CAUTION AGAINST THE DISPERSION OF DISEASED GRAPE-VINES.

A CONFERENCE of Delegates from the Geelong, Sandhurst, and Melbourne Vinegrowers Associations having represented to the Government that it is necessary to exercise a specially watchful supervision over all the vineyards in Victoria during the ensuing spring, with a view to the eradication of the disease in grape-vines caused by the insect known as *Phylloxera Vastatrix*, all owners of vineyards and other persons cultivating vines are hereby cautioned against introducing into localities at present free from infection rooted vines or vine cuttings from the Geelong or any other infected district.

All vinegrowers are hereby reminded that under *The Act for the eradication of Diseases in Vines* (No. 595) the Inspectors of Vineyards and their assistants are empowered to enter, without notice, upon any land in which any grape vines may be planted or growing, and may be authorized to take all measures for the eradication of disease by destroying the vines, or by other treatment as the case may require.

FISHERIES ACT 1873.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Fisheries Act 1873* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council from time to time, by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, might define the limits of and what waters should be deemed to be, and what should be deemed the mouth or other boundary of any river, creek, stream, bay, estuary, or lake; and might fix a distance from the mouth of any or every river, creek, or stream within which nets and fixed engines were not to be used: And whereas it is expedient to cancel so much of a Proclamation, dated 11th December 1876, as relates to the rivers La Trobe, Avon, Mitchell, Tambo, and Nicholson, and McLellan's Strait, and to define the mouths or boundaries of the same as under: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby cancel so much of the Proclamation, dated 11th December 1876, as is above mentioned, and do define the limits of, and what waters shall be deemed to be, and what shall be deemed the mouth or other boundary of, the rivers, creeks, and streams below mentioned, and do fix the distance from the mouth of the said rivers, creeks, or streams within which nets and fixed engines are not to be used, as follows, viz.:-

LA TROBE AND AVON RIVERS.

In Lake Wellington, a line running south by west from Swell Point to a beacon erected two (2) miles to the south-east by east of the entrance of the La Trobe River.

MITCHELL, TAMBO, AND NICHOLSON RIVERS.

In Lake King, a line running east from the east point of Eagle Point Bay (Eagle Point) to the Tambo Bluff.

THE CHANNEL OF COMMUNICATION BETWEEN LAKE WELLINGTON AND LAKE VICTORIA KNOWN AS McLELLAN'S STRAIT (WHICH IS TO BE DEEMED A "STREAM" WITHIN THE MEANING OF "THE FISHERIES ACT 1873").

Western Mouth.—In Lake Wellington, a line running south by west-half-west from a beacon placed on the shore near the foot of Mount Cunningham (about two (2) miles to the northward of the western entrance of the strait) to another beacon erected on the shore two (2) miles to the south-westward of the said western entrance.

Eastern Mouth.—In Lake Victoria, a line running south-east by south from a beacon erected on the shore between Jones' and Blond Bays (about two (2) miles to the north-eastward of the eastern entrance of the strait) to another beacon erected on a point of land two (2) miles due east of the said entrance.

N.B.—All the above bearings are magnetic.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-sixth day of June in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and in the forty-second year of Her Majesty's reign.

2. Every person offending against this Regulation, on refusing to pay upon demand the fees specified therein, shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence.

Names of Trustees.—The Right Reverend Martin Crane, D.D., Bishop of Sandhurst; the Reverend Stephen Reville, D.D., of Sandhurst; the Reverend James Joseph McGillicuddy, of Echuca; Thomas Mitchell, of Echuca East; and Philip Nolan, of Wharparilla.

Power of Disposition.—Power to sell, lease, mortgage, exchange, or otherwise dispose of, subject to the written approval of the Roman Catholic Bishop of Sandhurst for the time being, or (in case of his death) of the person or persons administering the affairs of the diocese. The bishop or such person as aforesaid to have power to remove trustees and appoint new trustees, and to fill up all vacancies occurring in trusteeship.

Purposes to which Proceeds of Disposition are to be applied.—To such purposes of the Roman Catholic Church as may from time to time be agreed upon by the Roman Catholic Bishop of Sandhurst and a majority of the trustees.

REGULATIONS FOR COMMONS.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations for Commons.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF COMMONS SPECIFIED HEREUNDER WITHIN THE SHIRE OF ALEXANDRA.

