PREPARATION OF GENERAL ELECTORAL LISTS DURING THE WEEKS ENDING 1st SEPTEMBER AND 1st DECEMBER 1878.

SPECIAL NOTICE TO HOLDERS OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

IT is hereby notified that holders of Electors' Rights issued on or before 1st September 1877 for the Provinces, and 1st December 1877 for the Districts, must obtain renewed Rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the general lists to be made up from and after the 1st September next for the Provinces, and 1st December next for the Districts.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new Lists to be made up as aforesaid.

The old Right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed Right will bear the same number and be in the same form and tenor as that in lieu of which it is issued, and will be equally available for any election that may take place before the completion of the new Rolls in October and January next.

No elector whose name is on a Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any Province or District, is entitled to a renewed Electors' Right for such Province or District (*vide* sections 61 and 62 of *The Electoral Act 1865*, and section 21 of Act No. 334).

ADDITIONAL PORT AND HARBOR REGULATION.
PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Passengers, Harbors, and Navigation Statute 1865* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of ports in Victoria and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs, and might appoint officers to carry out and enforce such rules and regulations; and from time to time in like manner might alter, amend, or repeal any such limits, boundaries, rules, and regulations, and substitute others in their stead: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby frame the clause hereinafter numbered 19 A as an Additional Port and Harbor Regulation, viz.:

19 A.—For the preservation of the submarine cable at Western Port, no vessel shall anchor off Flinders during the night within the arc of the *white light* exhibited to seaward

from the end of the jetty, nor shall any vessel anchor during the day within the same area, viz., with the end of the jetty bearing between W. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. and N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ N.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twelfth day of August in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and in the forty-second year of Her Majesty's reign.

CASTLEMAINE AND SANDHURST WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

THE Governor in Council, in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by *The Water Works Act 1865*, has made the following regulations respecting the Castlemaine and Sandhurst District Water Supply, being a work constructed under the authority of the said Act:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of shops not used as dwellings shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Board within the said district, that is to say:—

(1) On every shop of £20 annual value and under, One pound per annum.

(2) On every shop above the annual value of £20 a rate of Four pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation up to £300 inclusive; Two pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £300 up to £700; and One pound five shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £700.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby abolish the Common called the Sandford Farmers' Common, and described in a Proclamation bearing date the fifth day of May, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two.

LALLAT AND DUNMUNKLE COMMON.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE LALLAT AND DUNMUNKLE COMMON.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council to frame regulations for the management of commons, and in pursuance of the provisions of chapter XIII. of the regulations made under the said Act by the Governor in Council on the 26th May 1873, it is provided that the managers of any common may submit to the Board of Land and Works draft regulations for the management of such commons: Now, therefore, the undersigned Charles Harcoon, Donald Munro, jun., and John Clark, the duly appointed managers of the Lallat and Dunmunkle Common, hereby submit to the

said Board for approval the following Regulations for the management of such common :—

