SHIRES OF BULN BULN AND NARRACAN CONSTITUTED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the sixteenth day of September 1878. PRESENT:

WHERAS by The Local Government Act 1874 (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to constitute any part of Victoria containing rateable property capable of yielding upon a rate not exceeding One shilling in the pound on the annual value thereof, estimated under the provisions of the said Act, the sum of Five hundred pounds,

a Shire, and it was further enacted that every Order under the provisions of Part I. of the said Act should be published in the Government Gazette, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas petitions have been presented to the Governor in Council in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, signed by not less than fifty inhabitants of the parts of Victoria respectively described in such petitions (being outlying districts and not in any shire) each of whom possess rateable property therein, praying that such parts should respectively be constituted municipalities by the names of the Shire of Bulh Buln and the Shire of Narracan: And whereas the substance and prayer of such petitions have been published in the manner directed by the said Act, and no counter-petition or petitions in opposition thereto (except as to boundaries in the case of Buln Buln) have been presented: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Excentive Council, doth hereby make Order constituting and describing a shire to be named the Shire of Buln Buln, and a shire to be named

the Shire of Narracan, and defining the boundaries of such Shires in manner following, that is to say:

Shire of Bull Bull—Commencing at a point on the boundary of the county of Mornington where it is intersected by the northern boundary of the Gippsland Railway reserve; thence southward along the said county boundary, being the east boundary of the shire of Berwick, to a point east of the south-cast angle of the parish of Cranbourne, west to a point north of the east angle of section 19, parish of Yallock; thence along the castern side of allotments 24 and 1, and the southward side of allotments 12, and 3, south and west to and around allotments 20, 28, and 26, all in the same parish, to the south-cast angle of Meikle's pre-emptive section; thence west to Western Port Bay; thence by the shore of the bay south-easterly to a point opposite the northern boundary of Hurdy Gurdy pre-emptive section, county of Mornington; thence to and by the said boundary and a line east therefrom to the cast boundary of the said county; thence north-casterly by Bear Creek and the Moe River to the intersection of the northern boundary of the Gippsland Railway reserve; thence by a line bearing true north to the south boundary of the county of Evelyn; thence by the south boundary of the county of Evelyn; thence by the south boundary of the county of Evelyn; thence by the south boundary of the county of Evelyn and the east boundary of the county of Mornington to the commencing point.

Wherever the line described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether specifically described or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary-line.

REGULATIONS TO PROVIDE FOR THE STRIPPING AND REMOVAL OF BARK FROM WATTLE-TREES ON CROWN LANDS.

- 1. Any Receiver and Paymaster, or other person duly authorized by the Governor in Council in that behalf, may from time to time grant to any applicant a license to strip and remove bark from any wattle-trees on any Crown lands specified in such license.
- 2. Every such license shall be available for the season commencing on the fifteenth day of September in any year and ending on the fifteenth day of January next following thereafter and no longer, and shall be in the form and subject to the conditions contained in the Schedules hereto.

 3. If any licensee shall strip or remove bark from any tree on any Crown lands except in accordance with the provisions of these regulations and the conditions of his license, he shall be deemed to have stripped or removed bark without a license, and, on conviction thereof under the provisions of The Land Act 1869, any license granted to him hereunder for the season during which such conviction may have been made shall, from and after the date of such conviction, become void and of no effect, nor shall any fresh license be granted to him or be of any force or effect during such season.

 4. No license shall have any force or effect except within the Survey District and during the senson for which the same shall be granted, nor shall it be of any force or effect within any reserve specially made and proclaimed under the provisions of The Land Act 1869 for the preservation and growth of wattle-trees.

