in distress may always be piloted out of immediate danger other than the danger of immediate or imminent capture.

PLACE FOR THE DISTILLATION OF SPIRITS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed by the Parliament of Victoria in the twenty-fifth year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act to consolidate and amend the Law relating to the Distillation, Rectifying, and Compounding of Spirits, to the granting a Duty upon Spirits Distilled in Victoria, and to regulate the Brewing of Beer and the Sale of Fermented and Spirituous Liquors in certain cases*, it was amongst other things enacted, that any person, except as thereafter excepted, who should carry on the business of a distiller or rectifier and compounder of spirits, or who should have in his possession, or who should make use of any still or other utensil for distilling or rectifying and compounding spirits, excepting in such place as the Governor in Council should by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* direct, should be liable to a penalty of not less than One hundred pounds nor more than Five hundred pounds: And whereas by a proclamation, under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the eleventh day of June One thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, certain premises in Sandridge were proclaimed as a place wherein the distillation of spirits might be carried on: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the proclamation of the premises in question, and to re-proclaim the same, with amended boundaries, and to re-proclaim the distillation of spirits may be carried on: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the proclamation of the premises hereinbefore referred to, and do proclaim the undermentioned place as a place wherein the distillation of spirits may be carried on, that is to say:-

Allotments Nos. 2 and 3, section 21 A, at Sandridge, parish of South Melbourne, Victoria, with a frontage of ninety-five feet running due east and west in Bay street, North Sandridge, with a depth of eighty-two and a half feet to the Esplanade, on which there is a frontage of seventy-six feet due east and west.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this seventeenth day of September in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, and in the forty-first year of Her Majesty's reign.

WHEREAS by The Local Government Act 1874 (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might from time to time make Orders, amongst other things, to constitute any part of Victoria containing rateable property capable of yielding, upon a rate not exceeding one shilling in the pound on the annual value thereof, estimated under the provisions of the said Act, the sum of Five hundred pounds, a shire; and it was also enacted that the Governor in Council might make Orders altering for the purpose of adjusting the boundaries of contemurous municipal districts, being shires, without any notice; and it was further enacted that every Order under the provisions of Part I. of the said Act should be published in the Government Gazette and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor in Council, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, signed by not less than fifty inhabitants of the part of Victoria described in such petition (being a portion of the Shire of Wimmera) each of whom possesses rateable property therein, praying that such part should be constituted a municipality by the name of the Shire of Dunmunkle: And whereas the substance and prayer of such petition have been published in the manner directed by the said Act and no counter-petition in opposition thereto has been presented: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make Orders constituting and describing a shire to be named the Shire of Dunmunkle, and defining the boundaries of the Shire of Wimmera in manner following, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF DUNMUNKLE.—Bounded by a line beginning at the intersection of the Yarrambiack Creek by the northward boundary of Kewell run; thence eastward along the boundaries of Kewell, Kirkwood, and Rich Avon runs to the Avon River; thence up the Avon and Richardson rivers to opposite the eastward boundary of allotment 192, parish of Wirchilleba; thence to the south-east angle of the said allotment; west to the River Wimmera, down the said river to the bifurcation of the Yarrambiack Creek; and down that creek to the starting point.

Wherever the line described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary-line.

THE SHIRE OF WIMMERA DIMINISHED.—Bounded by a line beginning at the most northern bend of the River Glenelg, county boundary of Lowan; thence north-westerly to the westward boundary of the colony, three miles north-east of Lake Cadmite; north along said boundary to a point sixty-six miles south of the River Murray; east to a point due north of Lake Coorong; south to that lake and around its eastern shore to the Yarrambiack Creek; up that creek to and up the Wimmera River to a point north-east from Brigg's Bluff, Grampian Range; to said Bluff and southward along the watershed of the Grampians to the head of the Glenelg River; and down this river to the starting point.

Wherever the line so described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary-line. Unless actually defined by survey, or otherwise stated, the bearings are to be taken as magnetic.

And His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby further order that the Council of the Shire of Dunmunkle hereby constituted shall consist of six members, and that such municipal district shall not be subdivided under this order.

And the Honorable James Brown Patterson, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

a petition purporting to be signed by one-fourth of the persons whose names are for the time being inscribed on the municipal roll of the United Shire of Mount Alexander has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order re-subdivide the United Shire of Mount Alexander into four several subdivisions, the boundaries whereof shall be as follow, that is to say:—

THE MOIRA AND YIELIMA STATE FOREST described in a Proclamation bearing date the 25th May 1870.

THE EORUCA NORTH TIMBER RESERVE described in a Proclamation bearing date the 21st December 1868.

THE TORRUMBERY NORTH TIMBER RESERVE described in two proclamations bearing date respectively the 14th February and the 6th November 1876.


