## THE EXTRADITION ACT OF VICTORIA 1877 (No. 588).

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Extradition Act of Victoria 1877*, numbered DLXXXVIII., it was amongst other things enacted that the said Act should not come into operation until Her Majesty should by Order in Council direct that the said Act should have effect within the colony as if it were part of *The Extradition Act 1870* (Imperial), but that it should thereafter come into operation as soon as such Order in Council should have been publicly made known in the colony: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in pursuance of the provisions of the said *Extradition Act of Victoria 1877* (No. 588), do hereby proclaim, set forth, and publicly make known in the said Colony of Victoria the Order of Her Majesty in Council bearing date the sixteenth day of May One thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, a copy of which is herewith, directing that the said Act, called *The Extradition Act of Victoria 1877*, shall have effect in the said Colony of Victoria, without modification or alteration, as if it were part of the Imperial Act called *The Extradition Act 1870*.

WHEREAS by section 18 of *The Extradition Act 1870* it is among other things enacted, that if by any law made after the passing of the said Act by the Legislature of any British Possession, provision is made for carrying into effect within such Possession the Surrender of Fugitive Criminals who are in, or suspected of being in, such British Possession, Her Majesty may, by the Order in Council applying the said Act in the case of any Foreign State, or by any subsequent Order, either—

Suspend the operation within any such British Possession of the said Act, or of any part thereof, so far as it relates to such Foreign State, and so long as such law continues in force there and no longer:

Or direct that such law or ordinance or any part thereof shall have effect in such British Possession, with or without modifications and alterations, as if it were part of the Act:

And whereas by an Act enacted by the Legislature of Victoria, the short title of which is *The Extradition Act of Victoria 1877*, it is provided that "all powers vested in and acts authorised or required to be done by a Police Magistrate or any Justice of the Peace in relation to the Surrender of Fugitive Criminals in the United Kingdom under *The Extradition Acts 1870 and 1873* are thereby vested in and may in the Colony be exercised and done by any Police Magistrate in relation to the Surrender of Fugitive Criminals under the said Acts":

And whereas it is further provided by the said Act that the said Act shall not come into operation until Her Majesty shall by Order in Council direct that the said Act shall have effect within the Colony as if it were part of *The Extradition Act 1870*, but that the said Act shall thereafter come into operation as soon as such Order in Council shall have been publicly made known in the Colony.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in pursuance of *The Extradition Act 1870*, and in exercise of the power in that behalf in the said Act contained, doth by this present Order, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, direct that the said Act shall have effect in the Colony of Victoria, without modification or alteration, as if it were part of *The Extradition Act 1870*.

And the Right Honorable Sir M. E. Hicks-Beach, Bart., one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct the publication, for general information, of the following sailing directions for the Lacepede Islands, and the code of signals adopted by the Officer in charge at those islands:—

SAILING DIRECTIONS.

A bright light will be hoisted on the flagstaff at the Government Quarters on the second westernmost of the Lacepede Group of Islands before nightfall, whenever a vessel which has been sighted has not succeeded in reaching her anchorage.

Light visible throughout a radius of nine miles, and at an elevation of about 50 feet above high-water level.

Vessels making the islands from the southward should pass them to westward of the westernmost of the group, giving it a wide berth to clear a reef running out from the S.W. extremity of that island, due west for two miles. When the vessel approaching has brought the island to bear S.E., she can stand towards the vessels in the roadstead, still leaving the West Island two miles distant on her starboard beam, and carrying 6, 6½, and 7 fathoms all the way until she lets go in 5 fathoms at low water, or 7 at high water, ordinary tides, and from 1½ to 1¾ miles from the shore of the island.

PREPARATION OF GENERAL ELECTORAL LISTS  
DURING THE WEEKS ENDING 1st SEPTEMBER  
AND 1st DECEMBER 1878.

SPECIAL NOTICE TO HOLDERS OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

IT is hereby notified that holders of Electors' Rights issued on or before 1st September 1877 for the Provinces, and 1st December 1877 for the Districts, must obtain renewed Rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the general lists to be made up from and after the 1st September next for the Provinces, and 1st December next for the Districts.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new Lists to be made up as aforesaid.

The old Right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed Right will bear the same number and be in the same form and tenor as that in lieu of which it is issued, and will be equally available for any election that may take place before the completion of the new Rolls in October and January next.

No elector whose name is on a Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any Province or District, is entitled to a renewed Electors' Right for such Province or District (*vide* sections 61 and 62 of *The Electoral Act 1865*, and section 21 of Act No. 384).

WHEREAS by *The Fisheries Act 1873*, it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, for any species of fish prescribe a close season or close seasons in every year: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby prescribe the period from the first day of May to the thirty-first day of October in each year (both days inclusive) to be the close season for all species of fish, so far as Lake Wendouree is concerned.

REGULATIONS FOR THE ADMISSION INTO VICTORIA, FREE OF DUTY, OF GOODS PRODUCED OR MANUFACTURED IN THIS COLONY AND TEMPORARILY REMOVED THEREFROM.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has made the following Regulations under the 11th section of *The Duties of Customs Act 1877* (No. 593).

1. Any person desirous of temporarily removing from Victoria any goods produced or manufactured in Victoria shall, seven days previous to such removal, give notice in duplicate Form A. to the Commissioner of Customs in the form annexed.
2. The goods intended to be removed shall, prior to removal be produced to the Collector or other proper officer of Customs at any seaport, or to the Customs Officer stationed on the Border most convenient to the owner of such goods, and proof must be given to the satisfaction of such officer that the said goods have been produced or manufactured in Victoria.
3. The Collector or other officer shall examine the packages and satisfy himself that the contents are correctly stated in the form relating thereto, and, in the case of live animals, shall take their brands and descriptions, and file a record of his examination. Upon the re-admission of the said goods into Victoria the proper officer of customs shall examine the same in detail, and, if found to correspond with the particulars taken at the time of the temporary removal, they may be admitted into Victoria free of duty upon the usual entry and declaration in Form B, or to the like effect.
4. In each case full particulars of exportation and admission free of duty must be reported to the Commissioner of Customs.
5. In the construction of these regulations the word *goods* includes live animals. Provided, however, that as regards "live animals" these regulations shall have no force or effect, except as to the temporary removal by any person in the occupation of any land in Victoria adjoining the boundary of Victoria, of any live animals owned by him from such land to any land in the occupation of such person on the other side of and adjoining such boundary any portion of which land is immediately opposite to such first-mentioned land, and except as to the admission into Victoria free of duty of any live animals so temporarily removed.
6. Nothing in these regulations shall prevent the Commissioner of Customs from authorizing the admission into Victoria, free of duty, of contractors' plant which has been temporarily removed into the adjacent colonies to carry out contracts therein prior to these regulations coming into force.

