NOTICE is hereby given that a lighthouse is now in the course of erection at Cape Maria Van Diemen. It is anticipated that the light will be ready for exhibition in January 1879. The following is a description of the light that will be exhibited.:-

Cape Maria Van Diemen lighthouse is situated on the small island which lies off the northern end of Cape Maria Van Diemen, at the extreme north of the North Island of New Zealand. The light will be a first order revolving white light, visible all round as far as the land will allow. It will attain its greatest brilliancy every minute. From the lower part of the tower a fixed red light will be shown over the Columbia Reef.

Due notice will be given of the exact date when this light will be first exhibited.

The births of 794 children, viz., 413 boys and 381 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of August. In the month of July 838 births were registered, or 44 more than in the month under review.

The deaths in August numbered 405, viz., 220 of males and 185 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 389. The deaths were more than those in July by 85, but exceeded the average of August during the previous ten years by 73. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average in those ten years by 31 only.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 71.9° on the 27th, and the lowest was 37.0° on the 6th. The mean temperature of the month (51.6°) was a little more than 1° above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (28.9°) took place on the 21st, viz., from a maximum of 66.8° to a minimum of 37.9°. The least range (8.1°) was on the 5th, viz., from a maximum of 53.1° to a minimum of 45°. The mean daily range was 14.6°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.912 inches) was nearly one-half of an inch below the average.

Fifty-four per cent. of the deaths registered during the month were of males; 46 per cent. were of females. Thirty-one per cent. were of children under the age of 5 years as against 34 per cent. in August 1877; 32 per cent. in August 1876; 33 per cent. in August 1875; 30 per cent. in August 1874, and in August 1873; 33½ per cent. in August 1872; 45 per cent. in August 1871; 40 per cent. in August 1870; 35 per cent. in August 1869; and 43 per cent. in August 1868.

The deaths of 19 persons of the age of 75 years or upwards were registered during the month, viz.:—Those of a female aged 75, of bronchitis; a female, aged 77, of heart disease; a female and a gunsmith, each aged 78, of apoplexy; a gardener aged 78, of brain disease; a carpenter, aged 78, of heart disease; a weaver, aged 78, of bronchitis; a laborer, aged 78, of congestion of the lungs; a bricklayer, aged 81, of erysipelas; a gentleman, aged 81, of pneumonia; a laborer, aged 85, of brain disease; a male, of occupation unstated, aged 78; a gentleman and a laborer, each aged 80, and 5 females, aged 77, 82, 83, 89, and 92 respectively, of old age.

Sixteen deaths from external causes occurred during the month, of which 5 are ascribed to accident, 1 to homicide, and no less than 7 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A farmer, aged 17, died of injuries to the head caused by a tree falling on him; a storeman, aged 30, was crushed by an hydraulic lift; a woolwasher, aged 32, fractured his skull by a fall on the pavement; a baker, aged 38, shot himself in the chest; a laundress, aged 40, died of fracture of the skull through falling down stairs; a laborer and a male of occupation unstated, each aged 30, and a female aged 54, were found drowned in the Yarra. The homicidal death was that of a male infant, who was suffocated at birth. Of the suicidal deaths, a saddler, aged 45, poisoned himself with strychnine; a squatter, aged 40, and an hotelkeeper, aged 49, drowned themselves, the former in Hobson's Bay, and the latter in the Yarra; a blacksmith aged 31, a female aged 32, and a draper aged 47 hanged themselves; a male inmate of the Melbourne Gaol, aged 50, strangled himself. All those who committed self-destruction, with the exception of the last, were set down as laboring under insanity.

One hundred deaths, or 25 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—49 in the Melbourne Hospital, 5 in the Immigrants' Home, 1 in the Children's Hospital, 9 in the Alfred Hospital, 6 in the Lying-in Hospital,

11 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 4 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Pentridge Stockade, 2 in the Protestant Refuge, 1 in the Industrial Home, and 1 in the Homoeopathic Hospital.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 127, of which 64, or 50 per cent., were of males; and 63, or 50 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 81 were under one year of age, 22 were between one and two, 12 were between two and three, 8 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 278. Of these, 156, or 56 per cent., were males, and 122, or 44 per cent., were females; 14 were between five and ten, 6 were between ten and fifteen, 15 were between fifteen and twenty, 16 were between twenty and twenty-five, 15 were between twenty-five and thirty, 21 were between thirty and thirty-five, 20 were between thirty-five and forty, 19 were between forty and forty-five, 20 were between forty-five and fifty, 23 were between fifty and fifty-five, 20 were between fifty-five and sixty, 24 were between sixty and sixty-five, 31 were between sixty-five and seventy, 15 were between seventy and seventy-five, 10 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 9 were upwards of eighty.