WHEREAS by The Land Act 1869 power is given to the Governor in Council to frame regulations for the management of com-

mons, and in pursuance of the provisions of chapter XIII. of the regulations made under the said Act by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of May 1873, the council of the shire of Alexandra, as managers for the Gobur, Yarek, Whanre-garwen, Acheroon, and Alexandra commons respectively, submit to the Board of Land and Works for approval the following regulations for the management of the said commons respectively:—

1. In the construction and for the purposes of these regulations the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules. The words "small cattle" shall mean sheep. Words importing the singular number shall mean and include the plural number, and words importing the plural number shall mean and include the singular number, and words importing male persons shall include females.

2. Ratepayers within the shire, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers, may depasture on a common, within a distance of five miles from their places of residence respectively, four head of large cattle. A farmer, having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him, may depasture on such common one additional head of large cattle for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him. Provided always that no person shall be entitled to depasture any cattle upon more than one common.

3. The fees for depasturing cattle on a common shall be payable to the herdsman of such common half-yearly, in advance, and shall be at the rate of four shillings (4s.) per annum for every head of horned cattle, and seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) per annum for each horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, and mule. The fees for depasturing small cattle shall be as provided for in special licenses for same, which may be granted by the managers. No fees shall be charged for cattle under nine months old whose dams are lawfully depasturing on the common.

4. The managers may grant to butchers or slaughtermen special licenses to depasture, for such periods of time as may be agreed upon, cattle intended for slaughter, on the following terms, viz.:—Large cattle (not to exceed fifteen in number) 6d. per head per week, to be paid in advance. And the managers may grant to dairymen a special license to depasture a number of cattle for dairy purposes only, not exceeding twenty head of large cattle, upon payment at the rate of four shillings (4s.) per head for such term of three months.

5. No person shall depasture a goat on any common without a special license from the managers, and the managers may grant such special licenses to holders of miners' rights actually engaged in mining, to depasture on a common a number of goats not to exceed four (4) for each person. The fees for depasturing goats shall be two shillings (2s.) per annum, payable in advance.

6. No person shall depasture cattle on the common unless such cattle be his or her own property.

7. No animal affected with any disease shall be allowed to depasture on any common, and, so soon as the herdsman of any common shall discover that any cattle registered on such common is infected with any such disease, he shall forthwith give notice thereof to the owner of such cattle, and also to the nearest inspector of stock having jurisdiction in the district in which such common is situated, and shall also forthwith give notice to the managers of the common. It shall be the duty of the herdsman to observe and carry out all the requirements of the Acts of the Parliament of Victoria in force for the time being relating to diseases of animals which are demanded of owners or persons in charge of diseased cattle, so far as such requirements can be held to apply to commons, or the managers or persons in charge thereof.

8. No person shall be allowed to depasture on a common an entire horse or bull, except with the consent in writing of the managers.

9. No cattle shall be removed from a common by the owner, or by any person on his behalf, until all fees for commonage due in respect of such cattle shall have been paid, nor until after such reasonable notice shall have been given to the herdsman as will enable him to attend at the removal if he thinks it necessary.

10. If any cattle while registered and actually depasturing on a common shall be sold by the owners thereof, but not removed, neither the managers nor the herdsman of the common shall be liable or responsible for any loss, damage, costs, penalties, or forfeitures which may happen to or be incurred by the owners thereof in respect of such cattle.

11. The managers will keep books in the forms prescribed by Schedules A and B hereto annexed. All licenses for depasturing shall be in the form in Schedule A, and shall be signed by the secretary of the shire. The book of accounts to be kept by the managers shall be in the form in Schedule B; and, at the time of preparing the annual balance-sheet of the shire, a separate balance-sheet of the accounts of all the commons within the shire shall be prepared and audited by the shire auditors, and the same, when certified to be correct by the shire auditors, shall be forthwith published in the newspaper in which the shire advertisements are appointed to be published; and copy of such account shall be forwarded to the Board of Land and Works.

12. All books of accounts, or licenses, registers, plans, and other documents relating to the commons and to the management thereof, shall be open to the inspection of any persons entitled to commonage at all reasonable times during the hours in which the office of the shire hall shall be open for business upon payment of a searching fee of One shilling.

HERDSMAN.