The births of 698 children, viz., 358 boys and 340 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of June. In the month of May 814 births were registered, or 116 more than in the month under review.

The deaths in June numbered 361, viz., 198 of males and 163 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 337. The deaths were less than those in May by 72, and exceeded the average of June during the previous ten years by 22. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been 21 less than the average of those ten years.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 57°5' on the 5th, and the lowest was 31°1' on the 22nd. The mean temperature of the month (46°5') was nearly 4° below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (22°4') took place on the 5th, viz., from a maximum of 57°5' to a minimum of 35°1'. The least range (6°6') was on the 17th, viz., from a maximum of 51°4' to a minimum of 44°8'. The mean daily range was 11°75'. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.909 inches) was nearly one-fourteenth of an inch below the average.

Fifty-five per cent. of the deaths registered during the month were of males; 45 per cent. were of females. Twenty per cent. were of children under the age of 5 years as against 38 per cent. in June 1877; 30 per cent. in June 1876; 32 per cent. in June 1875 and June 1874; 33 per cent. in June 1873; 42 per cent. in June 1872; 37 per cent. in June 1871 and June 1870; 40 per cent. in June 1869; and 45 per cent. in June 1868.

Nine deaths of persons who had arrived at the age of 75 years or upwards occurred during the month, viz.:—Those of a female, aged 75, of liver disease; a farmer, aged 77, of stricture of the bowels; a male, of occupation unstated, aged 79, of bronchitis; a quartermaster, aged 78, a gentleman, a retired military officer, and a bootmaker, all aged 80, of old age; a watchmaker, aged 83, of pneumonia; and a gentleman, aged 85, of heart disease.

The violent deaths during the month amounted to 20, of which 16 were ascribed to accident, 1 to homicide, and 3 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths: a sign writer, aged 46, died of fracture of the skull caused by a fall; a hawker, aged 56, died of internal injuries resulting from being thrown out of a cart; a dentist, aged 55, died of exhaustion consequent on injuries received through falling down stairs; a boy, aged 11, was crushed between the buffers of two railway trucks; a school-boy, aged 12, was killed by the wheels of a train passing over him; a boy, aged 8, was killed by the kick of a horse; a barrister, aged 38, died from the effects of an overdose of chloral; a sailor, aged 34, and a tobacconist, aged 52, were drowned in Hobson's Bay; a girl, aged 10, was choked by a piece of orange; a ship's cook, aged 28, died of asphyxia from the inhalation of chloroform; 4 male infants, aged 1, 4, 5, and 11 months respectively, and a female infant, aged 8½ months, were suffocated in bed.

The homicidal death was that of a hawker, aged 47, who died of injuries to the head, caused by being struck with a bar of iron.

Of the persons who committed suicide, a female, aged 42, and a miner, aged 53, hanged themselves, and a horseclipper, aged 47, drowned himself. These were set down as laboring under temporary insanity.

Ninety-seven deaths, or 27 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—58 in the Melbourne Hospital, 6 in the Immigrants' Home, 1 in the Children's Hospital, 5 in the Alfred Hospital, 3 in the Lying-in Hospital, 3 in the Benevolent Asylum, 3 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 12 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the St. Vincent de Paul's Orphanage, 1 in the Homeopathic Hospital, 1 in the Melbourne Industrial Schools, and none in the Pentridge Stockade.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 93, of which 52, or 56 per cent., were of males; and 41, or 44 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 57 were under one year of age, 20 were between one and two, 6 were between two and three, 6 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 268. Of these, 146, or 54 per cent., were males, and 122, or 46 per cent., were females; 14 were between five and ten, 7 were between ten and fifteen, 4 were between fifteen and twenty, 20 were between twenty and twenty-five, 15 were between twenty-five and thirty, 17 were between thirty and thirty-five, 27 were between thirty-five and forty, 28 were between forty and forty-five, 30 were between forty-five and fifty, 29 were between fifty and fifty-five, 23 were between fifty-five and sixty, 18 were between sixty and sixty-five, 19 were between sixty-five and seventy, 17 were between seventy and seventy-five, 4 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 5 were upwards of eighty.

Typhoid fever, which was fatal in 53 instances in April, and 40 in May, caused only 6 deaths in the month under review. Whooping-cough occasioned no deaths in May, but 12 in June. Almost all other miasmatic diseases caused fewer deaths in the latter than in the former month. Most deaths in May were set down to local diseases, the highest numbers being found under those of the respiratory and digestive systems. Phthisis, classified as a constitutional disease, caused 54 deaths in May and 48 in June.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. #### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and St. George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that the Governor might make and proclaim reserves for the preservation and growth of timber, and might from time to time, after one month's notice should be given in the *Government Gazette*, alter and revoke any such proclamation, and the Board of Land and Works might issue licenses to cut timber upon such reserve or any part thereof on such terms and conditions, and subject to the payment of such license fee as should from time to time be approved of by the Governor and be set forth in such license: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, proclaim as a reserve for the preservation and growth of timber the Crown lands hereinafter described, that is to say:—

**TIMBER RESERVE IN THE PARISHES OF ASHENS, JUNG-JUNG, LONGERENONG AND MARMA.**—Five thousand nine hundred and thirty acres, more or less, county of Borung, parishes of Ashens, Jung-Jung, Longerengong, and Marma, in the four separate portions hereinafter described, viz.:—One thousand one hundred and sixty acres, more or less, commencing at a point on the eastern bank of the Yarramblick Creek, bearing east from the north-east angle of allotment 11, parish of Longerengong; bounded thence by the road from Glenorchy to Kewell bearing north-westerly and north-easterly to the south boundary of allotment 8, parish of Jung; thence by that allotment and a line bearing S. 89° 55' W. to the aforesaid creek; and thence by that creek southerly to the point of commencement.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more

commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described as a Common, that is to say:—

**TARNAGULLA COMMON.**—Four thousand acres, more or less, county of Gladstone, parishes of Tarnagulla and Waanyarra, being the unappropriated Crown land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.:—Commencing at the south-west angle of the Tarnagulla Goldfield Common; thence south by a line to the north boundary of Jones' Creek Goldfield Common; thence east by that common to the west boundary of the Tarnagulla Farmers' Common; thence north-westerly, east, and north by the last-named common to the south-east boundary of the municipal district of Tarnagulla; thence south-westerly, west, and north by the boundary of that municipal district to the south boundary of the Tarnagulla Goldfield Common aforesaid; and thence west by that common to the point of commencement.—(78.C.13980.)