It was mentioned in the report for July that 56 deaths had been caused by diseases of the respiratory system, which was an unusually large number. These affections in a fatal form were still more prevalent in the month under review, and resulted in no less than 76 deaths. Seventeen deaths were set down to old age in July, and the same number in August, which shows the period to have been especially fatal to old people. The mortality from Zymotic diseases was however, low in both months.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to the undermentioned Common the Crown lands hereinafter described, that is to say:—

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR A COMMON.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Rules and Regulations for a Common.

ROSEDALE SHIRE—RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE ROSEDALE COMMON.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council to frame regulations for the management of commons, and in pursuance of the provisions of chapter XIII. of the Regulations made under the said Act by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of May 1873, the Council of the Shire of Rosedale as Managers of the Rosedale Common submit to the Board of Land and Works for approval the following Regulations for the management of the said Common:—

No. 1. All residents within five miles of any portion of the gazetted boundaries of the common shall be entitled to depasture four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

No. 2. The fees for depasturing cattle shall be paid half-yearly in advance on the 1st days of April and October in each year according to the following scale, viz.:—

- a. For horned cattle (5s.) Five shillings per head per annum.
 - b. For horses (8s.) Eight shillings per head per annum.
 - c. For sheep (1s. 4d.) One shilling and fourpence per head per annum.
 - d. For goats (2s.) Two shillings per head per annum.
- Calves and foals under (8) eight months old, the progeny of registered cattle on the common, shall be free.

No. 3. When the fees are paid the herdsman shall give a receipt on the authorized form, and shall register the brands and descriptions of the cattle, together with the owner's name and address, and the amount of fees paid, in a book to be called the Commons Herd Book, and shall brand the cattle so registered with the commons brand.

No. 4. No pigs shall be allowed to depasture on the common, nor any bull or entire horse, without the consent of the managers, who shall at the time fix special fees.

No. 5. The managers or herdsman will not be responsible for any cattle depasturing on the common, but the herdsman shall see all registered cattle on the common once at least in every seven days, and in the event of any straying he shall give notice in writing to the owners thereof within (24) twenty-four hours after being missed.

No. 6. In the event of any cattle straying off the common and being impounded, the herdsman shall be responsible to the owners for the impounding expenses, and for the safe return of such cattle to the common, provided the requirements of rule (5) five have not been complied with.

No. 7. The herdsman shall impound all cattle trespassing on the common, and keep correct accounts of the same, so that the fees arising therefrom shall be properly accounted for, and all fees arising from this source shall go the credit of the commons account.

No. 8. All persons desirous of removing stock permanently from the common shall give (24) twenty-four hours' notice of their intention to the herdsman.

No. 9. The managers or herdsman shall have the power to cause any cattle having, or suspected of having, any contagious disease to be removed from or to such part of the common as may be directed, and the herdsman shall give notice at once to the owners of such cattle being diseased.

No. 10. In the event of any cattle dying upon the common, the owners of the same shall, after (24) twenty-four hours' notice from the herdsman, or after having the carcass pointed out to them by the herdsman, cause all such carcasses to be at once burned or destroyed, failing which the herdsman shall cause the same to be destroyed at the owner's risk and cost.

No. 11. The brand for the common shall be R C pitch brand.

Due notice, by advertisement in the local newspapers circulating in the district, shall be given of the mustering of cattle on the common every six months, and every owner of cattle shall assist, or authorize some person to represent him, in branding them with the common's brand, or pay sixpence per head to the herdsman, the amount to go to the credit of the common's account.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding (£20) Twenty pounds for each offence.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT OF A RESERVE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES AND FOR PUBLIC RECREATION, IN THE PARISH OF MOKEPILLY.

WHEREAS by the 108th section of *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: Now, therefore, the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the Regulation following to be observed and enforced in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Orders of 22nd October 1877 and 29th July 1878 respectively, for Water Supply Purposes and for Public Recreation in the parish of Mokepilly.

LADDERS.

