By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, § 44) it was amongst other things enacted that notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the undermentioned localities to be respectively districts wherein publicans' licenses may be specially granted under the provisions of the 44th section of the said Act, that is to say:—

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Statute of Gaols 1864* it was amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council might proclaim any hulk or floating prison to be used as a public prison for the reception and safe keeping of all prisoners convicted and sentenced for any offences by any court of Victoria, and might define by Proclamation the limits and boundaries around such hulk within which no person should come, and the place of embarking and landing prisoners to and from such hulk; and such Proclamations from time to time might vary, alter, new assign, and revoke: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do hereby revoke the Proclamation dated the thirteenth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, constituting the *Sacramento* a Penal Hulk, also the Proclamation, dated the twenty-seventh day of September, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, re-defining the limits and boundaries around the said Hulk as therein set forth,

SHIRE OF KYNETON.
PROPOSED SEVERANCE.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Local Government Act* 1874 (No. 506, § 46), the substance and prayer of a petition in accordance with the 39th and 44th sections of the said Act, which has been presented to the Governor in Council, are published, viz. :—

The petitioners are more than 150 in number, and state that they constitute a three-fourths majority of the ratepayers and inhabitant householders resident within the Kyneton riding of the shire of Kyneton, which they desire should be constituted a Borough. They further state that the area of the riding does not exceed nine square miles, in which no point is distant more than six miles from any other, and contains not less than 300 inhabitant householders; that their interests and requirements are not in accord with those of the ratepayers in other parts of the shire; that the income of the riding last year amounted to £5000; and that their three representatives are liable to be outvoted by their nine colleagues; and they pray as follows:—

"That you will be pleased to make an Order severing Kyneton riding from the shire of Kyneton, and constituting it a borough, under the name of Kyneton, with boundaries," as described below, and subdivided into wards, as also described and named below; the council to consist of nine members.

The Kyneton riding of the Shire of Kyneton, as at present constituted, has boundaries thus described, viz. :—

Commencing at a point on the River Campaspe, being the south-eastern angle of section 26, parish of Carlsruhe; thence by the eastern boundary of sections 26, 29, 30, and 31 of the same parish to the north-east angle of section 31; thence west by the north boundary of said section 31, and a direct line to the north-eastern angle of suburban portion 18; thence west by the southern side of a Government road to the north-western angle of suburban portion 17; thence west one chain; thence north one chain to the south-eastern angle of section 46; thence north by the western side of a Government road to the north-eastern angle of section 42; thence by a line bearing north-westerly, being the south-western boundary of a Government road to a road forming the eastern boundary of portion D, section 45; thence by the eastern side of that road and by the northern and western boundaries of the race-

6. The Accountant, or such inspecting officer as he may appoint, shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the specification, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supply as to the quality or kind of timber, the same is to be decided by the General Overseer of Locomotives, whose decision shall be final.

8. Irregularity in quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor to such mulct, not exceeding Twenty-five pounds for each case, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government to terminate the contract forthwith.

9. For each and every week's delay in the delivery beyond the time specified in this contract the Government shall be entitled to deduct, as and for liquidated damages, the sum of Five pounds sterling.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.