**REGULATIONS FOR COMMONS.**

**T**HE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations for Commons.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE GOLDFIELDS COMMONS—THE UNITED GOLDFIELDS COMMON OF LINTON, BROWNS, SPRINGDALLAH, HAPPY VALLEY, LUCKY WOMANS, AND ITALIAN GULLY, AND OF THE CARRNGHAM AND CHEPSTOWE UNITED GOLDFIELD AND TOWN COMMON—WITHIN THE MINING DISTRICT OF BALLARAT.**

The following Regulations (in lieu of the regulations heretofore in force) shall be deemed and taken to be the regulations for the management of the Goldfields Commons, and the Carrngham and Chepstowe United Goldfield and Town Common, within the Mining District of Ballarat, and all persons entitled under *The Land Act* 1869 to depasture cattle upon a goldfields common shall (subject to the conditions, restrictions, and limitations hereinafter set forth) be permitted to depasture cattle upon any such common.

1. Any holder of a miner's right or business license shall be permitted to depasture upon the goldfields common nearest to which he shall reside so many head of cattle, &c., as in the schedule hereto relating to such common is prescribed, on payment to the managers of such common therefor the fees prescribed in the scale of fees relating to such commons.

2. That it shall be lawful for the manager of any goldfields commons, when and so often as they shall deem fit, to grant to butchers, slaughtermen, dairymen, and others a special license, in accordance with the provisions of *The Land Act*, to depasture on said common any number of cattle not exceeding 30 head, and to charge for such special license a fee in accordance with the scale of fees relating to such common.

3. That it shall be lawful for the managers of any goldfields common, if they think fit so to do, to permit goats to be depastured upon such common, on payment of the fees prescribed in the scale of fees relating to such common; provided always that no one person shall be entitled to depasture more than four goats, unless a greater number be prescribed in the schedule relating to such common.

4. That no bulls or entire horses shall be depastured on any goldfields common without the sanction of the managers of said common; but the managers may, when and so often as they may please, grant special licenses for the depasturing of bulls and entire horses.

5. That all young cattle the progeny of cattle upon any goldfields common may, while under six (6) months old, be depastured on such common free of charge, but all such cattle over six (6) months shall be charged for at the rate prescribed in the scale of fees relating to such common; provided always that no young bulls nor entire colts over twelve months old shall be permitted to remain on any goldfields common without the express sanction of the managers thereof.

6. That the managers of a goldfields common shall be empowered to appoint some suitable person as herdsman, and such herdsman at any time to suspend, remove, or dismiss; and to allow such herdsman such salary or remuneration from and out of the common fund, provided always that the salary of the herdsman shall be a charge upon the common fund only and not upon the managers personally, nor upon this board.

7. That it shall be lawful for the managers to impose upon the herdsman all such duties, obligations, responsibilities, and restrictions as shall be or appear to them necessary to secure to the commoners the full benefit of the common, and to invest

him with all such powers as they themselves possess, and to bind such herdsman by such instrument in writing as to them shall appear necessary, and to take from such herdsman such security as shall to them appear necessary to insure the faithful discharge and exercise of the duties and powers vested in him.

8. That all fees collected by the managers of any goldfields common in respect of cattle, &c., depastured upon such common shall be by them paid to a fund to be called the common fund, and they may disburse such fund for the purposes of such common, but for no other purpose without the express sanction of this board.

9. That the managers of each goldfields common shall appoint certain times and places for the registering and branding of cattle, shall give due notice thereof, and shall by themselves or the herdsman attend at such times and places for the purpose aforesaid, and all persons desirous of depasturing cattle upon the common shall be in attendance with their cattle at the time and place appointed for the purpose of giving a full and correct description of such cattle and assisting to brand the same, and shall pay the prescribed fees for such cattle before the same shall be branded or registered, and the manager shall cause all cattle, &c., in respect of which the fees shall have been so paid to be registered in proper books to be by them kept for that purpose, and to be branded with the common brand.

10. That the fees for cattle depasturing upon any goldfields common shall be paid by the owners of such cattle half-yearly or quarterly in advance; that the quarters shall commence respectively upon the first Monday in the months of January, April, July, and October in each year; that the fee for the quarter then next ensuing shall be deemed to be due on the first Monday aforesaid, and any person neglecting to pay the said fees within fourteen days from and after the day on which the same shall have become so due shall be proceeded against by the managers according to law.

11. That all cattle, pigs, goats or sheep found upon any goldfields common without the common brand shall be deemed to be trespassing thereon, and shall be forthwith impounded by the herdsman.

12. That no person will be permitted to remove any cattle from any goldfields common without having first given notice to, and obtained permission of, the managers or herdsman in charge of such common.

13. That the managers in charge of a goldfields common shall not be held responsible for any loss or injury of or to any cattle depasturing upon such common, but shall, by their herdsman, take every possible care of such cattle, and in the event of loss or injury shall give to the owners of such cattle every information and assistance.

14. That the managers shall cause to be removed from the common under their control all diseased cattle, or all cattle which may, by a competent person, be declared to be diseased and dangerous to the health of other stock on the common, and may require the owner thereof to keep such cattle off the common; and should the owner refuse or neglect so to do, the managers may cause such diseased cattle to be forthwith destroyed, and the owner of such cattle shall not be entitled to compensation therefor.

15. That it shall be lawful for persons travelling with cattle to encamp with such cattle upon any goldfields common for a space of twenty-four hours free of charge; but should such cattle remain upon the common after the expiration of the said twenty-four hours, they shall be deemed to be trespassing thereon, and shall be impounded accordingly: Provided always that the managers may, if they think fit, grant permission for such cattle to remain upon the common on payment in advance being made to them or to the herdsman, of the fees following, that is to say:—For horses, threepence (3d) per head per day; for horned cattle, one and a half-penny (1½d) per head per day.

16. The managers of any goldfields common may destroy any goats found upon the common under their control, unless such goats are branded with the common brand, and the fees for the depasturing of such goats be duly paid.

17. That any person who shall infringe any of these regulations, or who shall wilfully injure or destroy, or unnecessarily disturb any cattle depasturing upon any goldfields common, shall be proceeded against by the managers of such common under the Land Act, and will be liable to be fined for the first offence £5, and for any subsequent offence £20.

18. That it shall be lawful for the managers of any goldfields common to frame and adopt rules (not inconsistent with these regulations or with any Act or bye-law relating to or affecting goldfields commons in this district), for fixing the times and places of their meetings, for regulating the proceedings at such meetings, and for regulating the conduct and defining the duties of their officers and servants; but no such rules framed or adopted by the managers shall in any way affect or interfere with the number of cattle to be depastured upon any such common, nor with the fees to be paid for depasturing such cattle thereon.