The ladders are to be of red or yellow Baltic fir, free from large or loose knots, and perfectly straight in grain, sound and free from heart and sap. The rounds are to be cleft, of young and fresh hickory, English ash, or English oak, straight in grain, and turned to 1 1/2 inch diameter in centre, and for 1/2 inch holes at ends. The sides of the ladders are to be bored to receive the rounds, and the holes are to be tapered outwards, so as to admit of the round being opened and wedged. All the rounds are to well fill the holes, and be wedged with glue into the sides, previously having received a coat of wet white lead. Every eighth round a tie bolt 1/2 inch diameter with collar at each end 1 1/2 inch diameter is to be inserted below the round with nut and washer at each end, the rounds to be 9 inches apart centre to centre. The ladders are to be finished with three coats of good lead and oil paint, of such color as may be ordered.

The 36-foot ladders are to spread at bottom 18 inches clear between the sides, which are to be 4 1/2 inches x 2 1/2 inches; and at top 9 1/2 inches clear, and sides 2 1/2 inches x 1 1/2 inches.

The 30-foot ladders 18 inches clear at bottom, with sides 4 1/2 inches x 2 1/2 inches; and at top 10 1/2 inches clear, and sides 2 1/2 inches x 1 1/2 inches.

The 24-foot ladders 16 inches clear at bottom, and sides 4 1/2 inches x 2 inches; at top 10 inches clear, and sides 2 1/2 inches x 1 1/2 inches.

The 20-foot ladders 15 inches clear at bottom, and sides 3 1/2 inches x 2 inches; at top 10 inches clear, and sides 2 1/2 inches x 1 1/2 inches.

The 16-foot ladders 14 inches clear at bottom, and sides 3 1/2 x 1 1/2 inches; and at top 10 inches clear, and sides 2 1/2 inches x 1 1/2 inches.

REBATES ON GOODS TO RIVERINA.

THE Board of Land and Works, by virtue of the powers and authorities vested in it by *The Public Works Statute 1865*, doth hereby make the following bye-law for fixing the amount of rebate to be allowed on certain goods carried to Riverina by way of Wodonga or Springs, that is to say:—

On and after the 1st August 1878 all goods forwarded by rail from Melbourne or Williamstown to Springs or Wodonga for the township of Wagga Wagga, or for any destination north of an imaginary straight line drawn between the south end of the Uraua Swamp on the west and the township of Billabong on the east, will be charged the following rates, viz:—

Iron wire, in bundles ...	40s. per ton.
Woolpacks ...	40s. "
All other goods ...	65s. "

The ordinary local rates, as per Goods Tariff, will be charged in the first instance, and a reduction to the above rates will be made on production of rebate sheets accompanied by certificates from consignees that the goods have been duly received at their destination, and a declaration or such other evidence as may be approved of by the Board. Rebate sheets must be rendered within one calendar month of the goods leaving Springs or Wodonga station as the case may be. Provided always that the Board may allow the reduction aforesaid without such certificates, declaration, or other evidence, if a sufficient guarantee be given to its satisfaction that such goods shall be forwarded to Wagga Wagga aforesaid, or to a destination north of the said imaginary straight line.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

THE Board of Land and Works doth hereby authorize and appoint each and every of the persons named in the schedule hereto annexed (being servants or employes of the Board) as its agent for the purpose of severally carrying into effect (so far as applicable to each respective case) the under-mentioned provisions of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, that is to say:—

Under the 128th section of the said statute to seize and detain any person trespassing on any line of state railway, or on any state railway premises whose name and residence shall be unknown to such agent, and to give such person in charge to a police constable, whose duty it is to bring the offender before a justice, and also to complain to any justice against such offender, and charge him with an offence against the 155th section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*.

Also to complain to any justice against any person trespassing on any line of railway or on any railway premises for an offence against the 155 section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, and to summon such person before a justice and charge him with such offence.

This authority is not to supersede any authority for the like purpose heretofore made and given by the Board of Land and Works.

RULES of the Amherst District Hospital (Incorporated), as revised and amended, and confirmed at a general meeting of contributors, held on the 26th August 1878, in accordance with the provisions of the Act for government, &c., of Charitable Institutions:—

OBJECTS.

1. The objects of the institution are to afford surgical and medical aid to poor persons requiring it. That any person who shall be admitted, under any circumstances, and shall be found able to pay, will be required to do so, and will receive temporary relief only.