The cattle depasturing on any common are in the care and custody of a herdsman appointed by the managers, and he is responsible for the efficient carrying out of these regulations. He shall also conform to any special instruction issued to him by the managers relative to the registration, custody, and delivery to owners of the cattle on the common for which he is a herdsman, and to the prevention of trespass thereon of cattle other than travelling cattle, for which no commonage fees shall have been paid. He shall also provide security by approved bond with two sureties for the honest and faithful discharge of his duties, in such amount (not less than £50) as the managers may deem adequate.

The herdsman shall register the permanent brands, or brand with the common brand, all cattle registered on the common. All cattle not registered or branded with the common brand shall be deemed to be trespassing on the common, and such cattle shall be impounded. The register-book shall be in the form prescribed by the managers, and shall be supplied to the herdsman.

The herdsman, for all fees received by him, shall give printed receipts in the form of Schedule A hereto annexed, consecutively numbered, the butts of which receipts must be retained for inspection; and he shall forward to the managers, on the first Tuesday in each month, a certified account, together with all moneys received by him on their behalf during the preceding month, and a return showing the number of the various kinds of cattle then on the common. The herdsman's monthly return shall be a copy of his register-book for the period.

The herdsman of every common shall assist to muster and brand all cattle registered on such common; and in the event of his missing any cattle from the common shall, within forty-eight hours from the time of missing the cattle, give notice to the owners thereof that such cattle are missing.

The herdsman shall be responsible for any penalties, damages, trespass rates, or costs incurred by and recovered from any owner of cattle lawfully depasturing on the common in any case where such penalties, damages, trespass rates, or costs shall in the opinion of the managers have been occasioned by the neglect of the herdsman.

RECOVERY OF FEES AND FINES.

When the owners of cattle depasturing on the commons, or either of them, refuse or neglect to pay the prescribed fees within 21 (twenty-one) days from the date from which they may be due, such fees may be recovered in a summary way before a court of petty sessions.

Any person who shall infringe any of these regulations, shall, on conviction thereof before a court of petty sessions, forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty not exceeding £20 (Twenty pounds), and every such penalty may be recoverable in a summary way before a court of petty sessions.

The following shall be the purposes to which the residue of fees paid in respect of depasturage on such commons, after paying incidental expenses, shall be applied, viz., to making improvements on the said commons and aiding charitable institutions, as the said shire council shall direct, subject to the concurrence of the Board of Land and Works first obtained thereto.

3. Orders will be supplied in turn, to be regulated by the post date upon the envelope enclosing the same, and when two or more orders shall bear the same date, then alphabetically.

4. When an order cannot be supplied in full, a refund shall be made to the person whose name appears in the deposit-receipt; but such refund shall be made only on the certificate of the Superintendent of the State Nursery, and shall be only for the amount named in his certificate.

5. The Superintendent of the State Nursery will pack, address, and deliver the trees at the Macedon railway station, unless any purchaser should elect personally to superintend the same or should appoint another to do so in his behalf, but in such case no deduction in the prices will be made as an allowance for cost of packing.

6. All charges levied upon the trees subsequent to their delivery at the railway station, Macedon, shall be borne by the consignee.

7. This department will deliver the trees in good order at the Macedon railway station, but it will not undertake any liability in respect of the loss, miscarriage, detention, non-delivery, damage, or decay of the same subsequent to their delivery thereat.

The births of 814 children, viz., 433 boys and 381 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of May. In the month of April 666 births were registered, or 148 less than in the month under review.

The deaths registered in May numbered 435, viz., 246 of males and 189 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 379. The deaths were less by 12 than those recorded in April, but exceeded the average of May during the previous ten years by 57. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of those ten years by 9 only.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 66°9' on the 21st, and the lowest was 33°2' on the 16th. The mean temperature of the month (52°0') was nearly three-quarters of a degree below the

average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (28°8') took place on the 18th, viz., from a maximum of 63°0' to a minimum of 34°2'. The least range (7°3') was on the 14th, viz., from a maximum of 58°6' to a minimum of 51°3'. The mean daily range was 16°5'. The mean atmospheric pressure (30·068 inches) was a fraction above the average.

Of the deaths recorded during the month males contributed 57 per cent., and females 43 per cent. Twenty-six per cent. were of children under the age of 5 years, as against 34 per cent. in May 1877; 38 per cent. in May 1876; 37 per cent. in May 1875; 39 per cent. in May 1874; 40 per cent. in May 1873; 46 per cent. in May 1872; 39 per cent. in May 1871; 38 per cent. in May 1870; 43 per cent. in May 1869; and 45 per cent. in May 1868.