MINING OPERATIONS AUTHORIZED ON EXCEPTED LANDS AT MALDON.

THE Governor in Council has authorized E. G. Walker and party to occupy for mining purposes, under miners' rights, those pieces or parcels of land severally described in the schedule hereto (which said pieces or parcels of land form portions of the lands respectively set apart and reserved as sites for Police purposes and for Public Recreation, and have been excepted from occupation for mining purposes or for residence or business under any miner's right or business license under Orders in Council of the 14th day of May 1878), subject to the conditions following:—

1. No portion of the surface of either of the said pieces or parcels of land shall be occupied for purposes of residence, nor shall any tents or huts be erected thereon.
2. During the progress of mining operations all excavations and mullock banks shall be securely enclosed by a substantial fence, and all shafts shall, during the absence of the workmen, be protected by a strong cover fastened over the mouth of the shaft by a padlock.
3. No shaft or excavation shall be made, and no mining debris shall be deposited on the surface within thirty feet of any building, and no building shall be undermined at a less depth than one hundred feet from the surface.

## VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

## SECTION X.—BYE-LAWS.

THE Board of Land and Works, by virtue of the powers and authorities vested in it by *The Public Works Statute 1865*, doth hereby make the following Bye-laws for the several purposes therein respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

## No. I.

Melbourne time is to be observed at all stations.

## No. II.

Any person (unless having a free pass) taking a seat or remaining in or upon any carriage used on the railway, as a passenger, or travelling therein upon the railway, without having first paid his or her fare and obtained a ticket, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

## No. III.

Each passenger, on paying his or her fare, will be furnished with a ticket, which he or she is to show whenever required by a station-master or porter authorized by him or by the guard in charge of the train; and if it be a journey or return ticket, he or she must allow it to be marked when required; and every ticket (whether single, return, or periodical) must be delivered up upon demand of any porter or other servant of the Board of Land and Works who may be authorized to collect tickets. Any person guilty of a breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

## No. IV.

Tickets are not transferable. A ticket can only be used by the person for whom it may be issued. Any person using or attempting to use a transferred single, return, or periodical ticket, after being once used or travelled with, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

## No. V.

No passenger shall be entitled to rebook or take a ticket at any intermediate station for the purpose of continuing his journey in the same train as that in which he shall have arrived at such station.

## No. VI.

Any person knowingly attempting to defraud the Board by travelling upon the railway in or upon a carriage of a superior class to that for which he or she is provided with a ticket, or altering a return or other ticket, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

## No. VII.

Tickets, whether single or return, shall be available, and shall be used by passengers only to convey them to the stations named thereon, or to any station short of that destination, provided the passenger by so using a ticket derives no advantage as regards fare. In no case, however, shall the "cheap" or "excursion" tickets be used at or for any other station than those named thereon. Any person using or attempting to use a ticket in violation of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

## No. VIII.

No ticket will be recognized by any collector or servant of the Board authorized to collect or examine tickets unless the number, date, and names of the stations printed on such ticket are perfectly legible. The holder of any ticket which may be defaced or rendered illegible in any of the above particulars will be regarded as not having paid his fare, and will be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

## No. IX.

Any person, not being duly authorized by the Board, who shall sell or offer for sale any free pass, ticket, or portion of a return ticket, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

## No. X.

No male passenger will be allowed to enter or remain in any waiting-room or carriage set apart for the accommodation of females, and any person persisting in remaining in any such room or carriage, after being warned to leave the same, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

## No. XI.

Any person, not being a servant of the Board, who shall open any carriage for the purpose of entering the same, with a key or other instrument, after the tickets have been examined, and the carriage doors locked by the station-master, guard, or other person appointed for that purpose, or any person who shall let him or herself out of any carriage on arrival at any station, or at any time during the journey, by the use of a private key or other instrument, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

## No. XII.

No person shall be permitted to travel outside a carriage or vehicle on the railway under any circumstances whatever, or to get into or upon or to quit any carriage or vehicle when the train is in motion; and any person doing so, or attempting to do so, shall be liable to a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

## No. XIII.

Smoking is strictly prohibited in any of the railway sheds, yards, offices, pier, or waiting-rooms; and any person found smoking in any goods or other shed, yards, offices, pier, or premises, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

## No. XIV.

Smoking is strictly prohibited in any of the railway carriages to the annoyance of any passenger, and any person who persists in smoking after being requested by a passenger, or warned by any servant of the Board to desist, shall forfeit a penalty not exceeding Two pounds, and may be removed from the carriage by any of the railway servants.

## No. XV.

Dogs will be conveyed and charged for, according to printed conditions, but they will not on any account be allowed to accompany passengers in the carriages. Any person persisting in taking a dog into any passenger carriage, in breach of this bye-law, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

## No. XVI.

No gratuity is, under any circumstances, allowed to be received by the servants of the Railway department, on pain of immediate dismissal. Any person giving or offering a gratuity to any such servant shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

## No. XVII.

Any person making use of insulting or abusive language to any officer or servant of the Railway department of the Board while in the execution of his duty, or any person making use of obscene or blasphemous language in any carriage or upon any platform or premises of the Board, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

## No. XVIII.

Any person driving or attempting to drive sheep or cattle, or attempting to ride or drive any horse across the line, either at an authorized crossing-place or elsewhere, when a train is in sight, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

## No. XIX.

Any person or persons wilfully driving or negligently allowing to stray, any cattle, horses, sheep, or other animal on the railway or any lands or premises of the Board, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

## No. XX.

No carman or hackney coachman, drayman, porter, carter, or other person will be allowed to come into or upon the lands, pier, or premises of the Board, for the purposes of removing passengers or luggage, either with or without a dray or hand cart, or truck, unless required by a passenger, and specially engaged by him for such purpose; and no person will be allowed to come into or upon the premises of the Board for the purpose of touting or soliciting custom (unless licensed to do so) or hire of whatever kind; and any carman or hackney coachman, drayman, carter, porter, or other person evading, or attempting to evade, or being guilty of a breach of this Regulation, or refusing, or neglecting to quit the premises of the Board when thereto required by a station-master or other servant of the Board, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

## No. XXI.

Any person found bathing, swimming dogs, or otherwise polluting the water in any of the railway reservoirs or tanks, shall be subject to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

## No. XXII.

Any person or persons, unless those duly authorized by the Board, who shall be found posting or sticking bills, &c., within or upon any of the railway property or premises, shall be subject to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

## No. XXIII.

No person shall be entitled to require to be carried upon or along any railway of the Board any sheep, cattle, horses, or live stock which, in the judgment of the Board, their officers or servants, may be infected with any disease of whatsoever nature, and the Board, their officers or servants, may refuse to take any sheep, cattle, horses, or live stock suspected by them to be diseased. Any person causing or procuring any diseased sheep, cattle, horses, or live stock to be carried, or offering, or causing any of them to be offered for the purpose of being carried upon or along any such railway, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

## No. XXIV.

If any person shall willingly, knowingly, or negligently drive or attempt to drive, or allow to stray into any railway station, yard, shed, or premises, or upon any lands, or within any fences, the property of the Board, any sheep, infected with scab or other disease, or any cattle, horses, or live stock having or suffering from any disease whatsoever, he shall be liable to a penalty for every such offence not exceeding Twenty pounds.

