By His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

No. 506, § 19, 38, & 49), it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to annex an outlying district forming with the municipal district of some municipality one continuous area to such municipal district; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor in the sections of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition under the municipal seal of the shire of Goulburn, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order annex to the shire of Goulburn the outlying district described in such petition, and doth direct that the portion so annexed shall be attached to and form part of the Tabilk Riding of the said shire; and with the advice aforesaid doth hereby re-define the boundaries of the said shire of Goulburn as hereby added to, and also of the said Tabilk Riding of the said shire, in manner following, that is to say:-

THE SHIRE OF GOULBURN AS INCREASED.—Starting at the south-west boundaries of Wangambeham and Killen runs, and following the waters of the Pranjiip Creek to the Goulburn River; thence up that river and following the boundaries of the Longwood Electoral Division to the south-west angle of section A, parish of Avenel; thence by the western boundary of section A, the northern boundary of sections A and B, and the eastern boundary of section B, parish of Avenel, to the south-western angle of the Avenel Racecourse Reserve; thence easterly by the south boundary of said reserve and a direct line to a point in a direct line with the eastern boundary of the township of Avenel; thence to and by the eastern boundary of Avenel township to the boundary of the Longwood Electoral Division; thence by the said electoral boundary to the commencing point.

THE TABILK RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF GOULBURN.—Commencing at the south-eastern angle of allotment No. 29, parish of Pranjiip; thence by a line west to the Goulburn River, being the southern boundary of the parishes of Bunganaal and Wahring; thence by the Goulburn River to the junction of Hughes' Creek; thence by Hughes' Creek to the south-west angle of section A, parish of Avenel; thence by the

western boundary of section A, the northern boundary of sections A and B, and the eastern boundary of section B, parish of Avenel, to the south-western angle of the Avenel Racecourse Reserve; thence easterly by the south boundary of said reserve and a direct line to a point in a direct line with the eastern boundary of the township of Avenel; thence to and by the eastern boundary of Avenel township to the boundary of the Longwood electoral division; thence by the said electoral boundary and the boundary of the shire to the commencing point.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council to frame regulations for the management of commons, and in pursuance of Chapter XIII. of the Regulations made under the said Act by the Governor in Council, on the 26th day of May 1873, the Council of the Shire of Bannockburn, as managers of the commons situated within the shire, submit to the Board of Lands and Works, for approval, the following regulations for the management of the said commons:—

1st. In the construction and for the purposes of these regulations the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules; the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats, and the word "farmer" shall mean a person who resides on and uses for the purpose of agriculture, or dairying, land held by that person, either in fee, or under lease or license issued under the provisions of any Land Act.

2nd. Ratepayers, holders of business licenses, carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within the shire shall be respectively entitled to depasture on any of the above-named commons situated within five miles of their places of residence: four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole, or a portion thereof, in small cattle; on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A

farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him, may depasture on any such common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

8rd. The fees for depasturing cattle shall be paid quarterly in advance, on the first day of January, April, July, and October in each year, and all cattle remaining on a common seven days after expiration of the period for which payment has been made may be impounded without notice to the owners.

4th. The fees for depasturing on any of the above-named commons shall be as follow:—

(1.) For every cow, heifer, ox, or steer, One shilling and sixpence per quarter.

(2.) For every mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, or mule: Two shillings and sixpence per quarter.

(3.) For every head of small cattle, not less than Fourpence per quarter.

5th. No person shall be allowed to transfer his or her right of commonage, and the managers may require any person applying for a license to depasture cattle on any of the said commons to make a statutory declaration that such cattle are his or her *bona fide* property.

6th. No entire horse or rig shall be allowed to depasture on any such common, nor any bull, except such as shall be approved of by the managers in writing.

7th. No animal affected with any contagious or infectious disease shall be allowed upon any such common; and in the event of any cattle dying, and the owner thereof failing to remove the same within twelve hours of the receipt of notice, they shall be removed at the owner's expense.

8th. The managers may from time to time employ and remove such persons as herdsmen as they may deem requisite, and pay them out of the common fees; and every such person shall find security, to the satisfaction of the managers, for the proper execution of his duties, and the herdsman of each common shall, in the event of any cattle being missing from the commons, give notice to the owners thereof within twenty-four hours of his becoming aware of the absence of such cattle.

9th. In the event of any cattle being lost from any such common, and the herdsman thereof failing to give notice to the owners of such cattle within seven days, he shall pay to such owners the value of the cattle lost, provided that in no case shall payment for any cow, heifer, ox, or steer, exceed Three pounds per head, or for any mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, or mule, Five pounds per head.