Twenty-two deaths of persons of the age of 75 years or upwards were registered during the month, viz., those of a carter, aged 75, of cancer; a man cook, aged 75, of apoplexy; a female, aged 75, of old age; a cook, aged 77, of epilepsy; 2 females, each aged 77, of hydatids of liver and apoplexy respectively; a laborer and a gentleman, each aged 78, of bronchitis and old age respectively; a female, aged 78, of bronchitis; a laborer, aged 79, and a baker, aged 80, of disease of the brain; a female, aged 80; an accountant, aged 82, a female, aged 83, and 2 females, each aged 84, of old age; a groom, aged 85, of congestion of the lungs; 2 females, each aged 88, of apoplexy and bronchitis respectively; a shepherd and a female servant, each aged 89, of old age; and a blacksmith, aged 95, of old age.

Twenty-two deaths from external causes were recorded during the month, of which 19 were ascribed to accident and 3 to suicide. The following are the particulars:—A boy, aged 16, a female, aged 41, and a time-keeper, aged 55, died of injuries resulting from falls; a carpenter, aged 50, died of fracture of the leg caused by an explosion of nitro-glycerine; a blacksmith, aged 28, died of injuries received by a fall of gravel; a farm-laborer, aged 50, died of accidental injuries to the lungs and fracture of the ribs; a market-gardener, aged 54, died of the results of an accidental fracture of the skull; an agent, aged 46, died of the effects of a gunshot wound in the head; a boy, aged 11, died from injuries to the leg caused by the wheel of a dray passing over it; a boy, aged 5, was accidentally drowned; a shop-boy, aged 14, a station-manager, aged 50, a quartz-miner, aged 54, a female, aged 35, a male, of occupation unstated, aged 45, a male, aged 26, a housekeeper, aged 47, were found drowned—the three first in the River Yarra, and the two last in Port Phillip Bay; a male child, aged 17 days, was suffocated in bed; a male child, aged 4 days, died of hæmorrhage of the umbilicus.

Of the suicidal deaths, a charwoman, aged 65, drowned herself, and a male, of occupation unstated, aged 31, also a foreman, aged 50, committed self-destruction whilst of unsound mind by laying themselves under the wheels of a railway train.

One hundred and two deaths, or 23 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—50 in the Melbourne Hospital, 8 in the Immigrants' Home, 1 in the Children's Hospital, 10 in the Alfred Hospital, 5 in the Lying-in Hospital, 14 in the Benevolent Asylum, 2 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 11 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, and 1 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 113, of which 62, or 55 per cent., were of males; and 51, or 45 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 69 were under one year of age, 20 were between one and two, 13 were between two and three, 7 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 322. Of these, 184, or 57 per cent., were males, and 138, or 43 per cent., were females; 21 were between five and ten, 13 were between ten and fifteen, 18 were between fifteen and twenty, 20 were between twenty and twenty-five, 22 were between twenty-five and thirty, 20 were between thirty and thirty-five, 24 were between thirty-five and forty, 20 were between forty and forty-five, 21 were between forty-five and fifty, 35 were between fifty and fifty-five, 31 were between fifty-five and sixty, 20 were between sixty and sixty-five, 22 were between sixty-five and seventy, 13 were between seventy and seventy-five, 10 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 12 were upwards of eighty.

Deaths from typhoid fever, which numbered 53 in April, fell to 40 in May. Deaths from scarlatina also fell from 7 to 2, deaths from dysentery from 11 to 2, and deaths from diarrhoea from 41 to 13. On the other hand deaths from diphtheria increased from 5 to 11, and deaths from croup from 8 to 11. Eight deaths in May were set down to childbirth or its consequences; and as the births registered numbered 814, it follows that 1 death of a mother occurred to about every 100 births.

LACEPEDE ISLANDS—WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

THE Government of Western Australia invites tenders from persons desirous of obtaining the sole right to remove guano from the Lacepede Islands group, which is situated in about 17° south latitude, and 122° east longitude from Greenwich, and on which it is calculated there are now at least 40,000 tons of guano. Such tenders must be sent in to the Colonial Secretary, Perth, Western Australia, on or before the 15th October next, but the Government does not bind itself to accept the highest or any tender.