## No. XXV.

All goods and merchandise (whether bonded or free), and all luggage arriving by train at any station or pier shall be removed from the platform, sheds, or pier within forty-eight hours, or such less time as may be fixed, and any free goods, merchandise, or luggage not removed by that time may be stored at the risk and expense of the consignees or owners, and may then become subject to such charges as may from time to time be fixed by the Board; and any bonded goods or merchandise which shall not be removed within the period aforesaid, shall be subject to the payment of the sum of One shilling per ton per diem until the removal of the same from the premises of the Board. And all goods, merchandise, and luggage unclaimed by the owner for the space of seven days after arrival may be sold by the Board, and after deducting what may be due to the Board for railway carriage, storage, and charges (including expenses of sale), to pay over the surplus, if any, to the owner on demand.

## No. XXVI.

If any goods, produce, timber, or other merchandise should be brought into any station, either by the owner or consignee, or in the wagons or vehicles of the Railway department, and which goods or merchandise, in accordance with the conditions of the published tariffs, it shall be the business of the owner, consignee, or consignee to load into or discharge from the railway wagons or vehicles; and in case the owner, consignee, or consignee refuses or neglects to load into or discharge from the railway wagons or vehicles such goods within twelve work-

ing hours of their arrival at the station, the Board, by its officers and servants, may forthwith proceed to load into or discharge from the railway trucks such goods at the risk of the owner, consignee, or consignee, and such goods shall be subject to the costs of such loading or unloading, as the case may be, in addition to the freight and to such other costs or charges as may become due under preceding bye-law.

No. XXVII.

Upon every parcel or package containing any of the articles mentioned beneath (and also in the first section of *The Innkeepers and Carriers Act*, No. 78), brought or delivered either to be carried for hire or to accompany the person of any passenger, and its value and contents declared, as in the said section is mentioned, and where such value shall exceed the sum of ten pounds, there shall be paid an increased rate of charge, that is to say, double parcels or excess luggage rate if the declared value be over ten pounds and under fifty pounds, and quadruple parcels or excess luggage rate if the value exceed fifty pounds, as a compensation for the greater risk and care to be taken for the safe custody or conveyance, as the case may be, of such valuable articles, or any precious stones, jewellery, watches, clocks, or time-pieces of any description; trinkets, bills, notes of any bank in Her Majesty's dominions, or of any foreign banks; order notes or securities for payment of money, whether foreign or otherwise; stamps, maps, writings, title deeds, paintings, engravings, pictures, gold or silver plate, or plated articles, glass, china, silks in a manufactured or unmanufactured state, and whether wrought up or not wrought up with other materials; furs or laces, or any of them contained in any parcel or package delivered either to be carried for hire or to accompany the person of any passenger.

No. XXVIII.

The percentage or increased rate of charge to be paid in respect of animals mentioned in the 24th section of the *Railways Act 1863*—namely, in respect of any horse declared to be above the value of Fifty pounds, any herd of neat cattle above the value of Twenty pounds, any sheep, pig, or other small animal above the value of One pound—shall be at the rate of Two pounds ten shillings per centum upon the value so declared above the respective sums so limited as aforesaid, and which percentage shall be paid in addition to the ordinary rate of charge.

No. XXIX.

No claim for loss will be allowed or recognized unless the particulars of such claim shall be lodged with the secretary within fourteen days after such loss shall have arisen, and no claim for damage will be recognized or allowed after the removal from the railway premises of the goods or merchandise alleged to have been damaged. And the delivery of such goods shall be considered complete when notice of arrival has been given to the consignee, or, where the address of the consignee is not known, the Board will accept no liability for loss or damage after the goods shall have been at the receiving station forty-eight hours. All goods and live stock to be carried subject to the printed conditions of carriage.

No. XXX.

The Board will not be responsible for articles left by passengers at any station unless the same be duly registered, for which a charge per article will be made and a ticket given in exchange, and no article will be given up without the production of the ticket, or satisfactory evidence of the ownership being adduced, and any article will be delivered up to the bearer of the ticket, unless previously delivered up to the owner. The Board will not be responsible for any package exceeding the value of Ten pounds.

No. XXXI.

When and so soon as the discharge of the cargo of any vessel at the railway pier shall have been completed (and whether or not such discharge shall happen within the period fixed therefor) the master of the vessel whose discharge shall have been completed shall immediately thereafter cause to be taken on board thereof such sand or stone ballast as may be required to steady such vessel, and shall thereupon leave the pier and anchor such vessel outside of the buoys laid down by the Railway department. Provided always that such vessel is not receiving or about to receive loading from the railway pier, or the wagons or trucks belonging to the Board. Any person guilty of a breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

No. XXXII.

Every vessel, whether about to receive loading or not, shall be removed by the master thereof from the railway pier within twelve hours after written notice shall have been left on board by the Pier-master requiring the removal of such vessel, and any master failing to remove his vessel within the period aforesaid shall pay to the Board a sum of £20 per day for every day or fractional part of a day thereafter during which such vessel may occupy a berth at the said pier.

No. XXXIII.

The master of any vessel arriving at the pier shall cause the discharge thereof to be proceeded with beyond the usual working hours—that is to say, in the summer from Six o'clock in the morning until Six o'clock in the evening; and in winter from Seven o'clock in the morning until Five o'clock in the evening, if so required by the Pier-master. And if the master of any vessel, when so required, shall neglect or refuse to cause the discharge of his vessel to be proceeded with accordingly, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each and every day or fractional part of a day he shall neglect or refuse.

No. XXXIV.

Every vessel shall be discharged by stevedores, and such stevedores shall be employed by and at the expense of the

masters or agents of such vessel, and not by or on behalf of the Board.

No. XXXV.

No person, not authorized by the Board to supply ballast to vessels lying at the pier, will be allowed to come upon such pier, or within three hundred yards thereof, with ballast for any vessel. Any person guilty of a breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

No. XXXVI.