 1. The license fee shall be payable in advance.
 2. This license is not transferable, and is available only for the survey district specified therein.
 3. No tree of less than five inches in diameter, when of the black or feather-leaf species, nor less than four inches when of the golden or broad-leaf species, shall be stripped of its bark. The measurement in each of the foregoing cases shall be taken at two feet from the ground.
 4. No bark shall be stripped from a tree until after the same has been felled.
 5. No tree shall be felled at a greater height than two feet from the ground.
 6. The licensee will be required to thoroughly strip the bark from the trunk and branches of every tree felled, and to complete the stripping of one tree before commencing to strip another.
 7. No tree shall be felled so as to obstruct any track.
 8. The licensee only shall strip bark under the authority of this license, and if any bark stripped by him be transported from Crown lands by any other person, such other person also shall hold a similar license.
 9. All bark stripped under the provisions of this license shall remain the property of the Crown until the same shall have been removed from Crown lands.
 10. This license shall be produced by the holder thereof when asked so to do by any Crown lands bailiff or other officer appointed to enforce the regulations under which the same is issued.
 11. This license may be transferred on payment of One shilling to the person who issued the same.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE RUSHWORTH RECREATION RESERVE.

WERGEATION RESERVE.

WE, Wolton Wigg, John Henderson Roberts, John Walter Mason, George Phillips, and George Digby Heily, the duly appointed committee of management of the land at Rushworth, namely, the Rushworth Recreation Reserve, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the above-mentioned reserve, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of The Land Act 1869.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
- No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency or regards his dress, language, or conduct.
- 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
- 4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
- 5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management nagement.
- 6. No person shall erectany dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management being first obtained.
- No person except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve shall enter any plots which may be enclosed within the reserve for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act* 1869, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding 25 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a halliff of Crown lands, or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

for each person, a sum not exceeding Two shillings and six-pence, and after the said hour of One o'clock p.m., for each person a sum not exceeding One shilling. (3.) For the third day, from Ten o'clock a.m. during the remainder of that day, for each person a sum not exceeding One shilling.

3rd. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards his dress, language, or conduct.

4th. No person shall damage in any way the improvements, buildings, yards, trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, neither shall fires be lighted therein without the consent of the committee.

5th. No person shall climb or jump over fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

6th. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority of the said committee.

7th. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the committee of management first obtained.

8th. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots which may be enclosed within the reserve for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of The Land Let 1869, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailift of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailift or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE LAND RESERVED AT LINTON FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

WE, the Council of the Shire of Grenville, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land in the township of Linton reserved for Water Supply purposes having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the above-mentioned reserve, and for the preservation of decency and good order therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of The Land Act 1869.

REGULATIONS.

The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards his dress, language, or conduct.

No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut their names on the fences, seats, or trees, or throw stones, or discharge firearms in the reserve.

No person shall interfere with, or injure in any way, the works connected with the water supply.

All goats and poultry found within the reserve may be destroyed.

No person shall put in the reserve any cattle or pigs without the written permission of the Council of the Shire of Grenville; and any person allowing cattle of any description to wander within the reserve shall be proceeded under the provisions of The Land Act 1869.

No person shall fish in the waters within the reserve without the written permission of the Council of the Shire of Grenville.

No person shall bathe in the waters within the reserve.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of The Land Act 1869, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who shall

knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

1. All the charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground is broken, or a vault re-opened.

2. On application for permission to make a wault or erect a monument in the cemetery being made to the trustees, a certificate of permission will be granted on payment of the proper fees.

3. Charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, on the certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence, proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, and that the relatives of the deceased were unable to pay the usual fees.

4. Order for interment to be given either to the sexton or to the officer of the trustees on the previous day, when a form of instruction, according to schedule A, must be filled up and given to the sexton.

5. The sexton shall dig all ordinary graves, unless otherwise specially ordered, on payment of the proper fees. Parties requiring beick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees or any two of them.

6. The time fixed for the funeral must be the time the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

7. The usual hours for the performance of the funerals shall be from 10 o'clock a.m. to 6 p.m. from September to April inclusive, and from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the other four months.

8. All vaults, monuments, graves, and gravestones must be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the

owner.

9. A plan of every monument or headstone must be submitted to the trustees for their approval.

10. All persons destroying the fences, or in any way injuring the cemetery, will be prosecuted as the law directs.

11. Every coffin in a vault must be bricked in or cemented, or covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

12. A plan of ground and a register will be kept, which may be examined on payment of the proper charges.

13. No interment shall be less than six feet in depth for adults and children over ten years of age, nor less than five feet in depth for children under ten years of age.