2. In the event of any person in a position to pay for surgical or medical advice, elsewhere being detected in the receipt of the charity of the institution, such person shall be charged at the rate of Two pounds per week for each week from the date of admission, if an in-patient; or shall pay to the hospital the sum of Ten shillings for each occasion upon which advice may have been received at the hospital if an out-patient; but the board may order the removal of any such persons from the hospital; provided the case is not one of emergency.

CONSTITUTION.

3. The institution shall be governed by a board of management, consisting of a president, two vice-presidents, treasurer, and nine ordinary members of committee, who shall be elected at the annual meeting of contributors, held on the second Thursday of the month of January in each year, and shall retire in the following order, viz.:—The president, vice-president, and treasurer, annually, and one third of the nine ordinary members lowest on the poll to retire the first year, and one-third next lowest on the poll to retire on the second year, and at the expiration of every succeeding year the one-third longest in office; the retiring members to be eligible for re-election. But no person shall be eligible for election as a member of the board of management, unless he (being absent) have previously signified his consent to be nominated,

such consent being in writing, and addressed to the president, the chairman of the meeting; or to the contributor, proposing nomination who shall be required to produce at the meeting, the consent aforesaid.

4. If it shall happen that any member or members of the board of management whose retirement may require to be determined by lot, shall be absent from the meeting at which it shall be necessary to determine by lot who shall go out of office, then the chairman of the meeting, if need be, shall inscribe the name or names of him or them so absent on the paper, and shall do all that is necessary to be done on behalf of the absentee or absentees for determining the nine of the said lot; and the retirement or otherwise and the decision then arrived at shall be valid and effectual as if such party or parties were present.

5. Should vacancies occur in the offices of ordinary members of committee, president, vice-president; treasurer, or honorary medical officers, the board shall supply such vacancies for the remainder of the year. Provided that if more than one-third of the number of the Board resign at one and the same time, the vacancies shall be filled at a special meeting of contributors, and all persons elected under this clause shall hold office as if elected under Rule 3.

6. It shall be lawful at meetings of contributors for any contributor duly qualified to vote either in person or by proxy, such proxy being a contributor duly qualified. Provided that such proxy shall hand to the chairman of the meeting, before any nominations be made, the authority in writing, signed by the contributor; and such authority shall extend to the one meeting and the business specially named therein. The number of proxies to be held by one and the same person shall not exceed four.

7. The annual general meeting shall elect two gentlemen, not members of the board, as auditors for that year. The auditors shall, at the end of each year, examine the treasurer's financial report and all accounts, vouchers, and documents relating thereto, and shall report thereon to the annual general meeting. The treasurer's annual financial report to be made up to the 31st December in each year. In event of vacancies, the same may be filled up by the board of management.

8. No new law, or repeal, or alteration of these bye-laws shall be entertained unless one month's previous notice has been given in committee, or by a requisition calling a special meeting of contributors, and the same shall not become valid unless approved of at a special general meeting of contributors called for that purpose.

9. It shall be competent at any time for four members of the board of management or any twenty contributors, by writing under their hands, to request the president to summon a special meeting of contributors, the occasion of calling such meeting, being stated in the requisition; and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting except that for which it shall have been summoned; such meeting to be advertised in one or more local newspapers at least one clear week before the day of meeting.

GOVERNORS AND CONTRIBUTORS.

10. That every benefactor of £20 and upwards be eligible for life to be a member of the board of management, and have the privilege of recommending; in each year, two in-patients and four out-patients:

11. That a subscription of £1 a year constitute a contributor, who shall be allowed the privilege of recommending one in-door or two out-door patients annually. He shall be qualified, to be elected a member of the board of management, and to vote at any special or annual general meeting of contributors, and for every additional £1 he may subscribe he shall be privileged to recommend one in-door or two out-door patients, and that these privileges continue in force for twelve months from the date of his contribution. But no new contributor shall be entitled to recommend a patient, or vote at the annual or special meeting, until fourteen days after the date of payment of his subscription.

12. Every benefactor of £10, or contributor of £1 per annum, shall be entitled to one vote; every benefactor of £20, or contributor of £3 per annum, shall be entitled to two votes; and every benefactor of £50, or contributor of £5 and upwards per annum, shall be entitled to three votes at all general and special meetings of contributors.