10th. All cattle intended for depasturing on any such common shall be delivered to the herdsman at the common yard by the owner, who shall give the herdsman a memorandum in writing, of the number, brands, and description of such cattle, and the owner may upon application to the managers withdraw any cattle for which commonage fees have been paid and substitute others therefor.

11th. No cattle shall be taken off any such common without notice to the herdsman by the owners thereof, except in cases where they may be frequently required, when the managers may, if they think proper, grant permission in writing to the owners of any cattle to remove and replace the same in a quiet manner, so as not to disturb other stock unnecessarily, but the herdsman shall not be considered to be in any way responsible for such cattle.

12th. Should any common cattle acquire the habit of breaking into the neighboring paddocks, the owners thereof shall remove the same from the common within seven days of the receipt of notice to this effect, but such owner shall be allowed to replace such cattle so removed by others.

13th. The managers shall not be held responsible for any loss or injury to any cattle depasturing on any of the above-named commons.

14th. All unregistered cattle, and all cattle without the common brand, found on any such common shall be impounded forthwith.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justices, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds sterling for each offence.

SHIRE OF WHITTLESEA.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE WHITTLESEA TOWN COMMON.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act* of 1869 power is given to the Governor in Council to frame regulations, and in pursuance of regulations made by the Governor in Council on 26th May 1873, the Council of the Shire of Whittlesea, as managers of commons within the shire, make the following regulations in lieu of the regulations made on the 22nd December 1870, for the management of the Whittlesea Town Common:—

1. Persons entitled to depasture stock shall be resident householders in the township of Whittlesea, and the number allowed for each shall be four (4) head of cattle, and to be the *bona fide* property of the person permitted to depasture, failing which to forfeit the right to depasture.

2. The fees, to be paid in advance, shall be for each head of horned cattle, Six (6) shillings per annum, and for each

horse, Ten (10) shillings per annum; also, all calves or foals above the age of six (6) months to be at the same rate.

3. No bulls or entire horses shall be permitted to depasture on the common without the permission of the shire council.

4. Any person travelling with stock or teams will not be permitted to remain longer than twenty-four (24) hours on the common; and owners and occupiers of land adjoining the township of Whittlesea, who water their cattle in the township, shall keep the road in going to or coming from the water, and shall not remain longer than one hour in going or returning; and all cattle found trespassing shall be dealt with according to law.

5. Sheep may be depastured on such portions of the common as may be set apart for that purpose by the managers.

6. All persons entitled to depasture on the common shall muster their cattle, in their own yards, at the commencement of each quarter, and deliver them to the herdsman appointed by the shire council.

7. Any persons entitled to depasture on the common desirous of keeping goats, or geese, can do so on the following conditions, namely, every three (3) goats shall be deemed equal to one head of cattle, and four (4) geese shall bear the same proportion.

8. The shire council shall not be responsible for any stock that may stray or be impounded off the common.

9. All cattle shall be branded with the common brand, and no stock shall be removed without first giving notice to the herdsman.

10. Every person offending against any of the above regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £20 for such offence.

The foregoing regulations were made by the Council of the Shire of Whittlesea on the 11th day of March 1878.

DOOKIE PUBLIC CEMETERY.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE TRUSTEES OF THE DOOKIE PUBLIC CEMETERY.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground is opened.

2. The charge will be remitted for the burial of any person if their relations are unable to pay the costs and charges.

3. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug.

4. Wooden or iron fenceings allowed, but if not kept in proper repair may be removed by order of the trustees.

5. All orders for interment to be given to the sexton or other person appointed by the trustees on the day previous to the funeral.

6. In case an interment is to be made in any private grave the consent in writing of the proprietor must be left with the order.

7. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.

8. The procession to arrive at the cemetery at the hour appointed.

9. A plan of the cemetery and registry will be kept, and may be inspected.

10. The person in charge of the cemetery has orders to turn out any person behaving indecorously, or injuring anything in the cemetery.

11. The trustees reserve the right to recommend any alterations from time to time.

The births of 666 children, viz., 341 boys and 325 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of April. In the month of March 686 births were registered, or 20 more than in the month under review.

