### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have this day assented in Her Majesty's name, to a Bill, passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

An Act to sanction the issue and expenditure of certain sums from "The Public Works Loan Account 1872" for salaries, wages, and contingencies for the service of the year ending the thirtieth day of June, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this thirteenth day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and in the forty-second year of Her Majesty's reign.

By His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or

union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to the undermentioned Common the Crown lands hereinafter described, that is to say:—

**THE DIMBOOLA TOWN COMMON**, proclaimed by Order of the 9th of March 1869, and increased by Orders dated respectively the 19th July 1869 and the 7th June 1875, is hereby further increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.:—County of Borung, parish of Dimboola:—Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 115; thence westerly and northerly by that allotment, and westerly, northerly, and easterly by allotment 91 to the north-east angle of the latter; thence northerly by a road twenty-nine chains eighty-three links; thence west by a line to the Wimmera River; thence south-easterly by that river about one hundred and seventeen chains to a reserve for camping and watering purposes; thence north-easterly by that reserve to the road from Dimboola to Lochiel Bridge; thence north-westerly by a direct line to the west angle of E. ## REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE TREASURY, FITZROY, CARLTON, AND FLAGSTAFF GARDENS.

WHEREAS by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted that the Board of Land and Works shall have power from time to time to make and alter or rescind rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: Now therefore the said Board of Land and Works, in exercise of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby rescind all rules and regulations heretofore made relating to the Treasury Gardens, the Fitzroy Garden, the Carlton Garden, and the Flagstaff Garden, and doth hereby make the regulations following for the care, protection, and management of the above-named gardens:—

## REGULATIONS.

- All persons visiting or walking through the Treasury Garden shall keep on the footpaths.
- No person shall interfere with the seats, trees, shrubs, grass, flowers, statuary, fountains, fish, or birds in any of the above-named gardens, or throw stones or other missiles, beat carpets, or commit any nuisance, or light fires therein, or leave therein any bottles, orange-peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or litter or refuse of any kind, or smoke when off the paths.
- No person shall climb on or jump over the seats or fences in or around the said gardens, or lie on the seats, or stick bills on the fences or on the gates, or cut names, letters, or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or otherwise deface the same or write thereon.
- No person, unless employed in the gardens under the direction of the curator thereof, shall bring into the gardens any horse or vehicle, or enter plots of ground enclosed for plantations or for other purposes.
- No person shall bring into these gardens any dog unless the same be held by a chain or cord.
- No children under seven years of age shall be allowed in these gardens unless in charge of adult friends or nurses.
- Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing in the said gardens any act of indecency, may be forthwith removed therefrom by any bailiff of Crown lands or police constable, and be liable to prosecution for an offence against these regulations.

8. All goats and poultry found within these gardens may be destroyed by any bailiff of Crown lands or police constable.

9. The Treasury Garden shall be closed to the public daily during such hours as the Minister of Lands and Agriculture may from time to time determine.

Offenders against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE ALBERT, YARRA, PRINCES, FLINDERS, FAWKNER, AND STUDLEY PARKS, AND THE GOVERNMENT HOUSE DOMAIN.

WHEREAS by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted that the Board of Land and Works shall have power from time to time to make and alter or rescind rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in exercise of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby rescind all rules and regulations heretofore made relating to Albert Park, Yarra Park, Princes Park, Flinders Park, Fawknor Park, Studley Park, and the Government House Domain, and doth hereby make the Regulations following for the care, protection, and management of such parks and domain:—