13. Every firm of partnership, becoming contributors shall exercise their privilege through one member of the firm only.

14. No salaried officer in the pay of the institution shall be eligible to be a member of the board of management or vote at the annual or special meetings.

BOARD OF MANAGEMENT.

15. The board of management, shall direct the general business of the institution, shall frame bye-laws for its internal regulation, the same not being contrary to the general rules, and appoint and discharge all paid officers and servants of the institution. They shall meet on the Thursday nearest to, and immediately preceding, the full moon in every month, and on such other days as they may appoint. The chairman of the board, in case the votes are equal, shall have an additional or casting vote.

16. The board of management shall choose from among themselves a visiting committee, who shall meet on such days and at such hours in each week as they may appoint; and shall audit the house accounts, engage and discharge servants, and regulate the internal management of the institution.

17. All accounts for payment shall be passed by the board, and signed by the chairman of the meeting.

18. No member of the board of management shall be allowed, either directly or indirectly, to enter into or derive any benefit from any contract with or for the hospital.

19. Any member of the "ordinary" committee neglecting his duty for four consecutive monthly meetings, without reasonable cause, shall cease to be a member of the board, and another officer be appointed in his stead.

TREASURER.

20. All moneys received on account of the hospital shall be paid to the treasurer, and appropriated by him to the purpose of the institution, under the direction of the board of management.

21. Previous to making any payment, the treasurer shall receive a warrant of the board of management authorizing such payment, which shall be signed by the president or vice-president, and countersigned by the secretary.

All moneys received by the treasurer shall be deposited by him in such bank as the board may from time to time direct.

SECRETARY.

22. The secretary shall keep the minutes and records of the institution, conduct the correspondence, call all meetings, and bring all business before the same, and carry out the resolutions.

23. He shall by advertisement, fourteen days previous to meeting, convene the annual general meeting in the month of January.

24. He shall convene special meetings when directed by the board of management, and he shall give three days' notice to the members of the board of each ordinary or special committee meeting.

25. He shall compile all reports that may be ordered by the board, fill up all cheques, and perform the clerical duties connected with the office.

26. He shall have charge of the common seal of the corporation, but shall not affix the seal to any deed or other instrument, except by order of the board of management.

COLLECTOR.

27. He shall canvass the district for subscriptions; he shall give a receipt for every sum he receives, and keep a counterpart of such receipt; he shall hand over to the treasurer once in every week the monies received by him during the preceding week; he shall also lay before the board every month a statement of the contributions received during the last month; and shall find security satisfactory to the board.

STOREKEEPER.

28. He shall receive and weigh previous to taking delivery of the stores, and shall weigh out the supplies, &c., according to the dietary scale. He shall in the month of December in every year assist the secretary in taking stock of the household property of the institution, medicines and surgical instruments excepted, and shall enter the same in the stock-book of the institution.

HONORARY MEDICAL OFFICERS.

29. The subscribers at the annual meeting in each year may appoint not more than three honorary medical officers, who may attend at the meetings of the board of management; but the said honorary medical officers shall not have any vote. The attendance of honorary medical officers shall be once a week for one month in rotation, and at such times as they may find it convenient, but in cases of emergency all may be requested to attend; and the arrangement of the rotation of duty to be left to themselves.

30. The honorary medical officers shall have access to the institution at all times, irrespective of rotation of duty.

31. The honorary medical officers shall not interfere with the admission or discharge of patients.

32. No capital operations shall be performed without a previous consultation of the medical staff, except in cases of emergency, and they shall regularly consult in all cases of importance or protracted continuances in the house.

HOUSE SURGEON.

33. The house medical officer shall possess the certificate of qualification of the Medical Board of Victoria.

34. He shall attend at the institution at such times as the board of management may from time appoint.

35. He shall at once report to the visiting committee any patient who may be disorderly. He shall make a special report of every patient who may have been two months in the hospital, and he shall report any case that may be considered incurable by the medical staff; to be dealt with as the board see fit.

36. He shall have the immediate superintendence of the wardsmen, nurses, and servants, and direct them in their duties. He shall preserve order, sobriety, and in cases of insubordination or gross default of duty on the part of any nurse or wardsmen, he may discharge or suspend such servant, with the sanction of the visiting committee, and, if necessary, he may, provisionally, hire a substitute for such servant so discharged or suspended, and he shall report his having done so, with the cause of such discharge or suspension, to the Board of management at their next meeting.