1. All ratepayers, holders of miner's right, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within a distance of five miles from the common may respectively depasture four head of large cattle or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. Special Licenses may be granted to butchers or to slaughtermen to depasture for such periods of time as may be agreed upon, cattle intended for slaughter, subject to the condition that the fees shall not be at a proportionately less rate than four shillings per head per annum for large cattle and one shilling and fourpence per head per annum for small cattle.
 2. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture one additional head of large cattle or the equivalent in small cattle for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.
 3. The fees for depasturing cattle shall be paid in advance, and shall be as follow :—Horses, eight shillings per head per annum ; all other large cattle, six shillings per head per annum ; and for sheep and small cattle, two shillings per head per annum.
 4. All large cattle over six months old must be registered and paid for.
 5. No bull shall be allowed to depasture on the common unless approved of by the managers.
 6. All entire horses strictly prohibited.
 7. The herdsman shall take charge of the cattle depastured on the common, and be responsible for the efficient carrying out of the regulations framed for the management of the common. He shall also conform to any special instructions issued to him by the managers relative to the registration, custody, and delivery to owners of the cattle thereon, and to the prevention of trespass thereon of cattle other than travelling cattle, for which no commonage fees have not been paid.
 8. All fees to be paid quarterly in advance, the quarters to commence on the first day of January, first day of April, first day of July, and the first day of October in each year.
 9. The herdsman will be required to muster the stock as often as the managers shall think necessary, in some convenient place to be appointed by them, to be branded with the common brand ; public notice of which will be given by placards posted by the herdsman not less than three days previously.
 10. All stock to be branded by the herdsman. Horses to be exempted from being branded.
 11. Every care to be taken of the cattle, but no responsibility.
 12. No stock of any kind shall be turned on the common without giving due notice to the herdsman, with description of brands, otherwise they will be impounded.
 13. The fees to be paid on stock remaining on the common over twenty-four hours shall be as follows :—Large cattle, threepence per head per night ; horses threepence per head per night ; small cattle half-penny per head per night.
 14. The herdsman to have authority to impound all straying or unauthorized stock found on the common, a registry of which he will be required to keep, so that all damages and fees arising therefrom may be properly accounted for.
 15. It shall be incumbent upon the owners of any cattle or sheep diseased, or supposed to be diseased, to remove such cattle or sheep from the common within twenty-four hours after notice in writing requiring them so to do has been given them by the herdsman or one of the managers ; and in the event of the owner's refusal or neglect so to do, he shall be considered as a trespasser, and be proceeded against accordingly.
 16. All cattle must be the *bona fide* property of applicant for commonage, and persons registering cattle must sign a statement to that effect.
 17. The managers will not be responsible for any neglect or irregularities of the herdsman.
 18. Each herdsman shall provide security for the honest and faithful discharge of his duties in the sum of Twenty pounds sterling.
 19. Any person infringing any of the regulations for the management of the common may, on the herdsman's report to the managers, be refused a renewal of his license.
 20. Owners of stock travelling across the common to and from water shall give notice to the managers of their intention so to do, and shall have permission to travel by a road to be approved of by the managers.
 21. The managers may reduce to the minimum rate prescribed in the general regulations the fees in case of widows, orphans, or other persons in very straitened circumstances.
 22. Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.
- The foregoing regulations were adopted at a meeting of the managers held at Burreroe, on Saturday the sixth day of July 1878.

COLERAINE TOWN COMMON.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE TOWN COMMON OF COLERAINE.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council to frame regulations for the management of commons, and in pursuance of the provisions of chapter XIII. of the regulations made under the said Act by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of May 1873, the Council of the Shire of Wannan, as Managers for the Coleraine Town Common, submit to the Board of Land and Works for approval the following Regulations for the management of the said common in lieu of the regulations heretofore in force in respect thereof.

1. All resident householders in the town proper shall be allowed to depasture four head of cattle or four horses.
2. Carriers coming from a distance and travelling teams will be allowed to depasture their teams for twenty-four hours free of charge.
3. Cattle known to destroy fences will not be allowed on the common, and no entire horse or bull over nine months old will be allowed thereon without the permission of the managers ; and all foals and calves on arriving at the age of twelve months must be paid for as full grown animals.
4. Owners of stock must register their brands when paying fees ; the agistment fees shall be Two shillings and sixpence for every head per quarter, to be paid in advance to whomsoever the managers may appoint to receive the same ; the quarters will commence on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October in each year.
5. All stock found trespassing on the common without being registered will be impounded by the person in charge of the common.
6. No diseased cattle, or cattle that have been on a ruin where diseased cattle have been depastured or have been in contact with diseased cattle within the previous three months shall be permitted on the common, and any such cattle must be removed within six hours after a notice, signed by two of the managers, shall have been served upon the owner, or any person in whose charge they may be, under a penalty of Ten pounds, to be recovered at the nearest court of petty sessions.
7. Any person cutting or destroying any growing timber on the common, or driving or disturbing cattle on the common, will forfeit his privilege of depasturing under these rules, and be liable to prosecution.
8. No person shall remove stock from the common without first giving notice to the herdsman.
9. The herdsman shall visit the pound yards every day (Sunday excepted), and when registered stock are impounded he shall inform the owners thereof without delay, when registered stock are missing from the common the herdsman shall immediately inform the owners.
10. The herdsman shall be responsible for any stock missing unless he can prove to the managers that he has given the notice as required in rule number nine.
11. Persons depasturing horses on the common can have them yarded every morning before Nine o'clock (Sunday excepted), by giving notice to the herdsman on the previous evening.
12. Any permanent resident, not being a householder, shall have the privilege of grazing one horse on the common by paying One shilling per week in advance.
13. Any laboring man, not being a resident of the town of Coleraine, but employed within the township, shall be allowed to depasture one horse on the common by paying One shilling per week in advance.
14. The herdsman shall report to the managers any cattle known to rush or endanger the safety of any person ; and being so authorized by two of the managers, shall give notice to the owners to remove them within twenty-four hours, and in default shall proceed to impound such cattle.
15. The herdsman shall attend every ordinary meeting of the council, and shall furnish a report showing the number of stock, and of any notice served under these rules, and shall, when required, produce his books and supply any information that may tend to assist the managers in carrying out the foregoing regulations.
16. The herdsman shall be responsible for keeping the common land free from thistles and all obnoxious weeds.
17. Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

