POSTED IN VICTORIA.

THE Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following amended Regulation relating to packets posted in Victoria, to take effect from the 1st July 1878:-

Every packet must be sent either without a cover (in which case it must not be fastened, whether by means of gum, wafer, sealing-wax, postage-stamp, or otherwise), or in a cover entirely open at one or both of the ends, or one or both of the sides, so as to admit of the contents being easily withdrawn for examination. For the greater security of its contents the packet may be tied at the ends with string; but, in such case, the postmaster is authorized to cut the string, though if he do so he must again tie up the packet as before. Samples of seeds, drugs, and so forth, which cannot be sent in open covers, may be enclosed in bags of linen or other material, tied round the neck, so as to be easily loosened and refastened, or (as inland packets only) in closed transparent bags; but foreign packets must not be sent in closed bags, although transparent.

2. When a fee is payable under the Act on the lodgment with the Registrar of any application to register any society, or any amendment of rules, no further fee shall be payable under the regulations in respect of the acknowledgment of registry of such society or amendment of rules.

## "THE LAND TAX ACT 1877."

## AUSTRALIA—EAST COAST—MORETON BAY.

## 1. ALTERATIONS IN YELLOW PATCH LIGHT.

THE Queensland Government has given notice, that on 20th December 1877 the following alterations were made in Yellow Patch light, Moreton Bay:—

The light (fixed) is now dioptric of the fourth order, and will show white between the bearings S.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W. and S.E. by E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  E.; red from S.E. by E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  E. to the fairway buoy (S.E. by E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  E.); and white from S.E. by E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  E. to E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  N.

NOTE.—The seaward white light kept in sight leads westward of Hutchinson Shoal and north-eastward of the shoal water extending off North Banks.

When the light changes from red to white on the south-western edge of the red sector, a vessel will be on the line of Yellow Patch Light and the fairway buoy.

DIRECTIONS.—Vessels approaching Moreton Bay from the northward and entering by Howe Channel—with fine weather and smooth water—should, after making the fixed white light on Comboyuro Point, be careful not to enter the red sector of Yellow Patch light until Comboyuro Point light is obscured on a S. by E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  E. bearing.

On Comboyuro Point light being obscured, haul gradually to the southward, enter the red sector of Yellow Patch light, and on opening out Comboyuro Point light, steer for it keeping on the edge of the white light. When Yellow Patch light comes nearly in line with Cape Moreton light, edge to the westward and open out the fixed white light on Cowan Cowan Point, which, bearing S. by E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  E., leads westward of Venus Bank.

Leaving Moreton Bay at night, by Howe Channel, after passing the line of leading lights for Middle Channel, keep on the eastern edge of Comboyuro Point light until Yellow Patch light changes from white to red, the vessel will then be in a position north-westward of the fairway buoy, and may at once steer seaward.

Attention to these directions will take a vessel through Howe Channel in not less than 16 feet at low water; by similarly keeping the eastern edge of Cowan Cowan Point light just open, the least water will be 19 feet. Cowan Cowan Point light, however, being more distant, is not as good a guide as Comboyuro Point light.

## TRINITY BAY.

## 2. TEMPORARY LIGHT ON LOW ISLES.

Also, that on 27th December 1877, and pending the construction of a lighthouse on Low Isles, a light was temporarily exhibited from the westernmost Low Isle, Trinity Bay:—

The light is a fixed white light, elevated 40 feet above high water, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 8 or 9 miles.

## AN ORDINANCE

(Enacted by the Governor of the Colony of Fiji with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.)

## REGARDING QUARANTINE.

(L.S.) ARTHUR GORDON.

9th March 1877.

Preamble.—WHEREAS it is expedient to repeal an Ordinance passed in Council on the 11th day of February 1876 intitled "An Ordinance regarding Quarantine" and to make other provisions in lieu thereof:

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council, as follows:

I. Short title.—Ordinance No. III. of 1876 intitled "An Ordinance regarding Quarantine" is hereby repealed.

II. Permanent Quarantine stations appointed.—Those islands or parts of islands enumerated in Schedule A hereto attached shall be set apart and appropriated as permanent quarantine stations at which may be landed any persons cargo or baggage from any vessel in quarantine and near which any vessel in quarantine may be anchored for the performance of such quarantine.