## REGULATIONS.

- Unless otherwise directed by the Minister of Lands and Agriculture, the double gates at the Albert Park shall, from the 1st April to the 30th September, be closed to the public from Six p.m. to Six a.m., and from the 1st October to the 31st March from sunset to Six a.m.
  - Except on the roads in Studley Park, and as hereinafter provided, no vehicle used for hire or transport of goods, stores, or materials of any kind, bearing either name or number, shall be allowed within these parks and domain without the permission, in writing, of the Minister of Lands and Agriculture; and no person shall ride or drive within the said parks and domain except on the roads laid out therein: Provided that any licensed vehicle hired by the day or hour shall not be excluded from being used on the roads in Albert Park. This regulation shall not apply to His Excellency the Governor, nor to any person resident within the Government House Domain.
  - No person on horseback or leading any horse shall enter the Yarra Park and Fawknor Park, and no vehicle shall be allowed therein without the permission, in writing, of the Minister of Lands and Agriculture.
  - No person shall offer any article for sale in these parks and domain without the permission, in writing, of the said Minister.
  - No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, flowers, or birds in the said parks and domain, or throw stones or other missiles, or commit any nuisance therein, or leave therein any bottles, orange peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or litter; and no fires shall be lit within such parks and domain unless under the authority of the said Minister.
  - No person shall climb on or jump over the seats and fences in and around the said parks and domain, or stick bills on those fences or gates, or cut names, letters, or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or otherwise deface or write thereon.
  - No person shall depasture any horses or cattle in the said parks and domain without the permission, in writing, of the Minister of Lands and Agriculture, and then in such portions thereof only as may be specified in such permission.
  - No person shall disturb the wildfowl in Albert Park.
  - Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing in the said parks and domain any act of indecency, may be forthwith removed therefrom by any bailiff of Crown lands or police constable, and shall be liable to prosecution for an offence against these regulations.
  - Entrance into plots of ground enclosed for plantations or for other purposes is prohibited.
  - All goats and poultry found in the said parks and domain may be destroyed by any bailiff of Crown lands or police constable.
- Offenders against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and



wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE SKIPTON RECREATION RESERVE.

WE, Philip Black Anderson, James Stoddart, William Allan, and Charles Whitpaine, the duly appointed committee of management of the land at Skipton reserved for recreation purposes, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management of the above-mentioned recreation reserve, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

#### REGULATIONS.

1. The recreation reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards his dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the committee of management.
6. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the committee of management being first obtained.
7. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots which may be enclosed within the reserve for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five (5) pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten (10) pounds.

#### BAILLIESTON COMMON SITUATED WITHIN THE SHIRE OF WARANGA. REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council to frame regulations for the management of commons, and in pursuance of the provisions of chapter XIII. of the Regulations made under the said Act by the Governor in Council on the 26th May 1873 the Council of the Shire of Waranga, as Managers of the Baillieston Common, submit to the Board of Land and Works for approval the following Regulations for the management of the said common:—

1st. In the construction and for the purpose of these regulations the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules; the

words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats; and the "farmer" shall mean a person who resides on and uses for the purpose of agriculture or dairying land held by that person either in fee or under lease or license issued under *The Land Act 1862*, the *Amending Land Act 1865*, or under *The Land Act 1869*.

2nd. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business license, or carrier's license, and farmers within the Waranga Shire, shall be respectively entitled to depasture on this common, situated within a distance of five miles from their place of residence, four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him shall be allowed to depasture on such common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent of small cattle, for every ten acres of land cultivated by him.

3rd. The fees to be paid for depasturing on the said common shall be as follows, viz:—

- 1st. For every cow, heifer, bullock, or steer, at the rate of Four shillings per annum.
- 2nd. For every mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, or mule, at the rate of Five shillings per annum.
- 3rd. For every sheep or goat at the rate of One shilling and fourpence per annum.

4th. All fees shall be paid half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in each year, and so on in proportion for any less period not under one month; and all cattle remaining on a common seven days after the period for which payment has been made may be impounded without notice.

5th. No person shall be allowed to transfer his or her right of commonage.

6th. The managers may from time to time employ and remove such person as herdsman or otherwise as they may deem requisite, and pay them out of the common fees. And such persons shall find security to the satisfaction of the managers for the due execution of their duties; and in case any cattle be missed from the common it shall be the duty of the herdsman, as soon as possible, and within twenty-four hours after the same being missed by him, to give notice thereof to the owner of such cattle.