37. He shall have the charge of and be accountable for the medicines, medical instruments, furniture, utensils, and stores in the hospital, and shall cause an inventory of the same to be made in a book to be kept for that purpose, in which shall regularly be entered the receipt, cost, issue, loss, or breakage of each article.

38. He shall enter regularly in the medical registry the names of the patients as they are admitted and discharged, and note, if required, the nature and history of their diseases whilst in the hospital, and shall have such medical registry, under the different heads, ready at all times for the inspection of the visiting committee.

39. He shall give all requisite information to the honorary medical officers on their visits to the hospital, and shall enter all prescriptions in a book to be kept for that purpose.

40. He shall on his visits to the wards examine their condition with respect to cleanliness, temperature, and ventilation.

41. He shall affix to the bed of each patient his name, age, disease, religion, the date of his admission, how or by whose recommendation admitted, and the diet ordered by the medical officer, and as far as possible the date required by the deputy registrar of the district in virtue of his office, and the name of the honorary medical officer by whom attended. Should any patient have any complaint to prefer, he shall enter the same in the patients' complaint-book immediately, in the presence of the wardsmen or nurse of the ward, and shall lay such book before the visiting committee at each meeting.

42. He shall perform all the minor operations of surgery and the *post mortem* examinations not personally performed by the honorary medical officers, and shall keep the registry of the dead-house.

43. In the absence of the honorary medical officers in all cases of emergency he shall cause immediate notice of such emergency to be given to them, being authorized in the meantime to act to the best of his judgment, avoiding as far as possible any unnecessary interference with the duties of those officers.

44. He shall give due notice to the honorary officers when a consultation is to be held or when an operation is to be performed.

45. He shall carefully dispense the medicines prescribed, and write legibly the names of the patients on each bottle, and the manner in which the medicines are to be administered; and shall keep a proper supply of medicines and utensils ready in cases of emergency.

46. He shall inspect the diet of the patients when necessary and see that it is properly cooked and prepared and such as is ordered; and that the patients partake of no food, liquor, or medicine except that prescribed, and that the responsibility of the quantity and quality of the provision supplied to the hospital and issued to the patients rests with the house surgeon.

47. He shall, in the months of June and December in every year, and at other times when required by the board of management, take stock of all the medicines and surgical instruments in the possession of the institution, and hand the list over to the secretary to be entered into the stock-book of the institution.

PATIENTS.

48. All applicants for admission must be provided with a recommendation ticket; the fitness of the applicants regards nature of disease to be determined by the surgeon.

49. All patients shall be required to pay the actual expense of their maintenance as far as circumstances may enable them, and all property found on deceased patients shall be appropriated to the defraying of the expense of their maintenance and burial, and the residue (if any) to be handed to their legal representatives.

50. Severe accidents and cases of decided emergency may be admitted at any time by the visiting committee, one of the honorary medical officers, or house surgeon.

51. No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement, no child under three years of age, no person insane or laboring under *delirium tremens*, or syphilis, or infectious disorder, or subject to epilepsy, or any one who, in the opinion of the examining physician or surgeon, might receive equal benefit as an out-door patient, shall be admitted into the hospital.

52. Patients shall conduct themselves orderly and shall strictly observe all the directions of the honorary medical officers, house surgeon, house steward, wardsmen, and nurses, or any persons who may be in charge.

53. They shall take their medicines at the time directed, and they shall not take any other medicines than those prescribed; and they shall not conceal nor put away any portion of the medicines or diet administered to them.

54. No one shall leave his or her ward and go into another ward or department, nor leave the house, nor remain out for a longer time than is granted, nor shall introduce visitors, nor receive medicines, victuals, liquor, or tobacco, or anything without the express leave of the house surgeon.

55. They shall not gamble, or smoke, or spit on the floor, nor deface or injure any parts of the ward, nor any furniture, bedding or clothing therein; nor sing, blaspheme, nor use rude or indecent language, on pain of dismissal.

56. No patient shall give reward or gratuity to any of the wardsmen, nurses, or any of the other servants.

57. Any patient having any cause of complaint shall make the same known to the house surgeon, whose duty it shall be to enter such complaint immediately, in the presence of the nurse or wardsmen of the ward, in a book kept for that purpose, which book shall be laid before the visiting committee of each meeting.

58. Patients considered by the house surgeon sufficiently convalescent to be able to assist in the work of the institution, may, at the direction of the house surgeon, be so employed.