III. Governor may appoint other stations.—The Governor may from time to time by public notice to that effect in the Royal Gazette set apart and appropriate either permanently or temporarily any other locality as a quarantine station and may authorize the landing thereof of any persons or goods from any vessel performing quarantine.

IV. Appointment of officers.—The Governor may from time to time appoint a superintendent of any quarantine station and may as occasion requires from time to time appoint such guardians being constables of police or others as he may deem requisite to ensure the due observance of the provisions of this Ordinance.

V. No communication allowed till vessel is admitted to pratique.—Penalty.—No vessel coming from beyond the colony shall communicate with any island or place within the colony until she shall have received pratique at a port of entry and every such vessel on approaching a port of entry with a view of communicating shall hoist a yellow flag by day or a green light by night at the mast or foremast head and such yellow flag by day and such green light at night shall be kept hoisted

by such vessel until such vessel shall be admitted to pratique and the master of any vessel or any other person convicted of an offence against the provisions of this section shall forfeit any sum not exceeding Two hundred pounds or be imprisoned for any term not exceeding six months.

**VI. Vessel not to approach within one hundred yards of other vessel before being admitted to pratique.**—No one to approach such vessel.—It shall be unlawful for any vessel that has not been admitted to pratique to approach within one hundred yards of any other vessel in harbour or for any person except as provided for in this Ordinance to leave a vessel or to transmit any article therefrom or for any person except a Health Officer or Pilot and their respective boats' crews to approach within one hundred yards of a vessel before such vessel shall have been admitted to pratique and any person offending in any of these particulars shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding One hundred pounds or to three months' imprisonment.

**VII. How pilot is to approach vessel.**—Copy of Ordinance to be handed to Master.—The Pilot shall approach the vessel on the windward side within speaking distance and shall not go alongside nor on board unless he shall believe that the vessel is free from infectious or contagious disease or unless his not boarding such vessel would endanger her safety. As soon as convenient after his arrival alongside or on going on board he shall deliver to the Master or Surgeon of the vessel a copy of this Ordinance and all regulations made in virtue of the powers herein contained and in the event of his going on board the vessel he shall remain there till such vessel shall have received pratique.

**VIII. How Health Officer shall approach vessel and as to admission to pratique.**—The Health Officer shall approach the vessel on the windward side within speaking distance but he shall not go on board nor grant the vessel pratique until there shall have been delivered to him a copy of the Schedule B hereto attached with the questions therein contained answered in writing and signed by the Master or Surgeon of the vessel.

**IX. Pilot may anchor vessel in certain cases.**—Whenever the Health Officer shall from any inevitable cause be prevented from going alongside any vessel before such vessel has entered the harbour the Master of such vessel or the Pilot on board such vessel may if satisfied that there is no infectious or contagious disease of a dangerous nature on board bring the vessel to anchor in the harbour but communication with such vessel shall not be allowed until such vessel has been admitted to pratique by the Health Officer.

**X. Penalty for failing to make true declaration.**—Every Master and every Surgeon of any vessel which shall have sailed from a place where there existed at the time of such sailing any infectious or contagious disease of a dangerous character or which shall have communicated otherwise than by signal with any vessel or place in which such infectious or contagious disease existed who shall fail to make a true declaration to the Pilot and Health Officer who shall come alongside or on board such vessel shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Two hundred pounds.

**XI. Penalty for failing to declare the existence of disease on board.**—Every Master or Surgeon of a vessel which shall have on board any person affected with any contagious or infectious disease of such a nature as to be dangerous to the public health who shall fail to declare the same to the Health Officer or Pilot or who shall attempt to conceal from the Health Officer any person so affected or who shall refuse or fail to bring every person on board such vessel before such Health Officer for inspection at the request of such Health Officer shall on conviction be punished by a fine which shall not be less than Forty pounds nor exceed Two hundred pounds or by imprisonment for not less than three nor more than twelve months and in aggravated cases these penalties may be cumulative.

**XII. Penalty if Surgeon fail to give information, and if Health Officer or Pilot allow introduction of disease.**—Any Surgeon of a vessel that shall fail to inform the Master thereof of the existence of any infectious or contagious disease of a dangerous nature on board such vessel and every Health Officer or Pilot that shall knowingly allow the introduction of such disease into any port in the colony shall on conviction be liable to the penalties provided in Section xi. of this Ordinance.