7th. The managers shall keep the books in the prescribed form in schedule 24 of the regulations of 26th May 1873, in which books shall be recorded the description and brands of the cattle depastured on the common; the moneys received as commonage fees; the payments made from the fund derived therefrom; the dates of such payments, and the authority for making them; and shall give printed receipts in the form prescribed in the said schedule, consecutively numbered, the butts of which receipts must be retained for inspection.

8th. The managers shall keep an account current at the Bank of Victoria, Rushworth, and shall without delay pay to such account all moneys coming to their hands by virtue of their office; and shall make all payments by cheque, signed by any two of such managers; and within one month after the termination of each year publish in a newspaper circulating in the Waranga Shire a certified account of their receipts and expenditure for the year, in the form prescribed in schedule 25 of the aforementioned regulations, and forward copy thereof to the board.

9th. The managers may make such arrangements as they may deem necessary for receiving and branding cattle, and for returning the same to the owner thereof; and it shall be the duty of the herdsman to afford every facility in finding and returning such cattle.

10th. No entire horse nor any bull shall be allowed to run upon the common.

11th. The managers may set apart a portion of the common for depasturing sheep thereon, and the persons depasturing shall be responsible for the same being kept on the portion of the common (if any) set apart for their use. Sheep trespassing on any other part of the common may be impounded.

12th. At the time of placing cattle on the common the owners thereof shall make a statement setting forth the extent of land in their occupation, together with the number of acres under cultivation; and give the herdsman a memorandum in writing of the number, brands, and description of the cattle so placed on the common; and all such cattle shall have the owners' firebrands thereon.

13th. Cattle shall not be taken off the common without notice to the herdsman from the owner thereof, except in cases where they may be frequently required, when the managers, if they think proper, may grant permission to the owners to remove and replace the same at pleasure, in a quiet manner, so as not to interfere with or disturb other stock unnecessarily; but the herdsman shall not be considered to have any supervision whatsoever over such cattle.

14th. Any person having right of commonage, or the managers of any neighbouring common, may register with the herdsman of the common the description and brands of any missing cattle in a book kept for that purpose, upon payment of a fee of One shilling for every head of such cattle so registered; and such cattle if found on such common shall not be impounded until notice has been given to the owners or persons registering, who shall be required to remove the same within fourteen days from such notice being given, otherwise they shall be impounded.

15th. No diseased cattle shall be placed upon the common, and cattle becoming diseased after being placed thereon shall



be removed within twenty-four hours after notice by the herdsman to the owner thereof, and in case such cattle be not removed within the time specified the cattle so diseased shall be removed or destroyed at the expense of the owner.

16th. The managers shall not be responsible for any cattle placed on the common.

17th. Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

#### RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE DONALD COMMON, WITHIN THE SHIRE OF ST. ARNAUD.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council to frame regulations for the management of commons, and in pursuance of the provisions of chapter XIII. of the Regulations made under the said Act by the Governor in Council, on the 26th day of May 1873, the Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud, as Managers of the Donald Common, submit to the Board of Land and Works, for approval, the following Regulations for the Management of the said Common:—

1. All persons entitled to commonage under the provisions of *The Land Act of 1862*, *The Amending Land Act of 1865*, and *The Land Act of 1869*, shall be allowed to depasture stock on the Donald Common, situate and being within the Shire of St. Arnaud, subject to these regulations, and upon payment in advance of the fees specified in the schedule hereunto annexed.

2. Ratepayers and other persons entitled to commonage residing within five miles of the said common may depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. Farmers having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by them may depasture on such common in addition one head of large cattle or three head of small cattle for every ten acres of such land so cultivated.