No boatman, waterman, or other person will be allowed to ply for hire to or from the railway pier, or within a distance of Three hundred yards therefrom, unless licensed by the Board to do so; and any person infringing this bye-law will be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

No. XXXVII.

No ship, barque, steamer, brig, schooner, sloop, lighter, barge, boat, or other vessel of any kind or description whatsoever, shall be moored or fastened to the railway pier, or attached to any ship, barque, steamer, brig, schooner, sloop, lighter, barge, boat, or other vessel of any kind or description whatsoever, so moored or fastened, without the consent in writing of the Pier-master; and the master or other person causing any such ship, barque, steamer, brig, schooner, sloop, lighter, barge, boat, or other vessel to be so moored and fastened or attached without such consent as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds; and should the Pier-master not have given his consent to the mooring or fastening of such vessel, he may proceed to remove the vessel in the manner pointed out by the 34th clause of *The Railways Act 1863*.

No. XXXVIII.

All goods that may be brought to vessels lying alongside the railway piers or breakwater by lighter or other craft will be subjected to the following charges, viz.:—One shilling per ton on goods, and Sixpence per bale on wool.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.—WOOL RATES.

THE Board of Land and Works, by virtue of the powers and authorities vested in it by *The Public Works Statute 1875*, doth hereby make the following Bye-law for fixing the Charges and Regulations for the Carriage of Wool upon Railways vested in the Board, that is to say:—

RATES PER BALE (not over 4 cwt.).

30 miles and under, 1s. per bale.	
Over 30 " and up to 60 miles, 4d.	} per bale additional for every 5 miles or part of 5 miles.

The above mileage rates do not apply to the Williamstown Line, or to wool consigned from country stations direct to the pier, upon which 6d. per bale in addition to the above rates will be charged.

New South Wales wool delivered by teams at Echuca, Wodonga, and Springs, will be allowed 6d. per bale on above mileage rates.

Consignments of wool borne by rail from Ararat and Stawell to Geelong or Melbourne, and amounting in the aggregate from both stations for the year ending 30th June 1879 to 4000 bales and upwards, and forwarded by one and the same consignee, will be allowed 6d. per bale.

The following Special Rates will also be charged upon Wool the clip of Stations in New South Wales:—

Wool to the Williamstown Pier may be consigned direct from country stations, but only provided that the name of the vessel it is intended for to be given on the consignment note. If the vessel is not at the pier or not ready to ship the bales

on their arrival, then the truck may be brought back to Melbourne and unloaded there, all at the cost and risk of the owner.

Dumped wool carried by railway over 50 miles will be allowed 4d., over 90 miles 8d., and over 150 miles 1s. per mile.

WILLIAMSTOWN LINE.

<sup>1</sup> NOTE.—This rate is net cash without discount. Vessels loading will be required to take wool or other cargo from trucks in preference to lighters or other craft. If from delay in this respect, or from any cause not due to the Department, the vessel is not ready to receive wool or general cargo within twelve hours after the arrival of the trucks, demurrage will be strictly enforced at the rate of 10s. per truck per diem until the trucks are unloaded by the consignee, or until the department, at the cost and risk of the consignee, unloads the trucks and sends the goods to store. Wool consigned for shipment, and requiring to be dumped, will be deliverable at the dumping sheds, where a receipt must be given on behalf of the ship.

All bales of wool carried on the above lines weighing over 4 cwt. each will be charged 25 per cent. per bale additional upon the rate for a 4 cwt. bale for every cwt. or portion of a cwt. in excess.

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

The above rates are subject to minimums of three, four, five, and six shillings for each consignment, according to distance and conditions in goods classification.

Twelve hours will be allowed for the removal of wool after arrival of the trucks. From that time storage will be charged, and strictly enforced, at the rate of One penny per bale per diem until the wool is removed by the consignee, or sent to store by the department at the consignee's cost and risk. All wool is carried at owner's risk as to condition, and will be signed for accordingly. If detailed weight lists are furnished by the department for the use of consignees, the charge for weighing will be Fourpence per bale; if weighed by the owners, One penny per bale will be charged for the use of the scales. Consignors requiring weight lists must pay for same at sending station. Rebate sheets must be rendered within 2 months of date on which wool is consigned, or no claim will be recognized.

All previous wool rates are now cancelled.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

THE Board of Land and Works, by virtue of the powers and authorities vested in it by *The Public Works Statute 1865*, doth hereby make the following Regulations for the Carriage of Gunpowder, Blasting Powder, Gun Cotton, Dynamite, Giant Powder, Lithofracteur, and all other dangerous and explosive compounds used for firing or blasting purposes.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARRIAGE OF GUNPOWDER OR OTHER DANGEROUS AND EXPLOSIVE COMPOUNDS.

1. Gunpowder or other dangerous and explosive compounds will not be received for carriage by railway unless packed in kegs or barrels closely bound or hooped without any iron about them, of quarter, half-quarter, or whole barrel sizes, the staves to be of half-inch minimum thickness; or in canisters made of tin, copper, zinc, or other suitable metal; or in cardboard boxes, strong and impervious to leakage, enclosed in wooden cases of half-inch thickness at the sides, and one inch thickness at the ends; or in metallic cylinders of pattern similar in construction and security to those used by the Imperial Government for the conveyance of small quantities of powder by railway; or in packages made otherwise so strong and secure that no part of the contents can become scattered in the handling or removal thereof.

2. The contents of each keg or package must be specified on the outside thereof in letters not less than one inch in length; and the package must be fully and plainly addressed. A written or printed label must also be affixed describing how the contents are packed.

3. Consignments will be carried by powder van only, and, if practical, in the same van throughout, and they will not be received at Footscray or any railway station save on certain days.

4. The days appointed for receiving gunpowder and other dangerous and explosive compounds at railway stations will be subject from time to time to such alterations as the current time table may render necessary, and may be ascertained on application to the various station-masters.

5. A powder van will be run from any station by the first available goods train, subject to twenty-four hours' notice, and provided that the railway freight of the consignment amounts to or exceeds £10.

6. Consignments from different consignors, or from one consignor to different consignees, though all to care of one carrier, will be charged for separately.

7. In the event of senders neglecting to mark each package according to these regulations, the Board may decline to carry the same, and direct the removal and storage of the packages at the cost of the owner.

8. Consignors at any railway station may ascertain, by enquiry of the station-master, at about what time their consignments will be despatched, and if they neglect to make such enquiry, or to advise the consignee, the Board will not be liable for any loss or damage arising from such omission.