**XIII. Penalty for refusing to answer &c.**—Every person on board of any vessel arriving at any port of entry who shall refuse to answer or shall answer falsely or evasively the questions contained in Schedule B hereto attached or such questions as may be put to him by the Health Officer or Pilot respectively shall be liable to a fine which shall not exceed Two hundred pounds.

**XIV. Admission to pratique how indicated.**—When the Health Officer has admitted a vessel to pratique the same shall be indicated by hauling down the yellow flag or green light and communication with such vessel shall then be free.

**XV. When vessel shall be put in quarantine.**—Should the Health Officer from the answers to the questions contained in Schedule B hereto annexed or from any other source have reason to believe that danger to the public health might be apprehended by admitting any vessel to pratique he shall direct such vessel to be detained in quarantine and such vessel shall then be removed to a quarantine anchorage and shall anchor where the Harbor Master directs and shall continue to display the yellow flag by day and the green light by night until she shall have been admitted to pratique.

**XVI. When vessel is put in quarantine people on board may be landed.**—When a vessel has been brought to a quarantine anchorage as provided for in Section xv. the persons on board such vessel may if it is thought desirable by the Health Officer be landed at the quarantine station as well as any cargo or baggage that may be directed or allowed by such Health Officer but no person shall leave such vessel in quaran-

time nor transmit any article therefrom except to proceed or be taken to the quarantine station under the control of the officer in charge of such station.

**XVII. Penalty for approaching vessel or quarantine ground when in quarantine.**—Should any person except as provided for in this Ordinance approach within one hundred yards of any vessel in quarantine or within one hundred yards of the boundaries of any quarantine ground when a vessel is performing quarantine therein or of any quarantine station when used as such such person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding One hundred pounds and shall in addition be obliged to go into quarantine at his own expense and remain there until he can be safely liberated by the Health Officer. Provided always that the Governor may if he sees fit grant permission to any person to go into quarantine at his own expense to remain until admitted to pratique.

**XVIII. As to visiting party to vessel or quarantine ground in quarantine.**—Carrying provisions &c.—A party by land under the charge of an officer of police and displaying a yellow flag or a police or Harbour Master's boat flying a yellow flag may proceed as often as necessary so far as the boundary of the quarantine station or so far as one hundred yards from a vessel in quarantine in order to convey any communication to and from and whatever provisions and other necessities are required by those in quarantine and shall leave them in some safe place at the boundary of the quarantine station or in the case of a vessel in quarantine in a boat to be moored at a distance of one hundred yards from such vessel so that those on board such vessel may procure such provisions or necessities after the visiting party or boat shall have retired at least one hundred yards but any person in quarantine that shall approach or remain within one hundred yards of any of the visiting party or any of the visiting party that shall approach or remain within the same distance of any person in quarantine or any person that shall send or take away from a quarantine station or from any vessel in quarantine any article that has not previously been disinfected shall be liable to a fine not exceeding One hundred pounds.

**XIX. Vessels other than those coming from beyond the colony may be put in quarantine.**—When a Health Officer shall from any cause believe that it would be expedient for the benefit of the public health that any vessel other than those coming from beyond the colony shall be put in quarantine it shall be lawful for such Health Officer to direct that such vessel be put in quarantine and such vessel shall thereupon display a yellow flag by day and a green light by night and shall be dealt with as if such vessel were a vessel coming from beyond the colony and placed in quarantine.

**XX. As to direction of quarantine stations &c.**—Every vessel performing quarantine and every quarantine station while used as such shall be under the direction of the officer of police or other officer appointed by the Governor to the duty of such direction and all persons on board of such vessel or in such quarantine station shall be bound to obey all lawful orders issued by the said officer of police or other officer so long as such quarantine continues and every vessel shall if deemed necessary by the Health Officer be guarded by one or more constables as sanitary guards who shall be armed and who shall remain on board or by one or more armed guard-boats to be furnished by the Superintendent of Police or chief police officer at the locality and every such quarantine station shall be guarded by such a number of police constables or sanitary guards as shall be deemed necessary by the officer appointed to the direction of such quarantine station.

**XXI. Mode of indicating quarantine station.**—When any quarantine station is used as such a yellow flag shall be kept constantly flying at some conspicuous place in such station from sunrise to sunset and from sunset to sunrise such quarantine station shall exhibit a green light and the display of such flag or such light shall be deemed sufficient notice that such station and the land or sea surrounding it to the distance of one hundred yards are in quarantine.