All tenders will have to state the price or royalty offered per ton for the guano (1) if shipped in the natural state; (2) if artificially prepared, dried, or sifted before shipment.

The person whose tender may be accepted (hereinafter spoken of as "the contractor") will have to bind himself to the following conditions:—

1. To remove the whole of the guano that there may be on the islands.
2. To take it away at the minimum rate of twenty thousand tons a year.
3. To remove the guano in such a manner and from such places as may be from time to time pointed out by the Government Officer stationed on the islands; and the contract will contain a clause providing that in case of the breach or neglect of these conditions the contract shall be void, and the contractor shall forfeit all buildings, erections, and plant that he may have set up on any of the islands, and also the sum of Two thousand pounds hereinafter mentioned.

The contractor will be required, within seven days after receiving a notification by telegraph or otherwise that his tender is accepted, and before the issue of any license, to deposit in the hands of the Western Australian Government, or of such person as they may name as their agent in this behalf, the sum of Two thousand pounds, as security for the due performance of the contract, and this sum will be retained by the Government until the termination of the contract, and will be liable to forfeiture as hereinbefore mentioned. He will also be required at the same time to pay a like sum of Two thousand pounds, by way of royalty, in advance. The contractor will at no time be at liberty to remove any guano unless the royalty agreed upon has been paid, and no less sum than Two thousand pounds will be accepted at any time in payment of royalty until such time as there is left on the islands a quantity of guano the agreed royalty on which shall be less than Two thousand pounds.

The only instructions that will be given to the Government Officer stationed on the islands, and which he will be required to insist upon with regard to the manner in which and the places from which the guano shall be removed, will be to divide the islands into convenient sections, to point out the section or sections from which guano may be removed, and to require that the whole of any one section be cleared before any new ground is entered on.

The quantity of guano taken by each ship on which royalty has to be paid shall be ascertained by adding 25 per cent. to the registered tonnage of timber-built ships, and 40 per cent. to the registered tonnage of iron-built ships; provided that, if the captain or agent of any ship, or the Government Officer, shall in any instance be dissatisfied with the foregoing arrangement, he shall be at liberty to cause the ship to be exactly measured according to Lloyd's rules, and the number of cubic feet so ascertained divided by 40 shall be taken to be the tonnage capacity of the ship.

No tonnage, light, or harbor dues will be charged in any port of the colony on ships solely engaged in the guano trade, and no customs duties will be levied on goods and stores that may be landed on the islands for persons solely employed in the preparation and shipment of guano.

The contractor will be at liberty to erect on any or all of the islands any buildings, jetties, tramways, &c., and, subject to the conditions before expressed as to forfeiture, to remove the same at any time within six months of the termination of the contract.

No license for the shipment of guano under the regulations now in force will be granted after the 15th August next, and

every such license granted after the date hereof will provide for the compulsory removal of the guano for the shipment of which it is the permit before the 15th October next.

It will at all times be optional with the licensee to ship the guano in its natural state, or artificially prepared, dried, or sifted.

The contract to be entered into in pursuance of this notice shall be deemed to commence on 1st January 1879.

Each tender, unless otherwise expressed, shall be deemed to be open to acceptance by the Government for the space of one calendar month from the 15th October, and the Government shall be at liberty to accept any tender by notifying to the person making it, by telegraph, that his tender is accepted. Any person who shall tender, and, on his tender being accepted, shall fail to pay the two several sums of Two thousand pounds as hereinbefore set forth, shall be deemed to have broken his contract, and the Government shall thereupon be at liberty to accept any other tender, and to hold such person responsible for all loss consequent on his breach of contract.

A Bye-Law of the Shire of Bungaree, made under Section 213 of the Local Government Act 1874, and Numbered 2, for Regulating the Proceedings of Council, Officers, &c.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1874, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bungaree order as follows:—

1. In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the council.

2. At every meeting of the council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed as required by the Local Government Act 1874.

3. After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follow, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the council at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (1.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (2.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (3.) Presentation of reports.
- (4.) Ordinary business.
- (5.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (6.) Extraordinary business, and new rules and regulations.
- (7.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (8.) Notices of motion.
- (9.) Payments.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4. Whenever a division shall be demanded by any councillor, the councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold

up their hands, and the result shall be declared by the chairman.