59. Patients shall not sit up after Eight o'clock in the winter or after Nine o'clock in the summer, and all patients con-

sidered by the house surgeon able to do so shall rise at Seven o'clock in the summer, and before Eight o'clock in the winter.

60. The board may, if necessary, make provision on the hospital grounds for the reception and treatment of patients laboring under contagious or infectious diseases.

OUT-PATIENTS.

61. Out-patients holding a ticket of recommendation will receive out-door relief at such times as the board of management may appoint, except in cases of emergency.

62. Each out-door patient, having a recommendation from a subscriber, will be entitled to receive medical relief for six weeks from the date of first advice, but should the disease from which the person is suffering require more than six weeks' attendance it will be necessary to obtain another ticket of recommendation:

63. Any person or persons imposing on the charity of the institution will render themselves liable to prosecution.

64. Ministers of religion shall have access to sick persons of their respective denominations, at such times as shall be appointed by the board; and any minister may attend any patient at any time when requested by such patient; and that, in case of death, a notice shall be forwarded to the clergyman of the denomination the deceased patient is supposed to belong to, stating the hour of burial.

VISITORS.

65. 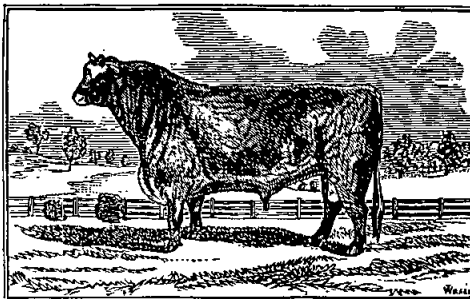

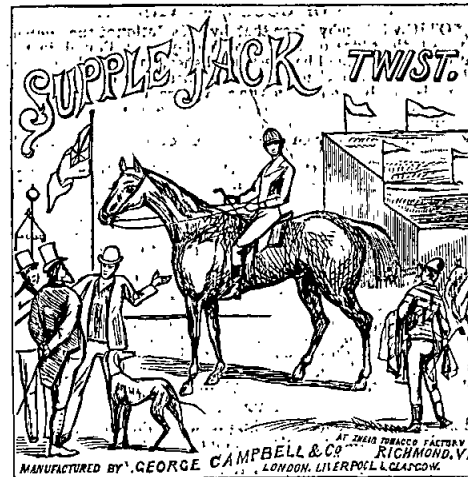

BYE-LAW No. 18.

A Bye-Law of the Borough of Clunes, made under the 213th section of "The Local Government Act 1874," and numbered eighteen, for regulating the keeping of Goats within the Borough.

SECTIONS one to five of subdivision one, part eight, of the Bye-law numbered sixteen of the said borough are hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following sections are enacted:—

1. Every person who within the borough shall keep any goat over the age of three months, or own any such goat usually kept therein, shall register with the town clerk thereof the name of such person as a keeper of goats within the borough, together with the address of such person, and shall, at the time of such registration, pay to the town clerk the sum of Two shillings; and thereafter, on the first day of January in each year, shall likewise pay to the town clerk the sum of Two shillings as annual fee for each goat so kept within the borough; and shall place and keep upon the neck of every goat so owned and kept a triangle, with bars 18 inches long, having attached thereto a tin plate bearing a number corresponding with the number entered in the registration book opposite the name of the person so registered as the owner of such goat; and if any person shall, without lawful excuse, offend in any respect against this section he shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for such offence a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

2. If any goat shall be found within the borough having on its neck a triangle and plate purporting to bear a number as of a person so registered in the borough as an owner or keeper of goats, such goat shall *prima facie* be presumed to be owned and kept within the borough by the person whose name is registered with the town clerk, and opposite whose name the said number shall appear in the registration book aforesaid.

3. The council of the borough from time to time shall provide one secure enclosure for the keeping and custody of goats for the purposes of this subdivision, and forthwith, when any such enclosure shall have been provided, shall notify the same and the situation thereof in some newspaper generally circulating within the borough.

4. Every goat found at large in any street or public place within the borough, not being furnished with a triangle and plate as hereinbefore required, may, by the proper officer appointed by the council for that purpose, be forthwith seized and confined in such enclosure as aforesaid until dealt with as hereinafter provided.