**XXII. Persons escaping may be fired on.**—Any person who shall escape or attempt to escape from any quarantine station or from any vessel in quarantine may be brought back by force and if necessary to prevent his escape may be fired on.

**XXIII. Penalty for leaving quarantine station &c.**—Every person who being subjected to quarantine at any quarantine station shall on any pretence whatsoever leave such station until he shall have been admitted to pratique by the Health Officer shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding One hundred pounds or to imprisonment not exceeding three months.

**XXIV. Persons having communicated with vessel in quarantine to go into quarantine.**—Whoever shall have communicated with a vessel in quarantine whether such communication shall have taken place before or after the order for quarantine shall have been given and whoever shall have communicated with any person or place under quarantine who shall neglect or refuse to remain in or return to such vessel or place in which such person may have been ordered to perform quarantine as the case may be and to remain in such vessel or place respectively during the whole period of quarantine may upon an order from the nearest magistrate be arrested and brought back. Provided if such communication shall have been witnessed by any member of the police force or any special constable on duty at the place or vessel where it occurred the party offending may immediately and without warrant be apprehended by the same or any other member of the force or special constable.

**XXV. Person may embark on vessel in quarantine but must remain there.**—The penalties provided for in this Ordinance in regard to communication with vessels in quarantine shall not apply to the case of any person who shall embark in any vessel when in quarantine for the purpose of being a passenger therein or one of the officers or crew thereof. Provided that

nothing in this section shall be held to authorize any person who shall have embarked in any vessel for any of the purposes mentioned in this section to quit such vessel or to communicate with the shore or any other vessel in any harbour or roadstead in the colony respectively while such vessel first mentioned shall remain in quarantine and every person so embarking who shall in relation to such embarkation fail to obey any directions and orders which he shall receive in regard thereto from the officer of police or other officer appointed to direct the due observance of quarantine at any port of entry or quarantine station shall be liable to the penalties provided by this Ordinance for unlawful communication with a vessel in quarantine.

**XXVI. Person approaching quarantine ground through ignorance to be detained.**—Should any person through ignorance stress of weather or other accident land upon or approach within one hundred yards of any quarantine station when in quarantine or any vessel undergoing quarantine such person shall be detained in quarantine until he can safely be liberated by the Health Officer.

**XXVII. Boats' crews to remain on board if vessel is put in quarantine.**—All persons belonging to the Pilot's boat and to that of the Health Officer respectively who shall have been on board of the vessel either before or after the time when such vessel was ordered to perform quarantine shall remain on board such vessel or return thither as the case may be.

**XXVIII. Mode of prosecution.**—All offences under this Ordinance may be prosecuted before and adjudicated upon by any stipendiary magistrate in a summary manner.

**XXIX. Penalty for offences where penalty is not specified.**—Any person who shall commit a breach of the provisions of this Ordinance for which a specified penalty is not herein provided shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Fifty pounds or to imprisonment for any period not exceeding three months or to both if the convicting magistrate shall so think fit.

**XXX. Disposal of fines &c.**—All fines and penalties imposed under this Ordinance shall be received by the convicting magistrate to the use of the colony. Provided always where there shall be an informer a sum not exceeding one-half of any such fine or penalty may be paid to such informer if the Governor shall so direct.

**XXXI. Regulations may be made.**—There shall be made by the Governor in Council and published in the *Royal Gazette* as often as circumstances may require regulations concerning any of the provisions of this Ordinance which regulations may declare that any infraction thereof shall be punished by a fine which shall not exceed Fifty pounds or by any imprisonment not exceeding three months or both. All such regulations shall have the same effect to all intents and purposes as if they had been *verbatim* embodied herein except in so far as they shall be inconsistent with any provision hereof.

**XXXII. Irresponsibility of Crown as to loss or expense.**—No owner nor any person whatsoever on board of or connected with any vessel put in quarantine shall have any claim against the Crown for detention or any other loss or expense incurred in connection with such quarantine.

**XXXIII. Boundaries of quarantine station.**—The boundaries of the quarantine stations and anchorages shall be fixed by the Governor in Council and shall be notified in the *Royal Gazette*.

