- 5. Every tender must be accompanied by a bank depositreceipt for a sum equal to Ten fer Cent. of the amount for
  which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the
  money to be lodged to the credit of the Deputy PostmasterGeneral, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in