14. The ground will be open daily from sunrise to sunset. 14. The ground will be open daily from sunrise to sunset.

15. The trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alteration from time to time in these regulations and charges, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council.

Pending the publication of a correct Admiralty Chart of the Eastern Group, the intermediate islands and reefs should be altered relatively with the above positions. Thus, for instance, Bacon Islands (and consequently the Argo Reef) is in error 14 miles in latitude and 74 miles in longitude. Reid Islands and their encircling reefs should be altered the same amount to correspond. Again, Taywnasithi Taranasici should be altered to correspond with the new position of Vanua, Vatu and Kambara and so on with other dangers of the Eastern Group.

Information received from Lieutenant Richards of H.M.'s schooner "Renard."

Woodin Passage, S.E. part of New Caledonia.—Woodin Passage.—Iron cage beacons have been placed on the following dangers:—The half-fathion patch (Moziman's Shoal) to eastward of Pine Point; the end of the reef of the point to the westward of Cape Ndua; and on the Hydrography Shoal.

Heavy squalls from westward accompanied by rain and thick mist were encountered by the Renard in the eastern part of the Woodin Pass, and, from local information, appear to be frequent.

Good sheltered holding ground was found in 22 fathoms (mud) to S.E. of Montravil Island.

This information affects charts Nos. 2906, 936b, and 1380.

Havannah Harbor, New Hebrides.—The actual plan of

Havannah Harbor, New Hebrides.—The actual plan of Havannah Harbor appears very incorrect, though accurately placed on chart.

Loyally Isles.—I passed close to the Island of Tiga or Boucher, and find its position (by three chronometers which have been performing very well) to be 167° 57′ 30″ east, or about 15 miles to the eastward of the position given on the chart. Ndunding or Molard Island and Markan Point (the N.W. point of Maré or Britannia Island) are also a corresponding distance too far to the westward, and probably the whole island of Maré is equally out of position.

My latitudes of the above-named places coincide very nearly with that shown upon the chart.

Norfolk Island.—From information received from islanders a sharp pinnacle rock having 12 feet over it at L.W. lies due south of the west end of Nepean Island three-quarters of a mile. This is the rock on which the ship Mary Hamilton struck and became a total wreck.

Campbell Island.—There appears to be a discrepancy between the position assigned upon the general chart of the South Pacific (western sheet No. 788) to Campbell Island, and that given upon the chart of the Auckland and Campbell Islands, No. 1114; the longitudes given upon the latter place Observatory Point, Perseverance Harbor, in 169° 11° E., whereas the position on the former places it in 169° 21′ E., or 10 miles further to the eastward. In chart 788, South Pacific Ocean, Western Sheet, Campbell Island is placed 10 miles too far to the eastward.

Information received from Lieutenant De Hoghton, II.M.'s schooner "Beagle."

Api Island, New Hebrides.—In coasting down about a mile south of Pane, and half to three-quarters of a mile outside the fringe reef, is a circular coral patch about 100 yards in diameter, and awash at L.W. The patch is very flat and has deep water round it, excepting on the south side, where a tongue runs out for some 100 yards or so. Pane lies about one mile and a half E.S.E. of La Menu Island.

Maran Sound, Guadalcanar, Solomon Islands.—I entered Maran Sound through a passage half a mile wide on the cast side of Malpula Island, no soundings were obtained until some two miles inside the outer reef, and I anchored in ten fathoms close off the main land and to the southward of the island south of Malpula. The sound is of great extent, studded with small islands, and affords many and good anchorages, though in mostly rather deep water. The chart No. 214 gives, on a very small scale, some idea of the entrances, of which there are three principal ones. One to the southward through which the Sandfly entered, over a mile in width, leaving all the small outlaying islands well on the starboard hand, leads up to this entrance.

