DUNED RESERVE FOR RACING, ETC.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT
OF THE RESERVE FOR RACING AND RECREATION PURPOSES
AT DUNED.

WE, Robert Fletcher, Frank Ormond Robertson, Charles Joseph Elden, William Irving, Alexander Macdonald, Michael Coogan, and James Huié, the duly appointed committee of management of the land temporarily reserved by order of 22nd February 1869, as a site for racecourse and other purposes of public recreation at Duned, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management of the said reserve, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, except when required for special purposes.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency, as regards his or her dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the fences, gates, trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the committee of management being first obtained.
6. Any person committing in the said reserve, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being therein, any of the following offences shall be removed from the reserve, together with any horses, carriages, or other vehicles in their care; notwithstanding such person may have purchased or shall or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the reserve or any part thereof:—
 - i. Assaulting any other person.
 - ii. Being drunk.
 - iii. Riding, crossing, or trespassing upon the course, or any part of it, during a race meeting, or when the horses are prepared to start, or are running for any race.
 - iv. Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
 - v. Behaving improperly or riotously.
7. No person shall ride upon any part of the reserve, or train a horse thereon, at any time, without the consent in writing of the committee of management, and paying such fee as may be fixed from time to time by the said committee.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding five pounds for each offence, and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and may be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

I HAVE the honor to hand my report of the district, in accordance with section (12) twelve of *The Scab Act*, for the quarter ending to-day.

Since my last report the re-adjustment of boundaries of districts has materially enlarged this, by absorbing all the Ballarat on the eastern side of the Hopkins River, and that river forming the western boundary from its source to the sea.

Sheep from this district continue to be sent into New South Wales, and during the quarter I have given certificates for (99,959) ninety-nine thousand nine hundred and fifty-nine sheep, making in all, since their admission, (103,043) one hundred and three thousand and forty-three sheep. This has been a great boon, enabling owners to reduce the numbers on their overstocked runs, to the mutual benefit of both colonies.