LACEPEDE ISLANDS—WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

The Government of Western Australia invites tenders from persons desirous of obtaining the sole right to remove guano from the Lacepede Islands group, which is situated in about 17° south latitude, and 122° east longitude from Greenwich, and on which it is calculated there are now at least 40,000 tons of guano. Such tenders must be sent in to the Colonial Secretary, Perth, Western Australia, on or before the 15th October next, but the Government does not bind itself to accept the highest or any tender.

All tenders will have to state the price or royalty offered per ton for the guano (1) if shipped in the natural state; (2) if artificially prepared, dried, or sifted before shipment.

The person whose tender may be accepted (hereinafter spoken of as "the contractor") will have to bind himself to the following conditions:—

1. To remove the whole of the guano that there may be on the islands.
2. To take it away at the minimum rate of twenty thousand tons a year.

3. To remove the guano in such a manner and from such places as may be from time to time pointed out by the Government Officer stationed on the islands: and the contract will contain a clause providing that in case of the breach or neglect of these conditions the contract shall be void, and the contractor shall forfeit all buildings, erections, and plant that he may have set up on any of the islands, and also the sum of Two thousand pounds hereinafter mentioned.

The contractor will be required, within seven days after receiving a notification by telegraph or otherwise that his tender is accepted, and before the issue of any license, to deposit in the hands of the Western Australian Government, or of such person as they may name as their agent in this behalf, the sum of Two thousand pounds, as security for the due performance of the contract, and this sum will be retained by the Government until the termination of the contract, and will be liable to forfeiture as hereinbefore mentioned. He will also be required at the same time to pay a like sum of Two thousand pounds, by way of royalty, in advance. The contractor will at no time be at liberty to remove any guano unless the royalty agreed upon has been paid, and no less sum than Two thousand pounds will be accepted at any time in payment of royalty until such time as there is left on the islands a quantity of guano the agreed royalty on which shall be less than Two thousand pounds.

The only instructions that will be given to the Government Officer stationed on the islands, and which he will be required to insist upon with regard to the manner in which and the places from which the guano shall be removed, will be to divide the islands into convenient sections, to point out the section or sections from which guano may be removed, and to require that the whole of any one section be cleared before any new ground is entered on.

The quantity of guano taken by each ship on which royalty has to be paid shall be ascertained by adding 25 per cent. to the registered tonnage of timber-built ships, and 40 per cent. to the registered tonnage of iron-built ships; provided that, if the captain or agent of any ship, or the Government Officer, shall in any instance be dissatisfied with the foregoing arrangement, he shall be at liberty to cause the ship to be exactly measured according to Lloyd's rules, and the number of cubical feet so ascertained divided by 40 shall be taken to be the tonnage capacity of the ship.

No tonnage, light, or harbor dues will be charged in any port of the colony on ships solely engaged in the guano trade, and no customs duties will be levied on goods and stores that may be landed on the islands for persons solely employed in the preparation and shipment of guano.

The contractor will be at liberty to erect on any or all of the islands any buildings, jetties, tramways, &c., and, subject to the conditions before expressed as to forfeiture, to remove the same at any time within six months of the termination of the contract.

No license for the shipment of guano under the regulations now in force will be granted after the 15th August next, and every such license granted after the date hereof will provide for the compulsory removal of the guano for the shipment of which it is the permit before the 15th October next.

It will at all times be optional with the licensee to ship the guano in its natural state, or artificially prepared, dried, or sifted.

The contract to be entered into in pursuance of this notice shall be deemed to commence on 1st January 1879.

Each tender, unless otherwise expressed, shall be deemed to be open to acceptance by the Government for the space of one calendar month from the 15th October, and the Government shall be at liberty to accept any tender by notifying to the person making it, by telegraph, that his tender is accepted. Any person who shall tender, and, on his tender being accepted, shall fail to pay the two several sums of Two thousand pounds as hereinbefore set forth, shall be deemed to have broken his contract, and the Government shall thereupon be at liberty to accept any other tender, and to hold such person responsible for all loss consequent on his breach of contract.