There is an entrance between Malpala and the mainland off which lies a small island to be left on the starboard hand entering, and another between Malpala and the easternmost large island, easily made out from seaward.

Information received from Lieutenant Horne, H.M.'s schooner

Port Resolution, Tanna.—The following information respecting the harbor of Port Resolution, Tanna, was received from Mr. Nellson, the resident missionary:—
On the 10th January 1878 there was a very severe earthquake, the land on the north shore rising some twenty feet or more. On the 14th February there was another very severe shock when the same land rose another twelve feet, as near as he could calculate, also a reef extending about 200 yards in a N.Ely, direction from Cook's Pyramid, awash at all states of the tide; at the same time the small bay to the north of this harbor was filled in entirely by the falling forward into the sea of upwards of one hundred and fifty acres of earth and rock, making the coast line almost straight and about one hundred and fifty feet high.
For three square miles to the northward of Port Resolution it is one mass of loose earth and rock, with numerous hot prings. The harbor is much contracted and the dangers much increased.

When the second shock took place there was a surf from

much increased.

When the second shock took place there was a surf from twenty to thirty feet high, raised by the land falling into the sea; this rushed into the harbor, taking everything before it. On entering the harbor in the Sandhy the leadsman got as little as a quarter less two, but I failed to find the spot when away sounding in the gig.

St. Bartholomev, New Hebrides.—I found a very good anchorage for small crafts off the east end of St. Bartholomew and inside some small islets, which are connected at low water with St. Bartholomew by the southernmost of the three.

Espiritu Santo.—Chart No. 1880 is so very much out about Espiritu Santo that it was impossible to fix my position.

The following dangers have recently been examined by H.M.'s surveying vessel Nassau, Captain R. H. Napier, R.N., in charge of survey.

1. Benjamin Aymar Rock.

This rock, on which the American barque Benjamin Aymar struck in January 1878, consists of a small rocky patch with 2 feet of water on its shoalest part at L.W. springs. A depth of from 9 to 10 fathoms was obtained in every direction at a distance of 13 cables from it, the bottom being mud. Changehi Peak bears N. 68° B. from the rock. Monde Dog lighthouse bears S. 87° E. from the rock. Sea Dog Summit bears S. 69° B. from the rock. Sea Cat Summit bears S. 71° E. from the rock.

Clearing Marks.—The southern extreme of Changchi Island in line with the northern extreme of Matsou Island leads clear to the southward, and Crab Island should not be brought to bear castward of north to clear to the eastward.

2. Norman Court Rock.

This rock consists of two pinnacles lying in a north and south direction and distant 1½ cables from each other.

The southern one is distant 4½ cables from Flat Rock, and has 9 feet of water over it at L.W. springs, with deep water close around, but a rocky ledge with 6 fathoms over it extends 1½ cables to the S.E. by S. of it.

The northern one has only 6 feet over it at L.W. springs.

There is also a rocky patch, with 2½ fathoms over it, to the S.S.E. ½ E. of Flat Rock, and distant from it 2½ cables.

Flat Rock Summit bears N. 7° 10′ W. from the S. pinnacle. Changehi Peak bears N. 16° E. from the S. pinnacle.

Matsou Peak bears N. 6°9 W. from the S. pinnacle.

Sea Dog Summit bears S. 5° W. from the S. pinnacle.

3. Pilot Rock.

This danger (described at page 276 of the China Sea Directory, vol. III., 1874, as lying 3 miles east from the Sea Cat, but unnamed) is 3½ miles from the Sea Cat, and consists of a pinnacle of small extent, on which the sea breaks at L.W. springs, there then being about one foot of water over.