5. All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the president and the secretary of the municipality, unless otherwise ordered by the council.

6. All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered and given by the intending mover to the shire secretary at the close of the meeting of the council, or if not required by law to be given at a meeting, then three clear days prior to the next meeting of council; and such secretary shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be carried.

7. No councillor shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

8. No motion except that for receiving the same shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application, until the next ordinary meeting of council after that at which it has been presented.

9. Except by leave of the council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and rendered by the shire secretary in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

10. No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the councillor who gave notice of the same, unless by some other councillor producing written authority from him to that effect.

11. No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

12. Any councillor desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the councillor (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon and the question of order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

13. Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the council thereon.

14. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the council.

15. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the council unless it be seconded, but a councillor may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the council by directing the president or chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

16. A councillor moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a councillor merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

17. The councillors in meeting of council shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of mayor, president, chairman, or councillor, as the case may require.

18. If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

19. The chairman shall rise in addressing the council to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

20. No councillor shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply or in explanation, when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

21. The chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

22. No councillor shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion or comment upon the words used by any other councillor in a previous debate, and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on councillors shall be deemed highly disorderly.

23. Whenever any councillor shall make use of any expression disorderly, or capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, the councillor so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the council.

24. A councillor called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.

25. Any councillor using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order, or to withdraw and to apologise for such conduct, and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

26. Any person not being a councillor who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the council, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

27. Any councillor not attending in compliance with an order for a call of the whole council, without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof, shall be guilty of an offence.

28. Any councillor may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the council applying to the question under discussion.

29. The council shall vote by show of hands, and any councillor present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

30. The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the council, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

31. No second or subsequent amendment whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

32. If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

33. If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved; but only one amendment shall be submitted to the council for discussion at a time.

34. The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

35. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

36. Any councillor may protest against any resolution of the council; and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the council by the protesting councillor in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the shire secretary, and signed by such councillor, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes, if declared by a majority of the council to be not in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful to the council.

37. If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the councillors present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted, on motion upon notice.

38. If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice-book for a future day, on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

39. Minutes of all proceedings of committees, as well as of their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committee's minute-book, and being signed by the chairman of the committee, shall be presented to the council; and the shire secretary, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of committees.

40. The shire secretary shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time thereafter, by order of the council, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee, or of any two members of the committee.

41. No petition shall be presented after the council shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

42. It shall be incumbent on every councillor presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the council, and that the contents do not violate any bye-law or any provision hereof.

43. Every petition shall be in writing and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every skin or sheet on which it is written.

44. Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

45. No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

46. Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

47. No councillor or officer of the council, and no assessor or auditor of the municipality shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the council, or for any work to be done for the council.

48. All the plans and specifications for any public work shall be laid before the council at least six days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, and be open for inspection by any ratepayer during that time.

49. Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained in this subdivision may be suspended for a special purpose, on motion upon notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the council.

50. If any person shall be guilty of any wilful offence or misfeasance, or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission contrary to any provision contained in this subdivision, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding five pounds.

The provisions of this bye-law shall supersede and be in lieu of all standing orders at present in force for the council, and they are repealed hereby.

BOROUGH OF BRIGHTON.

BYE-LAW No. 33.

A Bye-Law of the Borough of Brighton, made under section 483 of the Local Government Act 1874, for regulating the use and enjoyment of the public recreation land known as the "Beach Reserve."

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act 1874," the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Brighton order as follows:-

1. No person shall enter or remain in the "Beach Reserve" who shall offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

2. No person shall set up any booth, tent, or other erection, or light any fire, or stick any bill in the reserve, unless the consent of the council in writing shall have been first obtained.

3. No person shall hawk or offer for sale any goods, articles, or things without having previously obtained written permission from the council.

4. No person shall in any way damage or remove any soil, tree, shrub, placard or notice-board, or disfigure by cutting or otherwise, the fences or seats in the reserve, or throw stones, or discharge fire-arms therein.

5. No person shall leave or deposit in the reserve any empty bottles, broken glass, cast-off clothing, litter, or any offensive matter or thing.

6. No person shall put in the reserve any poultry, goats, pigs, sheep, cattle, or other animals; and no conveyance or vehicle shall enter or remain, except in such portions of the reserve prescribed or set apart by the council.

Any person who shall offend against this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