9. The Board will not guarantee to despatch gunpowder and other dangerous and explosive compounds at any particular time or by any particular train, nor will it allow consignments, whether carried or to be carried, to remain on the railway premises longer than is absolutely necessary. And if a package carried by railway be not accepted and removed by the consignee it will be immediately sent to the nearest powder magazine, at the owner's risk and expense, or returned to the sender, who will be required to remove it at once from the premises, and to pay the whole charges incurred for carriage, back carriage, and demurrage.

10. Any person bringing to a railway station, or leaving thereat, any packages containing gunpowder or other dangerous and explosive compounds not labelled and addressed as aforesaid, or without having given written notice thereof to the porter or other servant of the Board by delivery therewith of a consignment note of the said packages, filled up and signed according to the form and effect hereinafter mentioned, shall be liable to a penalty of Twenty pounds.

11. The Board may at any time during the carriage of such goods, or while they are on the premises of the Board, detain and stop the further handling and delivery of packages which appear defective. And the Board may remove, repair, repack, and store such packages at the cost and risk of the owner.

12. Consignments will be carried at fourth-class rates. Minimum 2 cwt., provided the rate casts out Five shillings, but in no case shall the charge be less than Five shillings, for each consignment.

13. The duties of common carriers in respect of goods carried under this agreement are not undertaken by the Board; nor is the Board to be subject to any risk of loading, stowage, or unloading; nor is it to be answerable for loss or damage actual or consequential; nor for discrepancy in the delivery as to either quantity, number, or weight; nor for the condition of articles so carried; nor for any consequences arising from overcarriage, detention, or delay in, or in relation to the carriage or delivery thereof.

14. No servant of the Board is authorized to receive or to undertake the carriage of gunpowder or other dangerous and explosive compounds, or to give any receipt or acknowledgment for such goods, unless the sender or person bringing them to a railway station has required from the department and signed a special consignment note, setting forth, in form as follows, that such goods are carried solely upon the conditions hereinbefore mentioned, which are printed on the back thereof:—

## BYE-LAW No. XLIIA.

THE Board of Land and Works, by virtue of the powers and authorities vested in it by the *Public Works Statute 1865*, doth make the Bye-law following, that is to say:—

Goods which have not been carried and are not intended to be carried on the railway of the Board may be landed or shipped at the expense of the owners or consignees thereof, at the Echuca wharf, on payment of a charge of One shilling per ton, which charge shall be in consideration of the use of the wharf and cranes merely, and shall not entitle the person paying the same to the assistance of the officers and servants of the Board in landing or shipping such goods. In estimating such charge the Board or its officers may assume the weight of such goods to be as the same appears from the manifest or transire of any steamer or vessel from or on board which such goods are landed or shipped.

## VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.—PASSENGERS' LUGGAGE.

WHEREAS the luggage of passengers is often lost, misappropriated, or wrongly delivered from the want of any means of establishing the ownership thereof: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, by virtue of the powers and authorities vested in it by the *Public Works Statute*, doth hereby make the following bye-law for regulating the carriage of passengers' luggage upon railways vested in the said Board, that is to say—

## REGULATIONS FOR THE CARRIAGE OF PASSENGERS' LUGGAGE.

1. On and after date hereof the department will not undertake any liability in respect to the loss, miscarriage, detention, or non-delivery of passengers' luggage, carried or to be carried by railway free or at excess rates, unless the owner thereof has complied with the following regulations:—

2. No parcels, boxes, carpet-bags, portmanteaus, or other packages or luggage shall be received or carried, free or at excess rates, at the risk of the department unless fifteen minutes before the time of starting the luggage has been delivered to the station porter—to be weighed, paid for, and labelled accordingly, if the luggage is in excess; also to be labelled to the passenger's destination, and that the person paying such excess rates may obtain a receipt for the same; or, if the luggage is carried free, that he may require from the said porter a numbered check or checks for the said luggage, one check for each parcel, according to the description of the checks here following; and the department will not be liable for any loss, detention, miscarriage, or damage through the neglect by passengers of these regulations, whether such neglect arise through insufficiency of time or other cause not attributable to the default of the department.

3. A luggage check complete, and when not in use, consists of a leather tie about half an inch broad, and from six to ten inches long, with a slit at each end in which is fastened a disc or check of block-tin. Both checks are stamped with the same number. When in use the passenger is in possession of one of the checks, and the other is attached to his portmanteau or other free luggage, which will not be delivered except to the person giving up the check of the same number as that attached to the luggage.

4. Railway servants, on receiving luggage from passengers, will first ascertain and require payment for the excess weight, if any, attaching in such case to each parcel the "excess label," as also the yellow label, showing the destination, and hand at the same time to the passenger a receipt for the excess rates showing the total number of packages. If the luggage is carried free the porter receiving it will hand to the passenger a numbered check as before mentioned for each parcel. No check is required for excess luggage, nor is it to be issued for free luggage, until the yellow label showing the passenger's destination has been affixed; but from the time that the passenger obtains a receipt for excess rates, or receives a check or checks for free luggage, it is entirely at the risk of the department, and if carried free it is the duty of the porter to attach to each parcel a check correspondingly numbered. Finally, the station porter will see that the luggage thus labelled and checked is placed in the proper van in charge of the guard.

5. Luggage checked as above will be carried at the risk of the department to the place of destination, but it will devolve upon the passenger to claim it there, and to prove the ownership by giving up the numbered check or checks for the same. The duplicate check or checks will then be detached from the luggage prior to delivery. Luggage put out of the van on to the platform will be delivered, if carried free, as checks are presented, and if carried at excess rates, upon the presentation of the receipt for the same. All luggage unclaimed will be held by the station-master and be forwarded to Melbourne if not claimed within one month.

6. After checks are issued for luggage about to be carried free no package or parcel is to be delivered, even temporarily, at any station to the owner thereof unless he has returned the check or checks for the same; and it is the duty of the porter, on delivering the said luggage, and after removing the checks therefrom, to fasten the two checks of the same number upon the leather tie, one at each end as above mentioned, so that the check is complete and ready for future use.

7. No officer or servant of the department has authority to undertake any charge or responsibility in respect of luggage left temporarily at a station unless the same has been booked at cloak-room charges; or to place luggage in the van at the risk of the department, or to take any responsibility in respect of the same, unless it has been checked or paid for at excess rates as above mentioned.

8. These regulations do not apply to parcels taken by passengers with them in the carriage at their own risk. But no luggage will be allowed in the carriages unless of such a size that it can be placed under or over the seat without inconvenience to other passengers.

9. A supply of checks will be issued to each station, and all officers and servants using the same are enjoined to see that the two discs or checks of the same number for each fastening are properly secured thereon when not in use. If luggage is delivered without the passenger giving up his disc, or without detaching the corresponding disc from the luggage, the check becomes incomplete and useless. For every disc lost 2s. 6d. will require to be paid by the officer or servant responsible for such loss.