Changchi Peak bears N. 17° W. from the rock. Sea Cat Summit bears S. 87° W. from the rock. Sea Dog Summit bears S. 63° 15′ W. from the rock. This notice affects Admiralty Charts Nos. 1262, 1761, and

With reference to the preliminary notice issued by this Department, dated the 22nd day of October 1877, it is bereby notified that, on and after Monday the 16th day of September next, a Light will be exhibited from the Lighthouse which has been erected on Centre Island, the position and characteristics of which are as follow:—
The Centre Island Lighthouse is situated on the southern extremity of Centre Island, in Foveaux Strait, New Zealand.
The tower is 20 feet in height, built of timber and painted white. The light will be first order fixed, showing white from the bearing of north 78° west, round by the north, over an arc of 176°, to the bearing of south 82° east. The light will show red from this latter bearing to south 54° east, and between the bearings of north 78° west and south 4° east, and between the bearings of horth 78° west and south 4° east, and between the bearings of horth 78° west and south 4° east, and between the latter bearing and the bearing of south 54° east the light will not be shown.

The light is elevated 265 feet above the sea, and, allowing 15 feet for the height of the eye, will be seen at a distance of about 224 nautic miles in clear weather, and at lesser distances according to the state of the atmosphere.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.—RAILWAY WHARF, ECHUCA.

THE Board of Land and Works, by virtue of the powers and authorities vested in it by The Public Works Statute 1865, doth hereby make the following Bye-laws for the management of traffic at the Railway Wharf, Echuca:—

nanagement of traine at the Railway Wharf, Echuca:—

1. The limits of the wharf shall include any portion of the railway reserve adjacent thereto between the river and the gates at the first level crossing.

2. The Wharfmaster shall be responsible for the management of traffic at the Echuca Wharf, for the maintenance of order, and for the control of the railway officers and servants employed there, subject to the following regulations and to such instructions as he may receive from the Stationmaster.

3. All persons in charge of boats, barges, rafts, or other craft arriving at the wharf, shall be under the direction of the Wharfmaster as to the place or places at, to, or from which the said craft shall be moored, removed, or unmoored, at any time from the vessel's arrival until she leaves the said wharf. Any person found guilty of a breach of this byc-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

4. The loading or unloading of all craft moored at the Railway Wharf, or of teams or carts arriving at the same, shall be performed by or under the direction of the Wharfmaster, and at the expense of the owners or agents of the said craft, carts, or teams, and not at that of the Department.

5. The Wharfmaster shall have power to direct the loading or discharge of craft at any time during the day or night beyond the usual working hours, without hindrance or instruc-

tion from the person in charge of the said craft, or from others. Any person found guilty of a breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each and every day or fractional part of a day that such obstruction

every day or fractional part of a day that such obstruction continues.

6. Vessels are to be loaded or discharged in turn as they arrive at the wharf, and as cargo is ready to be loaded into or discharged from them, except in case of emergency, such as the arrival of a vessel in a sinking or dangerous state, when a preference will be given.

7. No vessel will be allowed to occupy a berth when there is no cargo for or on board of her, unless in the judgment of the Wharfmaster the said berth is not otherwise required.

8. As soon as a vessel is discharged or loaded, or if and when she is compelled to stop work for a time, she is to be removed out of the way by the crew or owners, or by the stevedore or others, acting under the direction of the Wharfmaster.

9. Any vessel so removed will have priority for a berth over vessels arriving subsequent to such removal.

10. Steamers with a barge will not be allowed to use more than one crane so long as other vessels have cargo to load or discharge.

than one crane so long as other vessels have cargo to load or discharge.

11. Vessels loading or discharging after sundown must provide sufficient lights on deck and in the hold to enable the stevedore to carry on the work safely and satisfactorily. Should the department provide lights, a charge of One shilling per light per hour will be payable by the vessel.

12. No steamboat, barge, or other vessel to be left at the wharf without a sufficient crew in charge; and a bright light must be shown from sunset to sunrise on all boats, barges, rafts, or other craft lying within the limits of the wharf. Any person found guilty of a breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

13. It shall be the duty of the Wharfmaster, on the arrival of a vessel and as she approaches the wharf, to point out by signal the berth she is to take up. At night a red signal lamp will be exhibited to mark the position of any berth that is vacant.

14. The wharf will be adequately lighted at night when vessels are working, but if not working at the wharf, a light will be shown only on the most frequented part of the wharf, and on the stairs under the wharf leading to each vessel.