Passed in Council this eighth day of March in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, § 44) it was amongst other things enacted that notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the locality hereinafter described to be a district wherein publicans' licenses may be specially granted, under the provisions of section 44 of the said Act, that is to say:—

The place known as the township of Shepparton, in the parish of Shepparton, in the county of Moira.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this second day of July in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and in the forty-second year of Her Majesty's reign.

## LACEPEDE ISLANDS—WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

THE Government of Western Australia invites tenders from persons desirous of obtaining the sole right to remove guano from the Lacedpede Islands group, which is situated in about 17° south latitude, and 122° east longitude from Greenwich, and on which it is calculated there are now at least 40,000 tons of guano. Such tenders must be sent in to the Colonial Secretary, Perth, Western Australia, on or before the 15th October next, but the Government does not bind itself to accept the highest or any tender.

All tenders will have to state the price or royalty offered per ton for the guano (1) if shipped in the natural state; (2) if artificially prepared, dried, or sifted before shipment.

The person whose tender may be accepted (hereinafter spoken of as "the contractor") will have to bind himself to the following conditions:—

1. To remove the whole of the guano that there may be on the islands.
2. To take it away at the minimum rate of twenty thousand tons a year.
3. To remove the guano in such a manner and from such places as may be from time to time pointed out by the Government Officer stationed on the islands: and the contract will contain a clause providing that in case of the breach or neglect of these conditions the contract shall be void, and the contractor shall forfeit all buildings, erections, and plant that he may have set up on any of the islands, and also the sum of Two thousand pounds hereinafter mentioned.

The contractor will be required, within seven days after receiving a notification by telegraph or otherwise that his tender is accepted, and before the issue of any license, to deposit in the hands of the Western Australian Government, or of such person as they may name as their agent in this behalf, the sum of Two thousand pounds, as security for the due performance of the contract, and this sum will be retained by the Government until the termination of the contract, and will be liable to forfeiture as hereinbefore mentioned. He will also be required at the same time to pay a like sum of Two thousand pounds, by way of royalty, in advance. The contractor will at no time be at liberty to remove any guano unless the royalty agreed upon has been paid, and no less sum than Two thousand pounds will be accepted at any time in

payment of royalty until such time as there is left on the islands a quantity of guano the agreed royalty on which shall be less than Two thousand pounds.

The only instructions that will be given to the Government Officer stationed on the islands, and which he will be required to insist upon with regard to the manner in which and the places from which the guano shall be removed, will be to divide the islands into convenient sections, to point out the section or sections from which guano may be removed, and to require that the whole of any one section be cleared before any new ground is entered on.

The quantity of guano taken by each ship on which royalty has to be paid shall be ascertained by adding 25 per cent. to the registered tonnage of timber-built ships, and 40 per cent. to the registered tonnage of iron-built ships; provided that, if the captain or agent of any ship, or the Government Officer, shall in any instance be dissatisfied with the foregoing arrangement, he shall be at liberty to cause the ship to be exactly measured according to Lloyd's rules, and the number of cubical feet so ascertained divided by 40 shall be taken to be the tonnage capacity of the ship.

No tonnage, light, or harbor dues will be charged in any port of the colony on ships solely engaged in the guano trade, and no customs duties will be levied on goods and stores that may be landed on the islands for persons solely employed in the preparation and shipment of guano.

The contractor will be at liberty to erect on any or all of the islands any buildings, jetties, tramways, &c., and, subject to the conditions before expressed as to forfeiture, to remove the same at any time within six months of the termination of the contract.

No license for the shipment of guano under the regulations now in force will be granted after the 15th August next, and every such license granted after the date hereof will provide for the compulsory removal of the guano for the shipment of which it is the permit before the 15th October next.

It will at all times be optional with the licensee to ship the guano in its natural state, or artificially prepared, dried, or sifted.

The contract to be entered into in pursuance of this notice shall be deemed to commence on 1st January 1879.

Each tender, unless otherwise expressed, shall be deemed to be open to acceptance by the Government for the space of one calendar month from the 15th October, and the Government shall be at liberty to accept any tender by notifying to the person making it, by telegraph, that his tender is accepted. Any person who shall tender, and, on his tender being accepted, shall fail to pay the two several sums of Two thousand pounds as hereinbefore set forth, shall be deemed to have broken his contract, and the Government shall thereupon be at liberty to accept any other tender, and to hold such person responsible for all loss consequent on his breach of contract.