10. For all purposes of ownership or delivery of luggage, free or at excess rates, the checks issued represent the parcels carried free, one check for each, and receipts for excess rates represent excess luggage; but both checks and receipts are transferable, and passengers are not bound to see in person after their luggage, either in paying for it, checking it before it is put in the van, or in obtaining delivery. Passengers may do this through any person not an officer or servant of the department. But luggage will not be carried in the van at the risk of the department unless these regulations have been complied with, nor, except as hereinafter provided, will luggage be delivered unless the checks or receipts for excess rates are produced; but any person producing them will receive the luggage as and for the owner.

11. Any passenger losing his checks or receipt for excess rates may be required, before he can obtain his luggage, to make a declaration to that effect, giving the numbers of the checks and a description of the luggage; also to guarantee the department against any loss or claim from wrong delivery. And should the evidence as to ownership appear to the department insufficient, it will be in the power of the department to detain the said luggage.

12. No officer or servant of the department is authorized to act as agent of the passengers in collecting checks or "excess" receipts at a station to obtain luggage from the guard. The passengers, personally or by their agents, must give up the same and claim delivery.

13. All unclaimed luggage kept at a station 12 hours after its carriage by railway will be charged cloak-room rates for each package, and the department will sell the same if unclaimed after six months.

14. When a disc or check is lost, the one remaining must be forwarded to the traffic-manager with a report. The number on the check forwarded will be altered by the addition of A or B, &c., and a fresh check similarly numbered will be supplied, the altered number to take the place of that previously used. This may be done monthly or as often as required by the traffic-manager.

15. Passengers with luggage breaking their journey will do so at their own risk as to any delay in delivery thereof, unless they have directed the luggage to be labelled accordingly, since guards can only be guided by the labels as to the arrangement of luggage in the van. If a passenger from Melbourne to Sandhurst, for example, has his luggage labelled and checked thereto, yet breaks journey to Castlemaine, the department will not be responsible to put out his luggage there. Passengers who intend to break their journey should have their luggage labelled and checked accordingly before starting.

16. Guards, porters, and others must be careful in handling luggage neither to injure labels nor to detach checks. The leather tie is not to be nailed or tacked to luggage; but when there is no handle or attachment a cord must be used for that purpose round the parcel.

17. Officers and servants will report without delay to the traffic-manager any loss by passengers of their checks, or of receipts for excess rates, so that delivery may be stopped to any other holder. Should wrong delivery be made before the loss is known, the department will not be responsible.

18. Receipts given to passengers for payment of excess luggage rates must invariably specify the number of parcels making up the luggage. Any infringement of this rule to be reported to the traffic-manager.

19. It is optional with passengers to require checks according to these regulations; but should they delay or omit to do so, luggage will be entirely at the passenger's risk whether lost, carried, or left behind.

**LACEPEDE ISLANDS—WESTERN AUSTRALIA.**

THE Government of Western Australia invites tenders from persons desirous of obtaining the sole right to remove guano from the Lacepede Islands group, which is situated in about 17° south latitude, and 122° east longitude from Greenwich, and on which it is calculated there are now at least 40,000 tons of guano. Such tenders must be sent in to the Colonial Secretary, Perth, Western Australia, on or before the 15th October next, but the Government does not bind itself to accept the highest or any tender.

All tenders will have to state the price or royalty offered per ton for the guano (1) if shipped in the natural state; (2) if artificially prepared, dried, or sifted before shipment.

The person whose tender may be accepted (hereinafter spoken of as "the contractor") will have to bind himself to the following conditions:—

1. To remove the whole of the guano that there may be on the islands.
2. To take it away at the minimum rate of twenty thousand tons a year.
3. To remove the guano in such a manner and from such places as may be from time to time pointed out by the Government Officer stationed on the islands; and the contract will contain a clause providing that in case of the breach or neglect of these conditions the contract shall be void, and the contractor shall forfeit all buildings, erections, and plant that he may have set up on any of the islands, and also the sum of Two thousand pounds hereinafter mentioned.

The contractor will be required, within seven days after receiving a notification by telegraph or otherwise that his tender is accepted, and before the issue of any license, to deposit in the hands of the Western Australian Government, or of such person as they may name as their agent in this behalf, the sum of Two thousand pounds, as security for the due performance of the contract, and this sum will be retained by the Government until the termination of the contract, and will be liable to forfeiture as hereinafter mentioned. He will also be required at the same time to pay a like sum of Two thousand pounds, by way of royalty, in advance. The contractor will at no time be at liberty to remove any guano unless the royalty agreed upon has been paid, and no less sum than Two thousand pounds will be accepted at any time in payment of royalty until such time as there is left on the islands a quantity of guano the agreed royalty on which shall be less than Two thousand pounds.

The only instructions that will be given to the Government Officer stationed on the islands, and which he will be required to insist upon with regard to the manner in which and the places from which the guano shall be removed, will be to divide the islands into convenient sections, to point out the section or sections from which guano may be removed, and to require that the whole of any one section be cleared before any new ground is entered on.

The quantity of guano taken by each ship on which royalty has to be paid shall be ascertained by adding 25 per cent. to

the registered tonnage of timber-built ships, and 40 per cent. to the registered tonnage of iron-built ships; provided that, if the captain or agent of any ship, or the Government Officer, shall in any instance be dissatisfied with the foregoing arrangement, he shall be at liberty to cause the ship to be exactly measured according to Lloyd's rules, and the number of cubical feet so ascertained divided by 40 shall be taken to be the tonnage capacity of the ship.

No tonnage, light, or harbor dues will be charged in any port of the colony on ships solely engaged in the guano trade, and no customs duties will be levied on goods and stores that may be landed on the islands for persons solely employed in the preparation and shipment of guano.

The contractor will be at liberty to erect on any or all of the islands any buildings, jetties, tramways, &c., and subject to the conditions before expressed as to forfeiture, to remove the same at any time within six months of the termination of the contract.

No license for the shipment of guano under the regulations now in force will be granted after the 15th August next, and every such license granted after the date hereof will provide for the compulsory removal of the guano for the shipment of which it is the permit before the 15th October next.

It will at all times be optional with the licensee to ship the guano in its natural state, or artificially prepared, dried, or sifted.

The contract to be entered into in pursuance of this notice shall be deemed to commence on 1st January 1879.

Each tender, unless otherwise expressed, shall be deemed to be open to acceptance by the Government for the space of one calendar month from the 15th October, and the Government shall be at liberty to accept any tender by notifying to the person making it, by telegraph, that his tender is accepted.
