THE following Regulations respecting the Receipt and Coinage of Gold at the Melbourne Branch of the Royal Mint, to be substituted for those approved by Order in Council of the 19th April 1875, have been issued by His Excellency the Governor in Council.

REGULATIONS FOR THE RECEIPT AND COINAGE OF GOLD AT THE MELBOURNE BRANCH OF THE ROYAL MINT.

Gold, in dust or bullion, can be deposited at the Mint for coinage, subject to the following charges, allowances, and conditions:—

Charges.

1. For a deposit containing 1,000 ounces of standard gold or over, Three half-pence per ounce on the gross weight of the deposit before melting.
2. For a deposit containing less than 1,000 ounces of standard gold, Twopence per ounce on the gross weight of the deposit before melting, provided that:—

Four shillings shall be the minimum charge for any one deposit.

Allowances.

1. Any silver in a deposit in excess of four per cent. of the weight of the deposit after melting will be allowed for at a rate per ounce fine; to be fixed periodically by the Deputy-Master.
2. A reduction of one-sixth of the above charges will be made on all deposits of unrefinable gold containing more than 24 ounces standard.

Gold will be considered unrefinable that contains silver in less proportion than four and one-half (4½) per cent. of the weight of the deposit after melting, and less than two (2) per cent. of base metal.

Mode of Payment.

On and after 1st January 1879 the following arrangement as to payment for deposits will come into operation.

Provided that a day's notice be given of the intention to bring gold for coinage, payment for deposits will be made in coin over the Mint counter, as specified below (excepting when holidays intervene), viz:—

For deposits exceeding 1,000 ounces standard—	Payment of not less than one-half the value of the deposit will be made, if desired—
Before noon on	
Monday...	At 2 p.m. on Tuesday in the following week
Tuesday...	" 2 " Wednesday " "
Wednesday...	" 2 " Thursday " "
Thursday...	" 11 a.m. on Saturday " "
Friday...	As if deposited on the following Monday.

The balance of the value will be paid as soon as possible afterwards. Even thousands only will be paid in coin; the complementary portion by cheque.

N.B.—These arrangements respecting payment will be carried out as far as possible, but the Deputy-Master cannot be held responsible for their absolute performance in case of accident to the machinery, or should unusually heavy deposits be made on one day. In this latter case preference will be given to the earlier depositors.

Deposits made under any other circumstances than the above will be paid for as at present, by cheque, as also all deposits made on the first working day, or during the last ten days, of each quarter.

Conditions.

1. Each parcel for which a separate assay is required shall be considered as a separate deposit: Provided always that the value of all deposits shall be determined upon the report of the Assay Department of this Branch of Her Majesty's Mint, which shall be final; and that the Deputy-Master may refuse any deposit which he may deem unsuitable for coinage; and that it shall be in his discretion to make exceptional arrangements, in cases in which he may consider it desirable to do so for the advantage of the public service.

2. The receiving-office at the Mint will be open daily for the receipt and issue of bullion from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m., except on Saturdays and holidays, and on the last two working days of March, June, September, and December.

Note.—Gold and silver bullion, in ingots or bars, can be obtained at the Mint to a limited extent; gold at £3 17s. 10½d. the ounce standard, and silver at such price as the Deputy-Master may think proper to accept. Not less than 25 worth of either metal will be sold at one time.

Gold coin which has become light after issue from the Royal Mint or any of its Branches will be received at the Mint, in parcels of not less than £50 nominal value, at £3 17s. 10½d. per ounce.

COMMONS ADDED TO.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGOUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to the undermentioned Commons the Crown lands hereinafter respectively described, that is to say:—

THE CARRICK O'SHANASSY, BUNGANAIL, WAIRING, AND DARGALONG UNITED COMMON, proclaimed by Order of the 24th January 1876, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz:—County of Moira, parishes of Bunganail and Monea North:—Commencing at a point on the north-west side of the North-Eastern Railway, where the eastern boundary of the existing common abuts thereon; thence north, south-westerly, north, east, north-easterly, and south-easterly by the boundary of the common to geodetic meridian 145° 24' east longitude; thence south to the aforesaid railway; and thence south-westerly by that railway to the point of commencement. Area of extension, 13,000 acres, more or less.—(78.1.3825.)

THE MOORMURNG AGRICULTURAL AREA FARMERS' COMMON proclaimed by Order of the 1st March 1869, and increased by Orders dated respectively 21st April 1870, the 17th August 1874, and the 11th September 1876, is hereby further increased by adding thereto the allotments and portions of allotments of land hereinafter enumerated, viz:—County of Tanjil, parish of Moormurng, allotments 27, 29, 31, 32, 33, 34, 36, 38, and 35, and the unappropriated portions of allotments 35, 37, and 35. REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE LEURA GARDENS AT CAMPERDOWN.

WE, John Henry Robinson, John Kirk, and James Samuel Morris, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land at Camperdown (known as Leura Gardens), reserved as a site for Recreation, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the above-mentioned reserve, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards his dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee.
6. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the committee having been first obtained.

7. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots which may be enclosed within the reserve for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

ALBERT PARK AND LAKE.—REGULATIONS FOR THE CONTROL AND MANAGEMENT OF THE ALBERT PARK AND LAKE.

WHEREAS by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted that the Board of Land and Works shall have power, from time to time, to make and alter or rescind rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: Now, therefore, the said Board of Land and Works, in exercise of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby, in addition to all existing rules and regulations relating to the Albert Park, make the following Rules and Regulations to be observed and enforced in respect of such park, particularly relating to the Lake therein, and for the guidance and observance of licensees, and owners of boats, and licensees of boat-house sites therein.

1. No person shall convey into the park, or place upon the lake therein any boat in respect of which a license has not been obtained.

2. No person, other than the holder of a boat license, or the holder of a license for a boat-house site shall be allowed to convey into or through the park any goods, or materials, or implements of any kind, or be allowed ingress or egress with any articles required for boating purposes.

3. No stakes or posts of any kind shall be driven into the bed of the lake, except where necessary for pier or jetty purposes.

4. All buildings around the lake, and all piers or jetties in the water shall be constructed in strict accordance with the plans marked "Albert Park, Nos. 1, 2, 3" and with the specification attached thereto deposited in the office of Lands and Survey.

5. All works or buildings of any kind shall be constructed so as to leave a clear road of thirty-three feet around the lake.

6. Licensees of boat-house sites shall be allowed to keep for hire, or for use upon the lake, one boat for every pound sterling last paid as rent to the Crown for the boat-house site, and for every boat in excess such licensee must obtain a separate license and pay the fee for same.

7. The board of Land and Works shall have power at any time to require any building or erection to be altered or removed.

8. No refuse, rubbish, or debris of any kind shall be deposited in, around, or in any way so as to affect the lake, or in any other part of the park.

Offenders against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any of the foregoing regulations, or who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands, or by a constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten (£10) pounds.