5. Subject to the provision in this subdivision contained, every goat so seized and confined as aforesaid, which shall not have upon the neck a triangle and plate as aforesaid, may, by the said officer of the council, be destroyed at or after noon of the day following the day of such seizure.

6. Any person putting or keeping on the neck of any goat owned or kept by him a triangle and plate as aforesaid without such goat being registered shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for such offence a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

LACEDPE ISLANDS—WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

The Government of Western Australia invites tenders from persons desirous of obtaining the sole right to remove guano from the Lacedpe Islands group, which is situated in about 17° south latitude, and 122° east longitude from Greenwich, and on which it is calculated there are now at least 40,000 tons of guano. Such tenders must be sent in to the Colonial Secretary, Perth, Western Australia, on or before the 15th October next, but the Government does not bind itself to accept the highest or any tender.

All tenders will have to state the price or royalty offered per ton for the guano (1) if shipped in the natural state; (2) if artificially prepared, dried, or sifted before shipment.

The person whose tender may be accepted (hereinafter spoken of as "the contractor") will have to bind himself to the following conditions:—

1. To remove the whole of the guano that there may be on the islands.
2. To take it away at the minimum rate of twenty thousand tons a year.
3. To remove the guano in such a manner and from such places as may be from time to time pointed out by the Government Officer stationed on the islands; and the contract will contain a clause providing that in case of the breach or neglect of these conditions the contract shall be void, and the contractor shall forfeit all buildings, erections, and plant that he may have set up on any of the islands, and also the sum of Two thousand pounds hereinafter mentioned.

The contractor will be required, within seven days after receiving a notification by telegraph or otherwise that his tender is accepted, and before the issue of any license, to deposit in the hands of the Western Australian Government, or of such person as they may name as their agent in this behalf, the sum of Two thousand pounds, as security for the due performance of the contract, and this sum will be retained by the Government until the termination of the contract, and will be liable to forfeiture as hereinbefore mentioned. He will also be required at the same time to pay a like sum of Two thousand pounds, by way of royalty, in advance. The contractor will at no time be at liberty to remove any guano unless the royalty agreed upon has been paid, and no less sum than Two thousand pounds will be accepted at any time in payment of royalty until such time as there is left on the islands a quantity of guano the agreed royalty on which shall be less than Two thousand pounds.

The only instructions that will be given to the Government Officer stationed on the islands, and which he will be required to insist upon with regard to the manner in which and the

places from which the guano shall be removed, will be to divide the islands into convenient sections, to point out the section or sections from which guano may be removed, and to require that the whole of any one section be cleared before any new ground is entered on.

The quantity of guano taken by each ship on which royalty has to be paid shall be ascertained by adding 25 per cent. to the registered tonnage of timber-built ships, and 40 per cent. to the registered tonnage of iron-built ships; provided that, if the captain or agent of any ship, or the Government Officer, shall in any instance be dissatisfied with the foregoing arrangement, he shall be at liberty to cause the ship to be exactly measured according to Lloyd's rules, and the number of cubical feet so ascertained divided by 40 shall be taken to be the tonnage capacity of the ship.

No tonnage, light, or harbor dues will be charged in any port of the colony on ships solely engaged in the guano trade, and no customs duties will be levied on goods and stores that may be landed on the islands for persons solely employed in the preparation and shipment of guano.

The contractor will be at liberty to erect on any or all of the islands any buildings, jetties, tramways, &c., and, subject to the conditions before expressed as to forfeiture, to remove the same at any time within six months of the termination of the contract.

No license for the shipment of guano under the regulations now in force will be granted after the 15th August next, and every such license granted after the date hereof will provide for the compulsory removal of the guano for the shipment of which it is the permit before the 15th October next.

It will at all times be optional with the licensee to ship the guano in its natural state, or artificially prepared, dried, or sifted.

The contract to be entered into in pursuance of this notice shall be deemed to commence on 1st January 1879.

Each tender, unless otherwise expressed, shall be deemed to be open to acceptance by the Government for the space of one calendar month from the 15th October, and the Government shall be at liberty to accept any tender by notifying to the person making it, by telegraph, that his tender is accepted. Any person who shall tender, and, on his tender being accepted, shall fail to pay the two several sums of Two thousand pounds as hereinbefore set forth, shall be deemed to have broken his contract, and the Government shall thereupon be at liberty to accept any other tender, and to hold such person responsible for all loss consequent on his breach of contract.
