## ATTACK ON POLICE, KING RIVER DISTRICT.

EIGHT HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD.

WHEREAS on Saturday morning, the 26th instant, a party of four members of the police force, namely, Sergeant Kennedy, and Constables McIntyre, Scanlon, and Lonigan, who were in the King River district, were surrounded by four men who presented arms and called upon the said members of the police force to surrender: And whereas Constables Lonigan and Scanlon were shot dead, McIntyre escaped to Mansfield, and Sergeant Kennedy has not yet been heard of: Notice is hereby given that a Reward of Two hundred Pounds will be paid by the Government for such information as will lead to the apprehension of each offender.