The deaths in April numbered 547, viz., 293 of males and 254 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 119. The deaths exceeded those in March by 66, and also the average of April during the previous ten years by 150. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been only 88 in excess of the average of those ten years.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 83.2° on the 8th, and the lowest was 44.1° on the 5th. The mean temperature of the month (59.6°) was a degree and a half above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (30.1°) took place on the 6th, viz., from a maximum of 79.4° to a minimum of 49.3°. The least range (7.1°) was on the 13th, viz., from a maximum of 61.2° to a minimum of 54.1°. The mean daily range was 16.9°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.978 inches) was below the average.

Of the deaths recorded during the month 53 per cent. were of males and 47 per cent. of females. Thirty-eight per cent. were of children under the age of 5 years, as against 40 per cent. in April 1877 and April 1876; 47 per cent. in April 1875; 32½ per cent. in April 1874; 42 per cent. in April 1873; 50 per cent. in April 1872; 49 per cent. in April 1871; 50 per cent. in April 1870; 47 per cent. in April 1869.

The deaths of 17 persons of 75 years or upwards were recorded during the month, viz., those of a male of occupation un stated, aged 75, of old age; a female, aged 77, of cancer of the ear; 2 gentlemen, a storeman, and a laborer, each aged 78, of old age; 3 females, each aged 80, of old age; a bootmaker, aged 82, of apoplexy; a widow, aged 82, of old age; a butcher, aged 83, of diarrhoea; a farmer, aged 86, 2 females, each aged 87, and a female aged 89, of old age.

Sixteen violent deaths were recorded during the month, 13 of which have been set down as accidental, and 3 as suicidal. The particulars are as follow:—A youth, aged 16, and a seaman, aged 15, died of fracture of the skull, the accident in the latter instance being caused by the kick of a horse; a laborer, aged 67, died of injury to the spine, the result of a fall from a scaffold; a gentleman, aged 89, died of the effects of a fall from a balcony; a fisherman, aged 46, was killed by falling from his cart; a female, aged 36, died of peritonitis induced by a fall; a female, aged 49, died of compound fracture of the leg, also the result of a fall; a laborer, aged 42, died of hemorrhage from a wound in the head, cause unknown; a female child, aged 7 months, died of a scald received by the upsetting of a kettle; a laborer, aged 43, died of the effects of carbolic acid swallowed in mistake; a boy, aged 12, and a mariner, aged 33, were accidentally drowned in the River Yarra; a male child, aged 21 days, was suffocated in bed. The suicidal deaths were those of a seaman, aged 34, who cut his throat; a carpenter, aged 52, who died of the effects of a poisonous compound, self-administered; and a female, aged 59, who hanged herself. The two last were stated to be laboring under temporary insanity.

One hundred and twenty-two deaths, or 22 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—73 in the Melbourne Hospital, 7 in the Immigrants' Home, 3 in the Children's Hospital, 14 in the Alfred Hospital, 7 in the Lying-in Hospital, 10 in the Benevolent Asylum, 3 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Homœopathic Hospital.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 212, of which 113, or 53 per cent., were of males; and 99, or 47 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 144 were under one year of age, 36 were between one and two, 16 were between two and three, 9 were between three and four, and 7 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 335. Of these, 180, or 54 per cent., were males and 155, or 46 per cent., were females; 15 were between five and ten, 18 were between ten and fifteen, 27 were between fifteen

and twenty, 17 were between twenty and twenty-five, 26 were between twenty-five and thirty, 19 were between thirty and thirty-five, 34 were between thirty-five and forty, 26 were between forty and forty-five, 40 were between forty-five and fifty, 28 were between fifty and fifty-five, 24 were between fifty-five and sixty, 23 were between sixty and sixty-five, 13 were between sixty-five and seventy, 13 were between seventy and seventy-five, 6 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 11 were upwards of eighty.

The most fatal zymotic disease in April was typhoid fever, which caused 53 deaths as against 47 in March. Deaths from scarlatina also increased from 3 to 7, deaths from croup from 5 to 8, and deaths from dysentery from 4 to 11. On the other hand deaths from diarrhoea fell from 76 to 41, and whooping-cough, which caused 8 deaths in March disappeared altogether from the list of fatal diseases in April. Diphtheria caused 5 deaths in both months. Phthisis in the month under review was the most fatal of all complaints, and caused 59 deaths as against 49 deaths in March.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, § 44) it was amongst other things enacted that notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the locality hereinafter mentioned to be a district where publicans' licenses may be specially granted, under the provisions of the 44th section of the said Act, that is to say:—

BUNBARTHA, in the parish of Tallygaroopna, in the county of Moira.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twentieth day of May in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and in the forty-first year of Her Majesty's reign.
