## PILOTAGE RATES, PORT OF POVERTY BAY.

Normanby, Governor.

WHEREAS by *The Marine Act 1867* it is, among other things, enacted that the Governor may fix the pilotage rates which shall be payable at each port, not being greater than the rates specified in the schedule to the said Act; and whereas it is expedient to fix pilotage rates for the Port of Poverty Bay:

Now therefore I, George Augustus Constantine, the Marquis of Normanby, the Governor of New Zealand, in exercise and pursuance of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, do hereby fix the rates set forth in the schedule hereto as and to be the pilotage rates to be levied and taken at the Port of Poverty Bay; and I declare that the said pilotage rates shall be levied and taken on and after the first day of April, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Licensing Act 1876 (No. 566, § 44) it was amongst other things enacted that notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the undermentioned locality to be a district wherein publicans' licenses may be specially granted under the provisions of the 44th section of the said Act, that is to say:—

The Township of Warrigal.

No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Order, amongst other things, altering, for the purpose of adjusting the boundaries of conterminous municipal districts, being shires, without any petition; and it was also enacted that any error in any Order under the provisions of Part I. of the said Act might be rectified by the Governor in Council by any subsequent Order: And whereas it has been deemed expedient that a portion of the boundary-line between the Shires of Echuca and Waranga should be altered: And whereas by an Order in Council, bearing date the eleventh day of February last, the boundaries of the said shire of Waranga, so far as they were conterminous with the said shire of Echuca, were incorrectly described, and it is expedient to adjust and re-define the said boundaries: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke so much of the hereinbefore-mentioned Order in Council of the eleventh day of February 1878 as relates to the shire of Waranga, and doth hereby re-define the boundaries of the said shire of Waranga and of the said shire of Echuca in manner following, that is to say:—

**"SOUTH WARD."**—Commencing at the south-east angle of portion A, section 3, parish of Cut-Paw-Paw; bounded on the west by a line bearing north to the Stony Creek; thence by the Stony Creek to the eastern fence of the Williamstown Railway line; thence by that fence and the western fence of the Graving Dock reserve to Hobson's Bay; thence by Hobson's Bay and Port Phillip Bay to the commencing point.

**"CENTRE WARD."**—Commencing at a point on the shore of Hobson's Bay in line with the western fence of the Graving

#### REGULATION UNDER "THE EDUCATION ACT 1872."

WHEREAS by the 18th section of *The Education Act 1872*, it was enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this Order make the Regulation following, that is to say:—

#### V. EXAMINATION AND CLASSIFICATION OF TEACHERS.

2a. Certificates of competency to teach in any State school will be granted to teachers recorded under the former Board of Education as exempt from examination and classified under *The Education Act 1872* as licensed to teach on obtaining a good report from an inspector and passing an examination in all the subjects of art of teaching for a certificate of competency prior to the first of January 1879. No teacher shall be entitled to a certificate under this regulation who shall not have complied with its provisions before the day mentioned. No person shall be entitled to be paid as a certificated teacher under this regulation prior to passing the required examination and obtaining the report referred to.

1. 2. Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers as below, the mail services for which they tender. Such numbers to be stated in the tender itself and endorsed on the cover enclosing the tender.

3. Every tender will be taken to include the entire service as called for. The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM FOR ONE or THREE YEARS in words as well as figures.

4. Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signatures and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit-receipt for a sum equal to *Five per Cent.* of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government. TENDERS are hereby invited, and will be received until Noon of Friday the third day of May 1878, for the Conveyance of Post Office Mails as undermentioned, FOR ONE or THREE YEARS from the 1st July 1878 to 30th June 1879, or 30th June 1881.

The covers of Tenders for these services must be endorsed "Tenders for Fourth Call."

##### CONDITIONS OF TENDER.

1. Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and may be forwarded (if by post, prepaid) addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for the Conveyance of Mails" endorsed on the cover, or placed in the tender-box at the General Post Office.

2. Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers as below, the mail services for which they tender. Such numbers to be stated in the tender itself and endorsed on the cover enclosing the tender.

3. Every tender will be taken to include the entire service as called for. The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM FOR ONE OR THREE YEARS in words as well as figures.

4. Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signatures and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit-receipt for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being completed.

7. The money deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts but not otherwise.

8. In the event of a portion of railway affecting any particular service being opened for traffic during period of contract, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the place of departure for the mail coaches shall be altered in such way as the Postmaster-General may from time to time direct; a ratable reduction shall be made in the amount paid for the service as then rendered by the contractors, such reduction to be computed on the basis of the average mileage rate of the lump tender or the average mileage rate of the single tender, in whichever form the tender may be accepted.

9. Persons tendering are requested to state the description of the vehicle they intend to use, and the number of horses by which it is to be drawn.

10. A separate tender must be sent in for each service; but notwithstanding this condition, any offer will be entertained for the performance of any number of services for a lump sum.

11. The tender of any person failing to comply with the foregoing conditions will not be entertained.

**BYE-LAW No. 22.**

**THE** Council of the Borough of St. Arnaud doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Local Governing Bodies Loan Act 1872, make the following bye-law:—

1. Any person receiving water from the council, who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

2. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the council, who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

3. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the council, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the council, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the council, he shall obtain from the council a license in that behalf to execute such works, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

4. Before any such license shall be granted by the council, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the council that he is a competent plumber. The council shall have the power of cancelling such license at any time.

5. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the council, without giving two days' notice to the council of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the council without the permission in writing of the council being

first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the council, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

6. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the council without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the council, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the council, or who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipe of the council of a strength and material not sanctioned by the council, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the council. and galvanized iron piping of approved quality only will be allowed for external and internal services. No taps exceeding  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch diameter in the bore will be allowed. Ordinary connections with sub-mains must be made with proper brass ferrules. One service-pipe only to each tenement will be permitted.

7. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the council into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the council that such service-pipe requires repairing, the council may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the said council may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main, being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenement supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any), and if none, the owner, shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair, or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the council.

8. Any person supplied with water by the council who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the council.

9. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

10. In the construction of this bye-law the word person shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole.