3. Ever commoner depasturing cattle must be the *bonâ fide* owner of the cattle so depastured.

4. Bulls or entire horses over the age of nine months will not be allowed on the common without the written sanction of the managers; and sheep will be allowed to depasture on such portions only of the said common as may be set apart for that purpose by the managers.

5. The herdsman of the common shall be in attendance at a place to be named on the seven days immediately preceding the first day of each quarter, for the purpose of registering cattle and receiving the fees thereon; and due notice of such attendance, and the time and place thereof, shall be given by the managers.

6. All persons taking cattle to depasture shall deliver them into the charge of the herdsman at the time and place appointed as aforesaid, together with a written statement of the number and brands of such cattle; and the herdsman shall, on receiving the fees payable on such cattle, give a receipt for the same on behalf of the managers, and shall forthwith, with the assistance of the owner or person in charge, brand such cattle in a conspicuous place with the common brand, which shall be of pitch or tar; and such brand shall be renewed whenever necessary, so as to be plainly legible during the whole period that such cattle are depasturing on the common. On presentation of the abovenamed receipt, the managers shall deliver or cause to be delivered to the person named therein a license for the period specified.

7. No cattle duly registered in the books of the managers shall be removed from the common, unless notice of intention to remove be first given to the herdsman, who shall obtain a receipt from the owner for the cattle so removed.

8. The managers or herdsman shall not be responsible for the loss of any cattle from the common, save as provided in the next section.

9. The herdsman shall, on any cattle straying, or being otherwise removed without the owner's consent, notify the owner thereof within ten days. And in default of giving notice within that time, should such cattle be lost, the herdsman shall be held responsible for the loss, to be computed at the rate of Two pounds sterling per head for horses, and Two pounds sterling per head for horned cattle, to be deducted from the remuneration payable to the herdsman.

10. All fees must be paid quarterly in advance to the herdsman of the common; licenses to date from the first of

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January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October in each year.

11. All stock on which the prescribed fees shall not have been paid within ten days after date for renewal of license will be impounded.

12. All dead carcasses found on the common, which the owner or owners may refuse or neglect to remove after receiving twenty-four hours' notice, in writing, from the managers or herdsman, the managers or herdsman shall have power to remove, or cause to be removed, by burning or otherwise, at the expense of such owner or owners.

13. The herdsman shall report, immediately on the indication of any contagious disease in any cattle on the common, to the managers, and shall give notice to the owner of such cattle to remove the same. The managers shall at once take precautionary measures to remove such cattle from the common; but they shall not be responsible for any loss the owners of such diseased cattle may sustain.

14. The herdsman shall take the necessary steps for the effectual destruction of thistles growing on the common, the expense of such work to be defrayed out of the common fund; provided that express authority for such expenditure be first obtained from the managers.

15. The herdsman shall be responsible for the efficient carrying out of the regulations for the management of the common, and shall conform to any special instructions issued to him by the managers relative to the registration, custody, and delivery to the owners of the cattle thereon, and to the prevention of trespass thereon of animals for which no commonage fees have been paid, or which are not allowed to depasture as herein provided.

16. The herdsman shall pay all moneys received by him in respect of depasturing or trespass fees, within ten days after receiving the same, to the treasurer of the shire, who shall then pay the same into the Bank of Victoria, St. Arnaud, or such other bank as may be from time to time appointed by the managers, to the credit of the managers of the said common.

17. The remuneration to be paid to the herdsman shall be taken out of the common fund, and shall not exceed seventy-five per cent. of all fees received.

18. The herdsman shall before entering upon his duties provide a guarantee for the due performance thereof, to the satisfaction of the managers, to the amount of Twenty pounds.

19. Whenever in these regulations any act or thing is required to be done by the managers, it shall be considered to be well and truly done if done by any two or more of them duly appointed from time to time to act on their behalf.

20. The managers shall, within one month after the termination of each year, publish in a newspaper circulating in the district a certified account of their receipts and expenditure for the year, in the form prescribed in Schedule XXV. to the regulations made by the Governor in Council on the 26th May 1873, and forward copy of such account to the Board of Land and Works.

21. Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

#### Schedule of Fees.

For each head of large cattle, Twenty-six shillings per annum.

For each head of small cattle, Ten shillings per annum.  
Progeny of horned cattle and horses, under six months old, if running with their mothers, free.

TOONGABBIE SOUTH COMMON, ROSEDALE SHIRE.

#### RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE TOONGABBIE SOUTH COMMON.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council to frame Regulations for the Management of Commons, and in pursuance of the provisions of Chapter XIII. of the Regulations made under the said Act by the Governor in Council, on the 26th day of May 1873, the Council of the Shire of Rosedale, as Managers of the Toongabbie South Common, submit to the Board of Land and Works for approval the following Regulations for the Management of the said Common:—

No. 1. All residents within five miles of any portion of the gazetted boundaries of the common shall be entitled to depasture four head of large cattle or the equivalent of the whole

or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture one additional head of large cattle or the equivalent in small cattle for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

No. 2. The fees for depasturing cattle shall be paid half-yearly in advance, on the first days of April and October in each year, according to the following scale, viz.:-

a. For horned cattle, (5s.) Five shillings per head per annum.

b. For horses, (8s.) Eight shillings per head per annum.

c. For sheep, (1s. 4d.) One shilling and fourpence per head per annum.

d. For goats, (2s.) Two shillings per head per annum.

Calves and foals under (8) eight months old, the progeny of registered cattle on the common, shall be free.

No. 3. When the fees are paid the herdsman shall give a receipt on the authorized form, and shall register the brands and descriptions of the cattle, together with the owner's name and address and the amount of fees paid, in a book to be called the Common's Herd-book; and shall brand the cattle so registered with the common's brand.

No. 4. No pigs shall be allowed to depasture on the common, nor any bull or entire horse, without the consent of the managers, who shall at the time fix special fees.

No. 5. The managers or herdsman will not be responsible for any cattle depasturing on the common, but the herdsman shall see all registered cattle on the common once at least in every seven days, and in the event of any straying he shall give notice in writing to the owners thereof within (24) twenty-four hours after being missed.

No. 6. In the event of any cattle straying off the common and being impounded the herdsman shall be responsible to the owners for the impounding expenses, and for the safe return of such cattle to the common; provided the requirements of rule (5) five have not been complied with.

No. 7. The herdsman shall impound all cattle trespassing on the common, and keep correct accounts of the same, so that the fees arising therefrom shall be properly accounted for; and all fees arising from this source shall go to the credit of the common's account.

No. 8. All persons desirous of removing stock permanently from the common shall give (24) twenty-four hours' notice of their intention to the herdsman.

No. 9. The managers or herdsman shall have the power to cause any cattle having, or suspected of having, any contagious disease to be removed from or to such part of the common as may be directed, and the herdsman shall give notice at once to the owners of such cattle being diseased.

No. 10. In the event of any cattle dying upon the common the owners of the same shall after (24) twenty-four hours' notice from the herdsman, or after having the carcass pointed out to them by the herdsman, cause all such carcasses to be at once burned or destroyed, failing which the herdsman shall cause the same to be destroyed at the owner's risk and cost.

No. 11. The brand to be for the common shall be TC pitch brand.

Due notice, by advertisement in the local newspapers circulating in the district, shall be given of the mustering of cattle on the common every six months, and every owner of cattle shall assist, or authorize some person to represent him, in branding them with the common's brand, or pay sixpence per head to the herdsman, the amount to go to the credit of the common's account.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding (20) Twenty pounds for each offence.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1874 (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality by notice in the Government Gazette to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and such land should thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Sandhurst has requested that the streets, hereinafter mentioned, within the said city, be so declared public highways: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the lands acquired or used for the streets hereinafter named and described and situate in the City of Sandhurst to be public highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—
