FURTHER PROROGUING THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Constitution Act* it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he might think fit; and also from time to time to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and to dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he should deem it expedient: And whereas the said Council and Assembly, called "The Parliament of Victoria," now stand prorogued until Tuesday the twenty-first day of May instant, and it is expedient to prorogue the same further: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria from Tuesday the twenty-first day of May instant until Tuesday the twenty-fifth day of June now next ensuing.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fourteenth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and in the forty-first year of Her Majesty's reign.

APPREHENSION OF SEAMEN DESERTING FROM FOREIGN MERCHANT VESSELS.

THE Governor has directed the subjoined Orders of Her Majesty in Council, which have been made from time to time, extending *The Foreign Deserters Act 1852* to Austria, Belgium, Chili, Denmark, France, Hanover, Hanse Towns, Italy, Mecklenburg-Schwerin, Morocco and Fez, Netherlands, Nicaragua, Oldenburg, Peru, Prussia, Russia, Sweden and Norway, Salvador and Spain, to be published for general information.

[CIRCULAR.]

Downing street, 21st January 1878.

SIR.—The Italian Government having represented that the authorities in New Zealand refused to assist in the apprehension of deserters from Italian merchant vessels, in accordance with the terms of the Order in Council of 11th June 1863, extending the provisions of *The Foreign Deserters Act 1852* to the Kingdom of Italy, I caused inquiries to be instituted into the matter, and it was found that the Order in question, and all others passed under this Act previous to the year 1865, of which a list is given in the margin, were not brought under the notice of this department at the time of their being passed, and consequently have never been communicated to the colonies.

As these Orders affect the whole of Her Majesty's Dominions, and as it is of importance that the colonies should therefore be in possession of them; I have now obtained copies, and transmit a set herewith for your information, and for publication in the colony under your government.

AUSTRIA, ETC.

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury and the Commissioners for the Affairs of India are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury and the Commissioners for the Affairs of India are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twentieth-ninth day of April 1878.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor in Council.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by one-fourth of the persons whose names are for the time being inscribed on the municipal roll of the Shire of Dundas has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order re-subdivide the Shire of Dundas into three several subdivisions, the boundaries whereof shall be as follow, that is to say:—

South Riding.—Commencing at the south-west angle of the parish of Moutajup; thence north by the boundary of that parish to the north-eastern angle of allotment 3, section 12, parish of Warrayure; thence west by the boundary of the last-mentioned parish to the north-west angle of the same parish; thence south by the boundary of the said parish to the north-eastern angle of the parish of North Hamilton; thence west to the north-western angle of allotment 1, section 13, parish of North Hamilton; thence south to the Grange Burn; thence by that burn to the eastern boundary of the borough of Hamilton; thence south and west by the boundary of that borough to the main road from Hamilton to Portland; thence south-west by that road to the shire boundary at the south-west angle of allotment 4, section 11, parish of Audley; and thence by the shire boundary to the commencing point.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight
Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything therein before contained the Governor might by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the Proclamation hereinafter mentioned: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do hereby revoke the Proclamation bearing date the seventeenth day of September One thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, prohibiting the cutting, digging, or removing of live or dead timber or particular description of timber or bark from certain Crown lands specified therein, and situate in the Wombat or Bullarook State Forest.

DISTRICT WHERE PUBLICANS' LICENSES MAY BE SPECIALLY GRANTED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, § 44) it was amongst other things enacted that notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the locality hereinafter mentioned to be a district where publicans' licenses may be specially granted, under the provisions of the 44th section of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE PARISH OF DRUMANURE.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fourteenth day of May in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and in the forty-first year of Her Majesty's reign.

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict.
